HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to approve, under "The Cemeteries Act, 1897," and amending Acts, of the By-laws set out hereunder for the Williams Public Cemetery, Reserve 13434.

# BY-LAWS FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE WILLIAMS PUBLIC CEMETERY.

BY virtue of all powers in that behalf vested in the Trustees of the Williams Public Cemetery, the said Trustees make the following By-laws:—

1. All fees and charges payable to the Trustees, as set forth in Schedule A, shall be paid at the times and manner therein mentioned unless otherwise ordered.

- manner therein mentioned, unless otherwise ordered.

  2. Any person desiring to inter any dead body in the Cemetery shall make an application in the form contained in Schedule B. Upon such application being approved by the Trustees, and upon payment of the prescribed fees, they shall cause to be issued to the person so applying an "Order for Burial," in the form contained in Schedule C.
- 3. All applications for interment shall be made at the office of the Trustees in such time as to allow of at least five working hours' notice to be given to the Secretary prior to the time fixed for burial. An extra charge shall be made for applications within such time. No free interment shall be allowed, unless the application, together with the Magistrate's order therefor, be handed in at the office in such time to allow of at least five working hours' notice being given as stated above.
- The Trustees shall cause all graves to be dug, and vaults, brick graves, or graves to be re-opened as and when required.
- 5. Before any interment is allowed, the "Order for Burial" shall be handed to and retained by the Secretary.
- 6. Every coffin shall have upon the lid an approved metal plate bearing the name of the deceased stamped or otherwise indelibly inscribed in legible characters thereon. No coffin not complying with this By-law shall be admitted to or be interred in the Cemetery.
- 7. Every grave shall be at least six feet deep, and no interment shall be allowed in any grave with a less depth than three feet from the top of the coffin to the original surface of the surrounding ground.
- 8. In the case of an application for interment in any private grave or vault to which the deceased had no claim during life, the written and verified consent of the grantee shall be handed in with the application.
- 9. No burial shall be allowed to take place in the Cemetery, nor shall any coffin be allowed to enter the Cemetery, unless a certificate from the District Registrar of Deaths that the death has been registered, or a Coroner's order for burial is handed to the Secretary, at the latest, upon the funeral entering the Cemetery. The certificate shall be retained, but the Coroner's order shall be returned to the person producing the same.
- 10. Unless otherwise ordered the principal entrance to the Cemetery shall be opened between the hours of 7 a.m. and 6 p.m. daily.
  - 11. The hours for burial shall be as follows:-

Week days, 8 a.m. to 5 p.m., Sundays, 2 p.m. to 5 p.m.,

and no burial shall be allowed to take place, nor any coffin allowed to enter the Cemetery, at any other hour except by written permission of the Trustees.

- 12. The time fixed for any burial shall be the time at which the funeral is to arrive at the Cemetery gates, and if not punctually observed, the undertaker responsible shall be liable to a fine of 10s. 6d.
- 13. Every funeral shall enter the Cemetery by the principal gate, and no vehicle, except the hearse and mourning coaches, shall be permitted to enter the Cemetery, or stand opposite the entrance gates. Horses shall not be allowed to proceed faster than at a walking pace within the Cemetery, and shall proceed by such roads as directed by the Trustees or any of their officers. Any driver or other person neglecting to observe such directions may be forthwith expelled from the Cemetery. No bicycle shall be ridden within the Cemetery.

- 14. Children under the age of 10 years entering the Cemetery must be under the charge of some responsible person.
- 15. Smoking shall not be allowed within the Cemetery, nor any fireworks discharged therein.
- 16. No dogs shall be allowed in the Cemetery, and any found there shall be liable to be destroyed.
- 17. Any person violating the rules of propriety and decorum, or committing any nuisance or trespass, or injuring any tree, shrub, flower, border, grave, or any erection, or in any way infringing these By-laws, shall be expelled from the Cemetery.
- 18. No person shall promote or advertise, or carry on within the Cemetery any trade, business, or calling by any means whatsoever, without the written consent of the Trustees. Any person infringing this By-law shall be expelled from the Cemetery.

