THE HEALTH ACT, 1911-12.

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Health Act, 1911-12," a Local Health Authority may make By-laws prescribing the Fees to be charged for the Registration of Lodging and Boarding Houses: Now, therefore, the Weston Local Board of Health, being the Local Health Authority for the Weston Health District, do hereby make the following By-law:—

"Every keeper of a lodging or boarding house shall pay, upon registration of such premises, and annually thereafter, to the Weston Local Board of Health, the fee of 5s."

HIS Excellency the Governor in Council has been pleased to approve the following Regulations and Forms under "The Game Act, 1912-13," with effect from the 1st September, 1914.

REGULATIONS.

(24.) The form of license to farm Native Game under the provisions of Section 12b (1) of the Act shall be as set out in Form K of these Regulations. The form of application for such license shall be in Form J.

(25.) The holder of a license granted under the provisions of Section 12b (1) of the Act shall provide a book or books, and keep or cause to be kept therein a true and complete statement of the numbers and particulars of all Native Game killed or otherwise removed during each day under the authority or by virtue of the license.

(26.) If the licensee shall commit or suffer any breach or non-observance of the said Act or Regulations which on the part of the licensee ought to be observed or performed, then the Minister may, without giving any notice, declare such license void, and upon publication in the *Government Gazette* of notice of such declaration such license shall cease and determine, and the production of the *Government Gazette* containing a notice as aforesaid shall be conclusive evidence in all courts of such a breach by the licensee or other cause sufficient to authorise such declaration and that the license has been lawfully determined.

(27.) The Minister may for any cause which he may deem sufficient, but in his absolute discretion, by any subsequent notice in the *Government Gazette* cancel any notice of forfeiture and re-instate the license on any terms and conditions as regards the grantee or anything lawfully done or suffered since the forfeiture as the Minister may deem fit.

(28.) Applications for licenses under Subsection 2 of Section 12b shall be made to the Minister, according to the form set out in the Schedule hereto (Form L).]

(29.) Licenses under Subsection 2 of Section 12b may be issued for any period not exceeding six months, such period being computed as from the date of the issue of the license, and shall be according to the form in the Schedule hereto (Form M).

(30.) Native Game taken under the authority of a license issued under Subsection 2 of Section 12b shall be liberated upon lands equipped as a farm for that kind of Native Game.

(31.) Persons licensed under Subsection 2 of Section 12b or their agents or servants shall, for the purposes of taking Native Game for stocking farms for Native Game, use only such traps or other appliances as may have been approved by the Chief Inspector of Fisheries.

(32.) Every licensee shall provide a book or books and keep or cause to be kept therein a true and complete statement of the numbers of each particular kind of Native Game taken during each day under the authority of such license.

(33.) Should, during trapping operations under the authority of a license issued under Subsection 2 of Section 12b, the licensee or his agents or servants secure Native Game or Native Game of any particular kind which has been killed during such trapping operations, or which has received injuries necessitating the killing of such Native Game, then such licensee or his agents or servants shall cause such Native Game to be skinned, and such skin or skins shall be preserved, and shall keep or cause to be kept in a book provided for such purpose a true and complete record of all Native Game so treated; provided that no licensee or his agents or servants shall dispose of Native Game so taken without the written consent of the Minister, and under such conditions as the Minister may consider necessary.

(34.) Every licensee shall, on demand of a Guardian or of an officer of police or other person authorised in writing by the Minister, produce or cause to be produced all books in which entries, as provided in the preceding Regulations, have been made, and any Guardian, or an officer of police or other person duly authorised as hereinbefore provided, may take therefrom such extracts as may be deemed necessary, and the licensee shall not prevent or attempt to prevent the taking of any such extracts.

(35.) No person other than a Guardian or an officer of police or other person duly authorised in writing by the Minister shall, without the consent of the licensee, enter or trespass upon any farm for any kind of Native Game, and no person, without the consent of the licensee, shall allow any dog or other animal likely to destroy or disturb Native Game, to enter or remain on any farm for any kind of Native Game.

(36.) Any person committing a breach of these Regulations shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding the sum of £20.

(37.) The Minister may at any time and for any reason or without assigning any reason revoke any such license as is mentioned in any of the foregoing Regulations Nos. 24 to 36 (both inclusive).

Cambridge Gulf.—Channel Rock.—The beacon marking these rocks has disappeared. Chart affected, No. 1388.

King Sound.—Point Torment, Elbow Shoal.—The two black buoys North of this shoal have been removed. Chart affected, No. 1052.

Port Hedland.—Outer Bar.—In crossing this bar deeper water has been obtained by keeping the leading beacons open, slightly either East or West.

Middle Ground.—This has shoaled considerably of late years. The dry portion of the bank has extended

as a narrow ridge to the North and Westward of buoy. Vessels should round buoy fifty yards off.

The single pile beacon (red) off Harriet Point has disappeared. Chart affected, No. 1437.

Onslow, Ashburton Roads.—The stake beacon on spit at entrance to Ashburton River has disappeared. Chart affected, No. 3152.

Hamelin Bay.—Buoys marking channel and mooring buoys have been removed. Charts affected, Nos. 1472, 1054.

The discovery of the following shoals is reported by H.M.S. "Fantome":—

Shoals between James Price Point and Station Hill.

(1.) A chain of shoals of less than 5 fathoms at L.W.O.S., of irregular shape, running in a N.N.E.'ly direction 13 cables from the shoalest part, which has a least depth of 12 feet over it at L.W.O.S. and lies $330\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ (N. 32° W. Mag.) 3.88 miles from Gantheaume Point Light, and $273\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ (N. 88° W. Mag.) 4.02 miles from Station Hill. In between these shoals are depths of 6 to 7 fathoms.

