WHEREAS by "The Game Act, 1912," it is provided that the Governor may from time to time, by Proclamation, declare any one or more portions of the State or any one or more localities to be respectively defined in such Proclamation a reserve for native game or any particular native game: Now therefore I, the said Governor, in exercise of the power aforesaid, do hereby, with the advice of the Executive Council, declare that the portions of the State and localities mentioned and defined in the First Schedule hereto shall be reserves for native game under the respective names therein mentioned: And that the locality defined in the Second Schedule hereto shall be a reserve for kangaroos.

First Schedule.

Name of Reserve, and Boundaries and description.

Pelican Island.—Comprising the whole of Pelican Island in Sharks Bay.

Leschenault Estuary.—All that portion of Leschenault Estuary situated North of a straight line extending due West from Mill Point.

Boolan.—Comprising all that portion of Pastoral Lease 470/94 which is bounded by a line starting from a point 80 chains West of Boolan Trig., then running 200 chains North; thence 265 chains East; thence 280 chains South; thence 265 chains West; thence 80 chains North to the point of commencement.

Boolanthanna.—Comprising all that portion of Pastoral Lease 470/94 which is bounded by a line starting from the North-East corner of Location 7, 53/3, and running 80 chains East; thence 80 chains South; thence 80 chains West; thence North to the point of commencement; also all that area contained in 53/3, Location 7.

Dorre Island.—Comprising the whole of Dorre Island.

Swan River.—All that portion of the Swan River extending from the Midland Railway Bridge, Upper Swan, over said river, downwards to its mouth, and to the extreme Western end of the Breakwater, including Perth and Melville Waters and Freshwater Bay.

Helena River.—All that portion of the Helena River extending from the Canning-Jarrah Timber Company's Railway Bridge over said river downwards to its junction with the Swan River.

Canning River.—All that portion of the Canning River extending from the South-Western Railway Bridge over said river downwards to its junction with the Swan River.

Vasse River and Estuary.—All that portion of the Vasse River and Estuary within the boundaries of the Municipality of Busselton.

Herdsmen's Lake.—Comprising the whole of Herdsmen's Lake, situated near Leederville.

Abrolhos Islands.—Comprising the whole of the Abrolhos Islands, situated West of Geraldton.

Monger's Lake.—Comprising the whole of Monger's Lake, situated near Leederville.

Wagin Lake.—Comprising the whole of Reserve 13279, about 260 acres, being Wagin Location 897, including Wagin Lake.

Second Schedule.

That portion of the State bounded on the South and West by the sea-coast, and on the North and East by a line starting from North Point on the sea-coast and running in an Easterly direction through Mt. Lesueur to a point North of the Kellerberrin Post Office; thence South till it intersects a South-Easterly line extending from Mt. Stirling to the mouth of the Fitzgerald River; thence along the said line in a South-Easterly direction to the mouth of the Fitzgerald River aforesaid, including the islands adjacent to the sea-coast aforesaid.

WHEREAS by virtue of "The Game Act, 1912," the Governor may, by Proclamation, from time to time declare the close season for any kind of native game either generally throughout the State or in any one or more districts thereof to be defined in any such Proclamation: And whereas the Governor may in like manner exempt from the operation of any such declaration any defined locality: And whereas it is desirable to exercise the powers hereinbefore mentioned in manner hereinafter set out: Now therefore I, the said Governor, acting with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim and declare that the close season throughout the State for each kind of native game mentioned in the first column of the First Schedule hereto shall be as set out in the second column thereof opposite the name of such kind of game: Provided that the Kimberley Division, as defined in "The Land Act, 1898," and that portion of the State within the boundaries of the East Murchison Goldfield shall be exempted from the operation of the close season declared for wild ducks of all species: And I do further, with the advice aforesaid, proclaim and declare that the portions of the State defined in the third column of the Second Schedule hereto shall be districts for the purposes of the said Act, and that the close season for each kind of native game mentioned in the first column of the said Second Schedule shall be as set out in the second column of such schedule opposite the name of such kind of game, and that such close season shall be operative in the district mentioned in the third column of such schedule opposite the statement of such close season and not elsewhere.

The First Schedule.

Kind of Native Game.	Statement of Close Season.
Wild Ducks of all species ...	From end of June to 5.30 o'clock in the afternoon of the 23rd December in every year.
Seals ...	November, December, January, February, and March in every year.

The Second Schedule.

Species of Native Game.	Statement of Close Season.	District within which Close Season operates.
Wild Geese of all species, Wild Turkey, Swamp Hen, Wild Pigeon, Gnow, Rottnest Snipe.	July, August, September, October, November in every year.	District A. — Comprising that portion of the State bounded on the West and South by the sea-coast, including the islands adjacent to it, on the North by the Murchison River, on the East by a line from Bompas Hill in the Great Northern Bend of the Murchison River through Wongan Hills and Mt. Stirling to the mouth of the Fitzgerald River.
Booby, Frigate Bird, Noddy, Pelican, Curlew, Scapie, Sea Snipe, Mutton Bird, Red Bill, Cormorant or Shag.	June, July, August, and September in every year.	District B. — Comprising that portion of the State North of the Moore River.
Finches and Weaver Finches (exclusive of Silver-eyes).	August, September, October, and November in every year.	District C. — The Kimberley Division as defined in the Land Act, 1898.

