UNIVERSITY OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

STATUTE.

No. 10.-Convocation.

PART I.-MEETINGS.

1. Convocation shall meet for the despatch of business at such times as the Warden may deem necessary.

The Warden, or in his absence the Clerk of Convocation, shall convene a meeting of Convocation upon the written requisition of fifteen members setting forth the objects for which the meeting is required to be convened, and such meeting shall be held within twenty days after the receipt of the requisition.

3. At any meeting of Convocation twenty-five members shall constitute a quorum.

4. If, at the expiration of thirty minutes from the time appointed for a meeting, there should not be a quorum present, the meeting shall lapse.

5. The Chairman shall have a vote, and in the case of

an equality of votes, a second or casting vote. 6. Convocation may adjourn any meeting or debate

to a future sitting. 7. Ten days' notice of any meeting of Convocation shall be given by advertisement in the *Government Gazette*, and in at least one other newspaper published in Perth ; and, in addition, a printed notice of meeting shall be sent by post to each member of Convocation, at least ten days before the meeting, stating the business to be considered at such meeting.

8. All the proceedings of Convocation shall be entered in a Minute Book, which shall be kept for the purpose.
9. At all meetings of Convocation the Warden shall be the Chairman, but, in the event of the Warden being absent, a Chairman shall be appointed to act during the absence of the Warden, by a majority of those present.

PART 2 .- STANDING RULES AND ORDERS OF CONVOCATION.

(i.) Conduct of Business.

1. The order of business at each meeting shall be as follows :-

(a.) (1.) Reading, amendment, confirmation, and sig-nature by Chairman of the Minutes of the last meeting.

(2.) Business arising out of the Minutes.

(b.) Correspondence.

(c.) Adjourned business.

(d.) Reports of Committees.

(e.) Statutes.

(f.) Matters referred to Convocation by the Senate.

Motions on the Notice-paper. (q.)

(h.) Other business,

(n.) Other business,
2. The order of procedure on a proposed new Statute or regulation shall be :--(1) Reception of the Statute or Regulation; (2) Committal to a Committee of the Whole, or to a Select Committee; (3) Adoption of the Statute or Regulation as amended by the Committee.
3. But if it is not desired to make amendments in the statute process.

Statute or Regulation it may be adopted without reference to a Committee. Any proposed Statute or Regulation may be re-committed. The question that a proposed Statute or Regulation be now received may not be amended. The question that a proposed Statute or Regulation be committee to a Committee of the Whole or to a Select Committee may be amended by the substitution of Select Committee for be amended by the substitution of Select Committee for Committee of the Whole and vice versa, but not otherwise. The question that a proposed Statute or Regulation be now adopted may be amended in order that it may be committed or re-committed, but not otherwise. All amendments in a proposed Statute or Regulation shall be relevant to the subject-matter thereof.

4. All notices of motion must be in writing and duly signed. Notices must be addressed to the Clerk of Convocation, and must reach the Office of the University fifteen days before the day of meeting. A notice of motion may be given by one member on behalf of another. 5. The regular order of business may be suspended at any meeting by a vote of two-thirds of the members present.

6. Except by permission of two-thirds of the members present no member shall introduce for discussion at a meeting a subject which has not been duly inserted on the Noticepaper for that meeting, and in no case shall such subject be decided at that meeting.7. A question shall be decided on the voices or by a show

of hands, unless a ballot be demanded by at least five members. When a question has been decided by show of hands any mamber may require the votes for and against to be re-corded in the Minutes.

8. A division shall be taken in such manner as the Chairman shall direct.

9. At a special meeting only the business specified in the notice of such meeting shall be considered.

(ii.) Rules of Debate.

10. Whenever the Chairman rises during a debate, any member then speaking or offering to speak shall sit down, and the Chairman shall be heard without interruption.

11. Should the Chairman desire to take part in a debate, he may vacate the Chair and call upon any mem-ber to act as Chairman.