  19. No person employed by the Trustees shall be
- 19. No person employed by the Trustees shall be permitted to accept any gratuity whatever, other than the remuneration he receives from the Trustees, and any such person found guilty of accepting such gratuity shall be liable to summary dismissal.
- 20. Subject to the By-laws, and to the directions of the Trustees, the Secretary and Superintendent shall exercise a general supervision and control over all matters pertaining to the Cemetery, including the conduct of all funerals and interments within the Cemetery. For such services he shall receive from the Trustees a prescribed salary per annum.
- 21. Any person requiring an "Exclusive Right of Burial" in any part of the Cemetery shall apply to the Trustees, in writing, specifying the location of the grave, and whether it is proposed to erect a brick grave or vault, and in such case submitting plans and specifications of the proposed work. Such application shall also state the name of any deceased person or persons whose remains it is proposed to inter therein.
- 22. Upon being satisfied of the matters aforesaid, and of the suitability of the said work, plans, and specifications, the Trustees may authorise the construction and erection thereof, or if no work is to be done, may issue a "Grant" in the form Schedule E.
- 23. Upon the completion of the work aforesaid, the Trustees may, if and when such work is done to their complete satisfaction, issue a "Grant" in the form Schedule E.
- 24. Every such Grant shall be subject to By-laws for the time being, and no interment in any such grave or vault shall be allowed unless upon the production of the Order for Burial aforesaid, nor shall any such grave or vault be opened, unless with the written consent of the Trustees.
- 25. Every coffin placed in any such brick grave or vault shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered with a slab of stone, slate, or iron, unless special written exemption be obtained from the Trustees.
- 26. If application be made for an "Order for Burial" in any grave or vault of the remains of any person other than the person to whom the "Grant" was issued or his registered assign, the written and verified consent of such grantee or assignee shall be produced.
- 27. Any person desiring to place or erect or to alter or add to any monument, tombstone, or enclosure in any part of Cemetery must first obtain the written consent of the Trustees, and otherwise comply with Section 23 of the principal Act (61 Vict., 23).

  28. Every tombstone, monument, or enclosure shall
- 28. Every tombstone, monument, or enclosure shall be placed on proper and substantial foundations, which if required by the Trustees or their officers shall extend to the bottom of the grave.
- 29. The materials used in any such crection shall be subject to the approval of the trustees, and any material rejected shall be immediately removed from the Cemetery by the contractor for the erection. All refuse or any material remaining after any work is completed shall be immediately removed from the Cemetery by the person causing the same.
- 30. Should any work by masons or others not be completed before a Sunday, they shall be required to leave the work in a neat and safe condition, to the satisfaction of the Superintendent.
- 31. Masons and other tradesmen shall, before commencing any work within the Cemetery, deposit with the Secretary and Superintendent the sum of 10s., which shall be forfeited if either the conditions of the two preceding By-laws be not complied with.

32. All material required in the erection and completion of any work shall, as far as possible, be prepared

before being taken to the Cemetery; and all materials required by tradesmen shall be admitted at such entrance as shall be directed, and no vehicle conveying such material with wheels less than 4in. broad shall be permitted to enter the Cemetery.

- 33. No catacomb shall be allowed.
- 34. Subject to the approval of the trustees, each applicant for an "Order for Burial" shall within three months from the date of the application cause to be placed thereon or thereby at least a number plate of the number of the grave.
- 35. No wooden fence, railing, cross or other wooden erection shall be allowed on or around any grave or
- 36. No trees or shrubs shall be planted on any grave except such as shall be approved by the Trustees.
- All workmen, whether employed by the trustees or any other person, shall, whilst in the Cemetery, be under the supervision of the Superintendent and Secretary.
- 38. Licenses for grave dressing or decorating may be issued by the Trustees. Such licenses to be renewed annually in January.
- 39. Any person taking part in dressing or attending to any grave shall comply with the following rules:—

  (a.) No rubbish or other material removed in dressing a grave shall be placel on any grave, but must be removed from the Cemetery as soon as the work is completed.
  - (b.) No soil shall be taken from any portion of the
  - Cemetery for dressing a grave except with the permission of the Superintendent.

    (c.) The dressing of all graves and the wheeling and carting of any material shall be subject to the supervision of the Superintendent.
  - (d.) Work in all cases to be carried on with due despatch and during working hours.
- 40. Prior to conducting any interment within the Cemetery or making use of the Cemetery for any purpose connected with interment, every undertaker shall pay to the Trustees an annual fee of £2 2s., and shall at the time of making such payment give his assent in writing to such conditions as the Trustees may deem fit to impose. Upon such assent being given and payment of the fee made, he shall receive a "Permit," to hold good during good behaviour and until the 1st day of January following, and unless in possession of such January following, and unless in possession of such "Permit" no undertaker shall be allowed to engage in or carry out any duty or work within the Cemetery.
- 41. Any person committing any breach of any of these By-laws made under any Act relating to cemeteries shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5, and in case of continuing a further breach, a further sum not exceeding £1 for every day during which such breach continues, and shall be forthwith removed from the Cemetery, and shall be treated as a trespasser and may be proceeded against accordingly.
- A plan of the Cemetery showing the distribution of the land, sections, situation and number of graves, and a register of all certificates of "Rights of Burial" shall be kept at the office of the Board.

