Leases 9882/56, 28322 and 28519/55, and H.F. Lease 15864/74 (Kent Locations 299, 281, 274, and 298) as described hereunder should be resumed for one of the purposes specified in paragraph 13 of Section 39 of the said Act, that is to say, for Water: Now therefore I, Major General Sir Harry Barron, Governor as aforesaid, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation resume portion of C.P.s. 9882/56, 28322 and 28519/55, and H.F. WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Mining Act, 1904," it is lawful for the Governor by Proclamation to alter or amend the boundaries of a Goldfield or District: Now therefore I, the said Governor, with the

advice and consent of the Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers in me vested in that behalf by the said ordinance, do hereby alter the existing boundaries of the North Coolgardie and Yilgarn Goldfields and the Ularring District of the North Coolgardie Goldfield, and hereby proclaim the boundaries of the said Goldfields and District to be as follows:—

North Coolgardie Goldfields.

Bounded by lines starting from a point North of Cairn H 26 on Koorarawalyee Rock and West of Cairn NB 1 at Wangine Soak, and extending North-West about 26 miles to Johnson's Rocks; thence North-North-Westerly about 41 miles to a cairn marked GDR 40 on Mt. Elvire; thence Northerly about 11 miles to a cairn marked AN 11 on an island on the Eastern end of Lake Barlee; thence North-North-Westerly about 7 miles to a cairn marked NB 33 on Yeedee Bulgar Hill; thence North-Easterly about 13 miles to a cairn marked NB 31; thence North-North-Easterly about 24 miles to a point South of the 43-mile post on the Lawlers-Birring Road and West of Trig. Station E 57 on Peperill Hill; thence East, passing through Trig. Station E 57 to a point South of the 24-mile post on the Lawlers-Leonora telegraph line; thence South about 32½ miles; thence East along the Southern boundary of the Mt. Margaret Goldfield about 256½ miles, and passing through a tree marked B 82, Brickey's Soak, to the 125th meridian of East Longitude; thence South about 76½ miles; thence West along the North boundary of the North-East Coolgardie Goldfield and Broad Arrow Goldfield about 228½ miles to survey mark R 3 near Cane Grass Swamp; thence Westerly to survey mark NB 1 at Wangine Soak, and West about 50 miles to the starting point.

Ularring District.

Bounded by lines starting from a point North of Cairn H 26 on Koorarawalyee Rock and West of Cairn NB 1 at Wangine Soak, and extending North-West about 26 miles to Johnson's Rocks; thence North-North-Westerly about 41 miles to a cairn marked GDR 40 on Mt. Elvire; thence East-South-Easterly about 13½ miles to a cairn marked AN 9 on Mt. Marmion, and about 12½ miles to a cairn marked AN 4 on Day's Rock; thence Easterly about 18¾ miles to mulga tree marked NB 22 and about 13½ miles to survey mark MR 5; thence East-South-Easterly about 10¼ miles to survey mark MR2; thence South-South-Easterly about 48¾ miles to survey mark NB1 at Wangine Soak; thence West about 50 miles to starting point.

Yilgarn Goldfield.

Bounded by lines starting from a point North of Cairn H 26 on Koorarawalyee Rock and West of Cairn NB 1 at Wangine Soak, and extending South along the West boundary of the Coolgardie and Dundas Goldfields, and passing through Cairn H 26 at Koorarawalyee Rock to a point East of the 100-mile post on the Southern Section of the No. 1 Rabbit-proof Fence; thence West to the said 100-mile post; thence North-Westerly and Northerly along the fence to the 14-mile post on the Northern section of the fence; thence East 20,833 links, North 24,000 links, and West 20,833 links to the 17-mile post on the fence; thence Northerly along the fence to the 158-mile post; thence Easterly about 75 miles to a cairn marked AN 11 on an island at the Eastern end of Lake Barlee; thence Southerly about 11 miles to a cairn marked GDR 40 on Mt. Elvire; thence South-South-Easterly about 41 miles to Johnson's Rocks; thence South-Easterly about 26 miles to starting point.

APPLICATIONS are invited by the Commonwealth Public Service Commissioner from persons qualified for appointment to the following positions.

Applicants outside the Public Service are eligible for appointment to the Administrative and Professional Divisions, but are not eligible for appointment to Clerical or General Division vacancies, unless they were in the service of a State on 1st January, 1901, or have retired from the service of the Commonwealth or of a State.

Applicants who are officers of the Public Service of a State should state the date of their appointment to the service, present position, and salary.

Applicants from outside the service should state their qualifications for the office they seek. Copies only of diplomas, references, testimonials, or certificates should be forwarded. If the originals are required they will be asked for.

