WHEREAS it is enacted by Section 19 of "The Health Act, 1911," that the Governor may constitute any portion of the State, not being a Municipal District, to be a Health District, with such boundaries and by such name as may be specified in the order: And whereas it is desired to constitute portion of the Nannine Road District a Health District under the said Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Western Australia, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, does hereby constitute the area of land embraced within the undermentioned boundaries (being portion of the area comprised in the said Road District) to be a Health District by the name of the Nannine Health District, under the provisions of "The Health Act, 1911."

Boundaries.—Starting from the intersection of the Northern side of Walter Street with the Western side of Peterkin Street and extending 95deg. 38min. 36 chains; thence 185deg. 38min. 32 chains 46 links; thence 127deg. 56min. 3 chains 54 3/10 links; thence 217deg. 56min. 29 chains; thence 307deg. 56min. 96 chains; thence 275deg. 38min. 15 chains 88 links and 5deg. 38min. 54 chains 5 links to the starting point; and all that area of land bounded by lines running parallel to and at a distance of one mile from the boundaries above described.

WHEREAS by Section 20 of "The Goldfields Water Supply Act, 1902," it is provided that the Governor may, by Order in Council, constitute and define the boundaries of a Water Area for the purpose of the said Act, and may divide the Area into districts, and define the boundaries of the districts: And whereas by Order in Council, dated 30th November, 1910, the area was divided into districts, and by Orders in Council dated respectively 30th January, 1912, and 6th August, 1912, alterations were approved in respect of the Schedule to the above-mentioned Order in Council dated 30th November, 1910: And whereas it is desirable to alter the boundaries of districts as therein defined: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and under the powers conferred by the said Act, doth order that, as and from this date, the following alterations shall be made in the Schedule to the above-mentioned Orders in Council, dated respectively 30th November, 1910, 30th January, 1912, and 6th August, 1912.

1. By adding thereto the following definition of the boundaries of a new district to be called the Westons Water District:—

All that portion of the Water Area comprised within a circle, the centre of which shall be the six-mile peg on the road leading from Carrabin Railway Station to Westons, and having a radius of three miles.

2. By adding to the definition of the boundaries of the Central Water District the words:—

"And excluding that portion of the Water Area comprised in the Westons Water District."

##### GENERAL.

1. All previous Regulations made under "The Pearling Act, 1912," are hereby repealed, subject, however, to the such and the like savings as apply in the case of a repeal of a Statute.
2. Except as herein or in "The Pearling Act, 1912," otherwise provided, any contravention of these Regulations, whether by act or omission, shall be an offence punishable on summary conviction by a fine not exceeding £20.
3. The forms in the schedule hereto or to the effect thereof are prescribed for use for the purposes to which such forms shall be applicable.
4. The fee for a duplicate or certified copy of any License shall be one-tenth of the License fee, with a minimum of one shilling.
5. The fee for a duplicate or certified copy of any permit shall be one shilling.