WHEREAS it is provided by "The Game Act, 1912," that the Governor may, by Proclamation, declare from time to time that any bird or animal indigenous to Western Australia shall be at all times strictly preserved either generally throughout the State or in any one or more portions thereof: Now therefore I, the said Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, in exercise of the power aforesaid, do hereby declare that the birds and animals indigenous to Western Australia mentioned in the First Schedule hereto shall be at all times strictly preserved generally throughout the State: And that Cockatoos shall be at all times strictly preserved in those portions of the State defined in the Second Schedule: And that Emus shall be at all times strictly preserved in all that portion of the State defined in the Third Schedule: And that the Opossum shall be at all time strictly preserved generally throughout the State till the end of the month of August, 1913.

First Schedule.

Swan, Bittern, Magpie, Kookaburra or Laughing Jackass, Wattle Bird, Wagtail, Robin Redbreast.

Second Schedule.

1. That portion of the State bounded by a line starting from a point on the sea-coast 10 miles North of the Northern mouth of the Gascoyne River; thence running in an Easterly direction 10 miles North of any portion of the Gascoyne River to a point three miles East of the Lyons River; thence due South 20 miles; thence in a Westerly direction 10 miles South of any portion of the Gascoyne River to the sea-coast; thence along the sea-coast to the point of commencement.

2. That portion of the State bounded by a line starting from a point on the sea-coast 10 miles North of the mouth of the Minilya River; thence running in an Easterly direction 10 miles North of any portion of the Minilya River to a point due North of the source of the said river; thence due South 20 miles; thence in a Westerly direction 10 miles South of any portion of the Minilya River to the sea-coast; thence along the sea-coast to the point of commencement.

Third Schedule.

That portion of the State bounded by a line starting from Point Ann on the South coast; thence following the No. 2 Rabbit-proof Fence to its junction with No. 3 Rabbit-proof Fence; thence following No. 3 Rabbit-proof Fence to the sea-coast; thence following the sea-coast to the point of commencement.

BY-LAWS.

Interpretation Clause.

In the construction and for the purposes of these By-laws, unless the context otherwise requires, the terms "Cesspool," "Drain," "Earth Closet," "House," "Land," "Owner," "Person," "Piggery," and "Slaughter-house" shall have the meanings severally attached to them in Section 3 of "The Health Act, 1911."

The words "Board," "Fitting," "Land," "Occupier," "Owner," "Person," "Pipe," "Prescribed," "Rateable land," "Water Area," "Waterworks," and "Works" shall have meanings severally attached to them in the principal or any amending Act and the By-laws made thereunder.

"Reservoir" shall mean any reservoir, dam, tank, cistern, or well.

"Feeder" shall mean any watercourse, creek, stream or other channel with either perennial or intermittent flow whereby water can be conveyed to any Reservoir.

"High Water Mark" shall mean the level of full supply of any Reservoir, or feeder thereto.

"Inspector" and "Local Officer" respectively shall mean a person appointed by the Minister for the purposes of these By-laws or to administer the said By-laws.

"Minister" shall mean the Minister of Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage acting in pursuance of Section 161 of "The Water Boards Act, 1904."

Division 1.—By-laws for Preventing Pollution of the Waters of the Catchment Area.

1. The by-laws in this Division apply to all Water Reserves and Catchment Areas constituted for the purposes of the principal or any amending Act.

2. All existing cesspools within the catchment area shall be cleansed and filled up to the satisfaction of the Inspector within one calendar month after notice, in writing, to that effect shall have been given to the occupier or owner of the premises concerned.

3. The owner or occupier of every house within the catchment area shall provide, for the use of the occupants of such house, an earth closet, with a sufficient number of pans approved by the Inspector.

4. Every closet within the catchment area shall be of stone, iron, wood, brick, or combination of two or more of such materials. Each closet shall be supplied with a sufficient number of receptacles, which shall be interchangeable with others in the same district, and which shall be of approved size, shape, and style, and every pan shall be emptied and cleansed once every week, or as often as may be required by the Inspector.

5. Each dwelling on the Catchment Area shall be provided with a closet and urinal erected in such position as directed by the Inspector.

Closets or urinals already in existence shall, wherever considered necessary by the Inspector, be removed where directed by the Inspector, and such removal or re-erection shall be at the cost of the owner who shall have the work completed within one calendar month from delivery by Inspector of written notice to owner requiring this to be done.

The floor and seat of every closet shall be so constructed that the top of the receptacle shall not be more than one inch below the surface of the seat.

6. No owner or occupier of any house within the catchment area shall permit the contents of any pan used in any closet or urinal to overflow from any cause whatever.

7. No owner or occupier of any house within the catchment area shall permit any closet or urinal, or pan appertaining thereto, or used by the occupants of such house, to become offensive or a nuisance, and every such owner or occupier, whenever directed, either verbally or in writing, by the Inspector, shall properly and effectively

empty and cleanse such closet, urinal, or pan to the satisfaction of the Inspector and dispose of contents by burying same where and as directed by the Inspector.

8. No person shall place, or deposit, or spread, or permit to be placed, deposited, or spread, in or upon any land or garden within the catchment area, any night-soil or human urine, whether mixed with any other substance or not, or any solution of nightsoil, unless the same has been thoroughly deodorised and disinfected to the satisfaction of the Inspector, and unless written consent thereto has been obtained.

9. No person shall deposit, or permit to be deposited, any refuse, dung, manure, or other offensive matter in or near any feeder within the catchment area, or within three hundred yards of high-water mark, or in any place where, in the opinion of the Inspector, storm waters will be liable to wash such matter into any feeder.

