WHEREAS by Section 9 of "The Fisheries Act, 1905-13," it is provided that the Governor may, by Proclamation, prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever, in every or any specified portion of Western Australian waters, by means of fishing nets and fishing lines, or either of such means of capture or by any other specified means of capture, for any specified term: Now therefore I, the said Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby, in exercise of the powers aforesaid and of every other power enabling me in this behalf, proclaim and declare as follows:—

That all those portions of Western Australian waters defined in the Locality Schedule hereto shall be closed against the use of fishing nets as from the date of this Proclamation to the 31st day of December, 1916, inclusive.

Locality Schedule.

The waters of Geographe Bay, near Wonnerup Inlet, bounded by the following lines:—

On the South by a North-Westerly line drawn from a point on the foreshore fifteen (15) chains South-West from the Southern side of the "Old Jetty," and extending into the waters of the said bay 40 chains; thence by a line drawn in a North-Easterly direction about 120 chains; thence by a line drawn in a South-Easterly direction extending to the foreshore of the said bay at a point 60 chains North of the Northern point of entrance to Wonnerup Inlet, and thence in a South-Westerly direction by the foreshore of the said bay to the point of commencement.

WHEREAS by "The Game Act, 1912-13" (Section 6), it is provided, *inter alia*, that the Governor may from time to time, by Proclamation, declare that any bird or animal indigenous to Western Australia shall be at all times strictly preserved, either generally throughout the State or in any one or more portions thereof: Provided that the Governor may in like manner exempt from the operation of any declaration under this section any defined locality: And whereas by a Proclamation dated the 24th day of June, 1913, it is provided that Emus shall be at all times strictly preserved in all that portion of the State defined in the First Schedule thereto: And whereas it is desirable to exempt from the operation of the said Proclamation a defined locality: Now therefore I, the said Governor, in exercise of the power aforesaid, do hereby, with the advice of the Executive Council, declare that all that portion of the State defined in the Second Schedule hereto shall be exempted from the operation of the said Proclamation until the 31st day of December, 1914:—

First Schedule.

That portion of the State bounded by a line starting from Point Ann on the South coast; thence following the No. 2 Rabbit-proof Fence to its Junction with No. 3 Rabbit-proof Fence; thence following No. 3 Rabbit-proof Fence to the sea-coast; thence following the sea-coast to the point of commencement.

Second Schedule.

That portion of the State bounded on the North by the No. 3 Rabbit-proof Fence; on the East by the No. 2 Rabbit-proof Fence; on the South by a line drawn from the mouth of the Bowes River (near Geraldton) to a point on the No. 2 Rabbit-proof Fence where the Mount Magnet Railway lines intersect such fence; and on the West by the sea-coast.