Date and year of birth should be stated, and applications must be in applicants' hand-writing.

LEEDERVILLE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL.

IN pursuance of the powers in that behalf contained in "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906," the Mayor and Councillors of the Municipality of Leederville do hereby repeal By-laws Nos. 2 and 3 of the Leederville Council, gazetted 28th March, 1902, and do hereby make and order the following By-law, to be numbered 2:—

BY-LAW No. 2.

Standing Orders.

1. The proceedings and business of the Council shall be conducted according to the following regulations, which shall be called the Standing Orders.

2. In the construction of this By-law, unless the context otherwise requires, the word "Mayor" shall include the Councillor chosen to preside at any meeting of the Council.

3. The business of the Council shall be conducted with open doors, except upon such occasions as the Council shall by resolution otherwise decide, which resolution may be moved without notice.

4. At any meeting of the Council a quorum shall consist of not less than four Councillors in addition to the Mayor. Every meeting shall proceed to business so soon after the time stated in the summons as there shall be a sufficient number of Councillors in attendance to constitute a quorum.

5. If at any meeting a quorum be not present within a quarter of an hour after the time appointed for such meeting, the majority of the Councillors present, or any one Councillor if only one be present, may adjourn such meeting to any date not later than seven (7) days from the date of such adjournment.

6. The Mayor, if present, shall preside at all meetings of the Council, and in his absence, or if after being present, he retires, one of the Councillors chosen by the Councillors present shall preside.

7. If at any time during any meeting of the Council a Councillor shall call the attention of the Mayor to the fact that a quorum is not present, the Mayor shall thereupon suspend the proceedings of the meeting for a period of two minutes, and if a quorum be not present at the expiration of such period, the meeting shall be deemed to have been counted out, and the Mayor shall adjourn it to some future day.

8. At all meetings at which there are not present four Councillors and the Mayor, or five Councillors, as the case may be, or at which the Council is counted out for want of a quorum, the names of the Councillors then present shall be recorded in the Minute Book.

9. The minutes of any preceding meeting, whether ordinary or special, not previously confirmed, shall be submitted as the first business at all meetings of the Council in order to their confirmation; and no discussion shall be permitted thereon except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings, and the said minutes shall then be signed by the Mayor as required by Section 176 of the Act.

10. Immediately after the confirmation of the minutes the Chairman may make any communication to the Council as he may deem advisable, or bring under consideration any business he may think necessary.

11. It shall be competent for any member of the Council to ask a question or questions at the appointed

time, but he shall confine himself to that question simply, and no debate shall ensue thereon at that time, provided always that if a member required an answer to his question on the night of the meeting he shall have given at least three clear days' notice in writing to the Town Clerk.

12. Every petition or memorial shall be respectful and temperate in its language, and shall be presented by a member of the Council only, who shall affix his name at the beginning thereof with the number of signatures, and any member presenting same shall acquaint himself with the contents thereof, and ascertain that it does not contain language disrespectful to the Council. The nature and prayer of any petition or memorial shall be stated to the Council by the member presenting the same. Any deputation intending to wait upon the Council must give three (3) days' notice in writing to the Town Clerk, stating the nature of the business, and must be introduced by a member of the Council.

13. The order of business of an ordinary meeting shall be as follows, or as near thereto as shall be practicable, but for the greater convenience of the Council at any particular meeting thereof it may be altered by resolution to that effect:—

- (a.) Reading and confirmation of minutes.
- (b.) Announcements by the Mayor.
- (c.) Petitions and deputations.
- (d.) Questions.
- (e.) Correspondence.
- (f.) Reports.
- (g.) Orders of the day.
- (h.) Ordinary business.
- (i.) New notices of motion.

14. An order of the day shall be taken to mean a notice of motion, or any matter which the Council may have postponed or directed to be considered at the next or any subsequent meeting of the Council.

15. Any adjourned debate on a motion before the Council, or any motion of which the Council may postpone consideration and direct to be considered at the next or any subsequent meeting of the Council, shall be set down on the business sheet before, and have precedence over, any other notices of motion on the same.

16. The orders of the day shall be numbered, brought on, and disposed of in the order in which they appear on the paper.

17. Any Councillor may bring forward such business as he may consider advisable in the form of a motion, of which notice shall be given in writing to the Town Clerk, either at the meeting previous to the meeting at which it is intended to move the same, or at any time thereafter, being not less than three clear days before such last mentioned meeting.

18. Every such motion shall lapse unless the Councillor who gave the notice thereof, or some other Councillor authorised by him in writing, be present to move the same when such motion shall be called on.