10. No stable, cow-shed, goat-shed, sheep-pen, or fowl-house shall be erected or constructed within three hundred yards of high-water mark, or in such a position that storm waters may wash any manure or refuse therefrom into any feeder. Every such structure situated elsewhere within the catchment area shall have attached thereto, for liquid and solid manure, a water-tight receptacle approved by the Inspector. Land sloping to a feeder on which any such structure stands shall be excavated to a depth of at least twelve inches, and the soil so obtained shall be used as an embankment around the area so excavated. Such work shall be done by and at the expense of the owner or occupier of such premises.

11. No building of any description situated within three hundred yards of high-water mark, or in such position that storm waters may wash any manure or other refuse therefrom into any feeder, shall be used for housing animals or birds, and any such building shall, on receipt of written notice to that effect, be taken down and removed by and at the expense of the owner or occupier.

12. The owner or occupier of any stable, cow-shed, goat-shed, sheep-pen, or fowl-house, situated within the catchment area, shall not allow any dung, manure, or other refuse to accumulate in or near such premises, but shall periodically remove or dispose of the same in such manner that it cannot pollute any water flowing, or which may flow, into any watercourse, and generally to the satisfaction of the Inspector.

13. The Inspector may, by written notice to the owner or occupier of any stable, cow-shed, goat-shed, sheep-pen or fowl-house within the catchment area, order the removal and disposal of any dung, manure, or other refuse from such premises, and fix the periods within which such dung, manure, or other refuse shall be removed and disposed of; and any person omitting to comply with such notice to the satisfaction of the Inspector within three days after such notice shall have been issued shall be guilty of an offence against these By-laws, and liable to penalties imposed for breach thereof.

14. No animal shall be stabled, housed, or yarded within three hundred yards of the high-water mark, or in any place where, in the opinion of the Inspector, any dung or other offensive matter may be carried or washed into any feeder.

15. No person shall, unless with written permission, allow any horse, cattle, sheep, goat, duck, goose, fowl, or other species of live stock to stray over any portion of the catchment area.

16. No person shall keep pigs, or allow pigs to be or to stray within one hundred yards of high-water mark, or within one hundred yards of any stream, watercourse, channel, or feeder by which water does at any time of the year reach the reservoir, whether such watercourse or channel or feeder shall at the time of any offence against this By-law contain water or not within the catchment area, nor shall any person have or maintain any sty in which pigs are kept on any portion of the catchment area within two hundred yards of the reservoir, or of any stream, watercourse, or feeder within the catchment area.

17. No person shall, except with written permission, establish or carry on any abattoir or slaughter-house in any part of the catchment area.

18. In the event of the death, or of any accident necessitating the slaughter of any horse, cattle, sheep, or other animal, the carcase of such animal shall be removed by the owner thereof to a safe distance from high-water mark, or any feeder, or to such place as the Inspector may direct, and the owner shall immediately thereafter dispose of same, by burning, to the satisfaction of the Inspector.

19. No person shall deposit, or cause or permit to be deposited, any rubbish, filth, blood, offal, or manure, or any slops, soap-suds, urine, water containing urine or other refuse, noisome thing, or matter in any part of the catchment area, whence it may, in the opinion of the Inspector, be carried by storm water into any feeder.

20. No person shall allow any filth, rubbish, blood, offal, manure, or any slops, soap-suds, urine, water containing urine or other refuse, noisome thing, or matter to flow or escape from any house or premises within the catchment area owned or occupied by him.

21. No person shall bathe or wash clothes or other articles in any stream, reservoir, aqueduct, or other waterworks within the catchment area, or wash, throw, or cause to enter therein any dog or other animal; or throw or convey, or permit to be conveyed or thrown therein any rubbish, dirt, filth, dead animal, or other noisome thing.

22. It shall be lawful for the Inspector, or any assistants acting under the directions of the Inspector, or other authorised officer, at his discretion, at any reasonable hour, with or without notice, to enter any land, house, or premises for the purpose of ascertaining whether any act or thing is being done or permitted within such land, house, or premises in breach of these By-laws; and to remove, or cause to be removed, anything therein or thereon in breach of these By-laws, or to take such steps as he may deem necessary for carrying out these provisions. The cost of such removal or such other necessary act shall be borne by the owner or occupier of the premises upon which such breach shall occur.

23. Unless otherwise provided for, the time which may elapse between the giving of a notice and the doing of a thing required to be done by any Inspector or other authorised officer shall be determined by the Minister for Works, according to the nature of each case.

24. No person shall shoot or hunt within the catchment area.

25. No person shall angle for or catch fish within the catchment area.

Division 2.—By-laws for Protecting the Water, Grounds, Works, etc., from Trespass and Injury.

26. No unauthorised person shall trespass within the fenced area adjacent to any waterworks or any reserve or other lands vested in the Minister.

27. No person shall, without first obtaining a license, cut or remove timber from any land or from any reserves or other properties in the possession of the Minister.

28. No person shall, without proper authority, enter any machinery house, valve house, or other portion of the works not open to the public, or enter any enclosure within the Water Area containing a tank, reservoir, meter, house, store, office, or other waterworks.

29. No person shall permit live stock to have access to any portion of the grounds in the vicinity of any waterworks.

30. No person shall post any bills, advertisements, or other notices on any portion of any waterworks or grounds in the vicinity thereof.

Division 3.—By-laws for the Licensing of Plumbers.

31. By-laws under this division shall apply to all plumbers' work done within the boundaries of every municipality or declared townsites within the Water Area, and in districts not within such boundaries plumbers' work shall be done under such arrangement as may be specified in each case by the Minister.

