WHEREAS by Section 9 of "The Fisheries Act, 1905-13," it is provided that the Governor may, by Proclamation, prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever, in every or any specified portion of Western Australian purposes by mean of fishing roots and fishing. Matsoever, in every or any specified portion of western Australian waters, by means of fishing nets and fishing lines, or either of such means of capture, or by any other specified means of capture, for any specified term: Now therefore I, the said Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby, in exercise of the powers aforesaid and of every other power enabling me in this behalf, proclaim and declare as follows:-

That all that portion of Western Australian waters defined in the Schedule hereto shall be closed against the use of fishing nets and fishing lines as from the date of this Proclamation to the 31st day of December, 1916, inclusive.

Schedule.

The whole of the waters of the channel entrance to Hardy's Inlet (Augusta), situated between a line drawn in a North-Easterly direction from Duke's Head (on the Western side of the Inlet) to Point Frederick (on the Eastern side of the Inlet), and a line drawn in a Westerly direction from Point Irwin (on the Eastern side of the Inlet) to a point where the Southern boundary of Hurford Street touches the foreshore on the Western side of the River.

Insect Pests Amendment Act, 1898.

PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, By His Excellency Major General Sir Harry Barron, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of St. Harry Barron.

[L.S.] Harry Barron, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of St. George, Commander of the Royal Victorian Order, Governor in and over the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies, in the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS by "The Insert Pests Amendment Act. 1898," it is provided that the Governor may from time to time by proclamation:—

- (1.) Prohibit, either absolutely or except in accordance with regulations under the said Act, the introduction into Western Australia, either generally or from any specific colony, country, port, or place, of any plant, fruit, fungus, parasite, insect, or anything which, in his opinion, is likely to introduce any disease into Western Australia;
- (2.) Prohibit, either absolutely or except in accordance with regulations under the said Act, the bringing into any specified portion of western Australia, from any other portion of Western Australia, from any other portion or specified portion of Western Australia, of any specified plant, fruit, fungus, parasite, insect, or other thing, which, in his opinion, is diseased or likely to spread disease;

 (3.) Appoint any specified ports to be the only ports of entry for plants or fruit, or for any specified plant or fruit:

And whereas in the opinion of His Excellency the Governor the introduction into Western Australia of potatoes and of second-hand bags used for the carriage

of potatoes from any of the other States of the Com-monwealth is likely to introduce and spread in Western Australia the following diseases, namely:-

Bacillus solanacearum (Brown Rot or Potato Bacteriosis,

Chrysophlyctis endobiotica (known as Potato Can-ker, Black Scab, Warty Disease, and Cauliflower

Disease of Potato),

Fusarium, spp. (Collar Rot, Foot Rot, Leaf Spot,
Dry Rot of Potato),

Oospora scabies (Thaxter), (Potato Scab),

Phytophthora Infestans (Potato disease, otherwise known as Irish Blight),

Anguillulidoe, spp. (Eelworms),

Lita Solanella (Potato Moth),

Doryphora decen-lineata (Colorado Potato Beetle):
And whereas it is therefore deemed by His Excellency
the Governor necessary and expedient to prohibit, except as hereinafter provided, the introduction into Western Australia of potatoes from the State of Queensland, and to restrict and regulate by regulations made and, and to restrict and regulate by regulations made as aforesaid the introduction of potatoes from the States of New South Wales, Victoria, South Australia, and Tasmania; and to prohibit the introduction into Western Australia of second-hand potato bags, unless disinfected as provided in such regulations as aforesaid; and to prohibit the introduction of potatoes and second-hand potatoes have into their portion of Western Australia decease. potato bags into that portion of Western Australia described in the schedule hereto, from any other portion of Western Australia: And whereas to enable the regulations made or to be made under the said Act for the inspection of imported potatoes to be carried into effect it is necessary to appoint certain ports to be the only ports of entry for potatoes: And whereas it is expedient to substitute, as from the date hereof, the provisions of this Proclamation for those of the Proclamation made under the said Act and published in the Government Gazette on the 22nd day of November, 1912: Now therefore I, the said Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby, except as hereinafter provided:-

- (a.) Prohibit absolutely the introduction into West-ern Australia of any potatoes the product of, or directly or indirectly from, the State of Queensland;
- (b.) Prohibit the introduction into Western Australia of any potatoes the product of, or directly or indirectly from, the States of New South Wales, Victoria, South Australia, or Tasmania, except in accordance with regulations made by Order in Council under "The Insect Pests Amendment Act, 1898";
- (c.) Appoint the following ports, namely, the ports of Eucla, Fremantle, Perth, and Geraldton, and all ports North of Geraldton, to be the only ports of entry for potatoes and potato bags, and prohibit the introduction of potatoes and potato bags into Western Australia at any other port or place;
- (d.) Prohibit absolutely the bringing into that portion of Western Australia specified in the schedule hereto, from any other portion of Western Australia, of any potatoes or secondhand potato bags;
- (c.) Revoke, as from the date hereof, the said Revoke, as from the date hereof, the said Proclamation published on the 22nd day of November, 1912, but so as not to affect the past operation thereof, and subject to such and the like savings as apply by virtue of "The Interpretation Act, 1898," in the ease of the repeal of a Statute.