12. Every member desiring to speak shall rise in his place and address himself to the Chair.

13. When two or more members rise to speak, the Chairman shall call upon the member who, in the opinion of the Chairman, first rose in his place.

14. A member may at any time move that the strict order of debate be followed. The motion shall be put to the vote without debate, and, if carried, no member, without the permission of the Chairman, shall speak twice during a debate, except that the mover of the original motion may reply, or that on one amendment being nega-tived a member may second a further amendment. Pro-vided that a member who may have been misrepresented before the mover replies, and that when an amendment becomes the question it shall be open to discussion, as though it were an original motion.

15. A reply shall be allowed to a member who has made a substantive motion, but not to any member who has moved an amendment.

16. No member may speak to any question after it has been put by the Chairman and the show of hands or ballot has been taken thereon.

17. In the absence of a member who has given notice of a motion any member present may move such motion, provided he has received written authority from the member who gave such notice.

18. A motion may be amended or withdrawn by the mover with leave of Convocation.

19. When the proposed amendment is to leave out certain words, the Chairman shall put a question, "That the words proposed to be left out be left out."

20. When the proposed amendment is to insert or add certain words, the Chairman shall put a question, such words be inserted or added."

21. When the proposed amendment is to leave out certain words in order to insert or add other words, the Chairman shall put a question, "That the words proposed to be left out be left out," which, if resolved in the negative, shall dispose of the amendment; but if in the affirmative, another question shall be put, that the words of the amendment be inserted or added, instead of the words which are left out.

22. Any member proposing an amendment may be re-quired to deliver it in writing to the Chairman.

23. Any motion or amendment not seconded shall not be further discussed, and no entry thereof shall be made on the Minutes.

When amendments have been proposed and negatived 24. or withdrawn, the question shall be put as originally proposed.

25.

5. A question may be superseded— (a.) By a motion, "That Convocation proceed to the next business."

next business." (b.) By the motion, "That Convocation adjourn," either of which, if seconded, shall be put forthwith. 26. A debate may be closed by the motion, "That the question be now put," being proposed, seconded, and carried, which question shall be forthwith put without amendment or debate : but such motion shall not pass in the affirmative unless by a vote of at least two-thirds of the members present in favour thereof. in favour thereof.

27. A motion to rescind any decision of Convocation must have been previously submitted in writing in accord-ance with the provisions of Rule 4. (iii.) Committee of the Whole.

A Committee of the Whole may be appointed by 28. a resolution, "That Convocation do now resolve itself into Committee of the Whole."

The Warden shall be Chairman of such Committee 29. unless be he unwilling to act, in which case any other member may be voted to the Chair.

A member may speak more than once on any question.
 A motion need not be seconded.

The Chairman shall have a vote, and in the case of 32. an equality of votes a second or casting vote.

(iv.) Select Committees.

33. Convocation may refer any matter to a Select Committee.

34. Unless it be otherwise determined, a Select Committee shall consist of five members, three of whom shall form a quorum. The Warden shall, ex officio, be an additional member of all Select Committees, and shall have the right, if he wishes, to act as Chairman ; otherwise the Committee shall elect a Chairman.

35. The Chairman shall have a vote, and in the case of an equality of votes, a second or casting vote. 36. The Report of a Select Committee shall be in writing,

signed by the Chairman, and presented by him.

(v.) General.

37. Should questions which are not dealt with in these Standing Orders arise, at either an ordinary, or a special, or an adjourned meeting, or in Committee of the Whole, the decision of the Chairman shall be final.

38. Any of these Standing Orders may be suspended for the time being, on motion made with or without no⁴ice, provided that such motion shall have the concurrence of two-thirds of those present.

No. 11.-Vice-Chancellor.