The above By-laws and Schedules were duly framed and presented to a meeting of the Board of Trustees held at their office on Friday, the 9th day of January 1914, and adopted.

IN exercise of the powers conferred by "The Roads Act, 1911," and "The Cattle Trespass, Fencing, and Impounding Act, 1882," the Goomalling Road Board Impounding Act, 1882," the Goomalling Road Board doth hereby repeal Scale of Trespass Fees published in the Government Gazette of the 10th October, 1913, and in lieu thereof order that the following Trespass, Impounding, and Sustenance Fees shall be charged and collected by the Board:—

Trespass on enclosed land, whether town, country, or suburban, not being a public street or thoroughfare in a city or town or public cemetery:—

For every entire horse, ass, or bull in the day-time, not less than £2 nor more than £4.

For every such horse, ass, or bull in the night-time, not less than £3 nor more than £5.

For every other head of cattle, by night or day,

a sum not exceeding 20s.

Trespass on a public street or thoroughfare in town or

city, or in an enclosed public cemetery:—
For every entire horse, ass, or bull, not less than
£3 nor more than £5.

For every other head of cattle, a sum not exceeding 40s.

Trespass Scale.

Description of Cattle:

Horse, mare, gelding, colt, filly, ass, mule, bull, ox, cow, heifer, calf, camel, deer, and foal—
"Great Cattle."

Ram, ewe, sheep, wether, lamb, goat, kid, and pig-"Small Cattle."

Trespass on unenclosed cemetery land:-

For every entire horse ass, or bull in the day-time, not less than £2 nor more than £4.

For every entire horse, ass, or bull in the night-time, not less than £3 nor more than £5.

For every other head of "great cattle," by night

or day, Threepence. For every head of "small cattle," by night or day,

One penny.

Poundage Fees.

Horses, cattle, and foals 3s. per head. Bulls and stallions 5s. per head. 3s. per head. Pies ... Sheep and goats 6d. per head. ....

Sustenance Fees.

Cattle, horses, calves, and foals, 3s. 6d. per head per day of 24 hours, and 2s. 6d. per head per day of 12 hours.

Stallions and bulls, 6s. per head per day of 24 hours, and 3s. 6d. per head per day of 12 hours.

Sheep and goats, 6d. per head per day of 24 hours, and 3d. per head per day of 12 hours.

Pigs, 2s. per head per day of 12 hours.

WHEREAS by "The Insect Pests Amendment Act, WHEREAS by "The Insect Pests Amendment Act, 1898," it is provided that the Governor may from time to time by Proclamation prohibit, either absolutely or except in accordance with regulations under the said Act, the introduction into Western Australia, either generally or from any specified colony, country, port, or place, of any plant, fruit, fungus, parasite, insect, or anything which, in his opinion, is likely to introduce any disease into Western Australia: And whereas, in the opinion of His Excellency the Governor, the introany disease into Western Australia: And whereas, in the opinion of His Excellency the Governor, the intro-duction into Western Australia of potatoes infected with any of the diseases described in the Schedule hereto is likely to introduce and spread such disease in Western Australia: Now therefore I, the said Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council de heady prohibits absolute the introduction Council, do hereby prohibit absolutely the introduction into Western Australia from the States of New South Wales, Victoria, South Australia, and Tasmania, and any other colony, country, port, or place whatsoever, of any potatoes infected with any of the diseases described in the Schedule hereto.

# WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

The Insect Pests Amendment Act, 1898.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Executive Council Chamber, at Perth, this 5th day of August, 1914.

WHEREAS by "The Insect Pests Amendment Act, 1898," the Governor, by Order in Council gazetted, may from time to time make such Regulations as he deems necessary for any purpose for which regulations are contemplated by the said Act or which he deems necessary in order to give full effect to the said Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby order that the proviso set forth in the Schedule hereto be added to Regulation No. 4 of the Regulations made on the 8th day of April, 1914, and that the Regulation numbered 8 and set forth in the said Schedule be inserted in lieu of Regulation No. 8 of the said Regulations: And that the said Regulations shall have effect as so amended, and that this Order shall take effect from the date of its publication in the Government Gazette.

#### Schedule.

Add to Regulation No. 4, at the end of proviso (c), the following additional proviso:-

Provided, also, that if the introduction of such potatoes into Western Australia was in contravention of any Proclamation under the aforesaid Act for the time being in force, then the said potatoes may be dealt with as provided in Section 9 of the said Act.

Insert the following Regulation in lieu of Regulation No. 8:—

8. A fee of two shillings and sixpence for every ton or portion of a ton of imported potatoes shall be charged to defray the cost of inspection and of carrying these Regulations into effect.
