Amendment of Regulations 89 to 96 inclusive, 112, and 168.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council, under Section 161 of "The Land Act, 1898," has been pleased to cancel Clauses 89 to 96 inclusive, 112, and Sub-clause C of Clause 168 of the Rules and Directions for the Guidance of Surveyors under the Department of Lands and Surveys, and to substitute the follow-

89. Extreme care must be exercised in the selection 89. Extreme care must be exercised in the selection of sites for Town and Suburban lands. The natural features and general topography should be such as to provide for the efficient surface drainage of the allotments and streets. Where practicable, streets should be located on the lower levels, in order that surface water may drain from the allotments into the street channels. The nature of the sub-soil and geological structure of the site will have an important bearing structure of the site will have an important bearing on the health of the town, and consequently impervious low-lying ground should be avoided wherever possible.

The probable extent of population and settlement in the surrounding district must be duly considered, and provision made for any extension that may be required in the future.

in the future.

Whenever the nature of the country and other 90. Whenever the nature of the country and other conditions will admit of it, townsites should be laid out in rectangular sections 8 chains by 5 chains 25 links, each section to be intersected centrally by a lane 25 links wide parallel to its longer side, and subdivided into allotments, of a quarter of an acre each, with the exception of the corner lots with a frontage of 100 links and depth of 250 links.

In subdivisions of town allotments of an area of one acre and under all angles of 95deg, and under at intersections of streets, shall be excised from the allotments by chords laid off at right angles to the lines bisecting the angles, and of the following lengths:—

Angles between 95deg. and 85deg., length of chord

The dimensions and approximate areas of the proposed lots must be indicated thereon.

In order to insure well graded streets and efficient drainage, sufficient data should be obtained by the surveyor to enable approximate contour lines to be plotted on the plan of the site. A report on the suitability and general characteristics of the site selected shall accompany the design, and if a departure from the before-mentioned directions relating to the manner of laying out the townsite is necessary, the reason for such departure must be given.

93. Open spaces should be reserved where necessary, and sites suggested for schools (about 5 acres), public buildings. educational endowments (about 8 or 10 buildings, educational endowments (about 8

The vertical intervals between contour lines will vary according to the nature of the country and should not exceed five feet.

All contour levelling performed by a Contract Surveyor will be paid for at daily rates as provided for under Departmental Regulations 160 and 171.

95. Where conditions are favourable, provision should be made for park lands within, or in the immediate vicinity of, the town.

96. Suitable sites should be selected in the vicinity of the town for hospitals, cemeteries, camping places, commons, abattoirs, sanitary depôts, etc., but not surveyed without special instructions.

#### COURT OF ARBITRATION, WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

No. 2 of 1913.

Between Eastern Goldfields Shop Assistants' and Warehouse Employees' Industrial Union of Workers (hereinafter called the "union") Applicant, and Eastern Goldfields Traders' Industrial Union of Employers (hereinafter called "the employers") Respondent.

#### AWARD.

The Court of Arbitration of Western Australia (hereinafter called "the Court"), having taken into consideration the matter of an industrial dispute between the above-named parties, and having heard the union and the employers by their respective representatives duly appointed, and having heard and considered the evidence adduced on behalf of the union and the employers respectively, doth hereby order and award that as between the union and the members thereof, and the employers and each of them, the terms, conditions, and provisions contained in the schedule hereto shall be binding upon the union and the members thereof, and upon the employers and each of them, and that the said terms, conditions, and provisions shall be deemed to be and they are hereby incorporated into and declared to form part of this award: And further that the union and the members thereof, and the employers and each of them, shall respectively do, observe, and perform every matter and thing on the part of the union and the members thereof, and on the part of the employers and each of them respectively, required to be done, observed, and performed, and shall not do anything in contravention of the said terms, conditions, and provisions, but shall in all respects abide by and observe and perform the same.

#### THE SCHEDULE HEREINBEFORE REFERRED TO.

- 1. Area.—The locality to which the award is limited is the area comprised within a radius of seven miles from the General Post Office, Kalgoorlie.
- 2. Term.—The award shall come into operation on the twentieth day of October, 1913, and shall continue in force for the period of at least twelve calendar months from the said date.
- Overtime,—All work required to be performed by any of the workers hereinafter mentioned after the usual closing hour (or before the usual opening hour) of the shop shall be deemed overtime, and shall be paid for at the rate of time and a-quarter.
  - Wages.—The following shall be the minimum weekly wages payable:
    - (i.) Grocer's traveller (exclusive of any allowance) (ii.) (a.) Carter (hours not to exceed 50 per week) 3 15 3 10 0 (b) Grocer's carter of under nineteen years of age (hours as above) 2 10

Provided always that the fixing of the foregoing minimum rates of wage shall not entitle an employer to reduce the wage of any worker who at the time of issue of this award was being paid a higher rate of wage than the minimum prescribed for his class of work.