1. The following shall be the duties and responsibilities of the Vice-Chancellor :-

- (a.) To draft the Annual Report of the University for submission to the Senate.
- (b.) To prepare for submission to each monthly meeting of the Senafe a written report of the work done at the University during the month, and at the end of each term to give a return of the number of lectures delivered during the term by each professor or lecturer and the number of students
- attending each lecture.(c.) To regulate the order to be observed at the con-ferring of Degrees and other academic distinctions, and at other public ceremonials of the University. subject to any directions which may be given by the Senate.
- (d.) To appoint and dismiss the subordinate servants of the University, and to regulate their duties subject to the direction of the Senate.
 (e.) To exclude any student from the University or its
- precincts until the next meeting of the Committee of Discipline, and to report to such meeting
- (f.) On occ:sion of his illness or temporary absence, to appoint in writing a deputy from among the Professors to exercise his powers and discharge his duties until the Senate shall have an oppor-tuation of the senate and have an oppor-tuation of the senate appointment or of tunity of confirming such appointment, or of making such other arrangements as may be deemed advisable.
- (g.) If immediately before or during an examination a vacancy occurs among the examiners, to ap-
- a vacancy occurs among the examiners, to appoint a substitute or substitutes for that examination after consultation with the Dean of the Faculty concerned, or his deputy.
 (h.) In all cases of emergency to take such steps as he may deem necessary for safeguarding the interests of the University, and in such cases to report his action to the next meeting of the senate.
 (i) Generally to take much merging any he necessary.

 (i.) Generally to take such mers areas as may be necessary for the efficient carrying out of the will of the duly constituted authorities.
 2. The Vice-Chancellor may resign his office by letter under his hand, addressed to the Chancellor.

3. The Senate shall have absolute power to remove the Vice-Chancellor from office for good cause.

4. In the event of the Vice-Chancellor's death, resignation, or removal, the senate shall, as soon thereafter as may be possible, appoint a successor to discharge his duties during the unexpired portion of his term of office. 5. The Vice-Chancellor shall hold office for such time.

No. 12.—Academic Dress.

At all lectures, examinations, and public ceremonials of the University, undergraduates must appear in academic dress. Provided that the Professorial Board shall have power to exempt students attending certain classes from wearing academic dress at these classes where such a course is deemed expedient.

Undergraduates.—A plain black stuff gown of a pattern approved by the Professoriel Board, with a narrow band of watered silk of the colour appropriate to their Faculty placed horizontally on the breast of the gown at each side. Black cloth trencher cap. Scholars.—Same as for other undergraduates, with the

addition of a black velvet bar on the right shoulder of the gown.

Bachelors.—Black stuff or silk gown similar in shape to the gown worn by Bachelors of Arts of the University of Oxford. Black silk hood similar in shape to the hood worn by Bachelors of Arts of the University of Oxford, lined with watered silk of the colour appropriate to the Faculty and edged with white fur. Black cloth trencher cap.

Masters .- Same as for Bachelors, but the hood without the white fur edging.

Doctors.—Black stuff or silk gown as for Bachelors, but with facings of watered silk of the colour appropriate to the Faculty. Hood of scarlet cloth lined with watered silk of the colour appropriate to the Faculty. Black velvet

trencher cap. Hoods.—The following are the colours of the watered silk linings for the hoods for Degrees in the several Faculties :-

Arts, Royal Blue. Science, Emerald Green. Engineering, Gold Law, Royal Parple Music, Peacock Blue Medicine, Ruby Red. Surgery, Ruby Red.

The patterns shall be in accordance with specimens ap proved by the Professorial Board, and the colours shall accord with specimens attached to a document preserved with the University records, and bearing the Seal of the University.

Persons who have been admitted ad eundem gradum 3. may at their option wear any academic dress to which they are entitled by virtue of their degrees in any other University or the dress prescribed for their degree in the University of Western Australia.

No: 13.-Method of Election by Convocation of Persons to be Members of the Senate.