Provided that seed potatoes the property of the Department of Agriculture may be brought into the area described in the schedule hereto, with the consent, in writing, of the Minister for Agriculture.

And I, the said Governor, with the advice and consent And I, the said Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, as aforesaid, do hereby prohibit the introduction into Western Australia from the States of New South Wales, Victoria, South Australia, Queensland, and Tasmania, of second-hand potato bags, either empty or containing goods, unless such bags are disinfected as hereinbefore mentioned.

This Proclamation shall have operation and effect on and from the date of its publication in the Government Gazette of the State of Western Australia.

Schedule.

All that portion of Western Australia situate South of lines starting from Point John, near Cape Peron, and extending Easterly along the shores of Mangles Ba to the terminus of the Rockingham-Jarrahdale Railway thence Easterly along the said railway, but excluding Mundijong Townsite, to the South-East corner of Location 518; thence Easterly to the North-West corner of Location 60, near the 35-mile on the Perth-Albany Road; thence East to the East boundary of the Rockingham-Jarrahdale Timber Company's concession; thence North to the North-West corner of the late P.P.R. 8/251; thence East to the North corner of Avon Location 6010; thence East-North-Easterly partly along the South-South Foot boundaries of Locations 29, 2009, 2008, and South-East boundaries of Locations 23, 909, 908, and 1652 to the extreme South-West corner of the Avondale Estate; thence in a general East-North-Easterly direction along the South-South-East boundaries of Lots 1 and 2 of that estate and part of the South-South-East boundary of Location 14 to the latter's East corner; thence South-South-East to a point situate West-South-West from the South corner of Location 1180; thence West from the South corner of Location 1180; thence East-North-East partly along the South-South-East boundaries of Location 1180 and 1217, Beverley Townsite, and part of the North-North-West boundary of Location M to Road No. 104; thence in a general Easterly direction along Roads Nos. 104 and 662 and to the old Beverley-Goldfields Road, via the North boundary of Location 9518, Pikaring, Wialkutting, Quarebia. Kumminin Wadderin and Graball to the No. 1 Rabbit. Kumminin, Wadderin, and Graball, to the No. 1 Rabbit-proof Fence near the 38-mile post; thence South-East erly along the said fence to a point in the latitude of Mount Ridley situate near the 165-mile post; thence East through the survey mark on Mount Ridley to a point situate North from the cairn on Hoursk Hill. and thence South to the sea-shore, and thence following the sea-coast Westward and Northward to the starting point.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by "The Insect Pests Amendment Act, 1898," the Governor by Order in Council may from time to time make such Regulations as he deems necesary for any purpose for which Regulations are contemplated by the said Act, or which he deems necessary for giving full effect to the said Act. Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the Regulations set forth in the Schedule hereto, and doth hereby declare that the said Regulations shall come into force on the publication of this Order in the Government Gazette.

Schedule.

REGULATIONS.

- All potatoes imported pursuant to the exception 1. All potatoes imported pursuant to the exception contained in the Proclamation made this day under "The Insect Pests Amendment Act, 1898," and to be published in the Government Gazette on the 24th day of April, 1914, must be in new and sound bags, with the name and address of the grower of the potatoes contained thereon, and the word "Potatoes" legibly reached thereon in letters not less than four index marked thereon in letters not less than four inches
- All such potatoes aforesaid shall have been inspected at the port of export by a competent officer duly appointed by the Department of Agriculture of the exporting State, and be accompanied by the following certificate:-

"I hereby certify that I have duly inspected the below-mentioned *..... potatoes, and have found them to be, to the best of my knowledge, clean and free from any disease mentioned in the note endorsed here-

- All potatoes imported into Western Australia under the conditions aforesaid shall be again inspected in Fremantle or at any other approved place of entry by an Inspector of the Western Australian Department of Agriculture, and, if found to be free from all the diseases mentioned in the said Proclamation, may be removed therefrom on payment of inspection fees as prescribed in Regulation No. 8.
- 4. In the event of any of the said diseases being found in any stage of development on any part of a consignment, the whole of such consignment shall be condemned by the Inspector in Fremantle or other place of entry, and no part of such consignment shall be allowed to be removed from the wharf or other place of entry; but the whole consignment shall be forthwith reshipped to a place or port beyond Western Australia at the expense of the consignee:

Provided that-

- (a.) Potatoes found upon inspection in Fremantle or other approved place of entry to be only slightly affected by any of the said diseases other than Irish Blight may be resorted under the supervision of an Inspector, if in the opinion of the officer in charge of the inspection work it is advisable to do so.
- (b.) When sorted, potatoes which are free from disease may be disposed of for consumption. The diseased portion of the consignment shall be reshipped from the State of Western Australia or destroyed by the consignee as soon

as directed by an Inspector.

