Colonial Secretary's Office, Perth, 3rd April, 1914. HIS Excellency the Governor in Council has been pleased to approve of the following By-law made by the Fremantle Municipal Council, under the provisions of "The Health Act, 1911-12."

IN pursuance of the powers contained in "The Health Act, 1911-12," the Municipal Council of Fremantle, being the Local Authority in and for the Health District of Fremantle, doth hereby make the following Bylaw, with respect to the collection, destruction, and disposal of refuse and diseased or unsound fruit within its juvisitation. its jurisdiction :-

1. For the purposes of this By-law, "refuse" shall mean and include all waste food or foodscraps, whether liquid or solid or partly liquid or partly solid, and all

- diseased or unsound fruit and vegetable matter.

  2. No person except the Local Authority or its servants shall remove, sell, offer for sale, or in any way dispose of any refuse as defined in this By-law, except as hereinafter provided. Provided the occupier of a house may himself collect, remove, or dispose of his own refuse.
- 3. The occupier of any house who has on his premises any refuse as defined in this By-law shall deposit the same in a covered galvanised iron receptacle supplied by and to remain the property of the Local Authority for that purpose, and shall at all times keep such receptacle covered, save only when opened to deposit refuse therein. In the event of such receptacle not being of sufficient capacity to hold all such refuse, such occupier shall forthwith notify the Health Inspector to that effect.
- The receptacle as hereinbefore mentioned shall be stored on the premises of the occupier, in such place as the Health Inspector may from time to time direct, and shall be available for removal by the servants of the Local Authority at such times as the Inspector may appoint.

5. It shall not be lawful for the occupier of any house to dispose of or to store any refuse save as is hereinbefore provided, without the express permission in writing of the Local Authority being first had and obtained.

6. The occupier of any house wherein is kept any receptacle provided by the Local Authority for the reception of refuse, as defined in this By-law, shall permit such receptacle with its contents to be removed by the servants of the Local Authority as they may

deem expedient.
7. The occupier of every premises whereon a receptacle is provided as aforesaid shall protect such receptacle from wilful damage or injury whilst such

receptacle is on his premises.

8. It shall be the duty of the Local Authority to provide a suitable place, buildings, and appliances for dealing with refuse in such a way as to prevent the same becoming a nuisance and offensive or injurious to health, and after all such material has been so dealt with the Local Authority may sell or otherwise dispose of same, and all profits derived therefrom shall be paid into the local fund.

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Health Act, 1911-12," a Local Health Authority may make By-laws: Now, therefore, the Narrogin Municipal Council, being the Local Health Authority for the Municipal District of Narrogin, do hereby make the following By-laws:—

# PART II .- INFECTIOUS DISEASES.

Inspection of premises
1. An inspector shall visit all premises in the district at least once in each period of six months, and so much more frequently as may be necessary, and immediately after every such inspection shall submit a report to the Local Authority on the condition of such premises, specifying any breach of the provisions of the Act or the Recordations or Parloys made thereauder. Regulations or By-laws made thereunder.

Cleansing and disinfection of premises.

2. The occupier of any premises shall cleanse and disinfect such premises or any part thereof at such times and in such manner as the inspector may direct.

Contacts liable to restrictions.

After it has been found that a person in any 3. After it has been found that a person in any house is suffering from an infectious disease, any inmate of such house, or any person who enters or quits such house, shall be deemed to be a contact, and shall be liable to restrictions, and obey such instructions as the Local Authority or its Medical Officer may direct or issue, and may be removed to an isolated place provided for that purpose; and if so removed, shall remain in such place for such period as the Medical Officer may direct direct.

Premises may be declared "isolated."
4. For the prevention of the spread of infectious disease, the Local Authority may from time to time declare any house or premises to be infected, and no person shall quit or enter any house or premises which has been de clared by the Local Authority to be infected, without the written consent of such authority.

Disinfection of personal effects.
When required by the Medical Officer, any person shall attend at such place as the said officer shall indicate, for the purpose of the disinfection of his body, clothing, and effects, in such manner as may be directed by the Medical Officer.