1. The annual election of two members of the Senate shall be held on the First Tuesday of March in every year, or upon such later date in that month as the Senate may appoint. 2. At least sixty days' notice of the election shall be

given by advertisement in at least one daily newspaper published in Perth, and also in the Government Gazette, and be posted at the University.

No person shall be eligible for election unless his name shall have been communicated to the Warden of Convocation under the hands of two qualified voters not less than twentyeight days nor more than forty-two days before the day fixed for the election.

- 4. No person shall be eligible for election who—
 (a.) Is not of the full age of twenty-one years;
 (b.) Is an undischarged bankrupt; or
 (c.) Has his affairs under liquidation by arrangement with his creditors; or
 - (d.) Has been convicted of an offence and sentenced to imprisonment unless he has received a free pardon or has undergone sentence passed upon him; or
 - (e.) Is an insane person or patient within the meaning of the laws in force for the time being relating to lunacy.

On the expiration of the time for receiving nominations the Warden shall cause the name of each person so nominated and the fact of his candidature to be forthwith advertised in at least one daily newspaper published in Perth, and in the Government Gazette, and to be posted at the University.

6. In the case of their being only two nominations the Warden shall report the fact to the Chancellor, who shall then declare the candidates duly elected. If there are more candidates than vacancies the election shall be by ballot of the members of Convocation voting personally or by voting papers transmitted through the post.

7. The elections shall be conducted in the following manner :

- (a.) A ballot shall be taken on the day appointed for the election of the University or such other place as the Senate may determine, of which due notice shall be given.
- (b.) The ballot shall commence at 10 a.m. and close at 5 p.m. on the day appointed. (c.) The voting paper shall contain the names of all
- duly nominated candidates arranged in alphabetical order, and shall state the number of vacancies. The voter shall mark his voting paper by making a cross opposite the name of each candidate for whom he votes.
- (d.) At any time after the notification of the day of election, and not later than fourteen days before the day of election, the Clerk of Convocation shall send by post a voting paper to every member of Convocation.

Each such voting paper forwarded by the Clerk of Convocation shall be accompanied by a form of declaration to be signed by the applicant, and to state his qualification, and also by an envelope marked "voting paper," and by a second envelope addressed to the Clerk of Convocation.

Having marked his voting paper, the voter shall place it without any other matter in the envelope marked "voting paper" which he shall seal and transmit to the Clerk of Convocation to-gether with the declaration duly signed, in the envelope provided for that purpose.

All voting papers so transmitted and received at the University not later than 5 p.m. on the day of election shall be counted in the ballot.

- (e.) The ballot shall be conducted by the Clerk of Convocation, assisted by scrutineers to be appointed by the Warden. Each candidate shall be entitled
- to nominate one scrutineer.(*f*.) At the expiration of the time allotted for the ballot, the Clerk of Convocation and scrutineers shall proceed to the examination of the voting papers including those transmitted by post and received as aforesaid, and the Warden shall report the result to the Chancellor, who shall then declare the two candidates who have received the greatest number of votes to be duly elected members of the Senate.
- (g.) In the event of an equality of votes, the election shall be decided by the casting vote of the Warden.
- (h.) The Clerk of Convocation shall reject as informal any voting paper upon which votes are not recorded for the exact number of candidates to be elected. In any case of doubt as to the form-ality of a voting paper, the matter shall be referred to the Warden, whose decision shall be final.

8. The Clerk of Convocation shall prepare a list of all persons entitled to vote, completed to the last day for receiving nominations for any election, and a copy of such list shall be exhibited at the University during the period from that date to the day of election.

9. In the event of the office of a member of the Senate elected by Convocation becoming vacant by death or re-signation before the expiration of his full term, the Senate at its first meeting after the occurrence of the vacancy shall fix a day of election of which at least sixty days' notice shall be given by advertisement in at least one daily newspaper published in Perth, and by notice posted at the University.

The election shall be conducted in manner similar to that prescribed for annual elections.