- 5. Carter's Attendance.—It shall be part of the ordinary duty of a carter to attend to his
- horses, provided such attendance is done during his ordinary working hours.

  A carter required to feed horses on Sunday shall be paid 2s. per hour whilst so engaged, in addition to the wage hereinbefore prescribed.
  - 6. Holidays.—The following holidays shall be allowed and paid for :-
    - (i.) New Year's Day; (ii.) Good Friday; (iii.) Easter Monday; (iv.) Labour Day; (v.) Foundation Day; (vi.) King's Birthday; (vii.) Cup Day (each town separately); (viii.) Christmas Day, and (ix.) Boxing Day
- Higher Duties .- A worker required to do work which is entitled to a higher rate than that which he usually performs shall be paid the higher rate whilst so employed.
- 8. Under-rate Workers.—Any worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum wage may be paid such lesser wage as may from time to time be agreed upon in writing between the union and the employer, and, in default of such agreement, within twenty-four hours after such worker shall have applied in writing to the secretary of the union stating his desire that uch wage should be agreed upon, such wage as shall be fixed by the

most convenient resident or police magistrate upon the application of such worker after twentymost convenient resident or poince magistrate upon the application of such worker after twentyfour hours' notice in writing shall have been given by him to the said secretary, who shall, if
he so desires, be heard by the magistrate upon such application. After having given notice
to the secretary, and after lodging the application mentioned, and pending the magistrate's
decision thereon, the worker shall be entitled to work for and be employed at the proposed
lesser rate. The determination of the magistrate shall have effect for the period of six calendar
months from the date thereof, and after the expiration of the said period until the wage shall
have been again fixed at the instance of the said secretary in the manner prescribed. The secretary of the union may by writing under his hand appoint an agent or substitute to represent the union at the hearing of the application before the magistrate.

9. Record Book.—The employer shall keep and enter up, or cause to be entered up, a book containing the names of each of his workers to whom this award applies, the class of work performed by and the wages paid to each such worker, and the time during which he or she has been employed; such book to be open to inspection by a representative of the union at least one day in each week between the hours of 10 a.m. and 4 p.m.

10. Posting Award.—A printed copy of the award shall be kept posted by the employer in a conspicuous place in his establishment.

## BY-LAWS OF THE AVON ROAD BOARD.

WHEREAS by "The Roads Act, 1911," the Board of WHEREAS by "The Roads Act, 1911," the Board of any District is empowered to make By-laws for all or any of the purposes of the said Act: It is hereby resolved by the Board of the Avon Road District, and with the approval of His Excellency the Governor in Council, that the following By-laws shall be in force in the aforesaid District from the date of the publications thereof in the Communication of the publications of the communication of the communication of the content of the cont tion thereof in the Government Gazette:

Appointments.

1. No permanent appointment shall be made to any office under the Board until an advertisement has been published in one or more newspapers, calling for applications from persons competent to fill such office. All appointments to any office shall be made by resolution of the Board. of the Board.

Duties of Secretary.
To attend all Board meetings, and committee meetings, when considered necessary.

To take notes of all minutes, and, when required, prepare reports of committees.

To conduct all correspondence, and give the other officers of the Board instructions as directed by the

To answer, as far as possible, all questions on the Board's business.

To see that the accounts are audited once a year, and

To see that the accounts are audited once it year, and the balance sheet prepared for publication.

To supervise the preparation of the Rate Book and Board's electoral lists, examine proofs of the latter, and arrange for distribution of copies prior to elections; also to attend all courts of revision and appeal.

To make all necessary arrangements for elections and prepared papers for some

prepare papers for same.

To summon all the members to all Board and committee meetings.

The Secretary shall keep the Cash Book, as well as any and all other books required to show the receipts and expenditure made by the Board; the said books shall be written every month, ready for the inspection of the Board, or any member of the Board who may at any time during office hours desire to see the books. He shall check all accounts sent in to the Board, and see that all accounts for works exceeding five pounds in expenditure have stated on them the authority under which such works have been done. He shall check all which such works have been done. He shall check all returns made by the collectors or other of the Board's officers, and shall see that with all returns the heels of the receipt books or the duplicates of the receipt accompany the returns. He shall supervise and attend to the due payment of all money coming through the hands of the Board's officers, and payable to the credit of the Board. He shall report to the Board at its next meeting any officer neglecting to make his returns as provided with the necessary vouchers attached thereto. He shall see, as far as possible, that all rates and taxes payable to the Board are duly collected. He shall pay in to the Board's bank, once a week, to the credit taxes payable to the Board are duly collected. He shall pay in to the Board's bank, once a week, to the credit of the Board, any sum or sums of money received by him on behalf of the Board. No money shall be paid into the bank to the credit of the Board by any officer of the Board except by or through the Secretary.