Occupier to permit disinfection.
6. The occupier of any premises whereon any case of infectious disease has occurred shall, when required by the inspector, permit such inspector to disinfect the premises or any part thereof and any articles therein.

Premises upon which infectious disease reported to be

inspected.

7. Upon receipt of a notification of a case of infectious disease, an inspector shall visit the premises whereon the case has occurred, and shall make inquiries as to the mode of contraction of infection, the means taken for preventing the spread of infection, and any other circumstances in connection with the occurrence of the case, and shall immediately after the removal of the patient, or if treated upon the premises, immediately after such patient is declared to be convalescent, disinfect such premises or such parties thereof and also such such premises or such portion thereof, and also such articles therein as he deems necessary or as the Medical Officer may direct.

Insanitary buildings to be destroyed.

8. The owner of any premises shall, when required by the Local Authority, destroy any insanitary house, building, or thing, or shall execute such amendments to such house, building, or thing as may be required by the Local Authority.

Infected animals to be destroyed.

9. The occupier of any premises shall, on being so ordered by a Local Authority, immediately destroy any infected animal which may be in his possession or upon premises occupied by him.

# Destruction of rats.

10. The owner, tenant, or occupier of every premises shall, at all times, destroy any rats or mice therein, and such method for destruction shall be used as may be directed or approved by the Local Authority.

#### Preventing the harbourage of rats.

11. The owner, tenant, or occupier of any premises shall, when so ordered by the Local Authority, carry out within the time specified such structural and other alterations thereto and to the drains thereof as may be directed, so as to render the buildings and drains sanitary, and to prevent the same being accessible to or a harbour-

Disposal of body of person dead of an infectious disease.

12. The occupier of any premises whereon there lies the body of any person who has died of an infectious disease shall cause such body to be buried or disposed of in such method, within such time and with such precautions as may be directed by the Medical Officer, provided that no such body shall be removed from the premises where death occurred except to a cemetery.

Medical Officer may examine persons.

13. The Medical Officer may enter any house and examine bacteriologically or otherwise any inmate of such house, or any person found thereon at the time of such visit, for the purpose of ascertaining whether such in-mate or person is suffering from an infectious disease or is a medium for the transmission of an infectious disease, and such person shall submit to such examination and shall permit the Medical Officer to remove such specimens as he considers necessary to a proper examination.

# Certificates in cases of diphtheria.

14. When under Section 238 of the Act a medical certificate is given as applying to a case of diphtheria, the certificate must specify that a bacteriological examination has been made with a negative result.

#### Certificates on return of children to school.

15. No parent shall send to school any child who has been suffering from an infectious disease or who has been in contact with any person who has been so suffer-ing unless a certificate has been obtained from a medical practitioner and is presented to the head teacher of the school to which the child is sent, certifying that such child is free from infection. Any such certificate shall be approved and endorsed by the Medical Officer.

#### Special pan service.

16. (a) Whenever required by an inspector a special pan service shall be maintained by the Local Authority or the contractor, as the case may be, at any premises. Such service shall consist of a duplicate pan of the type described in By-law 7, Part I., and the exterior type described in By-law 7, Part I., and the exterior of such special pan shall be painted yellow or red; such pan shall be treated at the sanitary site separately from the other pans, and its contents before burial shall be thoroughly mixed with an equal quantity of a disinfecting solution equal in strength to 5 per cent. pure carbolic acid.

(b) When any pan is left at premises as abovementioned, it shall contain sufficient disinfecting solution of the above strength to cover the bottom of such pan to a depth of at least one inch.

pan to a depth of at least one inch.

#### Special disinfection in typhoid cases.

17. The occupier of every premises whereon a case of typhoid fever exists shall disinfect or cause to be disinfected all discharges of the patient before such discharges are placed in the pan provided in accordance with the preceding By-law.

#### Library books.

18. (a) The person in charge of any library shall not there is any case of infectious disease.

(b) Any person residing at a house wherein a case of infectious disease.

any book obtained from any lending library shall, before returning such book to any library, disinfect the said book.

