WHEREAS by "The Fisheries Act, 1905," it is provided that the Governor may, by Proclamation, declare, *inter alia*, that any Western Australian waters shall be closed against the taking of any prescribed species of fish by any means whatever, or against fishing generally, by any method of capture, during any specified time in any year: And whereas it is desirable that the waters within a radius of half-a-mile of any portion of Rottnest Island should be declared closed as hereinafter provided: Now therefore I, the said Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby declare as follows:—

That the waters within a radius of half-a-mile of any portion of Rottnest Island shall be closed against fishing generally, and by any method of capture, from the date of the publication of this Proclamation until the 31st day of December, 1913.

WHEREAS by Section 8 of "The Roads Act, 1911," the Governor may, by Order in Council, re-divide any Road District into Wards: And whereas it is desirable to re-divide the Jandakot Road District into Wards: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby re-divide the Jandakot Road District into three Wards, with the names and boundaries as set forth in Schedule hereto; also re-allocates the number of members for each Ward as shown in said Schedule.

North Ward.

WHEREAS by Section 43 of "The Land Act, 1898," it is made lawful for the Governor, by Order in Council, without issuing any deed of grant to place any Reserve under the control of any Municipality, Road Board, or other person or persons, as a Board of Management, and to empower such Board to make, repeal, and alter by-laws for the control and management of such Reserves, and prescribe fees for depasturing thereon, and for other purposes, such by-laws to be approved by the Governor and published in the *Government Gazette*: And whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserve 2901, for Common, at Peawah (Mallina), should be placed under the control of Roebourne Road Board as a Board of Management: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby place the before-mentioned Reserve under the control of the Roebourne Road Board as a Board of Management, and doth empower such Board to make, repeal, or alter by-laws for the control and management of the said Reserve, for prescribing fees for depasturing thereon, for directing the manner in which such fees shall be imposed, paid, collected, and disposed of, and to impose penalties not exceeding in any case £5 for any breach thereof, and £2 a day for a continuing breach, but not more than £20 in the aggregate.

Additional Regulations.

8a. Upon the approval of a loan under Part IV. of the Act, the mortgagor shall pay to the Board—

(a.) For preparing the mortgage in the prescribed form a fee of ten shillings and sixpence; and

(b.) A verification of survey fee of one pound one shilling.

8b. Every mortgagor, when paying the balance due on a mortgage, shall pay to the Board for closing such mortgage a closing fee of ten shillings and sixpence.

14a. In all cases where a mortgagor employs a contractor to erect or improve his dwelling he shall deposit with the Board the accepted tender and the "Conditions of Contract" duly signed and witnessed by the contractor and mortgagor.

Amendment of Regulation 10.

Regulation ten is amended by inserting after "mortgage, etc.," the words "and also for the verification of survey."

MOUNT MALCOLM ROAD BOARD.

THE ROADS ACT, 1911.

WHEREAS by "The Roads Act, 1911," the Road Board of any District is empowered to make By-laws for all or any of the purposes in the said Act mentioned, the Mount Malcolm Road Board, in pursuance of the powers vested in the said Board under and by virtue of the said Act, doth hereby make and publish the following By-laws:—

BY-LAW No. 1.

Interpretation.

In these By-laws the following terms shall, unless the context otherwise indicates, bear the meanings set against them respectively, that is to say:—

- (a.) "District"—The locality or area for the time being under the control of the Mt. Malcolm Road Board.
- (b.) "Board."—The Mt. Malcolm Road Board.
- (c.) "Chairman."—The member acting for the time being as Chairman of the Board.
- (d.) "Member."—A member of the Board.
- (e.) "The Act."—The Roads Act of 1911, and its amendments.
- (f.) "Road or Reserve."—Any road or reserve, as the case may be, under the control of the Board.
- (g.) "Footpath" shall include any part of a road set apart for the sole use of foot passengers, whether kerbed or otherwise.
- (h.) "Person."—The word person shall include the plural, and also a body corporate.
- (i.) "Owner."—Any person in possession or receipt either of the whole or any part of the rents or profits of any house, building, land or tenement.
- (j.) "Occupier."—Any person who shall be, or is the occupier of any rateable property within the District.
- (k.) "Permission or consent."—The consent of the Board in writing.