32. No person shall affix, alter, or repair any service pipe or fitting to be used in connection with any main or other pipe belonging to the waterworks, or interfere in any way therewith, unless licensed as a plumber under these By-laws.

33. An application for a plumbers' license shall be in writing, signed by the applicant, and addressed to the Minister.

34. Every applicant for a plumbers' license shall satisfy the Minister that he is a competent plumber, and may be required to submit to an examination in the theory and practice of plumbing work.

35. Every license shall be granted by the Minister; and the granting and cancellation of any license shall be in the absolute discretion of the Minister.

36. Every license shall be annual, expiring on the 10th day of January next following the granting thereof, and may be in the Form A in the Schedule hereto.

37. A fee of ten shillings shall be payable for every license, except when a license is granted after the 10th day of July in any year, in which case the fee shall be five shillings.

38. Every applicant for a plumber's license shall, before receiving a license, deposit with the Minister the sum of five pounds, to be held by the Minister during the currency of the license as security for the proper performance of all work undertaken by the licensee.

39. The Minister may deduct from such deposit the expense of making good any bad work of the licensed plumber or his workmen, and as often as any expense is so deducted the licensed plumber shall make good the deposit to the sum of five pounds, and in default his license will be cancelled.

40. Every licensed plumber shall, within forty-eight hours of any change of his address, give notice, in writing, thereof to the Minister.

41. The mains shall be tapped only by the workmen of the Minister.

42. No licensed plumber shall interfere with any pipe or fitting belonging to the waterworks without the permission, in writing, of a local officer first obtained.

43. No ground shall be opened, nor shall any work be undertaken for the purpose of laying and fixing a new service or fittings, or in the extension or alteration of an existing service or fittings until notice shall have been given by the responsible licensed plumber to a local officer. Such notice shall be in writing, in the Form B in the Schedule, and shall describe the nature and extent of the proposed work, and shall be given forty-eight hours at least before the work is intended to be commenced, unless the officer expressly accepts shorter notice.

44. On the completion or extension of any service the responsible plumber shall report the work to a local officer as ready for inspection.

45. In no case shall the ground be filled in, or water be turned on to any land, until the work executed by the responsible plumber has been examined and passed by a local officer, and a certificate in writing has been given by such officer to that effect.

Division 4.—By-laws for General Purposes.

46. Within the Geraldton Water Area the water rate shall be at a rate not exceeding two shillings in the pound per annum upon the net annual value of all rateable land, provided that a minimum rate of not exceeding One pound per annum shall be payable on each separately assessed piece of land.

47. Water rates shall become due and payable yearly, in advance, on each first day of January: Provided that in all cases where a water rate is made after the first day of January in any year, the notice of the order for the making and levying of such rate, published in the *Government Gazette* and a newspaper, as provided by Section 94 of the said Act, shall specify the minimum sum payable as rate as aforesaid, and the date or dates when the rate shall be due and payable, and such rate shall be and become due and payable in accordance with the terms of such notice.

48. Every ratepayer will be entitled to consume on each separately assessed property for which he is rated that quantity of water which, if calculated at a price not exceeding five shillings per thousand gallons, would amount to the equivalent of the water rate paid on such property, provided that such water be taken during the period for which the rate is struck.

49. Every ratepaying-consumer taking water in excess of the quantity to which he is entitled in respect of the rate will be charged for the excess at a price not exceeding two shillings and sixpence per thousand gallons.

50. It shall be at the discretion of the Minister to supply water to any individual consumer, whether rated or not, at such price or prices as may be mutually agreed upon.

51. Where water is supplied by measure to the owner or occupier of land, whether rated under the Act or otherwise, payment for the same shall be made at such times and in such manner as may be agreed upon between the Minister and the consumer.

52. Any person or persons requiring a water service to town or suburban premises in respect of which for the time being, a water rate may not be made, may be supplied on payment of a minimum charge, which shall be fixed by the Minister in each case. The minimum charge shall then take the place of a water rate, and the general provisions of these By-laws, as applying to rate-paying consumers, shall apply to minimum-charge paying consumers.

53. Application for services shall be made on the printed form procurable at the Local Water Supply Office, and shall be lodged not less than one week before the service is required.

54. Applications will not be entertained unless full information, as indicated on the printed form, is supplied, and the full amount of rates due on the premises to which a service is required is paid.

55. The Minister may, by notice to a consumer, from time to time restrict the quantity of water that may be supplied to him in any one week.

56. The Minister may, from time to time, when necessary for the purpose of tapping or repairing the main, or otherwise, cut off the supply of water from any part or parts of the Water Area.

57. It shall be at the discretion of the Local Officer as to whether or not a meter shall be affixed to any service, and such officer will also determine the size and class of meter in each case.

58. Meters will be supplied by the Water Supply Department, and may, in the discretion of the Water Supply Department, be open or encased, and rent for same shall be payable yearly in advance, on the following scales:—

59. The quantity registered by a meter at any time between ten days before and ten days after any stated date may be taken as the reading of the meter at such stated date.

60. During the time any meter is undergoing repairs, or should it cease to properly register the consumption of water, the Minister may, at his option, estimate the quantity of water consumed by taking an average of the quantity used during the previous month or quarter, or during the corresponding period of the previous year, and shall charge for the consumption so ascertained.