#### Penalties for breaches of By-laws.

19. Where anything by this part of the By-laws is directed to be done or forbidden to be done, or where authority is given to any officer to direct anything to be done or to forbid anything to be done, and such act so directed to be done is done, in every such case the person making default as to such direction and pro-hibition respectively shall be deemed guilty of a breach hibition respectively shall be deemed guilty of a breach of this part of the said By-laws. And every person guilty of a breach of this part of the said By-laws shall be liable, for every such offence, besides any costs or expenses which may be incurred in the taking of proceedings against such person guilty of such offence, to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for every breach of any such By-law, or to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued, and in addition to such penalty shall be liable to pay to the Local Authority any expense incurred by such authority in consequence of any breach or non-observance of any By-law, or in the execubreach or non-observance of any By-law, or in the execution of any work directed to be executed and not so

# NORTH FREMANTLE GOVERNMENT ABATTOIRS.

Regulations framed under "The Abattoirs Act, 1909." The following Regulations relate to the Government Abattoir at North Fremantle:

Throughout these Regulations:-

1st April, 1914.

(a.) The term "Officer-in-charge" means the controller or any person for the time being responsible for the management of the Abattoir.

(b.) The term "owner" means any person delivering stock at the Abattoir for slaughter and dressing, whether actually owner thereof or not, and the Officer-in-charge shall not be bound to inquire as to ownership or the authority of such person as to the stock. (c.) "The Abattoir" means the North Fremantle

Government Abattoirs.

#### Officer-in-charge.

The duty of the Officer-in-charge shall be:—

 (a.) To engage the staff and slaughtermen and other persons engaged in connection with slaughtering stock in the Abattoir, and to control and direct the working of the Abat 

toir, and particularly-

(b.) To see that the provisions of "The Abattoirs Act, 1909," and any amendment thereof, and these or any other Regulations which may from time to time be framed thereunder, are duly observed and complied with, and if necessary to enforce the same and prosecute any person guilty of an offence against or breach of the said Act or any Regulations made thereunder, and otherwise to sue for and recover any moneys payable for the slaughter or retention of stock or curing of hides and skips hereinefter prescribed. hides and skins hereinafter prescribed.

(e.) To keep such books of account and records of owners and slaughtering, and do and perform

owners and slaughtering, and do and perform such other acts, matters, and things in relation to the Abattoir as shall from time to time be recessary for its purpose and be required by law or the Minister.

(d.) If deemed necessary by the Minister, the Officer-in-charge acting under his instructions may let any portion of the Abattoir from day to day for slaughtering purposes, on such terms and conditions as the Officer-in-charge shall prescribe, otherwise subject to charge shall prescribe, otherwise subject to such of the Regulations in respect of the Goldfields Government Abattoirs as are fairly applicable to the Abattoir.

Hours of Business.

3. Except as otherwise notified by advertisement at the Abattoir and—or—in a daily newspaper circulating in Fremantle and suburbs, the Abattoir shall be open for work between the hours of 8 a.m. and 8 p.m. daily, except on Sundays and public holidays observed at Fremantle, and also at any time on holidays or any other than usual working hours as the Officer-in-charge may from time to time prescribe or allow.

Manner of Slaughter and Dressing.

4. Stock shall be slaughtered and dressed in such numbers and in such manner as the Officer-in-charge shall from time to time direct.

#### Charges.

5. (a.) Slaughter and dressing shall be charged for at the following rates:—

4s. per head Cattle 5d. Sheep and Lambs do. . . Calves .. .. .. 1s. do. 38. Pigs

except that for slaughtering and dressing done on holidays and any other than the usual working hours the

charges shall be double.

(b.) The following charges shall be made for supply of food and water to such stock, pending slaughter, as shall not be fed and watered by the owner, namely:—

Cattle—1s. 3d. per head per day or part of a day. Sheep, Lambs, and Pigs—2d. per head per day or

part of a day. (c.) The charges for curing hides and skins shall be at the ruling rates.

All charges shall be payable on or before delivery to the owner or agent.