Other interpretations as defined in Section 5 of "The Roads Act, 1911."

BY-LAW No. 2.

Duties of Secretary.

1. To attend all meetings of the Board.
2. To attend all committee meetings when requested to do so.
3. To conduct all correspondence and give other officers instructions as directed by resolution of the Board.
4. To answer all reasonable questions in connection with all matters relating to the business of the Board.
5. Prepare the rate book and the Board's electoral lists, examine proofs of the latter, and arrange for distribution of copies prior to election. Also to attend all courts of revision and appeal, and make the necessary arrangements for the elections, etc.
6. Summon the members to all ordinary, special, and committee meetings of the Board.
7. Keep the cash book, as well as any and all other books required to show the receipts and expenditure made by the Board. The said books shall be written up every month ready for inspection by the Board, or any member thereof who may at any time during office hours desire to see them.
8. Prepare and place before the Board the quarterly financial statement, and enter same in the minutes as required by the Act.
9. Pay into the Bank within seven days after receipt, to the credit of the Board, all monies received by him amounting in the aggregate to £5 or upwards.
10. No money shall be paid into the Bank to the credit of the Board by any officer of the Board, except by or through the Secretary.
11. Issue all receipts on printed forms (except interim receipts).
12. To take notes of minutes and prepare reports of committees.
13. Obey all lawful commands or orders of the Board, and attend to all other matters affecting the finances of the Board and not herein specified.

BY-LAW No. 3.

Duties of Supervisor.

- (a.) To prepare all specifications for works and improvements as regards roads, footpaths, culverts, etc., under the control of the Board, situate within the district; examine all materials to be employed in such works, and to see that same are faithfully and properly executed.
- (b.) To see that the work of clearing and repairing all public roads and footpaths is properly carried out.

- (c.) To see that no labourers are engaged but those who are able-bodied, and to immediately discharge any labourer guilty of disobedience or incapable of performing the duties allotted to him.
- (d.) To see that all contracts are completed in accordance with the specifications and conditions of contract.
- (e.) To see that all drains, sewers, culverts, and bridges are maintained in a state of efficiency.
- (f.) To specially examine all roads throughout the district at least twice a year, if instructed by the Board to do so.
- (g.) To render to the Secretary, when required, reports and accounts of all matters under his control; to supply monthly, or oftener if required to the Board, returns of all work completed or in progress, with remarks thereon.

BY-LAW No. 4.

Appointment of Officers.

No permanent appointment shall be made to an office under the Board until an advertisement has been published in one or more local newspapers, calling for applications from persons competent to fill such an appointment. All appointments shall be made by resolution passed by the Board.

BY-LAW No. 5.

Meetings and Proceedings.

1. Notice shall be given, in writing, by the Chairman or Secretary, of ordinary meetings at least seven days before such meetings, and also for every meeting adjourned for a term exceeding six days.

The Chairman, if present, shall preside at all meetings of ratepayers and of the Board, and in his absence, or if after being present he shall retire, one of the members of the Board chosen by the ratepayers or members present, as the case may be, shall preside.

2. Meetings of the Board shall be of two kinds—"ordinary" and "special." Ordinary meetings are those called by the Chairman or Secretary as often as seems proper for the transaction of the ordinary business of the Board. Special meetings are those called to consider special business, the nature of which shall be notified on the notice paper summoning the meeting. No business shall be transacted at a special meeting other than that for which the special meeting was called.

3. Ordinary meetings shall be held at the office of the Board, Mt. Malcolm, unless otherwise arranged by resolution carried to that effect at the preceding ordinary meeting of the Board.

4. A special meeting may, on the requisition of three members of the Board, be called at any time in the manner prescribed in the Act, but the Chairman may call a special meeting of the Board as often as he may think proper. No business shall be transacted at any ordinary or special meeting, unless at least three of the Board, inclusive of the Chairman, or member of the Board chosen to preside in his absence, shall be present.

5. Any three members may require the Board room to be cleared of strangers, and the Chairman or other presiding Chairman shall immediately give directions to have the orders executed.

6. At all meetings of the Board, when there is not a quorum present, or when the Board is counted out (which counting out shall take place whenever there shall be less than a quorum present), such circumstances, together with the names of the members then present, shall be recorded in the minute book.

