THE STATE CHILDREN ACT, 1907.

LYING-IN HOMES.

Regulations,

- 1. (a.) Every application for a License in respect to a Lying-in Home must be in the form of Schedule 5, signed by or on behalf of the applicant, and must be accompanied by a certificate of the fitness and respectability of the applicant signed by a medical practitioner.
 - (b.) Every applicant for a License for a Lying-in Home shall pay a fee of Ten shillings for each year or part of a year ending 31st December.
 - (c.) Every License to the keeper of a Lying-in Home shall be in the form of Schedule 6 and shall not be transferable.

2. No application for a License shall be granted unless the premises in respect of which such license is sought, comply with the following conditions:---

- (a.) The building to be so situated that it shall on all sides have between it and the boundary of the land proposed to be used for the purpose of a Lying-in Home a clear space of not less than nine feet.
- (b.) Every room to be occupied by one or more patients shall have at least one thousand cubic feet of air space and one hundred square feet of floor area, and eight feet of lineal wall space for each patient; and if the floor be of wood, the bottom joists of every such room shall be at least three inches above the ground, and the space under every such floor shall be sufficiently ventilated.
- (c.) Every room shall be separately and independently and sufficiently ventilated to the external air.
- (d.) Every such room shall be provided with windows in the external walls having a ratio of one square foot of clear glass to each ten square feet of floor.
- (e.) Every such room to be constructed so as to be readily isolated.(f.) Every wall of such room to be properly pro-
- tected immediately above the foundation, by a durable damp course.
- (g.) The inner surface of every wall, and every ceiling to be smooth, and so constructed that (h.) The drainage of the premises to be sufficient and to the satisfaction of the Department.
- (i.) The water supply to be abundant and wholesome.
- (j.) Ablutionary appliances to be provided of such number and so arranged as the Department may prescribe. (k.) Every room to be sufficiently furnished to the
- satisfaction of the Department.

4.

- (1.) Mattresses for patients' use to be kept exclusively for that purpose.
- (m.) Every room to be used for patients, also kitchen and dining-room to be rendered flyproof.
- (n.) A laundry with all necessary appliances, sufficient to cleanse and disinfect all bed-ding, body clothing, linen, napery, and other similar articles to be provided.
- (o.) At least three-fifths of the area of the site to be un-built upon and open to the sky.

3. The foregoing Regulations, No. 2, shall not apply in the case of premises licensed before the coming into operation of these Regulations.

- (a.) Every License to the keeper of a Lying-in Home shall expire on the 31st day of December in each year, and must be surrendered immediately at the office at which it was issned.
- (b.) Application for renewal of a License shall be made on or before the 15th December during its currency.

5. Every Licensee of a Lying-in Home shall, within three days after the death or removal of any person in ner care, give notice thereof to the Secretary in the form of Schedule 7.

6. Every Licensee of a Lying-in Home shall send to the office of the Department, as soon after the end of each month as possible, a monthly return in the form of Schedule 8, showing admissions, discharges, and the names and dates of confinement of all women confined in such homes, and the particulars of all children born there during the preceding calendar month.

7. Every Licensee of a Lying-in Home shall keep a Register in the form of Schedule 9, and also any other books and records required by the Department.

8. Every person conducting or keeping a Lying-in Home shall :-

- (a.) Flush and disinfect all drains upon the premises at least once in every day, and cause all such drains to be maintained in good order and efficient action.
- (b.) Provide and at all times keep upon such premises, in efficient order, all materials and appliances necessary for the use of the inmates and staff.
- (c.) At all times exercise a close personal supervision of the premises and the persons employed therein, or thereon, and cause all orders of the medical practitioner in charge of any patient to be diligently carried out.
- (d.) Forthwith carry out all orders or directions that may be given from time to time by the Inspector relating to sanitary arrangements, the collecting or disposal of excrementitious matter, refuse, liquid or other wastes; or other directions which may be found necessary.
- (e.) At all times keep all household linen, beds, bedding, furniture, cutlery, crockery, cook-ing and other utensils, and all other things used in the management or conduct of such hospital thoroughly clean, and when required by an Inspector shall disinfect any or all of the said things.
- (f.) Cause all refuse or condemned linen or clothing to be burnt on the premises, in such a manner as may be directed by an Inspector.
- (g.) Provide separate approved airtight receptacles into which all used surgical dressings, human tissues or fluids other than those already provided for in these Regulations shall be placed, and all such special refuse shall be burnt.

9. No Licensee of any Lying-in Home shall be absent from the premises over-night, while there is any patient therein, unless a Registered or Certificated Nurse be left in charge.

10. No Licensee shall absent herself from her Lyingin Home for more than a week, while there is any patient on the premises, without first appointing a Registered Midwife to take charge during her absence, whose name shall be notified to the Department by the Licensee, 11. No children shall be permitted by a Licensee to remain on the premises of any home except children of the Licensee, infants recently born on the premises, and who may be patients in a general Hospital which is also Licensed as a Lying in Home, except by special permission of the Secretary.

12. Should any case of puerperal fever occur, the Licensee shall cause such case to be isolated and treated by a separate staff and shall at once report the case to the Department. No other maternity cases shall be admitted to the Home until it has been thoroughly disinfected, after discharge of the patient.

13. No Licensee shall suffer or permit a greater num-ber of patients to be in any Home than the number authorised in the License.

14. Every Licensee conducting a Lying-in Home shall maintain, at all times, a sufficient number of assistants, including those engaged in ordinary household duties, in such Home to the satisfaction of the Department.

15. No room, or any portion of a Lying-in Home shall be sublet, nor shall boarders or lodgers be taken in other than patients.

16. Poultry shall not be kept nor allowed to trespass within 25 feet of any Lying-in Home.

17. No cat or dog shall be kept nor allowed to trespass within any room of any Lying-in Home.

18. Application for or on behalf of a woman for con-tribution towards her support after her confinement, or partly before and partly after her confinement, must be in the form of Schedule 4 in the form of Schedule 4.

19. The subsidy to be paid by the Department with respect to a destitute woman admitted into a Lying-in Home, with the approval of the Minister, shall be 1s. per day for one month before her confinement and 1s. 6d. per day for three months after her confinement, and 1s. 3d. per day afterwards until she leaves the Home.

20. Where anything by this part of the Regulations is directed to be done or forbidden to be done, or where authority is given to any officer to direct anything to be done, and such act directed to be done remains undone, or such act forbidden to be done is done, in every such case the person making default as to such direction or prohibition respectively shall be deemed guilty of a breach of the said Regulations, and shall be liable for every such offence, besides any costs or expenses which may be incurred in the taking of proceedings against such person guilty of such offence, to a peualty not exceeding £10 for every breach of any such Regulations.


