WHEREAS by "The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909," it is provided in Section 20 that the Governor may exempt such reticulation works as in his discretion he may think fit from the operations of certain sections in this Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, does hereby exempt the reticulation works as hereinafter described from the operations of Subsections (a) and (b) of Section 20, and Sections 21, 22, and 23 of the said Act:—

Description of said reticulation.

A reinforced concrete drain with all apparatus relating thereto commencing as a circular drain 3ft. 6in. diameter at 11ft. 0in. on existing drain in Wellington Street, near William Street, and proceeding in a North-Westerly

direction along Wellington Street, a distance of 157ft. 8in.; thence as a rectangular drain 3ft. 6in. by 2ft., proceeding 24ft. in a Northerly direction, still in Wellington Street, to the boundary of the railway property.

A further portion of this reinforced concrete drain with all apparatus relating thereto emerges as a rectangular drain 2ft. 9in. by 2ft. 6in. from the railway property about 90ft. North-West along Roe Street from the William Street Bridge, and proceeds a distance of 23ft. 2in. in a North-Easterly direction across Roe Street; thence as a circular drain 2ft. 6in. diameter along Roe Street in a South-Easterly direction, a distance of 117ft. 10in. to William Street; thence in a North-Easterly direction, a drain 2ft. 3in. diameter, a distance of 11ft. to junction with existing drain in William Street.