7. The first business of all meetings of the Board shall be the reading of the minutes of the preceding meeting aloud, with a view to their confirmation.

8. The minute book prescribed by the Act shall be kept, in which any item of business transacted by the Board at a meeting shall be then and there entered by the Secretary. Minutes of special or ordinary meetings shall be confirmed at the next ordinary meeting. No discussion shall take place upon the minutes of proceedings except as to their accuracy, or for the rectification of a clerical error.

BY-LAW No. 6.

Order of Business.

- (a.) Reading and confirmation of minutes of last ordinary and special meetings.
- (b.) Consideration of business arising out of minutes.
- (c.) Consideration of petitions, memorials, and committee reports, if any.
- (d.) Tabling and consideration of Chairman's, Secretary's and Supervisor's reports.
- (e.) Tabling and consideration of correspondence received and despatched.
- (f.) Consideration of the financial position of the Board

- (g.) Passing of accounts for payment.
- (h.) Receiving and consideration of tenders.
- (i.) General business.
- (j.) Immediately after the confirmation of the minutes, the Chairman may make any communication to the Board which he may deem advisable or bring under consideration any business he may think necessary, and it shall be competent for any member to ask any question or questions, but he shall confine himself to the question simply, and no debate shall ensue thereon at the time.
- (k.) In the event of any member having urgent business to place before the meeting, he may move the suspension of the Standing Orders, and, if agreed to, such business shall take precedence of all other.
- (l.) Every petition or memorial shall be respectful and temperate in its language, and shall be presented to the Board by a member only, and any member presenting a petition or memorial to the Board shall affix his name to the beginning thereof, with the number of signatures; and any member presenting a petition or memorial shall acquaint himself with the contents thereof, and ascertain that it does not contain language disrespectful to the Board. The nature and prayer of every petition or memorial shall be stated to the Board by the member presenting the same.

BY-LAW No. 7.

Tenders.

Tenders for work shall be opened and dealt with when the subject-matter of the tenders comes on to be considered at the meeting of the Board, or by a Committee appointed for the purpose.

BY-LAW No. 8.

Motions and Amendments.

- 1. Speakers must not digress from the subject-matter of debate.
- 2. A motion once moved at a meeting cannot be withdrawn, unless by consent of the Board.
- 3. One or more amendments may be proposed on a motion before the Board. When more than one amendment is moved, the question shall be first put on the last amendment, then on the next in succession, and then on the original motion, in the reverse order in which they were moved.
- 4. A motion or amendment not seconded cannot be discussed by any member, except by the mover, nor put by the Chairman.
- 5. No member shall speak twice on the same subject, except by way of explanation, or to an amendment, or in replying upon any original motion of which he may have been the mover of the last carried motion. Nevertheless any member who may have been misunderstood shall be allowed to explain immediately before the mover rises to reply, but not after, and after the reply the amendment or the original motion, as the case may be, shall immediately be put to the vote.
- 6. In submitting a motion or amendment the Chairman must put the question first in the affirmative and then in the negative.
- 7. When an amendment is carried, the motion amended thereby becomes the substantive motion, upon which further amendments may be made before it is finally dealt with.

BY-LAW No. 9.

Appointment of Committee.

The Board may at any time appoint three or more members as a Committee to inquire into any matter and make a report and a recommendation thereon, but no committee shall incur any financial liability, or in any way commit the Board to any responsibility whatever, without the express and specified authority conferred by the By-laws or a resolution of the Board. The quorum of the Committee of three shall comprise two members.

BY-LAW No. 10.

Finance Accounts.

- 1. All accounts, bills, and vouchers shall be submitted to the Board by the Chairman at the ordinary meeting, and after being certified shall be paid by cheque.
- 2. An account shall be opened with such bank as the Board may direct, and all money received from whatever source shall be paid into such Bank to the credit of the Board, except money granted by the Government, which shall be paid into the Treasury (*vide* Clause 193 of the Act), and no account shall be paid except by cheque signed by the Chairman and countersigned by one member of the Board and by the Secretary.

BY-LAW No. 11.

Urgent Works.

- 1. The Chairman with one member, or, in the absence of the Chairman, any two members, may, in case of urgency, authorise the expenditure of any sum not exceeding Five pounds.
- 2. The supervisor is empowered to authorise the expenditure of any sum not exceeding five pounds, in cases of very urgent necessity, upon declared roads.
- 3. Any authorised expenditure, however, shall be reported at the next meeting of the Board.

