WHEREAS by Section 9 of "The Land Act, 1898," the Governor may resume, for any of the purposes specified in Section 39 of the said Act, any portion of land held as a Homestead Farm: And whereas it is deemed expedient that the portion of Homestead Farm 16486/74 as described hereunder should be resumed for one of the purposes specified in paragraph 7 of Section 39 of the said Act, that is to say for Water Supply purposes: Now therefore I, Major General Sir Harry Barron, Governor as aforesaid, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my proclamation resume portion of Homestead Farm 16486/74 (for the purpose aforesaid).

Schedule.

That portion of Homestead Farm 16486/74 (Avon Location 16269) bounded by lines starting from its North-West corner and extending 89deg. 51min. 3 chains; thence 179deg. 53min. 10 chains 26 $\frac{2}{10}$ links; thence 269deg. 56min. 3 chains to its West boundary and along the latter 359deg. 53min. 10 chains 26 $\frac{2}{10}$ links to the starting point. WHEREAS by "The Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1912," it is provided that the Governor

may dissolve a Board constituted under (*inter alia*) "The Water Boards Act, 1904," and that on and after such dissolution the lands and works of the Board shall vest in the Minister, and the Minister may exercise the powers and authorities and shall have the immunities conferred on a Board by such last-mentioned Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, in exercise of the powers conferred by "The Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1912," doth hereby revoke the order for the constitution of the Board for the Leonora Water Area, and doth hereby dissolve the Board for the said area, as from the 1st day of October inclusive.

WHEREAS by power conferred under Section 8 of "The Roads Act, 1911," the Governor may by Order in Council divide any District into Wards: And whereas it is desirable to divide the Gnowangerup Road District into Wards: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby divide the Gnowangerup Road District into four Wards, with the names and boundaries and number of members allotted to each Ward as shown in Schedule hereunder.

SCHEDULE.

Central Ward.

Bounded on the North by that portion of the North boundary of Road District from the North-West corner Eastward for about 1,540 chains.

Bounded on the East by a line starting from the Eastern point of Northern boundary, and extending Southward along the Western boundaries of Locations 5707, 4206, 3026, and Lease 18061/74; thence along part of the South boundary of latter, the East boundary of Location 2503, continuing Southward along the West and part of the South boundary of Location 2057, the East boundaries of Locations 2056 and 1680, part of the North and the East boundaries of Location 3008.

Bounded on the South by a line starting from the South-East corner of Location 3008, and extending Westward along a South, a West, a South, and again a West boundary of Location 3008, part of the South boundary of Location 1671, the South boundaries of Locations 1668, 1706, 1637, 1638, 1636, the North and West boundary of Location 1627, the West boundary of Reserve 5871; thence along North bank of river to the West boundary of Location 1582; thence Southward along said boundary for about 20 chains; thence due West to West boundary of Road District.

Bounded on the North by that portion of the North boundary of Road District from North-East corner of Central Ward to North-East corner of Road District.

Bounded on the East by that portion of East boundary of Road District from the North-East corner of same South-Westward for about 3,660 chains.

Bounded on the South by a line starting from a point on the East boundary of Road District about 3,660 chains South-Westward from North-East corner of same, and extending Westward to the South-East corner of Location 256, along the South and part of West boundary of same, the South and West boundary of Lease 1724/93, continuing Northward to South-East corner

of Location 213, along the South boundary of same; thence extending Westward to the North-East corner of Location 611, along the North boundary of same and Location 589; thence Westward to East boundary of Location 660, along part of the East, the South, and part of the West boundary of same for about 45 chains; thence Westward to North-East corner of Location 3017, along part of the North boundary of same, the East, the North, and part of West boundary of Location 5324 for about 10 chains; thence Westward to South-East corner of Location 3198, along the South boundary of same and Location 2260.

WHEREAS by "The Roads Act, 1911," the Road Board of any District is empowered to make By-laws for all or any purposes in the said Act mentioned: The Perth Road Board, in pursuance of the powers vested in the said Board, under and by virtue of the said Act and of every other authority enabling it in that behalf, doth hereby make and publish the following By-laws:—

Goats.

82. Every owner or keeper of any goat kept within the boundaries of the District shall once in every year register with the Secretary his name and address as the keeper of goats, and shall at the time of registration pay to such Secretary the sum of sixpence for every goat owned or kept by him within such District, and shall place and keep on the neck of every goat so owned and kept a collar bearing the name and address so registered; and if any person without lawful excuse offend in any respect against this By-law he shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds.

83. If any goat be found having on its neck a collar purporting to bear the name and address of a person registered as aforesaid, such goat shall be *prima facie* presumed to be owned and kept by such person.

84. The Board shall from time to time provide some secure enclosure for the keeping and custody of goats for the purpose of this sub-division, and forthwith when any such enclosure has been provided shall notify the same and the situation thereof in some newspaper generally circulating in the neighbourhood.

85. Every goat found at large in any street, road, or public place, may, by the proper officer of the Board, be forthwith seized and confined in such enclosure as aforesaid until dealt with as hereinafter provided.

86. Whenever a goat having on its neck a collar purporting to bear the name and address of a person resident within the District registered as aforesaid is seized hereunder the proper officer of the Board shall forthwith cause notice of such seizure to be given to such person or left at the place of such address.

87. Subject to the provisions hereinafter in these By-laws contained every goat so seized and confined as aforesaid which has not upon its neck a collar purporting to bear the name and address of some person registered as aforesaid may, upon the authority of any Justice of the Peace in writing, be destroyed by the proper officer of the Board at or after noon of the day following the day of such seizure, and every such goat which has on its neck a collar as aforesaid, upon the like authority and by the said proper officer, be destroyed at or after noon of the day following but one the day of such seizure.

88. The owner of any such goat which has been seized as aforesaid may apply *ex parte* to any Justice of the Peace that such goat be restored to such owner, and such goat shall, if a Justice shall so order and not otherwise, be, unless the same has been destroyed, restored to such owner accordingly, and such order of a Justice or any minute thereof under the hand of such Justice shall, for the purpose of this subdivision, be conclusive evidence that the person so applying was the owner of such goat.

89. The owner, whether registered hereunder or not, of every goat found at large in any street, road, or public place shall, whether such goat be destroyed or not, forfeit and pay a penalty of One pound (£1).

It is hereby resolved by the Perth Road Board, and with the approval and confirmation of His Excellency the Governor in Council, that the above By-laws shall be in force within the Perth Road District from the date of publication hereof in the *Government Gazette*.
