land held as a Conditional Purchase Lease: And whereas it is deemed expedient that the portion of Conditional Purchase Lease 6846/56 (Williams Location 8454), as described hereunder, should be resumed for one of the purposes specified in paragraph 8 of Section 39 of the said Act, that is to say for Townsite purposes: Now therefore I, Major General Sir Harry Barron, Governor as aforesaid, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my proclamation resume portion of Conditional Purchase Lease 6846/56 (Williams Location 8454) for the purpose aforesaid.

THE following amendment of the Supreme Court Rules is published for general information.

H. G. HAMPTON, Under Secretary for Law.

The Honourable ROBERT BRUCE BURNSIDE, Acting Chief Justice of Western Australia, and the Honourables JOHN ROOTH and JOHN ALFRED NORTH-MORE, Puisne Judges of the Supreme Court of Western Australia, in pursuance of all powers them in this behalf enabling, do hereby make the following Rules, which shall come into operation on the publication thereof in the Government Gazette, and which shall be added to and form part of Order XXXV. of the Rules of the Supreme Court, 1909, and be numbered 46 to 52:—

- 46. Where under the Foreign Tribunals Evidence Act, 1856, or the Extradition Act, 1870, Section 24, any civil or commercial matter, or any criminal matter, is pending before a Court or tribunal of a foreign country, and it is made to appear to the Court or a Judge, by Commission Rogatoire, or letter of request, or other evidence as hereinafter provided, that such Court or tribunal is desirous of obtaining the testimony in relation to such matter of any witness or witnesses within the jurisdiction, the Court or a Judge may, on the ex parte application of any person shown to be duly authorised to make the application on behalf of such foreign court or tribunal, and on production of the Commission Rogatoire, or letter of request, or of a certificate signed in the manner, and certifying to the effect mentioned in Section 2 of the Foreign Tribunals Evidence Act, 1856, or such other evidence as the Court or a Judge may require, make such order or orders as may be necessary to give effect to the intention of the Acts above mentioned in conformity with Section 1 of the said Foreign Tribunals Evidence Act, 1856.
- 47. An order made under the last preceding rule shall be in Form numbered 1 in the schedule hereto, with such variations as circumstances may require.
- 48. The examination may be ordered to be taken before any fit and proper person nominated by the person applying, or such other qualified person as to the Court or a Judge may seem fit.
- 49. Unless otherwise provided in the order for examination, the Examiner before whom the examination is taken shall, on its completion, forward the same to the Master of the Supreme Court, and on receipt thereof the Master shall append thereto a certificate, in Form numbered 2 in the schedule hereto, with such variations as circumstances may require, duly sealed with the seal of the Supreme Court, and shall forward the depositions so certified, and the Commission Rogatoire or letter of request, if any, to His Majesty's Secretary of State for the Colonies for transmission to the foreign court or tribunal requiring the same: Provided that when any Commission Rogatoire or letter of request has been received in this State direct from any tribunal or authority in a foreign State or country, then the Master may forward the depositions taken in consequence thereof, together with the said Commission Rogatoire or letter of request, direct to such tribunal or authority.
- 50. An order made under Rule 46 of this order may, if the Court or a Judge shall think fit, direct the said examination to be taken in such manner as may be requested by the Commission Rogatoire or letter of request from the Foreign Court or therein signified to be in accordance with the practice or requirements of such court or tribunal, or which may, for the same reason, be requested by the applicant for such order; but in the absence of any such special directions being given in the order for examination the same shall be taken in the manner prescribed in Part II.
- 51. Rules 46 to 50 of this Order shall apply, as far as may be, to applications under the Evidence by Commission Act, 1859 (22 Vict., c. 20), for the purpose of giving effect to any commission or letter of request from any British tribunal out of the jurisdiction, except that in the case of a letter of request from a Judge of an Indian Court the depositions with the letter of request shall be forwarded to His Majesty's Secretary of State for India: Provided, however, that they may be forwarded direct to such Judge if this Court or a Judge thereof shall so order.
- 52. Where a Commission Rogatoire, or letter of request, as mentioned in Rule 46 of this Order, is transmitted to the Supreme Court with an intimation that it is desirable that effect should be given to the same without the intervention or in the absence of the parties, the Master shall transmit the same to the Crown Solicitor, who may thereupon, with the consent of the Attorney General, make such applications and take such steps as may be necessary to give effect to such Commission Rogatoire or letter of request, in accordance with Rules 46 to 50 of this Order.

  - The Commissioner will not supply labour to handle cargo transhipped overside vessel to vessel.
  - Cargo is allowed 48 hours' free storage in wharf sheds, except transhipment eargo, which
    is allowed 72 hours.
  - 7. Grain (as defined above), flour, agricultural and horticultural produce (including fruit), and coal (and salt at Albany only), any of which being the product of the State of Western Australia, when brought for the purpose of transhipment for export beyond the State, shall be free of transhipping dues, but must pay handling charges incurred.
  - Goods which have already paid a full inwards wharfage at another port in the State of Western Australia shall (on prime entry) be exempt from the payment of wharfage dues on production of certificate on prescribed form.

#### OUTWARDS CARGO.

Where the Commissioner performs the necessary labour services, receiving and delivering the goods indicated in the two immediately preceding paragraphs, such services shall be charged for at the same rates as inward cargo of similar character and for like service.

All other goods shipped outwards shall pay wharfage dues and handling charges at the same rates as inward cargo of similar character, with the following exceptions:—

Bunker Coal.—Where worked out of trucks or other vehicles or off wharves into ship's bunkers or slings, wharfage nil; handling charges 9d. per ton for each handling incurred.