BY-LAW No. 12.

Unauthorised Expenditure.

Every item of expenditure and every liability incurred by the Committee or members of the Board otherwise than under the authority of the Act or these By-laws shall be deemed unlawful expenditure and a breach of this By-law by such person.

BY-LAW No. 13.

Acts, Omissions, or Neglects.

The following acts, omissions, or neglects are hereby forbidden to be done or allowed to be done, and any person guilty of any of the following offences shall, upon conviction, pay a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds:—

- (a.) Riding or driving horses, cattle, or other animals, or driving any carriage or cart upon or along any footpath.
- (b.) Placing any fencing wire, timber, bricks, or other materials upon any footpath, channel, surface drain, or road without having first obtained permission from the Board.
- (c.) Burning any shavings or other material or matter on any footway, carriage road, or open or public places adjoining a roadway, without permission.
- (d.) Damaging, destroying, or unlawfully interfering with any property under the control of the Board.
- (e.) Opening any drain or sewer, or removing the surface of any footpath or road, without the permission of the Board having first been obtained.
- (f.) Throwing or discharging any stone or other missile in any road or public place to the damage or danger of any person.
- (g.) No person shall keep or cause to be kept any swine or pig-stye within 100 feet of any house or running water without the consent of the Board, and no piggery shall be kept within five chains of any Government road in the district of the Board, or so as to be a nuisance to any person or injurious to the public health.
- (h.) No person shall keep or cause or permit any live stock to be kept within 100 feet of any house or running water without the consent of the Board.
- (i.) Neglecting to clean all private yards, ways, passages, or avenues, by which neglect a nuisance is caused.
- (j.) No person shall deposit, or cast, or allow to remain upon any road or public place, the carcass of a dead animal or any refuse or offensive matter.
- (k.) No person shall cause or permit foul or offensive liquid matter to flow from any land, house, or premises owned or occupied by him in or upon any road or footpath, or injure or pollute any well or watering place which shall have been made or constructed by or under the control of the Board.
- (l.) Furiously or negligently riding or driving along any road to the danger of the public.
- (m.) Using any bow and arrow, or playing at any game to the annoyance of any person in any public place, or obstructing any footpath or carriage road, whether by allowing any cart or animals to remain across the footpath or carriage way, or by placing goods thereon or otherwise.
- (n.) No person shall poison, kill, or maim any horse, cow, pig, bullock, dog, or other animal, and leave the same in any part of the Board's district without making proper provision for the burial or burning of the carcass thereof, and any person so doing shall commit an offence against these By-laws, and, upon conviction, shall pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds, and shall pay all expenses attending the proper burial or burning of any such animals.
- (o.) The plying for hire by carts or vehicles without a license.
- (p.) Blasting any rock, stone, or timber on or near any public road, without the permission of the Board, and not attending any direction in regard thereto given by such Board.

- (q.) Making cellar doors or other openings from the footpath of any road without the consent of the Board.
- (r.) No person shall leave open any gate across a public road that has been erected by permission of the Board.
- (s.) The owner of every vehicle or engine which, together with its load, shall weigh more than seven tons, shall travel the roads, bridges and culverts at his own risk, and shall be liable to pay for the damage done.
- (t.) Making any footpath or footway without the consent of the Board, or allowing any footway to remain which in the opinion of the Board is an obstruction.
- (u.) Damaging or destroying any well, dam, tank, pumps, windmills, windlass, bucket, rope, piping, troughing, fence, or gate, under the control of the Board, or carelessly leaving any tap connected with water tanks or water services running, thereby letting the water escape, bathing in any dam, well, or in any way polluting the water contained therein.

BY-LAW No. 14.
Contractors' Deposits.

When the contract price of any work shall exceed Ten pounds, every tenderer shall make a deposit with his tender equivalent to five per cent. of the amount thereof, such deposit to be returned to the unsuccessful tenderer, and to the successful tenderer on completion of his contract, and shall be forfeited to the Board for non-completion or ratification of Contract.

BY-LAW No. 15.
Sign Boards, etc.