61. If the consumer shall at any time be dissatisfied with any particular reading of a meter, and shall be desirous of having same tested, he shall give written notice thereof to the Local Officer within seven days of such reading, and thereupon the said meter shall be tested by passing through it a predetermined quantity of water; and if, upon such testing, it shall appear to the satisfaction of the Local Officer that the said meter registered above five per cent. more than was actually passed through it at such testing, then the said Minister will bear the expense of and incidental to such testing, and will also adjust the charge to the said consumer, but if the said meter, upon such testing, shall not register above five per cent. more than the quantity that shall actually have passed through it, then the said consumer shall pay to the said Minister all the expenses of and incidental to such testing; provided that the amount representing the expense of each and every test shall be fixed by the Minister, and shall in no case exceed the sum of Forty shillings: Provided, also, that the said consumer shall not be at liberty to avail himself of the right to test the registration of the said meter for any period other than one month next preceding the date of reading in respect of which he shall have given notice as aforesaid: Provided further that for testing meters of sizes ¾ in. and under a uniform fee of 10s. shall be charged.

62. No person shall break or in any way interfere with the seal fixed on a meter through which water is supplied by the Minister, or turn or attempt to turn any screw, bolt, or nut on or attached to such meter, or use any tool or appliance on any such meter, or introduce or attempt to introduce any body or substance into such meter, or in any way interfere with any portion of such meter or of any pipes or fittings attached thereto.

63. No licensed plumber or other person shall, under any circumstances, disconnect the flange from a meter, or shall, after a meter has once been fixed on a service and water has been turned on, disconnect or interfere with any piping within twelve feet of such meter. Such work shall be done by the servants of the Minister only.

64. Any person supplied with water through a meter belonging to the Minister shall pay the cost of making good all damages to such meter whilst on his land and in his charge, and shall deliver such meter up in good order on ceasing to hire same. Any repairs required shall be done by the officers of the Minister, and the expense incurred by the Minister in so doing shall, on demand, be paid by the owner or occupier of the land, and if not paid on demand, shall be recoverable in the same manner as water rates.

65. Any person supplied by the Minister with water through a meter shall, on finding that meter is damaged or not registering, immediately give notice of the fact to the local Water Supply Office.

66. No person knowing that a meter is damaged or does not register properly shall draw water through such meter from a service pipe which is supplied with water by the Minister.

67. In every case in which the supply of water shall have been cut off by reason of non-payment of rates or other charges or by reason of a defective service, or by request of the occupier or owner, or when, in the opinion of the Minister or local officer necessary to prevent waste of water, or for other reason, a fee of five shillings shall be charged for reconnection, and shall be payable by the owner or occupier for the time being on demand. The service shall not be restored until such fee shall have been paid.

68. No person to whom water is supplied by the Minister shall, without written permission, sell or supply water to any person who may not reside on the premises of which he is the occupier.

69. The occupier of any premises to which the water has been laid on, or, in the event of there being no occupier, the owner shall cause proper means to be taken by locks or otherwise, subject to the approval of the

Local Officer, to prevent the use of the water from the main by persons not connected with the premises supplied.

70. The owner or occupier of any allotment of land within the Water Area who shall erect or make, or cause to be erected or made, any building or addition to an existing building on such land shall, within one calendar month thereafter, give notice in writing thereof to the Minister.

71. Officers or workmen employed by the Minister shall not solicit or receive from the public any fee, gratuity, or reward.

Division 5.—Penalties.

72. Any person contravening any of these By-laws, whether by act or omission, shall be liable on summary conviction to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

THE GOVERNMENT TRAMWAYS ACT, 1912.

THE Commissioner of Railways, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon him by "The Government Tramways Act, 1912," does hereby make the following By-laws to come into operation on the 1st day of July, One thousand nine hundred and thirteen, and all By-laws conflicting therewith are hereby repealed :—

BY-LAWS.

1.—BY-LAWS EXTEND TO ALL PREMISES AND VEHICLES.

These By-laws shall extend to all premises used for Tramway purposes, and to all engines, motors, cars, and vehicles used in running thereon; and the word "carriage" shall include every such car or vehicle.

2.—PASSENGERS TO PAY FARES ON DEMAND.

Every passenger, not being the holder of a pass, shall, on demand by the Conductor, or any employee, pay the fare legally demandable for the journey. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds.

3.—TRAVELLING WITHOUT PAYING FARE.

Any person, not being the holder of a pass, who shall travel by and leave any carriage without first having paid his fare to the Conductor, or an employee, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds.

4.—TICKETS TO BE SHOWN ON DEMAND.

Every passenger on paying his fare will be furnished with a ticket and shall show his pass or ticket when required, to the Conductor or any employee, and shall also, on demand of any such employee, either deliver up his pass or ticket, or pay the fare legally demandable for the distance travelled over by the passenger. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds.

5.—SALE, PURCHASE, AND USE OF TICKETS.

Cash fare tickets are the property of the Commissioner, and are not transferable. Any person not duly authorised by the Commissioner who shall sell, or attempt to sell any pass, ticket, or portion of a return ticket, or shall use or attempt to use a transferred pass, ticket, or a portion of a return ticket, or a ticket the time for using which has expired, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

6.—DEFACED TICKETS NOT ACCEPTED.

No ticket that is defaced or illegible will be accepted, and its holder will be regarded as not having paid his fare, and if he refuses to pay the same shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds.

7.—AVAILABILITY OF TICKETS.

Tickets are (unless otherwise stated thereon) available only by the tram and for the journey on which they are issued, and any person who uses or attempts to use any ticket in contravention of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds.