# Delivery at Abattoir.

6. Stock shall be delivered to the Officer-in-charge at the gates of the Abattoir, with the owners' brands or other marks legibly shown thereon, at any time between sunrise and sunset, accompanied by a statement of ownership, and the number, kind, and brands or other marks of identification of such stock and of the daily slaughtering required, subject to the absolute right of the Officer-in-charge to refuse to accept delivery of all or any stock.

#### Retention.

7. The Officer-in-charge may refuse to allow stock to occupy the Abattoir pens or small yards attached thereto for a longer period than 24 hours before the slaughter.

#### Notice.

8. As each owner's stock is being slaughtered he may deliver to the Officer-in-charge a daily order in writing for slaughter of his stock according to his requirements, provided such order is given not later than 10 a.m.

from the Officer-in-charge all carcases upon completion of slaughter, dressing, and Government inspection, and all hides and skins on completion of curing, and the receipt thereof shall be acknowledged in writing upon such forms as the Officer-in-charge may provide or request, by such owner or agent, at the time of such delivery.

Such delivery shall be made at the Abattoir siding, and the owner or agent shall be obliged to receive same or supply to the Officer-in-charge an order in writing to make delivery into trucks or other vehicles, in which latter case a certificate of the Abattoir employee effecting delivery shall be conclusive as to the tally.

Offal.

Offal.

10. The offal, consisting of head, feet, tail, heart, tripe, and caul fat shall be the property of the owner, in accordance with the practice of the trade, and the same shall be removed by the owner within twelve (12) hours after slaughter; failing which the same shall become the absolute property of the Government without compensation or redress to the owner. The blood and viscera of slaughtered stock shall be retained by the Officer-in-charge as the property of the Government.

#### Retention of Carcases.

11. Any stock or part of stock condemned by a Government inspector as being unfit for human consumption, or any carcase found on slaughter to be subject to disease, shall be confiscated by the Officer-in-charge for the Minister, and the Officer-in-charge may retain any carcase, or portion of a carcase, and sell the same, without notice, by private sale or by public auction, in the event of any charges payable for the slaughter and dressing thereof or of any other stock of the same owner or any other proper charge being not duly paid: All proceeds of such sale shall be applied (first) in paying the cost thereof, (second) in payment of all moneys as aforesaid owing by the owner, and any balance remaining shall be paid to the owner.

### Responsibility.

12. The Minister or the Department of Agriculture and Industries shall not be responsible for any loss or damage to stock, carcases, carcase ment, offal, or hides and skins, not arising from the proven neglect or default of their own servants.

13. No person shall remove any stock, carcase, carcase meat, offal, hide, or skin, or interfere in the work done at the Abattoir, without the written authority or consent of the Officer-in-charge, and no person shall intrude or trespass upon the Abattoir grounds.

#### BUILDING BY-LAWS.

Plans and Specifications of Buildings.

34. a. Every person intending to erect, alter, or add to any building within the Road Area now or hereafter to be prescribed under the Building Regulations, shall, before commencing, deposit with the Secretary for approval, drawings showing the plans, elevations, and sections of such building, alterations, or additions, together with full and complete specifications of the works proposed to be done.

#### Scale of Fees.

35. The following fees shall be paid by the owner or builder to the Road Board in respect of all buildings to be erected or altered or any matter required or permitted under these By-laws, or the Roads Act :-

# External Walls.

36. Materials of external walls of buildings within the prescribed area of the Road District must be built of brick or stone or artificial stone, wood, or iron, or other material approved by the Board, and such, materials must be sound and subject to the approval of the Surveyor.

(2.) All main walls of brick or stone must have a thick-

ness not less than as prescribed below, viz. :

(a.) If the wall does not exceed 25 feet in height it shall be 81 inches thick.

(b.) Over 25 feet, but not exceeding 40 feet, 13 inches thick below the topmost storey, and 8½ inches thick for the rest of its height.
(c.) Over 40 feet, 17½ inches thick for the height

of one storey, then 13 inches below the top-

most storey, and then 8½ inches thick.
(3.) The party walls of brick buildings must have parapet walls with a damp-proof course at level of flashing and a capping of 1 to 1 cement mortar, and finished off with a pure

cement wash, to level of flashing.

