WHEREAS by "The Bank Holidays Act, 1884," it is provided that it shall be lawful for the Governor, when it is inexpedient that a day appointed for a Bank Holiday should be a Bank Holiday, to declare by Proclamation that such day shall not be a Bank Holiday and to appoint such other day as to the Governor may seem fit to be a holiday instead thereof: And whereas under the provisions of "The Bank Holidays Amendment Act, 1899," Monday, the 8th day of June, would, except as hereinafter declared, be observed as a Bank Holiday in commemoration of the birthday of the Sovereign: And whereas it is desirable that Wednesday, the 3rd day of June, should be appointed to be a Bank Holiday, the intention being that the birthday of the Sovereign should be observed on that day instead of the 8th day of June: Now therefore I, the said Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby declare that the 8th day of June proximo shall not be a Bank Holiday, and I appoint the 3rd day of June proximo to be a Bank Holiday instead of the first-named day.

WHEREAS it is desirable to extend the boundaries of the Metropolitan Water, Sewerage, and Drainage area, to increase the number of districts into which such area is divided, and to constitute the land hitherto comprised within the Armadale Water Area a district of the Metropolitan Water, Sewerage, and Drainage Area, and to re-define the boundaries of the Perth District: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, in exercise of the powers conferred by "The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909," "The Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1912," and "The Water Boards Act, 1904," doth order and declare as follows:—

- (a.) That the boundaries of the Metropolitan Water, Sewerage, and Drainage Area are hereby extended to include therein the land described in the first schedule hereto;
- (b.) That the number of districts into which the said area is divided is hereby increased to five, and the area defined in the second schedule hereto is hereby constituted the fifth district, by the name of the Armadale District;
- (c.) That the boundaries of the Perth District are hereby re-defined to include the land within the boundaries set out in the third schedule hereto;
- (d.) That the Order in Council for the constitution of a Board for the Armadale Water Area under "The Water Boards Act, 1904," is hereby revoked, and that such Board is hereby dissolved and the Armadale Water Area abolished; and
- (e.) That the Order shall come into effect on the first day of June, 1914.

#### FIRST SCHEDULE.

Bounded by lines starting from a point on the Seashore situated about eight chains West of the North-West corner of Perth Location 1032; thence East along North boundary of Perth Road Board to the intersection with the Western boundary of the Swan Road Board; thence Northerly along the West boundary of said Swan Road Board to its intersection with the North boundary of Swan Location G; thence East along the North boundary of said Swan Location G for a distance of about 9½ miles to the North-East corner of Swan Location 1328; thence South and along Eastern boundary to the South-East corner of said Location 1328; thence Easterly along Road, 50 links wide, to its intersection with Government Road No. 1890; thence South along road to the intersection with Newcastle Road; thence South to the North boundary of Reserve 3304; thence South-Westerly to the North-East corner of Cemetery Reserve 6955; thence South along the East boundary to the South-East corner of said reserve; thence East to the North-East corner of Swan Location 1775; thence South to the North boundary of Swan View Sub. Lot 31; thence East to the North-East corner of Swan View Lot 23; thence in a Southerly direction and along the Eastern Railway to the North-West corner of Lot 70, Black Boy Hill Estate; thence South to the North-West corner of Lot 58; thence South-West to the North-West corner of Lot 52; thence along the Western boundary of said Lot 52 to the York Road; thence South to the Northerly boundary of Helena Location 20b; thence East to the South-East corner of Lot 63, Greenmount; thence North for about seven chains; thence East to the South-East corner of Lot 61, Greenmount; thence Southerly and along Road crossing at Darlington Railway Station to South boundary of Location 1242; thence East to the South-East corner of

