WHEREAS by Section 3, Subsection 1, of "The
Abattoirs Act, 1909," it is provided that the Governor

may from time to time, by proclamation, declare portions of the State to be districts for the purposes of the said Act, and that the said Act shall be in force in the districts mentioned in such proclamation: And whereas by proclamation dated the twenty-second day of December, 1909, and published in the Government Gazette dated the twenty-fourth day of December, 1909, His Excellency the Governor proclaimed and declared that that portion of the State within a ten-mile radius from the Abattoirs constructed on Jerry Hill, in the vicinity of Kalgoorlie, should be a District for the purposes of the said Act: And whereas it is desirable to extend the above-mentioned District to include that portion of the State within a fifteen-mile radius from the said Abattoirs: Now therefore I, the said Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim and declare that the portion of the State within a fifteen-mile radius from the Abattoirs constructed on Jerry Hill, in the vicinity of Kalgoorlie, shall be a District for the purposes of the said Act, and that the said Act shall be in force therein accordingly.