Any person who shall erect or place any sign board, sign awnings, blinds, overhanging lamps, or other things over or near any footway or roadway, without obtaining the consent of the Board, shall forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a penalty not exceeding Two pounds for every such offence.

BY-LAW No. 16.
General Regulations of Traffic.

1. Every person having the care or conduct of any vehicle shall keep the same on the left or near side of the road, except in cases of actual necessity, or other sufficient reason for deviating, and shall not interfere with any person or vehicle passing or attempting to pass his vehicle.
2. The driver of any vehicle, or the rider of any horse or other animal, turning for the purpose of proceeding in an opposite direction, or turning the corner of any road in the district, shall bring his horse or other animal to a walking pace before commencing to turn.
3. No person having the care or control of a horse or other animal, or of any vehicle, shall allow the same to remain on any road of the district, or to obstruct any portion of the road for a longer time than necessary for loading or unloading the vehicle.
4. No vehicle with three or more horses shall proceed along any made road within the district with less than two abreast.
5. All vehicles plying for hire licensed under the Cart and Carriage Act shall have their license number affixed on some conspicuous part of such vehicle.

BY-LAW No. 17.

To prevent accidents from Bicycles, etc.

1. No person shall ride or impel a bicycle or motor car of any kind upon any footpath within the district.
2. No person shall ride any cycle or drive a motor round the corner formed by the junction of any road in the district, or across the intersection of any of the said roads, at a pace exceeding six miles an hour.

BY-LAW No. 18.
Careless Use of Fire.

1. No person or persons shall make or leave a fire by the roadside without taking proper precautions against such fire spreading, and any person or persons offending against this By-law shall, upon conviction, pay a penalty not exceeding five pounds.
2. No person or persons shall set fire to any standing tree on the road or trackside, and any such offender shall, upon conviction, pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

BY-LAW No. 19.

To prevent obstruction to Footpaths of the Streets within the Municipality.

To prevent obstructions on footpaths or roads, no person shall permit any boxes, cases, coal, sand, firewood, goods,

merchandise, wares, or other articles or effects to remain on any road or footpath within the district after sunset, nor in any case for a longer period than shall be necessary for housing and removing the same, without the permission of the Board.

BY-LAW No. 20.

To prevent Damage to Roads, Footpaths, and other Property.

1. No person, without having first obtained the written sanction of the Board, shall break up, cut down, damage, destroy, or injure any road, footpath, gutter, drain, culvert, bridge, public way, tree, plant, gate, fence, or other properties, of the said Board, or under their control, and any person found guilty of such damage shall pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.
2. No person shall damage by means of horse team, wagon, or any other means, any road or portion of road under construction or repair. Any person found guilty of such damage shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.
3. Any person who—
 - (a.) Cuts or removes, without the consent of the Board, any timber, earth, sand, gravel, stone, or other material from a road; or
 - (b.) Erects, without the consent of the Board, a structure upon a road so as to encroach thereon; or
 - (c.) Draws, without the consent of the Board, across the water side of a road, except over a properly constructed approach or culvert, a dray or other wheeled vehicle; or
 - (d.) Draws upon a road, timber, stone, or other material otherwise than on a wheeled vehicle, or suffers such material carried principally or in part upon a wheeled vehicle to drag or trail upon any made road, shall be deemed guilty of an offence against this By-law, and shall be liable, upon conviction, to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

BY-LAW No. 21.

Removal of Gravel, etc.

No person shall dig for or remove any gravel, stone, or timber from any reserve without first obtaining permission from the Board, and also paying any license fee that may be decided on by the Board.

BY-LAW No. 22.

Registration of Dogs, Bicycles, etc.

1. The owners of all dogs shall pay a yearly registration fee as prescribed by Statute. Numbered discs with registered number of owners shall be supplied by the Board, and must be worn by the dog.
2. The current year for the issue of all licenses by the Board shall be from the first day of January to the 31st day of December in each year.

BY-LA No. 23.

Camels.