(c.) A fee at the rate of two shillings (2s.) per hour shall be paid by the consignee to the Department of Agriculture to cover the cost of supervising the work of resorting.

5. The potatoes on arrival at the port of entry shall, at the expense of the importer, be delivered direct into

a shed, set apart by the Department of Agriculture, for inspection and such other treatment as may be decided upon from time to time by the Inspector or other officer

of the Department.

6. The importer or his agent shall, at the importer's expense, provide the necessary labour to open the bags and to re-bag the potatoes, if passed on inspection, and in every way facilitate the inspection.

7. Any consignment of potatoes being or having been or potatoes may be destroyed, disinfected, or otherwise dealt with, at the expense of the importer, as the Inspector may direct. 8. A fee of one shilling for every bag of imported potatoes shall be charged to defray the cost of inspec-

tion and of carrying these regulations into effect.

9. Imported second-hand potato bags shall be dis-

infected at the port of entry as follows, namely:—
By dipping the said bags and keeping them continually submerged for not less than fifteen minutes in a solution of not less than one pound of bluestone to every ten gallons of water.

10. All bags or packages that have contained imported potatoes may be disinfected or destroyed or otherwise disposed of by the Inspector.

11. Seed and other potatoes are prohibited from

being sent by parcels post, except in accordance with these regulations (see Post Office Guide, Folio 74).

12. If any importer or his agent fails or neglects to observe these regulations, or to carry out the requirements of any Inspector as aforesaid, the Inspector

may destroy the potatoes or perform the work at the expense in all things of the importer.

13. The Regulations published in the Government Gazette on the 19th day of April, 1912, shall not apply to potatoes or bags imported pursuant to any exception in the Proclamation aforesaid.

By-laws of the Cranbrook Public Cemetery.

By virtue of all powers in that behalf vested in the Trustees of the Cranbrook Public Cemetery, the said Trustees make the following By-laws:-

- 1. That all fees and charges payable to the trustees in accordance with Schedule "A" shall be paid when applications are made or orders given.
- 2. That any person desiring ground in the Cemetery for a private grave, tombstone and railing, or for any other purpose, shall apply to the trustees, who, on payment of the required fees, shall issue to such person so applying a certificate of right of burial in the form specified in Schedule "B."
- 3. Any person desiring to place or erect any monument, tombstone or enclosure in any part of the Cemetery shall make application to the trustees, and, if approved, shall obtain permission in writing, in the form of Schedule "D," before proceeding with the work.

- 4. Every person who has the exclusive right of burial in any grave shall keep such grave, and any erection thereon, in proper repair, and if after receiving notice in writing from the trustees requiring such repairs to be executed shall fail to do so, then after the expiration of 28 days the trustees may cause such repairs to be executed, and may recover the cost thereof from such person before any two justices in petty sessions.
- 5. That all applications for interment shall be made to the secretary of the trustees.
- 6. That the name, age, and other particulars of the deceased shall be furnished when giving the order, as in Schedule "C."
- 7. That every coffin shall have upon the lid a plate, with the name of deceased and date of death thereon.
- Every grave shall be at least five feet deep for adults and four feet for infants.
- 9. That in case of application for interment in any private grave in which during life the deceased person had no claim, the written consent of the owner shall be given with the application.
- 10. That no burial shall be permitted to take place in the Cemetery without an order for burial being obtained from the secretary of the trustees in the form of Schedule "C" and delivered to the sexton of the Cemetery.
- 11. That any workman employed by the trustees or by any other person shall at all times while in the Cemetery be subject to the supervision, direction, and control of the surveyor, comply with or obey the direction of the officer, and shall be removable from the Cemetery upon any breach of the by-laws, or any refusal or neglect to comply with or obey the direction of the officer.
- 12. That no rubbish or any material removed in dressing a grave shall be placed on any other grave or pathway, and if placed on any adjoining ground shall be removed immediately after completion of work.
- 13. That no smoking shall be allowed within the Cemetery, nor shall any explosives or fireworks be discharged therein, except by special permission, and in case of a military funeral.
- 14. That no animals other than horses drawing hearses or mourning coaches shall be permitted to enter the Cemetery. No dogs shall be admitted into any Ceme-tery; any found therein shall be liable to be destroyed.
- 15. That no person shall cut, pluck, gather, or take out of the Cemetery any flowers, plants, shrub, tree, or any part thereof, or do any injury whatsoever thereto, or to any plot, border, railing, fence, or any erection or road, or remove or interfere with anything laid, built, or placed upon any grave or plot space, and any person so doing shall be guilty of a breach of this by-law, and, on conviction, be liable to a penalty as hereinafter provided
- 16. That all fees not paid may be recovered, and all proceedings under these by-laws taken before any two justices in petty sessions, except where otherwise provided for.
- 17. That a plan of the Cemetery showing the distributive sections, blocks, graves numbered, a register of burials, certificates of right of burials, shall be kept at the office of the trustees.
- Any person committing a breach of any of the foregoing by-laws shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds, and in case of a continuing breach, not exceeding one pound for every day during which such breach continues.