#### SHARKS BAY PEARL SHELL AREA.

1. Applications for Exclusive Licenses in waters as defined in the Second Schedule of the Act shall be made in the prescribed form to the Inspector, as the authorised agent of the Minister. Each application shall be accompanied by an accurate description of the area applied for, together with an application fee of £1.
  2. In those parts which have been surveyed into blocks, each application must comprise one complete block as surveyed. The rental of every license covering a surveyed area shall be determined by the Minister.
  3. No Exclusive License (other than over a surveyed area) shall be granted or renewed if the length of the area exceeds twice its width, and no application for an Exclusive License covering an area of less than 10 acres shall be received by the inspector.
  4. Upon receipt of an application for an Exclusive License the Inspector shall give notice, by affixing a notice on the notice board of his tent or office, that an application has been made. Such notice shall remain on the notice board for not less than seven clear days.
  5. All objections that may be raised to the granting of an Exclusive License shall be lodged with the Inspector in writing within seven clear days from the date of the application being published as prescribed. The Inspector shall receive and report upon such objection or objections to the Chief Pearling Inspector, Perth.
  6. All applications for Exclusive Licenses shall ordinarily be allowed priority according to the times at which they were respectively lodged with the Inspector. In the event of two or more simultaneous applications for the same area, the priority may be determined by lot by the Minister, provided that nothing herein shall be deemed to interfere with or prejudice the discretion of the Minister as to the granting or refusal of any license.
  7. The Minister shall not be bound to entertain any application for an Exclusive License, and he may invite tenders for any such license or licenses, but shall not be bound to accept the highest or any tender.
  8. The rent of an Exclusive License covering an unsurveyed area shall be at the rate of not less than one shilling per acre per annum, with a minimum rental of one pound. Provided that in waters other than those described in the second Schedule of the Act, the annual rental shall be determined by the Minister at such amount as he shall in each case deem sufficient. All rent shall be payable half-yearly in advance on or before the first day of January and the first day of July in each year.
  9. The term of an Exclusive License shall be computed as from the first day of January of the year in which the application is made, and may be for any period not exceeding fourteen years.
  10. The rent of an Exclusive License shall be computed as from the first day of January or the first day of July (as the case may be) immediately preceding the date of the application.
  11. An applicant for an Exclusive License or his servants may, on payment of the prescribed fee of £1, and after obtaining the permission of the Inspector in writing, enter into occupation of the area applied for, for the purposes of cultivation only ; but such permit shall not authorise the gathering, collection, or removal of any pearls, pearl shells, or pearl shell oysters from the area applied for.
- The Minister in refusing any such application shall not be held responsible for any ostreicultural improvements that may have been effected on such area ; but the Crown shall be entitled to the benefit thereof.

12. Exclusive Licenses shall not be issued to minors, and if misrepresentation is made in this respect the license or licenses may be forfeited by the Minister on the recommendation of the Chief Pearling Inspector.
13. All holders of Exclusive Licenses shall cultivate their areas in a *bona fide* manner, to the satisfaction of the Inspector, by planting or protecting the pearl shell oysters on the area. The Inspector shall report to the Chief Pearling Inspector at the expiration of one year from the date of the issue of every license what steps the licensee has taken to cultivate his or her licensed areas and to carry out the conditions of the license, and in all cases where no cultivation has been carried out such license shall be liable to forfeiture by the Minister, on the recommendation of the Chief Pearling Inspector.
14. The Inspector shall report to the Chief Pearling Inspector when, in his opinion, any pearl shell oyster-bearing area, whether held under Exclusive License or not, has, by over-dredging, or from any other cause, been reduced to such a state that the further taking of pearl shell should be suspended. The Minister may, on the recommendation of the Chief Pearling Inspector, close any such area and prohibit the gathering, collection, or removal by any means whatever of pearls or pearl shell within or from the portion so closed for a specific period.
15. When, in the opinion of the Inspector, it is desirable that the use of dredges should be discontinued in any specific portion of a pearl shell area, the Inspector shall furnish a report to that effect to the Chief Pearling Inspector, who may prohibit the use of dredges in such portion of the waters for a specific period.
16. The boundaries of each area held under Exclusive License shall be marked and kept marked by the licensee by posts or stakes at such places and in such a manner as to define with reasonable accuracy the length, width, and shape of the area held under such license. Such posts or stakes shall show above the line of high-water mark at least four feet, and shall not be less in diameter than four inches. Buoys of wood or iron may be substituted for posts or stakes, if the water be deeper than two fathoms or if the bottom shall be of rock or otherwise incapable of holding a post.
17. No licensee or other person shall, without lawful authority, destroy or damage any post, stake, or buoy defining the position of any area held under Exclusive License or of any area closed against the taking, collection, or removal, of pearls or pearl shell.
18. All mature pearl shell gathered or collected on, or from, any area, whether held under Exclusive License or not, shall, as far as practicable, be cleaned on the area from which it was gathered or collected, and all immature pearl shell shall be returned to the water within reasonable time, but in no case shall such immature pearl shell be allowed to perish.
19. The Inspector or other person authorised by the Minister may seize and remove any young or immature pearl shell found in the possession of any person, and no person shall retain or have in his possession any immature pearl shell unless such shell is required for planting areas held under Exclusive License, in which case the permission of the Inspector in writing must be obtained to the collection or removal of the pearl shell, and no person shall open any pearl shells except at such places as shall have been approved by the Chief Pearling Inspector.
20. The fee for a general license shall be payable in advance on the date of application, and the term shall be for any period not less than three months computed as from the 1st day of January, April, July, or October in each year.
21. Applications for General Licenses shall be made to the Inspector, as the authorised agent of the Minister. and the applicant shall give the name of the owner and the name of the ship, provided that the Inspector may, in any case in which any ship is disabled or undergoing repairs, allow another to be substituted for the boat so disabled or being repaired.
22. A General License shall authorise the employment of not more than two men to each ship employed, provided that the Inspector may, in writing, grant permission to the employment of additional men, in which case a supplementary fee of 5s. per month shall be paid in advance for every man so employed.
23. Application for the Registration of a Ship under Section 45 of the Act shall be made personally or by agent to the Pearling Inspector, who on receipt of the prescribed fee shall allocate the number and letter or letters to be displayed by such ship and issue a certificate of Registration in the prescribed form and duly record such in the Prescribed Register.
24. The owner or master of every ship registered as in Section 45 of the Act shall cause the registered number of such ship, preceded by the initial letter or letters of the name of the port where the license was granted, to be conspicuously and legibly painted and displayed on each bow of the ship above the water line, in dark letters and figures on a light ground, or light letters and figures on a dark ground, such letters and figures being not less than twelve inches in length, and shall keep and maintain such letters and figures legible and conspicuous during the whole time that the ship is used or employed in pearling.
25. All applications for ship's registration shall be made to the Inspector, who shall enter in his register the name of the owner and the name and the registered number of the ship.
26. The owner or the master of every ship used or employed in pearling as in Section 44 shall, before proceeding to work on any area over which the authority of his license extends, bring the crew of such ship before the Inspector, who shall explain to such crew the Regulations under which they are to work.
27. No person shall have or carry on board any ship on any pearl shell area, or use from any ship, a dredge, without having first obtained the permission of the Inspector, and the Inspector or other officer authorised in writing by the Minister may go on board any such ship and seize and remove any dredge being carried or used in contravention of this Regulation.
28. Every holder of an Exclusive License or a General License shall, on or before the fourth day of each month, furnish to the Inspector, on forms supplied, a return of the number of bags of pearl shell gathered, collected, or removed by himself or his servants from any specific portion of a pearl shell area during the previous month.
29. The Governor may, by notification in the *Government Gazette*, declare any portion of a pearl shell area to be a Government Reserve for the growth and breeding of pearls or pearl shell and to be exempt from any power of license conferred by the Act, and on the recommendation of the Chief Pearling Inspector may, in like manner, cancel any such notification wholly or in part.