- (a.) The owner of any bull, bull camel, or stallion straying on any road within the district shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.
- (b.) Any bull camel straying whilst "in season" shall be destroyed, and the owner be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.
- (c.) All License and Registration Fees are due and payable to the Board on the first day of January in each year.
- (d.) The yearly registration fee for all packing camels used within the district shall be Ten shillings.
- (e.) The yearly registration fees for all draught camels used within the district shall be Five shillings.
- (f.) The yearly registration fee for all packing bull camels over three years old used within the district shall be £5.
- (g.) The yearly registration fee for all draught bull camels over three years old used within the district shall be 10s.
- (h.) All camel owners or drivers shall register with the Board the brand with which all camels owned are branded and registered.
- (i.) Numbered discs will be supplied by the Board, and must be attached to the neck of all licensed camels.
- (j.) One driver or attendant shall drive or attend any number of camels not exceeding eight, except in wagons, and shall pay a license fee of 10s. annually for license to drive or attend; any driver or attendant found driving or attending camels without such license shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding £20.

(k.) Any owner, driver, or attendant of camels shall, on demand of a member or officer of the Board produce his license or certificate of registration, and shall give such information respecting ownership or use of camels as may be required by any member or officer of the Board. Any owner, driver, or attendant of camels refusing or neglecting to comply with this By-law shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20.

(l.) Applications for registration and certificate of registration shall be in the form of schedules hereunder.

(m.) Any driver or attendant riding, driving, or leading camels other than camels attached to a wheeled vehicle shall on the approach or being overtaken by any wheeled vehicle, or horse or horses, immediately pull off the road a distance of at least twenty feet therefrom, and there remain stationary until such vehicle shall have passed; any driver or attendant refusing or neglecting to promptly comply with the By-laws shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

BY-LAW No. 24.

Stock to be kept off the road.

1. The owner of any cattle, horse, sheep, goat, pig, or other animal straying on any road fenced on both sides within the district shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, without a written permission from the Board being first obtained to graze such roads as abut on the applicant's property.

2. No person shall erect any barbed wire on the outside of any post or fence on a public road in the district.

BY-LAW No. 25.

Hawkers' Licenses.

1. It shall not be lawful for any person not being licensed to hawk for the purpose of trading or carrying about for sale within the Mt. Malcolm Road Board any articles of merchandise, fruit, meat, fish, game, poultry, vegetables or other eatables, in any cart, dray, wagon, barrow, truck, or on beast of burden, or in any vehicle whether drawn or pushed, or in any pack, tray, or basket.

2. Licenses in the form of the Schedule hereto may, in the discretion of the Secretary, be issued to any person applying to be licensed to hawk. (a) for any vehicles drawn by animal power, on payment of a fee of Five shillings per quarter. (b) with a barrow, truck, or other vehicle pushed or drawn by hand, or pack or basket on payment of the sum of Five shillings per quarter year. Every license so issued shall remain in force until the last day of the quarter of issue, unless suspended by the Secretary, and it shall not be necessary for him to assign any reason for any refusal to issue or for any suspension.

3. Every person applying for a license to hawk, shall first submit for approval the vehicle or tray, etc., proposed to be used for such hawking purposes, and obtain the approval in writing from the Secretary for the use thereof, and it must be kept clean and in repair to the satisfaction of the Secretary at all times when licensed. Every person licensed shall have his name in legible letters painted in some conspicuous place on the vehicle licensed.

4. Every person hawking any goods or other things to be sold by weight shall carry a correct weighing beam and weights for such purpose. Licenses granted under this By-law may be transferred by the Secretary; the fee payable shall be Twoshillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.), and the Secretary may refuse a transfer without assigning any reason for so doing.

5. Any person delivering any article of merchandise, meat, fish, game, poultry, fruit, vegetables or other eatables shall upon demand by any officer of the Board or any police officer produce his order for the delivery of such goods. Failing to produce such order, he shall be deemed to have committed a breach of this By-law.

6. The Secretary may for any offence against this By-law suspend any license, and the Board may revoke or cause any license granted to be cancelled, and any such suspension, revocation, or cancellation shall not affect any action under this By-law for any breach thereof. Any licensed person who commits a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10, and to have his license cancelled.

7. Any person hawking without a license and in contravention to this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20.

BY-LAW No. 26.

Penalties.

Every person who does, permits, or suffers any act, matter, or thing contrary to any of the foregoing By-laws, or commits or permits any breach or neglect thereof, shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these By-laws, and where not otherwise provided for shall be liable to a fine or penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for every such offence.

It is hereby resolved by the Mt.