Timber.—Wharfage, ls. 8d. per load of 50 cubic feet; haulage 10d. per load; handling charges on bulk consignments of 200 loads or over, shipped by one consignor, 1s. 3d. per load for railway sleepers, and 1s. 10d. per load for all other classes of timber in respect of each of the following services:—

- (a.) Unloading and stacking prior to shipment.
- (b.) Handling from stack to ship's slings.
- (c.) Handling in railway wagons at ship's slings.
- (d.) Any other distinct labour service rendered.

Scrap Metal.—Wharfage (same as inward rates); handling charges, if loose 2s. 6d., and if crated, cased, or bagged 1s. 2d. per ton for handling out of trucks or other vehicles into ship's slings.

THE amendment to Regulations under "The Stock Diseases Act, 1895," as published in the Government Gazette of the 14th August, 1914, is not in accordance with that approved of by His Excellency the Governor, which reads as under :-

The Regulations under "The Stock Diseases Act, 1895," approved and published in the Government 1895," approved and published in the Government Gazette on the 10th day of July, 1914, are hereby amended as follows; such amendments to come into force on and from the date of their publication in the Government Gazette:-

(a.) By inserting a new regulation to be numbered

Insert after Regulation 55 the following new Regulation :-

55a. Subject to Regulations 52 and 55, eattle may be introduced from the other States of the Common-wealth by land into that portion of the State lying to the East of the 123rd meridian of East Longitude and to the South of the 26th parallel of South Latitude, without the production of any such certificates as are mentioned in Regulation 48.

Provided that for such cattle the only place of entrance into the portion of the State above described shall be where the present road crosses the border at a point about eight miles distant in a North-Easterly direction from Eucla.

Provided, also, that all cattle introduced into State under this regulation shall be accompanied by a statutory declaration by the owner of such cattle or by the manager of he station from which such cattle have been brought that such cattle are free from disease and have not, within a period of six months immediately preceding the making of such declaration, been in contact with cattle infected with any disease, and by a certificate in writing by the person or persons who has or have had charge of such cattle from the time of their leaving the station from which they have been brought until their arrival in the State that such cattle have not, during such period of transit, been in contact with cattle infected with any disease.

## UNIVERSITY OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

Statute No. 14-Affiliated Institutions.

- 1. A College, School, or other Educational Institu-tion in the State may apply to be recognised as an affiliated institution of the University. Such recognition shall only be given by the Senate after a report from the Professorial Board upon evidence of efficiency satisfactory to the Senate. Students of any such affiliated institution shall be permitted to attend at such institution a course of study approved by the Senate instead of the whole or part of the first year's course of study at the University, in the Faculties of Arts, Science (including Agricultural Science), or Engineering; and after presentation of Schedules of Qualifica-tion certifying that they have attended the classes and laboratory instruction and passed the class examinations prescribed by the Senate, shall be admitted to the first University examinations in those Faculties. Provided always that the Students have passed the matriculation examination of the University previous to the commencement of their qualifying course.
- 2. Any College, School, or Institution desiring to take advantage of the foregoing ordinance must—
  - (a.) Give satisfactory evidence of its educational status and that it is established on a permanent and effective footing.
  - (b.) Submit, for the approval of the Senate, courses of study of such scope and standard as may be accepted by the Senate instead of the whole or part of the first year's courses in the Faculties of Arts, Science (including Agricultural Science), or Engineering, or any part thereof.
- The Senate shall in no case grant the privilege of this statute to any College, School, or Institution for a period of more than five years, but such privilege may be renewed for a further period after a report from the Professorial Board.
- 4. The Senate reserves the right of inspecting the libraries, laboratories, and the equipment and apparatus provided for practical work, and of inquiring into the qualifications of the teachers appointed to conduct the qualifying courses.

Statute No. 15-Granting and Conferring of Degrees.

- 1. Candidates who have fulfilled all the conditions prescribed for any degree, diploma, or certificate may be granted that degree, diploma, or certificate by the
- 2. Every degree or diploma gained by examina-tion or otherwise shall be conferred by the Chancellor, or a deputy appointed by him, either at a meeting summoned for the purpose or at a meeting of the Senate. The form of words to be used by the Chancellor or his deputy shall be as follows:-
  - "By authority of the Senate of the University of Western Australia and in virtue of my office as Chancellor (or acting on behalf of the Chancellor) I now confer upon you A.B. the Degree of in this University.
- 3. Recipients of degrees other than Honorary Degrees shall be presented for admission by the Dean of the Faculty to which the degree belongs.
- 4. In exceptional cases and by resolution of the Senate degrees may be conferred upon persons in absentia.
- 5. The Senate may confer Honorary Degrees upon -approved persons.
- 6. Recipients of Honorary Degrees shall be presented by the Vice-Chancellor or a deputy appointed by him.
- 7. No person shall be admitted to any degree, ordinary, ad eundem gradum, or honorary, until he has signed the register of graduates.
- \* 8. The Chancellor may, on the recommendation of the Senate, revoke the degree or degrees, diplomas, certificates and distinctions and all privileges connected therewith of any graduate of the University who shall be convicted of felony or of any indictable misdemeanour, or whose name shall have been removed for misconduct by a properly constituted legal authority from any official register or roll of members of the profession to which he belongs and way restore on profession to which he belongs, and may restore, on cause being shown, any person whose degree, diploma, or certificate has been revoked, to the degree, diploma, or certificate he previously enjoyed, without further examination.
