WHEREAS by Section 9 of "The Land Act, 1898," the Governor may resume, for any of the purposes specified in Section 39 of the said Act, any portion of land held as a Conditional Purchase or a Homestead Farm: And whereas it is deemed expedient that the portions of Conditional Purchase 30886/55 and Homestead Farm 15621/74, as described hereunder should be resumed for one of the purposes specified in paragraph 13 of Section 39 of the said Act, that is to say for Water: Now therefore I, Major General Sir Harry Barron, Governor as aforesaid, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my proclamation resume portions of Conditional Purchase 30886/55 and Homestead Farm 15621/74 (for the purpose aforesaid).

Schedule.

That portion of Conditional Purchase Lease 30886/55 (containing 2 acres 0 roods 6 perches) comprised in and being the Southern portion of Avon Location 20880 as surveyed and shown on diagram Northam 2519 in the Department of Lands and Surveys; also that portion of said Conditional Purchase Lease 30886/55, containing 1 acre 1 rood 23 perches, being a one-chain road from the South corner of Location 20880 to the South boundary of Location 18456, and surveyed and shown on the same diagram.

WARREN ROAD BOARD.

Alteration of Ward Boundaries.

11304/13.

WHEREAS by virtue of the power conferred under Section 8 of "The Roads Act, 1911," the Governor may, by Order in Council, alter the boundaries of any ward: And whereas it is desirable to alter the boundaries of the wards in the Warren Road District: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby alter the boundaries of the wards in the said Road District, by transferring from the Warren Ward to the Central Ward all that portion of the former's territory as described in the Schedule hereunder, and increase the number of members of the Board from seven to nine, allotting the number to each ward as follows:—Central Ward, 3 members; Perup Ward, 3 members; Warren Ward, 3 members; Total, 9 members. To take effect on and after the 1st January, 1914.

Schedule.

Bounded on the North by portion of the South boundary of Central Ward from the South-West corner of same to the West boundary of Lease 1331/93.

Bounded on the East and South-East by a line starting from a point on the South boundary of Central Ward, at its intersection with the West boundary of Lease 1331/93, and extending along part of the West boundary of same, the East and part of the South boundaries of Location 2034 to intersection of centre of Road No. 309; thence South-Westward along the centre of Road No. 309 to the West boundary of Road District.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to approve of the following additional clause to Form No. 5 (Form of Mortgage) under above Act:—

And the mortgagor further covenants with the Board that notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in any contract entered into or which may be entered into during the continuance of this security for the erection or completion (as the case may be) of the said dwelling house the mortgagor will forthwith proceed with the erection or completion (as the case may be) of the dwelling house and will finish such work to the entire satisfaction of the Board within the period of six months from the date of this instrument And it is expressly agreed and declared that failing the erection or completion (as the case may be) of such dwelling house pursuant to the last preceding covenant the Board may exercise all or any of the powers conferred in the Board by the Workers' Homes Act 1911 and this mortgage and consequent upon default or breach of any of the covenants expressed or implied therein.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to approve of the amendment of Regulations 1 and 13 under above Act, the amended Regulations to read as follows:—

1. The account of the Board, to be called the Workers' Homes Fund, shall be kept at the Treasury, and may be operated upon by orders signed by the Chairman or Deputy Chairman, Member or Deputy Member of the Board, as may be approved, and countersigned by the Secretary or other authorised officer.

13. Workers whose payments under Part IV. are made on the due date, or within seven days thereafter, shall be entitled to a rebate of one-half per centum of the portion of such payments consisting of interest. Workers whose payments are not paid within fourteen days of the due date shall pay a fine of one penny for each pound or portion of a pound on payments so in arrears, for each month or portion of a month during which such arrears continue. Such fine when paid may be accounted for by the Receiving Officer by affixing to the counterfoil of the receipt a specially printed adhesive "fine" stamp.

IT is hereby notified, for general information, that His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to approve of the areas scheduled hereunder being made available for selection under "The Land Act, 1898," and its amendments.