#### PEARL FISHERS.

1. The owner, or, in his absence from the port of termination, the agent of the owner, of any ship licensed under Section 23 of the Pearling Act, 1912, shall:—
  - (a.) Discharge and pay to every pearl fisher his wages within two days of the termination of the agreement or at the time that the pearl fisher is discharged, whichever first happens.
  - (b.) Before paying off or discharging any pearl fisher, give to the Superintendent at least 24 hours' notice of his intention so to do and shall deliver to the pearl fisher, at least 24 hours before he is paid off, a full and true account, in the form prescribed, of the pearl fisher's wages, and of all deductions to be made therefrom on any account whatever.
  - (c.) Shall sign and give to every pearl fisher on his discharge a certificate of his discharge in the prescribed form.

# RULES AND DIRECTIONS FOR THE GUIDANCE OF SURVEYORS.

IT is hereby notified that His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has approved of the amendments of the Rules and Directions for the Guidance of Surveyors by cancelling Clauses 17 and 143, and substituting in lieu thereof the following.

17. When carrying out surveys of lands proposed to be resumed for railway purposes under "The Public Works Act, 1902," a Surveyor will be expected to conform in every respect to the Regulations for the Guidance of Surveyors issued by the Department of Lands and Surveys and the Office of Land Titles.

Intersection posts and tangent lines should, in every case, be picked up and shown in the Field Notes.

In marking the boundaries of the Railway Lands on a curve, the ends of the straights should be fixed from the intersection posts by laying off the lengths of the tangents shown on the side widths plans.

In the case of a transition curve, the length of a tangent line will be increased by one-half the length of the transition curve; the lengths to be determined from the following table:—

Radius 5 to 7 chs. equals 150 lks. length of transition curve.

Radius 8 to 15 chs. equals 160 lks. length of transition curve.