(4.) In the case of a terrace of shops and dwellings, or of dwellings only, the front room and that immediately behind it, may be built to the full width of the allotment or tenement. All other rooms must have a clear space on one side of at least 4ft. 6in. in the clear between the dividing line of such tenement and the external walls of such rooms for the free admission of air and light. There must be 9 feet in the clear between the external walls of every pair of such constructed terraces, and all windows and ventilators must be opened on to the light and air space there provided for. No two or more dwellings or business premises will be permitted to have any yard or buildings in common save and except when in occupation of the same tenant or occu-

d. If any external wall or enclosure be at any time hereafter taken down or otherwise demolished for the height of one storey, or for the space equal to one-fourth of the whole surface of such external wall, then every part thereof not built in the manner and of the several materials by these By-laws directed for external walls must be taken down, and the same must be re-built in such manner and with such materials for and in all respects as by these By-laws directed for external walls hereafter to be built within the prescribed area of the Road District, and it shall be within the power of the Secretary or Building Surveyor to enforce the rebuilding of same.

# Party Walls.

37. In reference to the component parts thereof, every part of such party wall must be built of sound bricks or stone, or of such bricks and stone together, laid in with mortar or cement, and in such a manner as to produce solid work; and as to the woodwork which it may be desired to connect with party walls of any building, the bearing ends of wooden beams, breastsummers, girders, trimming joists, and the ends of partition heads and sills, and the bearing ends of the main timbers of any roof, and wood bricks, may

be laid into the substances of a party wall, but no such beam, breastsummer, girder, joist, partition, head, or sill, nor any part of a roof, being wood, nor any wood bricks, must be laid or placed within two inches of the centre of any party wall, and no other wood work of any kind must be laid into, placed upon, or driven into any part of the substance of any party wall; but if the ends of the timber be carried in iron shoes or stone corbels, then such iron shoes or corbels must be built into the wall at least one-half of the thickness of such wall; and the top of every such party wall must be finished with one course of sound hard bricks; set on edge in good mortar or cement, or by a coping of any other properly secured and sufficiently waterproof and fireproof covering.

#### Roofs, etc.

38. With regard to the roof, flat, or gutter of any building, any or every projection therefrom, and also balconies and shop-fronts, they must be so arranged and constructed and so supplied with gutters and pipes so as to prevent the water from dripping on to or running over the public way, and all such rain pipes, eaves, and gutters are to be made of metal.

#### Rooms.

39. (1) With regard to rooms in any part of any building in reference to height thereof, every room used, or intended to be used, for the purpose of habitation, must be at least the height of 10 feet from floor to ceiling, with the exception of scillions, which must be 9 feet high in respect to new buildings, and 8 feet high in respect to buildings

(2.) Every room used for the purpose of habitation, or for the assemblage of people for any purpose whatever, shall be well and properly ventilated to the satisfaction of the Surveyor or of the Board, by the insertion of air bricks below the floor, and by openings in the sleeper walls, also by ventilators in the ceiling or at the top of the walls thereof according to the size of such walls. No room shall contain

less than 600 feet of air space when finished.

#### Breastsummers.

40. All breastsummers shall be either of iron or approved wood, and to be loaded to one-third only of their breaking weight.

# Fire-places.

41. Every fire-place constructed of iron shall be lined with brick or stone built to a height of three feet from the level of the fire rest, and not less than 41 inches thick, and the hearth of every such fire-place or chimney must be laid and bedded wholly on brick or stone or other incombustible substance; such hearth must consist of a slab or slabs of brick, tile, stone, or slate, iron, or other proper and sufficient substance at least 12 inches longer than the opening of the chimney when finished, and at least 18 inches in front of the arch over the same.

#### Wood and Iron Buildings.

42. The external walls of all wood and iron buildings must be built at least 4ft. 6in. from the dividing boundary of the property upon which the building is being erected, and the adjoining property. The inside walls shall be of lath and plaster, metal, T. and G. jarrah, or other material approved of by the Board.