He shall give all receipts on the authorised printed

He shall have the Cash Book and Bank Pass Book made up in readiness for the meetings of the Board, and shall produce them at each meeting thereof.

At each ordinary meeting of the Board he shall produce a statement showing as nearly as possible the financial position of the Board with regard to payments. already made and present assets and liabilities; the latter to include moneys voted for specific purposes which have not yet been carried out or contracted for, and no further expenditure shall be incurred until such statement be produced.

The Secretary shall attend at the office of the Board for the transaction of all necessary business on such days and times as shall be fixed by the Board; he shall readily obey all lawful commands of the Board, and shall attend to all other matters relating to the finances of the Board, and not herein specified.

#### Duties of Supervisor.

3. The Supervisor shall prepare all plans and specifications for works being done by the Board, and shall see that such works are properly carried out, and shall give a certificate that such works have been faithfully carried out.

#### Meetings.

4. The Board shall hold an ordinary meeting once in every calendar month, at such time and place as may be decided by the Board. Special meetings may be held when considered necessary, and of which due notice has been given.

#### Order of Business.

The order of business at all ordinary meetings shall be as follows:-

(1.) Reading and confirmation of the minutes of the last ordinary and special meetings of the Board (if any).

(2.) Consideration of any business arising out of the minutes.

(3.) Reading correspondence received, and taking such action thereon as may be deemed neces

sary. (4.) Receiving reports from committees and officers

and dealing with same.

(5.) Opening tenders received, and dealing with

- (6.) Receiving deputations and petitions, and taking any action in same considered neces-
- (7.) Monthly financial statement read.
  (8.) Passing of accounts.
  (9.) Ordinary business of the Board.

No discussion shall take place upon the minutes except as to their accuracy, or for the rectification of any

Immediately after confirmation of the minutes the Chairman may make any communication to the Board which he deems necessary, or bring under the notice of the Board any business which he considers necessary at that stage of the meeting. It shall be competent for any member to ask any question or questions, but

he shall confine himself to the question, and no debate shall take place thereon at the time. Minutes of the Meeting.—In addition to the ordinary book prescribed by the Roads Act, a rough minute book shall be kept in which all items of business transacted by the Board shall then and there be noted by the Secretary, and subsequently entered by him in the minute book as prescribed by the Act.

#### Tenders.

6. Tenders shall be opened by the Chairman in the open meeting, and all deposits lodged by tenderers shall be entered either by the Chairman or a member of the Board in a book provided solely for that purpose. All tenders sent to the Board shall be accompanied by a deposit, either by approved cheque or postal note. deposits required shall be a minimum of Five shillings (5s.) below or up to the value of Five pounds (£5), and for any tenders exceeding Five pounds (£5) in value the deposit shall be Five pounds (£5) per centum on the amount of tender.

#### Deputations.

7. All deputations waiting on the Board shall be introduced by a member of the Board, who has previously made himself conversant with the requirements of the deputation, and who shall place the matter before the Board.

#### Motions and Amendments.

8. A motion once moved at a meeting of the Board may not be withdrawn without the consent of the Board. One or more amendments may be proposed on a motion before the Board. When more than one amendment is moved, the question shall be first put on the last amendment, and then on to the next in succession, and then on the original motion in the reverse order in which

they are moved.

A motion or amendment not seconded may not be discussed by any member except the mover, nor be put

by the Chairman.

In submitting a motion or amendment, the Chairman must put the question first in the affirmative and then in the negative.

When an amendment is carried the motion as amended thereby becomes a substantive motion, upon which a further amendment may be moved before the matter is finally dealt with.

#### Appointment of Committees.

9. The Board may at any meeting appoint three or more members of the Board to act as a committee to inquire into any matter and make a report and re-commendation thereon, but no committee shall incur any financial liability or in any way commit the Board to any responsibility without express or specific authority conferred by the By-laws or by a resolution of the Board.

The Chairman shall be an ex officio member of all committees.

The quorum of a committee shall comprise two (2) members.

There shall be a standing Finance Committee.

#### Urgent Works.

10. Any member of the Board shall be allowed a sum of money not exceeding Five pounds (£5) for necessary urgent work.

#### Footpaths and Verandahs.

11. All footpaths constructed in any townsite in the District shall be nine (9) feet wide. Any verandah erected over any footpath in the District shall be nine (9) feet wide, measuring from the edge of the street.

Bridges and Roads.

12. No person or persons shall take any load or loads over any bridge or culvert within the District if any such load weighs more than seven (7) tons, exclusive of

the vehicle carrying such load.

The Board will not be held responsible for any damage done or caused to any traction engine passing over any bridge or culvert within the District.