19. Any Councillor moving a motion or amendment, or taking part in the discussion thereon, shall rise and address the Mayor, and shall not be interrupted unless upon a point of order, when he shall resume his seat until the Councillor raising the point of order has been heard thereon and the question of order has been disposed of, when the Councillor in possession of the chair may proceed.

20. Any Councillor desirous of proposing an original motion or amendment shall state the nature of the same before he addresses the Council thereon, and if so required by the Mayor, shall put the same in writing.

21. No motion or amendment shall be withdrawn without the leave of the Council.

22. No motion or amendment shall be discussed or put to the vote of the Council unless it be seconded, but a Councillor may require the enforcement of any Standing Order of the Council by directing the Mayor's attention to the infraction thereof.

23. At meetings of the Council, speakers, in referring to others present thereat, shall designate them by their respective titles of Mayor or Councillor, as the case may be.

24. If two or more Councillors rise to speak at the same time the Mayor shall decide which is entitled to priority.

25. No Councillor shall speak twice on the same question except by way of explanation or in reply upon any original motion of which he may be the mover or as the mover of the amendment last carried; and no Councillor shall speak to any question after the mover shall have been permitted to reply.

26. The Mayor shall, without waiting for the interposition of the Council, call to order any Councillor proceeding to speak a second time on the same question.

27. A Councillor moving a motion shall be held to have spoken thereon, but a Councillor merely seconding a motion shall not be held to have spoken.

28. In cases of urgent necessity any Standing Order or Standing Orders of the Council may be suspended on motion duly made and seconded without notice; provided that such motion has the concurrence of the majority of the Councillors present; provided, also, that such majority be not less than six.

29. Any Councillor moving the suspension of any Standing Order shall state the object of such motion, but no discussion shall take place thereon.

30. Any member may require the production of any of the documents of the municipality relating to the question or matter under discussion, and the Town Clerk shall produce the same on being given 24 hours' notice in writing.

31. One amendment only shall be discussed at one time, but, if lost, another may be moved before the original motion is put to the vote, but upon any amendment being carried it shall be competent for any Councillor to move one other amendment thereon, but no more.

32. Upon the adoption of any amendment, such amendment shall be held to have quashed the original motion, and for all purposes of subsequent discussion the amendment so carried shall, subject to the last preceding clause, be treated as an original motion.

33. The Mayor shall, in taking the vote on any motion or amendment, put the question first in the affirmative, and then in the negative, and he may do so as often as it is necessary to enable him to form and declare his opinion from the show of hands as to which party has the majority.

34. The Council shall vote by a show of hands, but any Councillor may call for a division upon any question, in which case the Councillors voting in the affirmative shall, until the vote is recorded, stand up, and those in the negative retain their seats; all division lists shall be entered on the minutes.

35. No Councillor shall reflect upon any vote of the Council except for the purpose of moving that such vote be rescinded.

36. No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the Council, but if, on the question being put, the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration, or the next on the notice paper or any other that may be allowed precedence, shall be discussed before any subsequent motion for adjournment shall be entertained.

37. No resolution of any meeting of the Council shall be revoked, rescinded, or altered during the same municipal year except in manner provided in Section 165 of the Act.

38. No motion the effect of which would be to revoke, rescind, or alter any resolution carried in any previous municipal year shall be entertained unless notice in accordance with Clause 17 is given.

39. No motion for revoking, rescinding, or altering any resolution of the Council which shall have been negatived by the Council shall again be entertained during the same municipal year unless with the consent of at least eight members of the Council.

40. A debate may be adjourned to a later hour of the same day or to any other day by motion duly seconded without previous notice. No discussion shall be allowed upon a motion for the adjournment of a debate.

41. The Councillor upon whose motion any debate shall be adjourned by the Council shall be entitled to pre-audience on the resumption of the debate.

42. If a debate on any motion moved and seconded be interrupted by the Council being counted out, such debate may be resumed at the next meeting at the point where it was so interrupted, on motion without notice.

43. At all meetings of the Council, save where the Act otherwise provides, all the Councillors present shall vote. If there be an equal division of votes upon any question, the Mayor shall, in addition to his own vote, have a second or casting vote.

44. The Council may determine that any question shall be considered in committee of the whole, and a motion to that effect may be moved without previous notice.

45. Such committee shall consider such matters only as shall have been referred to it by the Council.

46. In committee of the whole the Standing orders of the Council shall apply, except that Councillors may speak more than once to the same question.

47. The Mayor shall report the resolutions arrived at in committee of the whole of the Council at its next ordinary meeting, or upon the resumption of the Council, as the case may require, and such resolution shall be dealt with as the Council may think fit.