# Temporary Buildings.

43. With regard to the granting of permission for the erection of temporary buildings, special permission may be granted by the Board for a period to be stated for the erection of temporary buildings; all the walls may be of wood or iron.

#### Verandahs and Balconies.

44. (1.) Awnings or verandahs to be erected over the footpaths are to be in accordance with the drawings and specifications approved of by the Surveyor and adopted by the Board. The minimum height is to be 8ft 6in. clear from the footpath, and the posts must not be less than 5in. x 5in. if in jarrah. The verandah must be painted and kept in repair to the satisfaction of the Secretary or Surveyor, who shall have the power to order such repairs to the verandahs generally, as he may deem necessary. In the event of neglect, or of the Surveyor observing the necessity o removal or repair, such must be commenced within seve

days of the report of notice from the Secretary or Surveyor, and must be completed within fourteen days of such notice, or otherwise the verandahs will be removed at the expense of the owner or occupier, to be recoverable from him in a summary manner before justices.

(2.) Balconies.—Verandah posts must be not less than

6in. x 6in. jarrah, 2 feet in ground, with a sole plate to be in one length equal to the extreme length of the balcony, of 9in. x 2in. jarrah. A top plate not less than 9in. x 2in. oregon or jarrah. Bearers not less than 6in. x 3in. oregon, not more than 4ft. 6in. apart. Joists not less than 4in. x not more than 4tt. 6m. apart. Joists not less than 4m. x 2in. with 1ft. 6in. centres. Floors T. and G. 1 1-8in. thick. Verandah posts not less than 4in. x 4in. Rafters not less than 4in x 2in. Top plate not less than 6in. x 2in. All plates to be bolted to the posts. The floor of balconics shall not be less than 10 feet from surface of footpath.

(3.) No balcony supported wholly from cantilevers or corbelled out from the wall will be permitted unless specially supported in writing by the Board.

#### Contractors' Sheds.

45. Nothing in these By-laws shall prevent any contractor or builder erecting a temporary office, sheds, or workshops of wood or iron on any building site during the building operations, providing that special application must be made to, and permission granted by the Secretary or Surveyor. Surveyor.

#### Chimneys-Domestic and Factory.

46. Every chimney shaft or flue hereafter built, raised, or repaired, must be carried up in brick or stone work all round, at least 4 inches thick to a height of at least 3 feet above the highest of such portion of roof, flat, or gutter adjoining thereto, measured at the point of junction. As to any chimney-shaft (except that of a steam-engine, brewery, distillery or manufactory), the brick or stone of such shaft or flue must not be built higher than 8 feet above the slope or flat or gutter which it adjoins, measured from the highest point of junction, unless such chimney-shaft shall be built of increased thickness or be built with and bonded with another chimney-shaft, or be otherwise rendered secure. As to the chimney-shaft for the boiler furnace of any steam engine or for any brewery, distillery, or manufactory, such shaft may be erected of any height so that it be built in such a manner and of such strength and dimensions as shall be satisfactory to the Secretary or Surveyor upon special appli-cation made and approved in each case.

# Chimney Pots.

47. As to earthen or metal chimney-pots, tubes, funnels, or cowls of any description whatever-If such pot, tube, funnel, or cowl, be higher than 4ft. above the brick or stone work of the flue upon which the same shall be erected, then it must be fixed 12 inches at the least into the brick or stone work of the flue on which it shall be placed or otherwise fixed to the satisfaction of the Surveyor.

# Power to Surveyor to Enter and Remove.

When anything shall have been done or omitted to be done in contravention of these By-laws, it shall be lawful for the Surveyor or Secretary, at his discretion, to enter on the premises and remove or cause to be removed any buildings or other things which have been erected in contravention thereof, or to do or cause to be done any act or thing which should have been done in pursuance thereof, and the cost of such doing shall be borne and paid by such owner or other person in addition to any penalties to which he may be liable in respect thereof under these Bylaws or Regulations.

