REGULATIONS.

WHEREAS His Excellency the Governor in Council may make Regulations under the provisions of "The Shearers' Accommodation Act, 1912":—Now, therefore, His Ex-cellency the Governor in Council, acting in pursuance of such powers, and on the advice of the Executive Council, does hereby make the following regulations:—

Section 2.

1. In the following Regulations the term "Inspec-tor" shall mean an Inspector appointed under "The Shearers' Accommodation Act, 1912."

Sections 5 and 10.

Certificate of Appointment. 2. The certificate of appointment of an Inspector shall be in the form numbered I. in the Schedule annexed

hereto. Section 6, s.s. (2), paragraphs ii. and iii. 3. No compartment provided for the sleeping accom-modation of shearers shall contain more than four bunks, bedsteads, or stretchers, and the floor space shall be of sufficient area to permit such bunks, bedsteads, or stretchers to be placed on the floor of the room, with sufficient area between them to provide space for the ordinary convenience of any person using the room, and which shall not be less than three feet. Every bunk shall rest on the floor of the room or compartment, and bunks in tiers, one above the other, will not be per-mitted. Every bunk or stretcher shall be at least 6 feet 6 inches long by 2 feet 6 inches wide, and shall at all times be maintained in good order and condition, be kept clear of the floor, and free from vermin.

Section 6, s.s. (2), paragraph ix.

4. In calculating cubic space for each shearer sleep-ing in a building the measurements shall be taken from the surface of the floor to the top of the wall plate and by the width and length of the room, clear of all projections not being studding; the top of the wall plate shall not be less than 8 feet above the floor.

In every sleeping and dining room sufficient light shall not be deemed to be provided unless the window or light area be not less than one-twelfth of the floor area. Adequate provision shall be made for proper inlet and outlet ventilation. 5. Where in any building the dining room is situated

under the same roof as compartments used for sleeping purposes, it shall be partitioned off from such com-partments from floor to ceiling, or to the roof if compartments are not ceiled.

No perishable provisions, tools, or implements shall be stored in any dining room or sleeping compartment.

Section 6, s.s. (2), paragraph x.

6. All rooms or compartments used for sleeping purposes or for dining in shall be floored with wood, cement, flagstones, asphalt, or such other material as the Inspector may approve.

Section 6, s.s.(2), paragraph vii.

7. (1.) Where in any district the shearing shed is located within the boundaries of a Local Health Author-ity, the latrine accommodation provided shall be con-structed and fitted in accordance with the requirements of by-laws made under the provisions of "The Health Act, 1911."

(2.) Where an Inspector is of opinion that the use of (2.) Where an Inspector is of opinion that the use of a cesspit at any shearing shed should be discontinued he may, by order in writing, require the employer within the time specified in such order to discontinue the use of any such cesspit and to provide in lieu thereof such other sufficient and proper latine accommodation as may be specified in such order.
(3.) There shall be provided by the employer a sufficient quantity of approved deodorant or disinfectant for application to all latrines used by the shearers, and to all drains and refuse recentacles, and every employer

to all drains and refuse receptacles, and every employer shall cause such deodorant or disinfectant to be applied daily in sufficient quantities to such latrines, drains, and receptacles while the same are in use.

Section 6, s.s. (2), paragraph xi.

8. Every employer shall, to the satisfaction of the Inspector, make proper provision for the efficient drain-age and disposal of all waste water and liquid from baths, washing utensils, kitchen and dining room.

Section 6, s.s. (2), paragraph xii.

9. The receptacles for refuse provided by the employer shall, if used for the reception of other than dry refuse, be constructed of impervious material, shall each be fitted with a suitable cover to the satisfaction of the Inspector, and shall be emptied and cleansed daily while in use.

10. Where the supply of drinking water is stored in tanks, all such tanks, whether below or above the surface of the ground, shall at all times be kept properly covered and protected from contamination.

Section 7.

11. Where tent accommodation is provided for shearers by any employer, each such tent so provided which is used for sleeping accommodation or for dining purposes shall be fitted with a suitable fly, shall, if required by the Inspector, be floored to his satisfaction, and shall not be used for the storage of perishable pro-visione teals are implements. visions, tools, or implements.

Section 8, s.s. (2).