Location 1246; thence North to the South-West corner of Location 1268; thence East and along road to the South-East corner of Greenmount Sub. Lot 133; thence in a South-Easterly direction to the North-West corner of Swan Location 1421; thence in a Southerly direction to the South-West corner of Reserve 5342; thence Westerly to the South-East corner of Helena Location 20a; thence along Southern boundary of said Location 20a to its intersection with the surveyed boundary of the Helena River Supplementary Catchment Area Reserve 8059; thence South-Easterly along the Western boundary of said catchment area to its intersection with the Helena River Catchment Area A6203; thence following the Western boundary of said Reserve A6203 to its intersection with the Canning Reservoir Catchment Area; thence along its Eastern boundary to the 57-mile peg; thence following the Southern and Western boundary of the Serpentine Catchment Area to its intersection with the Serpentine River and Western boundary of Cockburn Sound Location 255; thence along the left bank of the Serpentine River to its intersection with the Perth-Bunbury Road; thence Northerly along said Road to the North-East corner of Cockburn Sound Location 91; thence Westerly to the South-West corner of Location 500, Cockburn Sound; thence Northerly along the Western boundary of said Location 500 to its intersection with the South-Western Railway; thence North-Westerly along the Rockingham Jarrah Timber Company's Railway to its intersection with the Eastern boundary of Location 16, Cockburn Sound; thence North-East and North following part of the Eastern boundary of said Location 16 to its North-East corner; thence West along the Northern boundary of said Location 16 to its North-West corner; thence South to the South-East corner of Location 350; thence West to the Eastern boundary of Rockingham Common; thence South-West to the South-East corner of said Common; thence West along the South boundary of said Common and Reserve 746a to the seashore; thence Northerly along the seashore to the point of commencement.

#### Districts.

*Perth District.*—(As re-defined in Third Schedule.)

*Fremantle District.*—Bounded by lines starting from a point at the North-West corner of the North Fremantle municipal boundary; thence East to a point on the Eastern bank of the Swan River opposite Chidley Point; thence Northerly and Easterly along the foreshore to the intersection of the left bank of the Canning River, and the Western end of the Lower Canning Bridge; thence along the left bank of the Canning River to the North-East corner of Canning Location 26; thence East-South-Easterly along the left bank of Bull's Creek to its intersection with Road No. 1773; thence Westerly along the Northern alignment of Road No. 1773 to the South-East corner of Cockburn Sound Location 8; thence South-South-Westerly along the North-Western alignment of Road No. 312 to a point opposite the North-West corner of Cockburn Sound Location 177; thence South to the South-East corner of Cockburn Sound Location 551; thence West to the South-West corner of Cockburn Sound Location 63; thence South to the North boundary of Cockburn Sound Location 10; thence West along part of that location's North boundary to its North-West corner; thence South partly along the West boundaries of Locations 10, 3, and 84, to the South boundary of Location 109; thence West to the seashore; thence North along the seashore to the starting point, and excluding the Fremantle jetties and North and South Moles.

*Claremont District.*—Bounded by lines starting from a point on the seashore situated about 5 chains West of the South-West corner of Location 1911 (Endowment City of Perth), and extending Easterly to the Perth-Fremantle Railway; thence South-West along that Railway to a point due North of the North-West corner of Swan Location 717; thence South to North-West corner of said Location 717; thence East and along North boundary of Location 717 to its North-East corner; thence South to North-West corner of Location 716; thence East to its North-East corner; thence South and along Eastern boundary of Location 716 and middle of Dalkeith Road to middle of Alice Road; thence Westerly to middle of Davies Road; thence South and along middle of Davies Road to North boundary of Swan Location 85; thence Southerly to North-West corner of A. ## PART I.

By-law No. 24, paragraph (d), lines 11 and 12 are deleted, and the following substituted therefor:—

(d.) A service or trap door shall be fitted to enable pan to be readily withdrawn from outside, and shall be constructed of galvanised iron of 18 gauge to slide up and down, the sides and framing of bottom to stand out one inch from face of brick-work or other material, the top being flush with face of work, the sides to be grooved to allow of door sliding freely up and down in same, a handle to be rivetted on lower edge for the purpose of lifting.

## CEMETERIES ACT, 1897, AND AMENDING ACTS.

## By-laws Malcolm Cemetery.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to approve, under the provisions of "The Cemeteries Act, 1897," and Amending Acts, of the following By-laws for the control and management of Malcolm Public Cemetery, Reserve 13149.