#### Bench Marks, etc.

All survey levels, bench-marks, or other marks denoting the same shall be carefully preserved, and any person removing, altering, or obliterating or causing or permitting same to be removed, altered, or obliterated, shall be liable to a penalty of £10, and to pay all costs incurred in replacing or restoring same.

#### Mutual and Parapet Walls.

50. All walls erected within 2ft. of the boundary of allotment must have parapet walls with copings, the walls in every case, being carried up as per By-law No. 88

#### Cornices, etc.

No cornice or other ornament shall project beyond the alignment of the street more than 18 inches, and must not be lower than 15 feet above the level of the footpath.

#### Cellars and Lights.

52. No cellar will be allowed under the pavement of the street, and authority for fixing prismatic or other lights on the pavement must be obtained in writing from the Board before being fixed.

#### Earth Closets.

53. Under no circumstances must any earth-closet be built nearer to any dwelling or shop than 20 feet. In cases where the back line of allotments abuts on a right of way which runs alongside of other premises, the closets must not be placed nearer to the side of the right of way that forms the side line of another property than 34ft. for a distance of 75ft. from the street line off which the right-ofway runs.

#### Plans.

All plans of buildings and alterations must be examined and approved by the Board, and such approval certified to on the original drawings.

# BY-LAWS.

By virtue of all powers in that behalf vested in the Trustees of the Public Cemetery, the said Trustees make the following By-laws:

1. All fees and charges payable to the Trustees, as set forth in the Schedule A, shall be paid at the times and manner

therein mentioned.

2. Any person desiring to inter any dead body in the cometery shall make an application to the Trustees. Upon such application being approved by the Trustees, and upon payment of the prescribed fees, they shall cause to be issued to the person so applying an order for burial.

3. All applications for interment shall be made at least five working hours prior to the time fixed for burial. An extra charge shall be made for applications within such time. No free interment shall be allowed unless the application, together with the Justice's order therefor, be handed in in such time as to allow of at least five working hours as above.

The Trustees shall cause all graves to be dug, and vaults, brick graves, or graves to be re-opened as and when

5. Before any interment is allowed the "Order for burial" shall be handed to and retained by the gravedigger.

3. Every grave shall be at least six feet deep, and no interment shall be allowed in any grave with a less depth than four feet six inches from the top of the coffin to the original surface of the surrounding ground.

In the case of an application for interment in any private grave or vault to which the deceased had no claim during life, the written and verified consent of the grantee

shall be handed in with the application.

8. No burial shall be allowed to take place in the cemetery unless a certificate from a District Registrar of Deaths, that the death has been registered, or a Coroner's order for burial is handed to the Trustees.

9. The hours for burial shall be as follows:-

1st September to 30th April-Daily, from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m.

1st May to 31st August-Daily from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.

and no burial shall be allowed to take place, nor any coffin to enter the cemetery at any other hour, except by written permission of the Trustees.

The time fixed for any burial shall be the time at which the funeral is to arrive at the cemetery gates, and such time shall be rigidly and punctually observed.

11. No hearse, mourning coach, or other vehicle shall enter the cemetery, or proceed, except at and by such roads as directed by the officer of the Trustees from time to time. Any driver or other person fulling or neglecting to observe such directions commits an offence against these by-laws.

12. Children under the age of ten years entering the

cemetery must be in charge of some responsible person.

13. It shall be unlawful for any person to smoke within

the cemetery, or to discharge any fireworks within.

14. No dogs shall be allowed within the cemetery, and any person taking a dog into the cemetery commits an offence against these By-laws.

15. Any person violating the rules of propriety and decorum, or committing any nuisance or trespass, or injuring any tree, shrub, flower, border, or any erection, commits an offence against these By-laws.

1c. No person shall promote, or advertise, or carry on within the cemetery, any trade, business, or calling, either by solicitation, distribution of circulars, by cards, or otherwise, or by any other system of advertisement whatsoever.