8.—SMOKING IN UNAUTHORISED PLACES.

No person shall smoke in any waiting-room or in or upon any carriage or compartment or platform thereof not set apart for the purpose. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law may be removed by any employee, and, whether removed or not, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds.

9.—CONVEYANCE OF DOGS, ETC.

No person shall take into or have in his charge in any carriage, any bird, dog, or other animal, which, in the opinion of the Conductor, or any employee, will cause inconvenience or be offensive to any passenger. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds.

10.—LOADED FIREARMS NOT TO BE CARRIED.

No person shall, without the written authority of the Commissioner, take or place into or upon, or discharge from or upon any carriage any loaded firearm. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

11.—PASSENGERS' LUGGAGE, PARCELS, ETC.

No person, unless authorised by the regulations of the Commissioner, shall take luggage, other than small parcels which can be carried in the hand, and which, in the opinion of the Conductor or any employee, will not cause inconvenience, or be offensive to passengers, into or upon any carriage. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds.

12.—PERSONS INTOXICATED OR COMMITTING A NUISANCE.

No person in a state of intoxication shall enter or remain in any carriage or be upon premises of the Commissioner, and no person shall in or upon any such carriage or premises wilfully interfere with the comfort of any person, or commit any nuisance, or gamble, or write or use any insulting, indecent, obscene, or blasphemous words. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law may be removed from such carriage or premises, and, whether removed or not, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

13.—INJURING TRAMWAY PROPERTY.

No person shall wilfully or negligently injure any lining shutter, or blind, or break or deface any window, or remove or injure any number, plate, notice, or advertisement, or remove or extinguish any lamp of, or in, any carriage, or waiting room, or otherwise damage any fittings, carriage, or other property of the Commissioner. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

14.—ADVERTISEMENTS ON TRAMWAY PROPERTY.

No person, unless authorised in writing by the Commissioner, shall post, stick, paint, write, or distribute, or cause to be posted, stuck, painted, written, or distributed, any placard, bill, or advertisement, or other matter within or upon any carriage, post, fence, gate, platform, wall, building, or other property or premises of the Commissioner. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

15.—PERSONS WITH INFECTIOUS OR CONTAGIOUS DISEASES.

The Commissioner may refuse to carry any person who has any infectious or contagious disease. No person who has any such disease shall, without the authority of the Commissioner, resort to or come upon any premises of the Commissioner, or travel, or attempt to travel, on any carriage. No person who has charge of any person who has any such disease shall, without the like authority, aid or assist the person having any such disease to travel, or attempt to travel on the tramway. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law may be removed from any such premises or carriage by any employee.

16.—PERSONS OFFENSIVE TO PASSENGERS.

No person whose dress or person might soil the dress of any passenger or the fittings of any carriage, or whose presence would, in the opinion of the Conductor or any employee, be, for any sufficient reason, offensive to passengers, shall be entitled to enter or remain in or upon any carriage; and any such person found in or upon any carriage who refuses, at the request of any employee, to leave the same, may be removed therefrom, and, whether removed or not, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds.

17.—PERSONS ENTERING OR LEAVING CARS.

No person, except an employee or a passenger or intending passenger, shall enter or mount upon any carriage; and any person holding or hanging by any part of a carriage, or riding upon the roof or other portion of a carriage not intended for the conveyance of passengers, or getting into or upon or quitting any carriage whilst the tram is in motion, or attempting to do so, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds.

18.—MALE PERSONS NOT TO ENTER LADIES' WAITING ROOMS.

No male person shall enter any waiting-room or carriage set apart for the accommodation of females; and any such person who shall enter such room or carriage, or remain therein after being warned to leave the same, may be removed therefrom by any employee, and, whether removed or not, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds.

19.—LOST PROPERTY TO BE HANDED OVER.

Any person who finds any lost property in any waiting-room, or in or upon any carriage, shall immediately hand over the same to the Officer in charge of the Lost Property Office, or to the Conductor in charge of the tram. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds.

20.—INTERFERENCE WITH PASSENGERS ENTERING OR ALIGHTING.

Any person who shall wilfully prevent a passenger from getting in or out of any carriage, except when the tram is in motion, or obstruct any passenger in such ingress or egress, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds.

21.—ENTERING A FULL CARRIAGE.

Any person entering a carriage after being informed by any employee that the same is full, or, having entered, refusing to leave at the request of such employee, may be removed from such carriage by any employee, and, whether removed or not, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds.

22.—STANDING ON FRONT PLATFORM OF CARRIAGE.

Any passenger who shall remain upon the front platform of any electric motor car after having been requested by any employee to leave the same may be removed from such platform by any such employee, and, whether removed or not, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds.

23.—COMMUNICATION BETWEEN PASSENGERS AND EMPLOYEES.

No person shall make use of the means of communication between the passengers and the employees in charge of a tram without reasonable cause. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds.

24.—PASSENGERS NOT TO PLACE FEET ON SEATS.

No passenger shall place his foot or feet upon any seat or part of a seat in any waiting-room or carriage. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds.

25.—EXPECTORATING ON PREMISES OR CARRIAGES.

No person shall expectorate upon the floor or any other part of any carriage, waiting-room, or platform. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

26.—STANDING WHEN SEAT IS AVAILABLE.

No person other than an employee shall stand on any platform or other part of a carriage when a seat is available; and any such person who continues to so stand after being requested by any employee to be seated, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds.

27.—SALES ON TRAMWAY PREMISES.