## MALCOLM PUBLIC CEMETERY BY-LAWS.

In pursuance of the powers vested in them, the Malcolm Road Board as Trustees of the Public Cemetery at Malcolm, make the following By-laws, that is to say:—

1. That all fees and charges payable to the Trustees in accordance with Schedule "A" shall be paid when applications are made or orders given.

2. That any person desiring ground in the Cemetery for a private grave, vault, tomb, monument, cenotaph, tombstone, railing, wall, or for any other purpose, shall apply to the Trustees therefor. If approved, the Trustees, on the payment of the required fees, shall issue to such person so applying a Certificate of Right of Burial in the form specified in Schedule "B."

3. Any person desiring to place or erect any monument, tombstone, or enclosure in any part of the Cemetery shall, before obtaining permission to do so, submit a plan of such monument, tombstone, or enclosure and specify the material of which it is to be composed to the Trustees, and shall obtain such permission in writing before proceeding with the work, in the form of Schedule "D."

4. And every person who shall place or erect any monument, tombstone, or enclosure upon any grave, the exclusive right of which has not been obtained, shall keep the same in repair; and if after receiving one month's notice in writing from the Trustees, such repairs are not executed, then the Trustees may cause to be done the act or thing required and by such person omitted to be done, any may recover the expenses thereof from such person in a summary way before two Justices of the Peace.

5. Every person who has the exclusive right of burial in any grave shall keep such grave and any erection or construction thereon in proper repair; and if, after receiving notice in writing from the Trustees requiring such repairs to be executed, shall fail to do so, then after the expiration of twenty-eight days the Trustees may cause such repairs to be executed, and may recover the cost thereof from such person in a summary way before two Justices of the Peace in petty sessions.

6. (1.) That all applications for interment shall be made to the Secretary of the Trustees and six working hours' notice shall be given to the Sexton prior to the time fixed for the burial, otherwise an extra charge will be made.

(2.) The name of the deceased, age, and other particulars mentioned in Schedule "C." shall be furnished when giving the order.

7. The Trustees shall cause all ordinary graves to be dug, but any person desiring to construct a brick grave or vault shall be permitted to construct the same under the direction of the Surveyor, on payment of the required fees, and every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and made and kept air-tight.

8. That every coffin shall have upon the lid a lead or copper plate with the name of the deceased and date of burial stamped thereon.

9. That every grave shall be at least six feet deep, except those used for the burial of infants, which the Trustees may allow to be of lesser depth, but no interment shall be allowed in any grave with a less depth than three feet from the top of the coffin to the original surface of the ground.

10. That in the case of application for interment in any private grave or vault, to which during life the deceased person had no claim, the written consent of the owner shall be given with the application or other satisfactory evidence that the person desiring to bury therein is entitled to do so.

11. That no burial shall be permitted to take place in the Cemetery without an order for burial being obtained from the Secretary in the form of Schedule "C" and delivered to the Sexton at the Cemetery.

12. The hours for burial shall be as follows:—

On week days.—September to April inclusive, 9 a.m. to 6 p.m.; May to August inclusive, from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m.

On Sundays.—Throughout the year, from 9 to 10 a.m., and from 12 noon to 5 p.m.

13. That no burial shall be allowed to take place before or after the hours above-mentioned, except by special permission and upon payment of the fee for burials "not in the usual hours."

14. That the time stated in Schedule "C" for any burial shall be the time when the funeral is to be at the Cemetery, and the same shall be punctually observed.

15. That every funeral shall enter by the principal entrance and thence follow the Sexton to the grave. No bicycle, velocipede, carriage or vehicle, except hearses or mourning coaches, shall be permitted to pass the said entrance. Horses shall not be driven faster than at a walking pace, and no horses or other animals shall be ridden in the Cemetery.