Radius 16 to 20 chs. equals 200 lks. length of transition curve.

Chords to be laid off from one end of the curve to the other, the intersections of chords being placed at points midway between the rails. At the ends of straights and at chord intersections, the side widths to be laid off by secant distances computed from the widths of the railway reserve and half the included angles.

The lengths of the chords above referred to will vary as the radii of the curves, in accordance with the following table:—

I beg to report that I have examined the sample of the above pills submitted by you, with the following result:—

I perhaps may be permitted to draw your attention to the following paragraph in "Squire's Companion to the Pharmacopoeia" concerning gamboge:—

"As it is apt to occasion much sickness and griping it is best given in small doses repeated at short intervals until it operates; but it should never be given to children or very old persons or in inflamed conditions of the abdominal or pelvis organs."

Dose  $\frac{1}{2}$  to 2 grains.

I would also direct your attention to the passages which I have marked in the literature accompanying the pills, attached hereto.

Attached is an analysis by the Government Analyst of a specimen of Dr. Morse's Indian Root Pills. According to which the pill contains three active drugs. Gamboge, Aloin, and Capsicum.

The approximate amount of each active ingredient present in one pill is—

Gamboge,  $\frac{1}{2}$  grain.

Aloin, 1 grain.

Capsicum, a small quantity.

*Gamboge* is a gum-resin which has powerful purgative properties. It frequently causes some sickness and pain. It is also to some extent a diuretic, that is, it acts upon the kidneys and increases the flow of urine. According to most authorities it should never be given to children or old persons, as its purgative action may be very drastic. The dose varies from  $\frac{1}{2}$  grain to 2 grains.

*Aloin* is the active ingredient of Aloes. In small doses it is a bitter tonic to the stomach and a laxative; in larger doses, it is a powerful purgative.

This pill, therefore, constitutes an ordinary laxative or purgative compound, and as such would relieve conditions due to constipation; but it has no particular virtue above many other pills upon the market.

*Capsicum*.—This substance acts as a stimulant to the mucous lining of the stomach.

These drugs are well known to medical science, and indeed the combination differs very little from the compound pharmacopoeial "Gamboge" Pill.

On reading the statements made in the literature accompanying the pills, one is struck by the extravagant statements therein contained. The writer shows a very superficial and distorted knowledge of anatomical and physiological facts, which are so worded that the layman who accepts them is led to believe that these pills are a panacea for all ills. Either these statements are a deliberate attempt to deceive or they are the product of a totally ignorant and unskilled mind.

In justification of the above criticism I would particularly draw attention to the following statements:—

1. "Compounded to meet the requirements of every age, from infancy to advanced life."

In view of the statement of medical experts that "The Drug Gamboge" should not be given to infants or aged persons, the above is not correct and the recommendation is a dangerous one.

2. "One of the roots from which these pills are made is a Sudorific, the second is an Expectorant, the third a Diuretic, the fourth a Cathartic."

This statement suggests that four different active remedies are contained in the pill. According to the analysis this is not true, and is certainly misleading and intended to deceive.

3. "Dr. Morse's Indian Root Pills get at the cause as no other remedy does."

In view of the analysis, this is a gross exaggeration.

4. "They contain the essential properties that are temporarily lacking in the stomach, and complete the digestion and assimilation."

This statement is not true and is misleading.

5. "All other medicines sink into insignificance when compared with them."

This is a gross exaggeration.

6. "Dr. Morse's Pills do not gripe nor produce violent pains."

Yet further on the statement is made—"In some instances the first dose may cause a little pain or sick-

ness, but do not blame the pills." As stated above, Gamboge frequently does cause griping and sickness; therefore, the statements are inconsistent and misleading.

7. "These pills contain valuable medicinal agents which have a tendency to dissolve any substance which forms in the urinary passages" (referring to gravel and stone).

This is not true.

8. "Scrofula is a disease of the blood: it flies before Dr. Morse's Indian Root Pills like the foul miasma before mountain breezes."

As scrofula is a term applied to tuberculosis of the glands and sometimes of bones and joints, this statement, therefore, claims that the pills can cure tuberculosis. This is a ridiculous claim and totally misleading.

9. "Prescribed by doctors."