No person, unless authorised in writing by the Commissioner, shall sell or attempt to sell any article on any Tramway premises. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds.

28.—REFUSING TO LEAVE WAITING ROOM WHEN REQUIRED.

Any person, not being an intending passenger, who does not leave any waiting room when required so to do by any employee or police officer, may be removed therefrom by any such employee or police officer, and, whether removed or not, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

29.—FARE CONCESSION CERTIFICATES.

Any person who shall tender any certificate containing erroneous or misleading information and thereby obtain or attempt to obtain tickets for the purpose of enabling him to travel at concession rates, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

30.—OBSTRUCTING PROGRESS OF CARRIAGE.

No person shall make use of any carriage for the purpose of drawing any bicycle, tricycle, cart, or other vehicle. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds.

31.—FARES AND CONDITIONS.

Between any two points within the boundaries of Perth City, the charge shall be	3d.
Between any point in Subiaco and Perth Town Hall	3d.
Between any point in Leederville and Perth Town Hall	3d.
Between any point in Victoria Park and Perth Town Hall	3d.
Between any point in North Perth and Perth Town Hall	3d.
Between any point in Subiaco, Leederville, Victoria Park, or North Perth, and any point within the boundaries of Perth beyond the Perth Town Hall	4d.
From any point in Subiaco, Leederville, Victoria Park, or North Perth through Perth to any point in North Perth, Victoria Park, Leederville, or Subiaco	5d.
Between any two points on the Nedlands Park Tramway	3d.

NOTE.—Any passenger between any point in Subiaco, Leederville, North Perth, or Victoria Park, and any point beyond the Perth Town Hall, who does not notify the Conductor of his intended destination when paying fare, must, on arrival at the Perth Town Hall or the City boundary, as the case may be, pay the usual fare from that point to his destination.

Adult tickets, good for a 3d. ride, may be obtained from the Conductor at two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) per dozen.

City tickets, good within the following limits, may be obtained from the Conductor at one shilling (1s.) per dozen :—

Hay Street—Between Pier and King Streets ;

Barrack Street—Between Barrack Street Jetty and Wellington Street ;

William Street—Between the Palace Hotel and corner of Wellington and Barrack Streets.

Children's tickets, good for a 3d. ride, may be obtained by all children under 12, and school children under 15 years of age, upon their parents signing a certificate, at 1s. 6d. per dozen.

A transfer to any connecting line will be issued by the Conductor upon request, at the time of payment of fare only. Such transfer is good only at the point of intersection and on the first connecting car.

Workmen riding on any car between the hours of 6 and 8 a.m., and paying a cash fare will be provided, upon request, with return tickets available on the day of issue only for all cars having room between the hours of 12 and 1.30 p.m. on Saturdays, and 5 and 6.30 p.m. on other week days.

Children under 3 years of age will be carried free when not occupying a seat to the exclusion of an adult.

Upon request, car will stop at the near side of all street crossings, and at any other points designated by signs as stopping places.

The Conductor will present the fare box to passengers, who are required to deposit the precise fare therein.

EXTRACTS FROM "GOVERNMENT TRAMWAYS ACT, 1912."

Attention is especially called to the following sections of "The Government Tramways Act, 1912" :—

6. No person shall obstruct any person acting under the authority of the Minister or the Commissioner in setting out, making, forming, laying down, repairing, or renewing any Government tramway, or damage any Government tramway.

Penalty—Fifty pounds.

7. No person shall, without lawful excuse, do any of the following things, namely :—

- Interfere with, remove, or alter any Government tramway or the works connected therewith ;
- Place any stones, wood, refuse, or other material on any part of a Government tramway ;
- Do or cause to be done anything in such manner as to obstruct a tramcar using a Government tramway ;
- Obstruct, hinder, or interfere with the exercise of any power hereby conferred ; or
- Knowingly aid or assist in doing any such thing.

Penalty—Fifty pounds.

8. No person shall—

- While travelling, or after having travelled in any tramcar on a Government tramway, avoid or attempt to avoid payment of his fare ; or
- Having paid his fare for a certain distance, knowingly and wilfully proceed in any such tramcar beyond such distance, and neglect to pay additional fare for the additional distance, or attempt to avoid payment thereof, or
- Knowingly or wilfully refuse or neglect, on arriving at the point to which he has paid his fare, to quit such tramcar ; or
- Deface any notice placed by the Commissioner on any part of a Government tramway or of any tramcar ; or
- Obstruct any person employed on a Government tramway or on any such tramcar in the performance of his duty ; or
- Behave in a violent or offensive manner to the annoyance of others on a Government tramway or any such tramcar ; or
- Refuse to leave the platform or steps of any such tramcar when required to do so by the Conductor.

Penalty—Two pounds.

MUNICIPALITY OF SOUTH PERTH.

A By-law re Special Roll for Loan Poll.

A BY-LAW for the Municipality of South Perth, made under Section 447 of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906," and numbered 7, providing for a special roll of persons entitled to vote at a Loan Poll.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act the Mayor and Councillors of the Municipality of South Perth order as follow:—

1. When demand shall have duly been made under Section 446 of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906," the Town Clerk shall forthwith prepare a special roll of the names of all persons who on the day on which demand was handed to him appeared to be owners of rateable land within the meaning of the said Section 446.

The said roll shall be in the form of Schedule A, and shall be available for inspection by any ratepayer at the Town Clerk's office within the usual office hours not later than ten days before the date fixed for the holding of the poll.

