A By-law of the Municipality of Kalgoorlie, made under Section 179, Subsection 4, of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906," and numbered 117, for the general management of Public Baths, the conduct of the visitors thereat, and for fixing the charge to be made for the use thereof.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act, the Mayor and Councillors of the Municipality of Kalgoorlie

order as follows:—

- Hours of Admission—

 (a.) During such period of the year as the Council may determine, the Baths shall be open daily from 6 a.m. to 1 p.m., from 2 p.m. to 6.30 p.m., from 7.30 p.m. to 10 p.m. On Sundays the Baths will be closed at 6 p.m.
 - (b.) The Baths shall be open to and used only by persons of the female sex on Tuesdays from 7·30 p.m. to 10 p.m., or on such other days and hours as the Council may from time to time appoint.
 - (c.) School children under the charge of a teacher shall be admitted to the Baths free of charge, on such days and between such hours as the Council may from time to time appoint, and subject to such special restrictions as the Council may impose. During the time the Baths are occupied by such children no other persons shall be admitted thereto.

2. Costume-

- (a.) Every person of the male sex apparently above the age of twelve years using the Baths shall at all times, while bathing, wear drawers or other dress or covering sufficient to prevent indecent exposure of the person.
- (b.) Every person of the female sex apparently above the age of five years using the Baths shall, at all times while bathing, wear a bathing gown or other dress or covering sufficient to prevent indecent exposure of the person.

3. Admission and Entrance Tickets-

- (a.) No persons shall enter the Baths save through the gate or turnstiles set apart for entrance purposes.
- (b.) No person (save the officers or workmen of the Council, and school children admitted under the provisions of clause 1 (c.), shall enter the Baths without first paying the charge heroin prescribed, or tendering a proper ticket therefor, to the carotaker.
- (c.) No person to whom any ticket has been issued shall lend, give, or sell, or otherwise dispose of any such ticket to any other person, except as provided by clause 4.
- (d.) Persons to whom tickets have been issued shall, at any time when required by the Caretaker so to do, show, and if demanded deliver up to him the tickets in their possession, and no person shall enter or attempt to enter the Baths on any expired ticket or on any ticket belonging to any other person.

4. Charges for Admission-

The following shall be the sums to be paid for admission to and the use of the Baths and the requisites supplied therein:

Monthly tickets (including the use of one towel on

every occasion of using the Bath), 7s. 6d.

Ordinary tickets (including the use of one towel on every occasion of using the Bath), 5s. per doz.

Transferable coupons may be obtained by an adult officer in charge of companies of not less than twelve members of any recognised society.

For members over the age of 16 years, 5s. per doz. For members not more than the age of 16 years, 2s. per doz.—No towels.

Single Baths (including the use of one towel),—
Persons over the age of 16 years . . 6d.
Persons not more than the age of 16
years (towel extra) . . . 3d.
School children (towel extra) . . 1d.
School children as provided by
clause 1 (c) Free

Hot Baths (separate), including use of one towel. Each person .. 2s.

Towels and trunks—

For the use of extra towel . . . 2d.

For the use of bathing costume . . 2d.

Cash charges for admission are payable at the entrance to the Baths. Tickets may be obtained either from the Town Clerk or the Caretaker.

5. Control of Premises-

- (a.) Every person using the Baths shall obey all reasonable directions of the Caretaker with regard to such use.
- (b.) No person shall obstruct, interfere, or hinder the Caretaker in the performance of any duty in the Baths.

6. Towels-

- (a.) No person resorting to the Baths shall injure nor use any towel as a loin cloth, or destroy any towel or other article supplied to him by the Caretaker.
- (b.) Any person supplied with a towel or any other article by the Caretaker shall return the same to the Caretaker in good order and condition before leaving the Baths, and every person failing to return such towel or other article, or returning the same in a damaged condition, shall pay to the Caretaker, before leaving the Baths, the cost price of such towel or other article.

7. Offences-

- (a.) No person shall enter the Baths while in an intoxicated condition.
- (b.) No person shall at any time, while suffering from any cutaneous, infectious, or contagious disease, enter or use the Baths or any part of the Baths premises.
- (c.) No person in charge of any dog shall allow such dog to enter any part of the Baths premises.
- (d.) No person shall smoke in any part of the Baths premises.
- (e.) No person shall behave riotously nor curse nor swear nor use any indecent, obscene, or abusive language, nor gamble nor misconduct himself in any part of the Baths premises.
- (f.) No person shall climb up to or on any partition or roof or any other portion of the Baths buildings.
- (g.) No person shall, in the Baths rooms or elsewhere in the Baths premises, wastefully use the water nor leave any taps running.
- (h.) No person shall spit or expectorate in the Baths, or on any of the platforms or in any of the dressing rooms, or commit any nuisance on or in any part of the Baths or the Baths premises.
- (i.) No person shall in the Swimming Bath use any soap or other substance or preparation whereby the water in the Bath shall be discoloured or rendered turbid or unfit for the proper use of the bathers.
- (k.) No person resorting to the Baths shall wilfully damage any part of the Baths premises, furniture, or fittings, nor carelessly or negligently injure or improperly use or interfere with any taps, valves, or other fittings or appliances.
- (l.) No persons resorting to the Baths shall in any way interfere with any other person therein, nor throw or push, nor attempt to throw or push any person into the Swimming Bath, nor throw any stones or sticks or any other matter or thing to the annoyance of or interference with any other person using the Baths.
- (m.) No person shall enter or attempt to enter any bath room or dressing room that is already occupied.

8. Eatables, etc., forbidden-

(a.) No person shall bring into nor consume in any part of the Baths premises any eatables or drinkables whatsoever, provided that nothing herein contained shall prevent the Council from permitting the Caretaker, during its pleasure only and subject to such conditions as it may from time to time impose, selling temperance drinks at the entrance to the Baths for consumption at such entrance only and to be taken or consumed nowhere else within or upon the Baths premises.

9. Lost Articles-

- (a.) Every person resorting to the Baths who shall find any article which may have been left therein shall immediately deliver same to the Caretaker, who shall thereupon register a description of such article and all particulars relating thereto in a book, which shall by him be kept for that purpose, and on any person claiming such article and who satisfies the Caretaker that he is the lawful owner of the same shall have such article returned to him, and on receiving such article he shall sign for the same in the book before mentioned.
- (b.) The Caretaker shall on every Monday report to the Town Clerk regarding all articles found in the Baths and handed to him, and whether any such have been claimed and returned to the owner thereof; at the same time he shall hand to the Town Clerk any such articles unclaimed, who shall hand over same to the police.

10. Carnivals, etc.—

11. Enforcement of By-laws-