This may be correct in certain cases, but it is extremely unlikely that a medical man would prescribe a pill unless he knew what it contained.

10. For children "under the age of seven years" half a pill is recommended and over that age one to two pills, which means that a child of eight may be given one grain of Gamboge. According to expert opinion this is dangerous.

MUNICIPALITY OF WAGIN.

## YILGARN ROAD BOARD.

WHEREAS by Section 179 of "The Roads Act, 1911," the Board of any Road District is empowered to make By-laws for any of the purposes mentioned in the said section: And whereas the Yilgarn Road Board is desirous of making a By-law for the purpose mentioned in paragraph 63 of the said section: Now, therefore, the said Road Board doth in the exercise of the powers aforesaid, and of every power enabling it in this behalf, hereby make and publish the following by-law:—

A By-law for requiring every person having any tent, camp, or other habitation on any land of which he is not the rateable owner or occupier to pay in advance a fee to be levied annually.

1. Every person having any tent or camp or other habitation within the Yilgarn Road Board District on any land of which he is not the rateable owner or occupier shall, during such financial year after that now current, pay to the Yilgarn Road Board a fee according to the scale set out in the Schedule to this by-law.
2. Such fee shall be paid and levied annually in advance on the first day of the financial year by and on each person who then has such tent, camp, or other habitation.

## The Schedule.

When the tent, camp, or other habitation contains—

- (1) two rooms or less the fee shall be five shillings;
- (2) more than two rooms, the fee shall be Ten shillings.

A By-law for regulating the hawking of fruit, fish, meat, poultry, game, or vegetables, or any article of merchandise, and requiring licenses to be obtained by hawkers, and enforcing the obligation of hawkers and traders to carry scales.

1. Any person hawking fruit, fish, meat, poultry, game, or vegetables, or any article of merchandise within the district of the said Board without first having obtained a license thereto from the said Board, and also paying a license fee of 5s. per month for such license, shall for each such offence be liable to a penalty of not exceeding £20.
2. Every person so licensed as aforesaid shall at all times while carrying on any business of hawking within the district of the said Board, carry true and correct scales for the weighing and measuring of the goods dealt in by him, subject to a penalty not exceeding £20, for any and every breach thereof.

## BUILDING BY-LAWS.

*Plans and Specifications of Buildings.*

86. Every person intending to erect, alter, or add to any building within the Road Area shall, before commencing, deposit with the Secretary for approval drawings showing the plans, elevations, and sections of such building, alterations, or additions, together with full and complete specifications of the works proposed to be done.

*Scale of Fees.*

87. The following fees shall be paid by the owner or builder to the Road Board in respect of all buildings to be erected or altered or any matter required or permitted under these By-laws, or the Roads Act:—

All fees shall become part of the ordinary revenue of the Claremont Road Board.			

*External Walls.*

88. (1.) Materials of external walls of buildings within the Road District must be built of brick or stone or artificial stone, wood, or iron, or other material approved by the Board, and such materials must be sound and subject to the approval of the Surveyor.

(2.) All main walls of brick or stone must have a thickness not less than as prescribed below, viz.:—

- (a.) If the wall does not exceed 25 feet in height it shall be 8½ inches thick.
- (b.) Over 25 feet, but not exceeding 40 feet, 13 inches thick below the topmost story, and 8½ inches thick for the rest of its height.
- (c.) Over 40 feet, 17½ inches thick for the height of one story, then 13 inches below the topmost story, and then 8½ inches thick.

(3.) The party walls of brick buildings must have parapet walls with a damp-proof course at level of flashing and a capping of 1 to 1 cement mortar, and finished off with a pure cement wash, to level off flashing.

(4.) In the case of a terrace of shops and dwellings or of dwellings only, the front room and that immediately behind it, may be built to the full width of the allotment or tenement. All other rooms must have a clear space on one side of at least 4ft. 6in. in the clear between the dividing line of such tenement and the external walls of such rooms for the free admission of air and light. There must be 9 feet in the clear be-

tween the external walls of every pair of such constructed terraces, and all windows and ventilators must be opened on to the light and air space there provided for. No two or more dwellings or business premises will be permitted to have any yard or building in common save and except when in occupation of the same tenant or occupier.