12. Any notice given by an Inspector under the pro-visions of Section 8, subsection (2), of the Act, shall be in the form of Schedule II. hereto.

Section 12.

13. Any notice given by an Inspector under the provisions of Section 12 of the Act shall be in the form of Schedule III. hereto.

14. Any accommodation which in any respect is not in conformity with any of these regulations shall not be deemed to be proper, adequate, or sufficient for the purposes of "The Shearers' Accommodation Act, 1912."

Section 17 (b).

15. Any person committing a breach of these Regula-tions shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

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COURT OF ARBITRATION, WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

No. 5 of 1913.

Between the Amalgamated Timber Union of Workers (Coastal District), Western Australia (hereinafter referred to as "the union"), Applicant, and Millars' Timber and Trading Company, Limited; Swan Sawmills, Limited; The Kauri Timber Company, Limited; The Timber Corporation, Limited; South West Timber Hewers' Co-Operative Society, Limited; Collie Timber Company; Bunning Brothers, Limited; Whittaker Brothers; Vincent Brothers; Perth Jarrah Mills, Limited; The Nelson Co-Operative Timber Society, Limited; Port & Company, Limited; Lewis & Reid; Buckingham Brothers; and Adelaide Timber Company, Limited (hereinafter included under the designation "the employers"), Respondents.

AWARD.

The Court of Arbitration of Western Australia (hereinafter called "the court'') having taken into consideration the matter of an industrial dispute between the above-named parties, and having heard the union and the employers by their respective representatives duly appointed, and having heard and considered the evidence adduced on behalf of the union and the employers respectively, doth hereby order and award that as between the union and the members thereof and the employers and each of them the terms, conditions, and provisions contained in the schedule hereto shall be binding upon the union and the members thereof, and upon the employers and each of them, and that the said terms, conditions, and provisions shall be deemed to be and they are hereby incorporated into and declared to form part of this award: And, further, that the union and the members thereof and the employers and each of them shall respectively do, observe, and perform every matter and thing on the part of the union and the members thereof, and on the part of the employers and each of them respectively required to be done, observed, and performed, and shall not do anything in contravention of the said terms, conditions, and provisions, but shall in all respects abide by and observe and perform the same.

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4. *Classification of Benches.*—Any bench fed directly from a vertical saw or twin saws shall be classed as a big bench. Any bench fed directly from a big bench shall be classed as a No. 2 bench: Provided, however, that on this point the Court reserves to itself power to amend the clause by classifying benches according to the sizes of saws, should either party make application in that respect.

5. Time Sheets.—Time sheets shall be provided for firemen and guards to enable them to sign on and off duty daily.

6. Sanitary.—No rate shall be charged by the employer for the use of e.c's. now provided at the mills for the convenience of workers during working hours. Where sanitary service or removal of rubbish or both is or are being carried out by the employer no increase in the charge at present imposed upon the workers shall be made, other than is reasonably sufficient to make such service or services self-supporting.

7. A saw-filer who has more than eight saws to sharpen shall be supplied with an assistant.

8. Swamper's Work .-- Swamper's work shall consist of attending to one team only.

9. Shovels to be supplied.-Navvies and fettlers shall be entitled to be supplied by the employer with shovels.

a. d

10. Travelling Time.-(a.) Navvies shall be entitled to full pay for time occupied in travelling from their camp to work.

(b.) A worker called upon to work away from his home station shall be entitled to pay-

ment at ordinary rates for the time necessarily occupied in travelling to and from his work. 11. (a.) Piecework Fallers: Fortnightly Settlement, etc.—If any faller has twenty-five loads, or in the case of two fallers working together, if any such two fallers have more than be entitled to have the same measured by the employer's bush foreman or representative, and the employer shall, through such foreman or representative, issue to the faller a certificate of the result of such measurement. Upon presentation of such certificate to the paying officer the worker shall be entitled to payment forthwith to the extent of ninety per centum of the amount disclosed to be due by such certificate.

All logs hauled shall be measured at the mill or the bush landing. Should any log be docked such records shall be kept as will enable the faller to identify the log. The reason for such docking and the measurement of the log before and after docking shall be posted at the bush landing within three days after the next pay day. All trees felled by order of the bush boss shall be paid for in full.