48. No Councillor shall digress from the subject matter of the question under discussion or impute improper motives to any other Councillor, and all personal reflections upon any Councillor shall be considered highly disorderly.

49. Any Councillor may require the Town Clerk to take down any particular words used by a Councillor immediately upon the same being used.

50. The Mayor, when called upon to decide a point of order or practice, shall give his decision, and no argument or comment shall be permitted thereon, and his decision shall be final in that particular case.

51. Any Councillor who shall use any expression which, in the opinion of the Mayor, reflects offensively on any member of the Council, shall, when required by the Mayor, unreservedly withdraw such expression and make a satisfactory apology to the Chair; and if he decline or neglect to do so, the Mayor may refuse to hear such Councillor further upon the matter then under discussion and call upon the next speaker, or may suspend or adjourn the sitting of the Council, or may direct the offending Councillor to withdraw from the Council chamber for the remainder of the then sitting of the Council.

52. No Councillor shall make any noise or disturbance, or, except to raise a point of order, converse aloud while any other Councillor is speaking, or whilst any letter is being read or opened.

53. When the Mayor is putting any question, no Councillor shall walk out of or across the chamber, nor shall any Councillor, whilst any other Councillor is speaking, pass between the speaker and the Chair.

54. The Mayor may, on his own motion, call any Councillor to order whenever, in his opinion, there shall be cause for so doing.

55. Every Councillor shall be entitled to direct the attention of the Mayor to any infraction of the Standing Orders by any other Councillor.

56. Any Councillor who shall do anything or behave in any manner which is forbidden by any section of this By-law shall be deemed to be out of order.

57. Whenever it shall have been decided by the Mayor that any motion, amendment, or other matter before the Council is out of order, the same shall be rejected, and whenever anything said or done in Council by any Councillor shall be similarly decided to be out of order, such Councillor shall be called upon by the Mayor to make such explanation, retraction, or apology as the case may require.

58. Any Councillor who shall persist in any line of conduct which the Mayor shall have decided, or which by any Section of this By-law is declared to be out of order, or who shall refuse to make any explanation, retraction, or apology required by the Mayor as aforesaid, shall, upon the request of the Mayor, withdraw from the Council chamber for the remainder of the then sitting of the Council.

59. In the event of any Councillor refusing or neglecting to withdraw from the Council chamber when requested or directed by the Mayor so to do, the Mayor may order such Councillor to be removed from the said chamber and to be excluded therefrom during the remainder of the then sitting of the Council.

60. *Committees.*—In addition to such special committees as may from time to time be appointed, there shall be six standing committees appointed from among the Councillors, namely, a Works Committee and Building Committee; a Finance Committee and Lighting Committee; a Health Committee and General Purposes Committee, each of which shall consist of four members. Such committees shall be appointed each year at the first meeting of the Council which shall be held after the annual elections.

61. The members of the said committees shall, in default of agreement, be elected by ballot, and in the event of an equality of votes for two or more Councillors, the Mayor shall have a casting vote.

62. The Works Committee shall have the general direction of all works ordered or sanctioned by the Council, and of all streets, roads, ways, drains, bridges,

and other public places under the care and management of the Council; the management and general direction of street sweeping and watering. Such committee shall inquire into and report to the Council from time to time upon such improvements and repairs as they may think necessary, or which the Council may, by resolution, direct them to inquire into and report upon.

63. The Finance Committee shall examine and check all accounts and generally supervise the collection and expenditure of the municipal revenue. Such committee shall inquire into and report to the Council from time to time upon all matters which they may consider to affect, or be likely to affect, the finances of the municipality, or which the Council may by resolution direct them to inquire into and report upon. Such committee shall also have control of all matters affecting the staff of the Council.

64. The General Purposes Committee shall prepare drafts of all such By-laws as may from time to time be required for the good government of the municipality. They shall also have the control of all parks, reserves, and tree planting, and of the town hall and other municipal buildings, and the administration of all the municipal By-laws, except such as shall be specially placed under the control of any other committee. So far as concerns the administration of the By-laws in references to licensed vehicles, the proceedings of the General Purposes Committee shall not require the approval of the Council.

65. The Building Committee shall have control of the general administration of the Building By-laws.

66. The Lighting Committee shall have the control of the general management and direction of the Lighting Department and of the street lighting, and shall have power to inquire into and report to the Council on any matter likely to affect same.

