WHEREAS by "The Fisheries Act, 1905," it is provided that the Governor may, by Proclamation, declare, *inter alia*, that any Western Australian waters shall be closed against the taking of any prescribed species of fish by any means whatever, or against fishing generally by any method of capture, during any specified time in any year: And whereas it is desirable that the waters of the Capel River should be declared closed against the taking of English Perch: Now therefore I, the said Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby declare as follows:—

That the waters of the Capel River shall be closed against the taking of English Perch, by any method of capture, from the 1st day of October, 1913, to the 30th day of November, 1913.