2. (a.) When a corporation or joint stock company is the owner or leaseholder of rateable land, such corporation or joint stock company may, by letter delivered to the Town Clerk fifteen days or more before the date fixed for the holding of the poll, appoint a person to be registered in place of such corporation or joint stock company.

(b.) In default of any such appointment being made the manager, secretary, or attorney of any corporation or joint stock company may be registered.

3. On or before the fifth day before the closing of the poll any person—

(a.) Whose name has not been inserted in the roll may, by letter delivered or sent through the post addressed to the Town Clerk, apply to have his name inserted therein, and shall give particulars of his claim.

(b.) Whose name has been inserted in the roll and who is dissatisfied with such roll as not specifying the full rateable value of the land owned or leased by him may, in like manner, apply to the Town Clerk to have the amount of such rateable value altered, and shall give particulars of his claim.

(c.) Whose name appears in the roll or who claims to have his name inserted in such roll may, in like manner, object to the names of any other person as not being entitled to have his name retained therein, or as not being entitled to have the number of votes set against his name.

Any such claims or objections shall be in the form given in Schedule B or to the like effect, and any objection under subsection (c) shall be made in duplicate by the person objecting, and it shall be the duty of the Town Clerk to send one of such notices to the person objected to.

4. (1.) The Council shall hold an open court, to be called a Revision Court, within the Municipal District for the purpose of revising the roll, and such revision shall take place before the day fixed for the holding of the poll at such time and place as the Mayor shall appoint, and the Mayor shall give notice of the holding of such court, and the time and place thereof, by placing such notice on some building within the Municipality and by advertisement in a newspaper circulating in the district.

(2.) The Court shall consist of the Mayor, or, in his absence, of a Chairman appointed by the other members of the Court, and of not less than one-third of the Councillors.

5. Every such Court may be adjourned, and if at any time for half an hour after the hour appointed for holding such court or adjourned court a sufficient number of Councillors to form a court is not present, the Mayor, or, in his absence, any Councillor or the Town Clerk, shall adjourn the court, but no such court shall be adjourned beyond the day before the holding of the poll.

6. (1.) The Town Clerk shall himself, or some person on his behalf if he is prevented from so doing, attend the revision court and produce to the court the roll and the lists of the persons who have sent in claims and who have been objected to.

(2.) The valuer or valuers and all collectors of rates shall also attend the said court and produce all books, papers, and documents in their possession connected with their respective offices.

(3.) The officers aforesaid shall answer on oath or otherwise all such questions as the court may put to them touching any matters necessary to be ascertained for revising the roll.

7. (1.) The revision court shall have authority to hear, receive, and examine evidence by summons under the hands of the Mayor or Chairman, to require all persons as the court may think fit to appear personally before such court at a time and place to be named in such summons, and to produce all books and papers in their possession or under their control as may appear necessary for the purpose of their examination.

(2.) The court shall have like powers for compelling attendance of witnesses summoned and their examination upon and taking of oaths and affirmations and their answering questions touching the premises as by any law in force for the time being is vested in justices exercising summary jurisdiction, and the Mayor or Chairman may issue any summons at any time after he has appointed a time for holding the said court.

8. The revision court shall in open court determine as hereinafter provided upon the validity of all claims and objections, and every such determination shall be by the decision of the majority, and in case of an equal division of votes the Mayor or Chairman shall have a casting vote in addition to his vote as a member of the court.

9. (1.) The revision court shall insert in the roll under revision the name of every person who has claimed as aforesaid and has proved to the satisfaction of the court to be entitled to be inserted therein, for one or more votes according to the provisions of the Act.

(2.) Subject as hereinafter provided the court shall retain on the list the names of all persons to whom no objection has been duly made with the number of votes unaltered.

(3.) The revision court shall retain on the list the name of every person who has been objected to by any person and the number of votes unaltered unless the person so objected appears by himself or by some person on his behalf in support of the objection and proves the service of the requisite notices.

(4.) When the name of any person inserted in the roll or the number of the votes set against his name has been duly objected to and the person objecting appears by himself or by someone in his behalf in support of such objection, the court shall require proof on so much of the qualification of the person objected to as is embraced in the grounds of objection and no more.

(5.) In case the qualification of such person is not proved to the satisfaction of the court the court shall expunge the name of such person from the list or shall alter or correct the number of votes set against his name as the case may require.

(6.) The court shall expunge from the list the name of every person who is proved to be dead.

(7.) The court shall, by means of the rate book valuation and return, correct any mistake or supply any omission which may appear to such court to have been made in the roll in respect of the name, place of abode, or trade or occupation of any person who is included therein or in respect of the local description of the rateable property or the situation thereof or the rateable value thereof.

(8.) But no person's name shall be inserted in the court in the roll or except under subsection (6) be expunged therefrom unless notice has been given as is hereinbefore required.

10. (1.) The Mayor or Chairman shall in open court—

(a.) Write his initials against every name struck out or inserted as aforesaid and against any part of the roll in which any mistake has been corrected or omission supplied.

(b.) Initial every page of the roll so settled.

(c.) Cause to be written at the foot or end of the list a certificate that the same has been revised and is correct, with the date thereof.

(2.) The Mayor or Chairman and not less than two members of the court shall severally sign such certificate.

11. Any owner whose name appears on the special roll and who does not reside within the Municipality of South Perth may at any time before the day appointed for the holding of the poll apply personally or in writing

to the returning officer for a postal voting paper. The returning officer shall thereupon supply the same and shall make a mark against the name of the said owner on the said roll.