89. If any external wall or enclosure be at any time hereafter taken down or otherwise demolished for the height of one story, or for the space equal to one-fourth of the whole surface of such external wall, then every part thereof not built in the manner and of the several materials by these By-laws directed for external walls must be taken down, and the same must be rebuilt in such manner and with such materials for and in all respects as by these By-laws directed for external walls hereafter to be built within this Road District, and it shall be within the power of the Secretary or Building Surveyor to enforce the rebuilding of same.

#### *Party Walls.*

90. In reference to the component parts thereof, every part of such party wall must be built of sound bricks or stone, or of such bricks and stone together, laid in with mortar or cement, and in such a manner as to produce solid work; and as to the woodwork which it may be desired to connect with party walls of any building, the bearing ends of wooden beams, breastsummers, girders, trimming joists, and the ends of partition heads and sills, and the bearing ends of the main timbers of any roof, and wood bricks, may be laid into the substances of a party wall, but no such beam, breastsummer, girder, joist, partition, head, or sill, nor any part of a roof, being wood, nor any wood bricks, must be laid or placed within two inches of the centre of any party wall, and no other wood work of any kind must be laid into, placed upon, or driven into any part of the substance of any party wall; but if the ends of the timber be carried in iron shoes or stone corbels, then such iron shoes or corbels must be built into the wall at least one-half of the thickness of such wall; and the top of every such party wall must be finished with one course of sound hard bricks, set on edge in good mortar or cement, or by a coping of any other properly secured and sufficiently waterproof and fireproof covering.

#### *Roofs, etc.*

91. With regard to the roof, flat, and gutter of any building, any or every projection therefrom, and also balconies and shop-fronts, they must be so arranged and constructed and so supplied with gutters and pipes so as to prevent the water from dripping on to or running over the public way, and all such rain pipes, eaves, and gutters are to be made of metal.

#### *Rooms.*

92. (1.) With regard to rooms in any parts of any building in reference to height thereof, every room used, or intended to be used, for the purpose of habitation must be at least the height of 10 feet from floor to ceiling, with the exception of soillions, which must be 9 feet high in respect to new buildings, and 8 feet high in respect to buildings already erected.

(2.) Every room used for the purpose of habitation or for the assemblage of people for any purpose whatever, shall be well and properly ventilated to the satisfaction of the Surveyor or the Board, by the insertion of air bricks below the floor, and by openings in the sleeper walls, also by ventilators in the ceiling or at the top of the walls thereof, according to the size of such walls. No room shall contain less than 600 feet of air space when finished.

#### *Breastsummers.*

93. All breastsummers shall be either of iron or approved wood, and to be loaded to one-third only of their breaking weights.

#### *Fire-places.*

94. Every fire-place constructed of iron shall be lined with brick or stone built to a height of 3 feet from the level of the fire rest, and not less than 4½ inches thick, and the hearth of every such fire-place or chimney must be laid and bedded wholly on brick or

stone or other incombustible substance; such hearth must consist of a slab or slabs of brick, tile, stone, or slate, iron, or other proper and sufficient substance at least 12 inches longer than the opening of the chimney when finished, and at least 18 inches in front of the arch over the same.

#### *Wood and Iron Buildings.*

95. The external walls of all wood and iron buildings must be built at least 4ft. 6in. from the dividing boundary of the property upon which the building is being erected and the adjoining property. The inside walls shall be of lath and plaster, metal, T. & G. jarrah, or other material approved of by the Board.

#### *Temporary Buildings.*

96. With regard to the granting of permission for the erection of temporary buildings, special permission may be granted by the Board for a period to be stated for the erection of temporary buildings; all the walls may be of wood or iron.

#### *Verandahs and Balconies.*

97. (1.) Awnings or verandahs to be erected over the footpaths are to be in accordance with the drawings and specifications approved of by the Surveyor and adopted by the Board. The minimum height is to be 8ft. 6in. clear from the footpath, and the posts must not be less than 5in. x 5in. if in jarrah. The verandah must be painted and kept in repair to the satisfaction of the Secretary or Surveyor, who shall have the power to order such repairs to the verandahs generally as he may deem necessary. In the event of neglect, or of the Surveyor observing the necessity of removal or repair, such must be commenced within seven days of the receipt of notice from the Secretary or Surveyor, and must be completed within 14 days of such notice, or otherwise the verandahs will be removed at the expense of the owner or occupier, to be recoverable from him in a summary manner before Justices.