(b.) Hewers.—On each pay day each sleeper hewer shall be entitled to receive payment for ninety per centum of the sleepers cut whether same have or have not been passed, on presentation of the bush foreman's certificate, which shall be obtainable in manner similar to that provided in the case of fallers in the preceding subclause.

12. Camps.—Where portable tents such as those used at Mornington bush camps are provided for bush workers other than hewers the labour necessary to shift camp shall be supplied by the employer.

In other cases the bush worker other than hewers shall be entitled to payment at his ordinary rate of pay for the time he is occupied in shifting camp; with a minimum of four hours' pay. The amount due to a pieceworker under this provision shall in the absence of mutual agreement be calculated on the average of amounts earned by such pieceworker during the three pay periods immediately preceding.
 13. Timber Cutter, Carter, Hewer-Notice.-In the event of a timber cutter, carter, or

hewer desiring to leave his employment he shall be paid in full for his work on giving three days' notice.

14. Hours of Labour.-(a.) The week's work except in the case of watchmen, firemen on locomotives, guards, grooms, and feeders, shall consist of forty-eight hours, which may be so arranged as to permit of more than eight hours being worked on each of the first five working days of the week in order to provide for a short day being worked on Saturday. The hours of work for feed-mixers shall be forty-eight per week of six days and may be

Day watchmen, from 6 a.m. to 6 p.m. (d.) The hours of labour for guards and firemen on locomotives shall be eight consecutive hours per day, exclusive of time absent for meals. Such workers shall, if the employer so desires, work for a further two hours per day at ordinary time rate. A minimum fortnightly wage equivalent to ninety-six hours per fortnight, exclusive of

Sundays, at the minimum rate hereinbefore prescribed shall be guaranteed and paid by the employer to each such guard and firemen ready and available for work.

This sub-clause shall not be deemed to create a right on either side to fourteen days' notice to terminate the service.

Firemen on locomotives shall be allowed and paid for one hour extra per day for early and late attendance. (e.) All work required to be performed beyond the hours hereinbefore prescribed shall

be considered overtime.

15. Overtime.-(a.) Overtime required to be performed by any worker, other than a guard or locomotive firemen, shall be paid for at the following rates :

For the first four hours, time and a-quarter; thereafter time and a-half. (b.) A guard or locomotive fireman required to work beyond ten consecutive hours exclusive of time absent for meals) in any one day shall be entitled to payment at the rate of time and a-half for all such work.

(ii.) Payment as for one hour's work if performed after 6 p.m. and before darkness ; (iii.) Payment as for two hours work if performed after darkness has set in, or on Sunday,

(iii.) Fayment as for two hours work in performed affected attracted darkness has set in, or on Sunday, or the holidays hereinafter mentioned.
 16. Holidays.—(i.) The following days, or the days which may be observed in lieu thereof, shall, except in the cases of grooms, feeders and watchmen, be observed as holidays :— Christmas Day, Boxing Day, New Year's Day, Proclamation Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday and Eight Hours' Day.
 (ii) Woold to be performed by workers of her then grooms feeders and worked.

(ii.) Work required to be performed by workers ofher than grooms feeders, and watch-men on any of the said days, or on Sunday, shall be calculated and paid for at the rate of time and a-half, and in the case of a guard or fireman with a minimum time allowance of four hours.

(iii.) Each groom, feeder, and watchman, shall be entitled to an annual holiday of two weeks' duration on full pay ; provided, however, that should the service be brought to a termination before the expiration of twelve months from the date upon which this award commences to have effect, the said two weeks' holiday shall be commuted to a holiday of one day for each calendar month's service. Provided further that in case the worker is dismissed for serious and wilful misconduct

provisions of this subclause shall not apply. The annual holiday shall be granted at such time during the year as may be mutally agreed the

upon between the employer and the worker concerned.

17. Under-rate Workers .- Any worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum rate of wage hereby prescribed may be employed at a lesser rate of wage to be agreed upon in writing between the worker and the secretary of the applicant union, and in default of such agreement within twenty-four hours after such worker shall have applied in writing to such secretary stating his desire that such wage should be agreed upon, such wage as shall be fixed by the most convenient resident or police magistrate upon the application of such worker after twenty-four hours' notice in writing shall have been given by him to the said secretary, who shall if he so desires be heard by the magistrate upon such application.

