Whereas by "The Health Act, 1911-12," a Local Authority may make By-laws, and by the same Act may amend, repeal, or alter any By-laws made or presumed to have been made under such Act: Now, therefore, the Kalgoorlie Road Board doth hereby make the following By-law:-

BY-LAW No. 9A. Removal of Liquid Wastes.

- 1. No person other than a servant of the Local Authority shall remove liquid wastes from any house or premises within the area under the jurisdiction of the Local Authority.