16. That every erection shall be placed upon proper and substantial foundations, and if required by the Trustees shall extend to the bottom of the grave. All refuse, rubbish, or material remaining after the work is completed shall be removed from the Cemetery at once by and at the expense of the person causing the same.

17. All material required in the making, repairing, or completion of any work shall be fully prepared before being taken to the Cemetery.

18. That no catacomb shall be allowed.



19. That the Trustees shall not (except in very exceptional cases) permit the removal of any corpse from any grave for re-interment in this or any other Cemetery, and before any such exceptional case be dealt with by the Trustees, a written application setting forth the reasons for the proposed removal of such corpse, and verified by a statutory declaration, shall be produced by the nearest available representative of the deceased; and in the event of such application being granted, the permission of the Colonial Secretary, in addition to the permission of the Trustees, shall be obtained. If found necessary, the coffin shall be enclosed in a second and air-tight wooden or leaden coffin prior to removal.

20. That any workman or other employee, whether employed by the Trustees or by any other person, shall at all times, while in the Cemetery, be subject to the supervision, direction, and control of the Surveyor, and shall obey all such directions and shall be removable from the Cemetery upon any breach of the By-laws or any refusal or neglect to comply with or obey any such directions.

21. Any person taking part in dressing or attending to any grave shall comply with the following rules, namely:—

- (1.) That no rubbish or other material removed in dressing a grave shall be placed on any other grave or pathway, and if placed on any adjoining ground, shall be removed immediately after the completion of the work.
- (2.) That no loam shall be taken from any portion of the Cemetery for the purpose of dressing any grave.
- (3.) That no grave shall be dressed in wet weather, except by special permission of the Surveyor, nor shall any materials be wheeled or carted along any path or road while the surface is soft with rain or otherwise. Work in all cases must be carried on with due despatch, and only during regulation hours.

22. That no child under the age of fourteen years shall be admitted into the Cemetery except in charge of a responsible person.

23. That no smoking shall be allowed within the Cemetery, nor shall any explosives be discharged therein except by special permission.

24. That every driver of a hearse, mourning coach, or other vehicle, and every pedestrian shall keep strictly to the roads and footpaths as laid out for vehicles and pedestrians respectively, and vehicles shall only be turned at points where provision for so doing is made.

25. That no animals other than horses drawing hearses or mourning coaches shall be permitted to enter the Cemetery except by permission.

26. That no person in the Cemetery or its approaches shall commit any nuisance or trespass or be guilty of any breach of decorum, or cut, pluck, or gather or take out of the Cemetery any flower, plant, shrub or tree, or any part thereof or do any injury whatsoever thereto or to any plot, border, railing, fence, or any erection or road, or remove or interfere in any way with anything laid, built, or placed on or in any grave or burying place; and any person or persons so offending may be proceeded against in accordance with the Act.

27. That no person shall promote or advertise or carry on within the Cemetery or its approaches any trade, business, or calling either by solicitation, distribution of circulars or cards, or otherwise, or by any other system of advertisement whatever.

28. The "Secretary" or "Surveyor" as referred to in these By-laws means the person for the time being employed by the Trustees as the Secretary and Surveyor of the Cemetery, and such person or persons shall, subject to the Trustees, exercise a general supervision and control over all matters pertaining to the Cemetery, and to the carrying out and enforcement of these By-laws; and the direction of such person or persons shall, in all cases and for all purposes, be presumed to be and to have been the direction of the Trustees.

29. That all fees may be recovered and all proceedings under these By-laws taken before two Justices in petty sessions, except where otherwise provided for.

30. That any person committing any breach of any of these By-laws shall thereupon be forthwith removable from the Cemetery by the Trustees, or Secretary or Surveyor, and shall be treated as a trespasser; and may be proceeded against accordingly, in addition to any other proceedings or penalties to which such person may be subject.

31. That a plan of the Cemetery showing the distribution of the land, sections, blocks, and graves num-

bered, a Register of Burials, and a Register of Certificates of Right of Burial shall be kept at the office of the Trustees.

32. That the officiating minister at any burial shall be given at least six hours' notice prior to the time stated for such burial.