(2.) Balconies.—Verandah posts must be not less than 6in. x 6in. jarrah, 2 feet inground, with a sole plate to be in one length equal to the extreme length of the balcony, of 9in. x 2in. jarrah. A top plate not less than 9in. x 2in. oregon or jarrah. Bearers not less than 6in. x 3in. oregon, not more than 4ft. 6in. apart. Joists not less than 4in. x 2in., with 1ft. 6in. centres. Floor T. & G. 1½in. thick. Verandah posts not less than 4in. x 4in. Rafters not less than 4in. x 2in. Top plate not less than 6in. x 2in. All plates to be bolted to the posts. The floor of balconies shall not be less than 10 feet from surface of footpath.

(3.) No balcony supported wholly from cantilevers or corbelled out from the wall will be permitted unless specially authorised in writing by the Board.

#### *Contractors' Sheds.*

98. Nothing in these By-laws shall prevent any contractor or builder erecting a temporary office, sheds, or workshops of wood or iron on any building site during the building operations, provided that special application must be made to and permission granted by the Secretary or Surveyor.

#### *Chimneys, Domestic and Factory.*

99. Every chimney-shaft or flue hereafter built, raised, or repaired, must be carried up in brick or stone work all round at least 4 inches thick to a height of at least 3 feet above the highest of such portion of roof, flat, or gutter adjoining thereto, measured at the point of junction. As to any chimney-shaft (except that of a steam-engine, brewery, distillery, or manufactory), the brick or stone of such shaft or flue must not be built higher than 8 feet above the slope or flat or gutter which it adjoins, measured from the highest point of junction, unless such chimney-shaft shall be built of increased thickness or be built with and bonded with another chimney-shaft, or be otherwise rendered secure. As to the chimney-shaft for the boiler furnace of any steam engine, or for any brewery, distillery, or manufactory, such shaft may be erected of any height so that it be built in such a manner and of such strength and dimensions as shall be satisfactory to the Secretary or Surveyor upon special application made and approved in each case.

*Chimney-pots.*

100. As to earthen or metal chimney-pots, tubes, funnels, or cowls of any description whatever.—If such pot, tube, funnel, or cowl be higher than 4ft. above the brick or stone work of the flue upon which the same shall be erected, then it must be fixed 2ft. at the least into the brick or stone work of the flue on which it shall be placed or otherwise fixed to the satisfaction of the Surveyor.

*Power to Surveyor to enter and remove.*

101. Where anything shall have been done or omitted to be done in contravention of these By-Laws, it shall be lawful for the Surveyor or Secretary, at his discretion, to enter on the premises and remove or cause to be removed any buildings or other things which have been erected in contravention thereof, or to do or cause to be done any act or thing which should have been done in pursuance thereof, and the cost of such doing shall be borne and paid by such owner or other person in addition to any penalties to which he may be liable in respect thereof under these By-Laws or Regulations.

*Bench-marks, etc.*

102. All survey levels, bench-marks, or other marks denoting the same shall be carefully preserved, and any person removing, altering, or obliterating or causing or permitting same to be removed, altered, or obliterated shall be liable to a penalty of £10, and to pay all costs incurred in replacing or restoring same.

*Mutual and Parapet Walls.*

103. All walls erected within 2ft. of the boundary of allotment must have parapet walls with copings, the walls in every case being carried up as per By-law No. 88.

*Cornices, etc.*

104. No cornice or other ornament shall project beyond the alignment of the street more than 18ins., and must not be lower than 15ft. above the level of the footpath.

*Cellars and Lights.*

105. No cellar will be allowed under the pavement of the street, and authority for fixing prismatic or other lights on the pavement must be obtained in writing from the Board before being fixed.

*Earth-Closets.*

106. Under no circumstances must any earth-closet be built nearer to any dwelling or shop than 40ft. In cases where the back line of allotments abuts on a right-of-way which runs alongside of other premises, the closets must not be placed nearer to the side of the right-of-way that forms the side line of another property than 34ft., for a distance of 75ft. from the street line off which the right-of-way runs.

*Plans.*

107. All plans of buildings and alterations must be examined and approved by the Board, and such approval certified to on the original drawings.