67. At any meeting of a standing committee a quorum shall consist of one member and the Mayor or two members.

68. Special committees may consist of any number of members, and may be appointed for the performance of any duty which may be lawfully entrusted to a committee, and for the performance of which, in the opinion of the Council, a special committee ought to be appointed. No standing committee shall interfere with any matter which may for the time being have been entrusted to any special committee. The appointment of a special committee shall be made by resolution after due notice; such resolution shall state the duties proposed to be entrusted to such special committee, and may either state the number of Councillors to be elected by ballot, or shall name the Councillors whom it is proposed to constitute such committee. In the event of a ballot being taken, and an equality of votes being recorded in favour of any two or more Councillors, the Mayor shall have a casting vote.

69. The Town Clerk shall call a meeting of any committee when requested so to do by the Mayor or any two members of such committee.

70. Each standing committee shall keep a book, to be called a Minute Book, in which shall be entered minutes of all the proceedings and transactions. The minutes of each meeting shall be confirmed at the following meeting and signed by the Chairman thereof.

71. Any Councillor who shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law shall be liable, on conviction before a court of summary jurisdiction, to a penalty not exceeding £20.

72. Whenever any Councillor shall have committed an offence under this By-law, the Mayor may forthwith lay, or cause to be laid, an information before a justice of the peace for the purpose of summoning the offending Councillor, and shall afterwards appear and prosecute the charge.

THIRTEENTH SCHEDULE.

BY-LAWS of the Municipality of Geraldton, made under Section 179 of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906," and numbered 42A, 45, 51, and 59, for regulating the Erection of Tents, Pavilions, etc.; Park Lands, Reserves, and Recreation Grounds; Construction of Buildings; Weights and Measures.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act, the Mayor and Councillors of the Municipality of Geraldton order as follows:—

MUNICIPALITY OF GERALDTON.

By-law No. 42A.

Tents, Pavilions, etc.

Any person who shall erect a tent, pavilion, shed, or other structure of canvas, hessian, or other inflammable material anywhere within the municipality, without first receiving the consent of the Mayor or Council, in writing, shall forfeit and pay, on conviction, a penalty not exceeding £2 for every such offence.

MUNICIPALITY OF GERALDTON.

By-law No. 45.

Park Lands, Reserves, and Recreation Grounds.

In pursuance of the powers in that behalf contained in "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906," the Council of the Municipality of Geraldton doth hereby repeal Part 2 of By-law 45 and doth make the following in lieu thereof:—

(2.) The Council shall have power to grant the exclusive right to use and occupy any park lands, recreation grounds, or reserves within the municipality, for holding public sports, or amusements, to any responsible person or persons, for any time not exceeding three consecutive days, subject to such conditions as may be decided upon by the Council, and any person or persons obtaining such right shall be responsible for the proper care of all fences, buildings, erections, and trees upon or enclosing such park lands, recreation grounds, and reserves, and for the collection and removal of all waste material, broken glass, scraps, litter, and rubbish of any kind brought or made by them on the grounds prior to their leaving the grounds, and shall pay to the Council a fee to be fixed by the Council, but the public shall have the right to enter upon such lands on payment to the person or persons so using and occupying as aforesaid, of a sum of not more than one (1s.) shilling per head per day, and subject to the rules and regulations, provided that an extra charge of not more than one (1s.) shilling per head may be made to any part of the grounds set apart as a special reserve or stand—the charges in all cases to be fixed by the Council.

MUNICIPALITY OF GERALDTON.

By-law No. 51.

Regulations for the Construction of Buildings.

In pursuance of the powers in that behalf contained in "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906," the Council of the Municipality of Geraldton doth hereby repeal Part 13 of By-law 51 and doth make the following in lieu thereof:—

Frontages and Backyards.

13. For the purpose of preventing the building of dwelling-houses with frontages abutting on the backyards of other buildings and for providing proper access to all dwelling-houses and for providing open spaces attached thereto, it is hereby provided that:—

- (a.) No dwelling-house shall be hereafter erected or rebuilt which shall not directly front for the whole width of the building, without the intervention of any other building, a public street, or a private street which shall have been approved by the Council for the purpose of this clause.
- (b.) No building of any kind shall be erected on any block of land between any dwelling-house fronting a public street or approved private street and the said street.
- (c.) Nothing in this clause contained shall prevent the erection of a building intended to be or capable of being used as a combined business and dwelling-house, and in which the business portion of the building directly fronts any such public or approved private street as aforesaid, by reason only that the dwelling portion of the building shall be at the back or side of the business portion.
- (d.) No dwelling-house shall be erected or rebuilt which does not provide an open space exclusively belonging thereto either at the rear or on the side of the building, of the following extent, namely, an area having a width equal to the full width of that allotted to the building and a depth of at least thirty feet.
- (e.) In this clause the word "dwelling-house" shall comprise any building intended for or capable of being used as a dwelling-house.