After having made application to the secretary and after lodging the application to the magistrate and pending the decision thereon in either case, the worker shall be entitled to work for and be employed by the employer at the proposed reduced wage.

The determination of the magistrate shall have effect for six calendar months from the date thereof, and after the expiration of the said period until the wage shall be again fixed, in the manner prescribed at the instance of the said secretary. The secretary may by writing under his hand appoint an agent or substitute to represent

the union at the hearing of any such application before a magistrate.

18. Boys.—The employer may employ boys under the age of nineteen years in any position, except that of sawyer, they are capable of filling at rates of pay commensurate with their age, abilities, and usefulness to the employer. Provided that any boy desiring such employment shall deliver to the employer or to his local manager a letter from the secretary

of the local or nearest branch of the union, intimating that the union desires employment be given such boy whose name and age shall be stated. 19. Stoppages.—All saws shall be changed in the employer's time, and any delay or stoppage occasioned by changing saws, repairing belts, breakage of machinery, or other cause shall be counted as working time and paid for: Provided that if any delay or stoppage occurs and a signal be given allowing workers to leave their work for at least half an hour the worker shall not be entitled to payment for time lost, and in that event the men shall resume work on the

signal being given for the purpose. 20. Night Shifts.—When a mill is worked by night as well as by day the employer shall as far as possible, arrange that the worker shall be required to work by night only on alternate weeks. Work performed on night shift shall entitle the worker to payment at the rate of one shilling per shift in addition to the minimum rate hereinbefore prescribed, except where such night shift work is rendered necessary in consequence of fire or other unforeseen disaster. 21. Rents not to be increased, etc.—The employer shall not during the currency of the award

either directly or indirectly increase the rents of the huts or houses now occupied by the workers in or about the mills, nor shall he deprive the worker of any privilege hitherto enjoyed by him.

22. Stores .- Where the employer supplies the workers with stores and supplies the prices charged shall not on the average be more than ten per centum above the prices generally current

in Perth for articles of a similar description and quality sold in like quantities. A current price list of the stores, groceries, ironmongery, and standard lines of drapery on sale shall be kept available for the use of customers in a conspicuous place in each store setting forth the price of each such article on sale therein.

Recognition of Union .- (a.) The employers shall officially recognise the applicant 23. union.

(b.) The employers in the employment of their workers shall not discriminate against members of the union, nor in the conduct of their business do anything with a view of directly or indirectly injuring the union. All workers shall work together in harmony. 24. Payment of Wages.—The workers shall be entitled to payment of wages twice during

each month.

25. Lower Duties .- Should a worker to meet the convenience of the employer be temporarily transferred to perform a class of work carrying a lesser minimum rate of wage than that at which he is usually employed he shall not, during such temporary transfer, suffer any reduction in his usual wage.

CECIL ANDREWS,

Director of Education.

Government University Exhibitions.

2. The said exhibitions shall be tenable for a period of three years and shall each be of the value of $\xi 40$ per annum in the case of students who are able to live at home while attending the University and of $\xi 60$ per annum in the case of students who are obliged to live away from home in order to attend the University. The Minister shall be the sole judge in case of any question as to the necessity for a student's living away from home.

3. Candidates for these exhibitions shall be required to pass the Leaving Certificate Examination and to satisfy the Department that they have reached the necessary standard for matriculation in all such subjects as are prescribed by the University.

4. (a.) Four subjects only, including English, will be taken into consideration.

(b.) One exhibition will be awarded to the candidate who obtains the highest marks in English and either History or Geography, one to the condidate who obtains the highest marks in Latin and Greek, one to the candidate who obtains the highest marks in French and German, one to the candidate who obtains the highest marks in Mathematics and either Applied Mathematics or Physics and one to the candidate who obtains the highest marks in any two of the following:—Biology, Geology, Chemistry, Physics. Provided that if the Minister considers that no candidate of sufficient merit has presented himself in any of the above groups, the exhibition in question shall be awarded on the same conditions as the remaining five.

(c.) The remaining five exhibitions shall be awarded to the five candidates who, after the exclusion of any who have already been successful in gaining exhibitions, have obtained the highest aggregates in any four subjects, including English, in which they have passed the examination.

(d.) The Minister reserves to himself the right to withhold all or any of the above exhibitions in the event of candidates not showing sufficient merit.