17. No person employed by or under the Trustees shall accept any gratuity whatever, nor shall he be pecuniarily interested in any work in the cemetery other than the remuneration he receives from the Trustees; and such person proved guilty of accepting any gratuity or being pecuniarily interested in any such work shall be liable to summary dis-

- 18. Any person requiring an "exclusive right of burial" in any part of the cemetery shall apply to the Trustees, in writing, specifying the location of the grave, and whether it is proposed to erect a brick grave or vault, and in such case submitting plans and specifications of the proposed work. Such application shall also state the names of any already deceased persons whose remains it is proposed to inter therein.
- 19. Subject to the By-laws, the Superintendent shall exercise and control over all matters pertaining to the cemetery, including the conduct of all funerals and interments within the cemetery.
- 20. Upon being satisfied of the matters aforesaid, and of the suitability of the said work, plans and specifications, the Trustees may authorise the construction and erection thereof, or, if no work is to be done, may issue a "Grant" in the form "E" in the Schedule.
- 21. Upon the completion of the work aforesaid, the Trustees may, if and when such is done to their complete satisfaction, issue a "Grant" in the Form "E" in the Schedule.
- 22. Every "Grant" shall be subject to the By-laws for the time being, and no interment in any such grave or vault shall be allowed unless upon production of the "Order for burial" aforesaid, nor shall any such grave or vault be opened, unless with the written consent of the Trustees.
- 23. Every coffin in any such bricked grave or vault shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered with a slab of stone, slate, or iron, unless special written exemption be obtained from the Trustees.
- 24. If application be made for an "Order for burial" in any grave or vault of any person other than the person to whom grant was issued, or his registered assign, the written and verified consent of such grantee or assignee shall be produced.
- 25. Any person desiring to erect any monument, tomb-stone, or enclosure in any part of the cemetery, must first obtain the written consent and approval of the Trustees, and otherwise comply with section 23 of the "Cemeteries Act, 1897," and shall have such fees as the Trustees shall from time to time direct.
- 26. Every tombstone, monument, or enclosure shall be placed on proper and substantial foundations, which, if required by the Trustees, shall extend to the bottom of the grave.
- 27. The materials used in every such erection, shall be subject to the approval of the Trustees, and any material rejected shall be immediately removed from the cemetery by the contractor for the erection.

28. All refuse and other rubbish remaining after any work is completed shall be immediately removed from the

cemetery by the person causing the same.

29. Monumental masons and other tradesmen shall, before commencing any work within the cemetery, deposit with the Secretary to the Trustees the sum of ten shillings, which shall be forfeited if either of the two last preceding By-laws are not complied with to the satisfaction of the Trustees

30. All materials required in the erection and completion of any work shall, as far as possible, be prepared before being taken to the cemetery, and all materials required by tradesmen shall be admitted at such entrance as the Trustees shall direct, and no vehicle conveying any such material with wheels less than four inches broad shall be permitted to enter the cemetery.

31. No catacomb shall be allowed.

32. All workmen, whether employed.

All workmen, whether employed by the Trustees or by any other person, shall at all times, whilst within the boundaries of the cemetery be subject to the supervision of the Trustees, and shall obey such directions as they may

find it necessary to give.

33. And any working man permitting any breach of these Regulations and By-laws, or r. fusing or neglecting to comply with any directions of the Trustees, commits an

offence against these By-laws.

- 34. Any person taking in dressing or attending to any grave shall comply with these Rules:—

  (a.) No sand, soil, or loam shall be taken from any portion of the cemetery for the purpose of dressing any grave, except with permission of the Trustees
  - (b.) No rubbish, soil, sand, or material removed shall be placed on any other grave, and, if placed on any adjoining ground shall be removed im-mediately the work is completed.

The dressing of all graves, and the wheeling and carting of all material shall be subject to the supervision of the Trustees.

Work in all cases shall be carried on with due despatch, and only during regulation hours.

35. Any person who commits a breach of, or an offence

against any By-law may be expelled from the cemetery.

The foregoing By-laws, with the accompanying Schedules, were duly framed, and presented to a meeting of the Board of Trustees, held at their office on the 24th of May, 1913.