(2.) A small coral head with a depth of 32 feet at L.W.O.S. is situated 324° (N. $37\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ W. Mag.) 5.50 miles from Gantheaume Point Light and $283\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ (N. 78° W. Mag.) 5.50 miles from Station Hill. This shoal is surrounded by depths of 6 to 7 fathoms.

(3.) A small coral head with a depth of 32 feet at L.W.O.S. is situated $338\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ (N. 23° W. Mag.) 5.32 miles from Gantheaume Point Light and $294\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ (N. 67° W. Mag.) 4.40 miles from Station Hill. This shoal is surrounded by depths of 6 fathoms.

(4.) A small coral head with a depth of 32 feet at L.W.O.S. is situated 329° (N. $32\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ W. Mag.) 11.79 miles from Gantheaume Point Light and $310\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ (N. 51° W. Mag.) 10.74 miles from Station Hill. This shoal is surrounded by depths of 6 to 8 fathoms.

(5.) A small coral head with a depth of 33 feet at L.W.O.S. is situated 3° (N. $41\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ W. Mag.) 9.65 miles from Station Hill and 339° (N. $22\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ W. Mag.) 11.32 miles from Gantheaume Point Light. This shoal is surrounded by depths of 7 to 8 fathoms.

(6.) A shoal of sand and coral with a depth of 26 feet at L.W.O.S. is situated $190\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ (S. 9° W. Mag.) 11.25 miles from the 87 summit on James Price Point, and 337° (N. $24\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ W. Mag.) 15.65 miles from Station Hill. From this head the shoal extends in a Nor'-Easterly direction $1\frac{1}{2}$ cables, in an Easterly direction $1\frac{1}{2}$ cables, in a Southerly direction $1\frac{1}{2}$ cables, and has depths of $4\frac{3}{4}$ to 5 fathoms. It is surrounded by depths of 6 to 7 fathoms.

(7.) A small shoal of sand and coral having a depth of 30 feet at L.W.O.S. is situated $212\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ (S. 31° W. Mag.) 10.92 miles from the 87 summit on James Price Point, and 329° (N. $32\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ W. Mag.) 19.00 miles from Station Hill. From this head the shoal extends in a Nor'-Easterly direction for one cable. It is surrounded by depths of 6 to 10 fathoms.

Shoals near James Price Point.

(8.) A shoal of sand and coral with a depth of 24 feet at L.W.O.S. is situated 285° (N. $76\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ W. Mag.) 2.27 miles from the 87 summit on James Price Point, and $202\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ (S. 21° W. Mag.) 7.56 miles from the 97 summit just South of Coulomb Point. The 5-fathoms line surrounding the shoal extends 285° (N. $76\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ W. Mag.) 2.77 miles from the above-mentioned 87 summit, 9 cables South, and 3 cables North from the above-mentioned 24 feet.

A depth of 30 feet sand and coral at L.W.O.S. is situated 244° (S. $62\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ W. Mag.) 2.88 miles from the 87 summit on James Price Point, and 200° (S. $19\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ W. Mag.) 9.44 miles from the 97 summit just South of Coulomb Point. The 5-fathom line surrounding this shoal lies 4 cables in a North-and-South direction and 3 cables in an East-and-West direction from this head.

A depth of 28 feet sand and coral at L.W.O.S. is situated $231\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ (S. 50° W. Mag.) 3.36 miles from the 87 summit on James Price Point and 199° (S. $17\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ W. Mag.) 10.2 miles from the 97 summit just South of Coulomb Point. The 5-fathom line surrounding this shoal lies 1 cable West, 2 cables East, 1 cable North, and 1 cable South from this head.

PUBLIC CEMETERY, MOUNT BARKER.

By-laws.

IN pursuance of the powers vested in them, the Plantagenet Road Board, as Trustees of the Public Cemetery at Mount Barker, make the following By-laws, that is to say:—

1. All fees and charges payable to the Trustees, in accordance with Schedule A, shall be paid at the time when applications are made, or orders given.

2. Any person desiring ground in the Cemetery for a private grave, tombstone, or railing, or for any other purpose, shall apply to the Trustees, who, on payment of the required fees, shall issue to such person so applying a certificate of right of burial in the form specified in Schedule B.

3. Any person desiring to place or erect any monument, tombstone, or enclosure in any part of the Cemetery shall make application to the Trustees, and, if approved, shall obtain permission in writing in the form of Schedule D before proceeding with the work.

4. Every person who has the exclusive right of burial in any grave, shall keep such grave and any erection thereon in proper repair, and if after receiving notice in writing from the Trustees requiring such repairs to be executed shall fail to do so, then, after the expiration of 28 days, the Trustees may cause such repairs to be executed, and may recover the cost thereof from such person before any two Justices in Petty Sessions.

5. All applications for interment shall be made to the Secretary of the Trustees or other person appointed in that behalf.

6. The name, age, and other particulars of the deceased shall be furnished when giving the order, as in Schedule C.

7. Every coffin shall have upon the lid a metal plate, with the name of the deceased and the date of death thereon.

8. Every grave shall be not less than five feet deep for adults and four feet for infants.

9. In the event of any application for interment in any private grave in which during life the deceased person had no claim, the written consent of the owner shall be given with the application.

10. No person shall perform the duties of an undertaker at any burial within the Cemetery, unless duly licensed therefor by the Trustees, and on payment of the fees set out in Schedule A.

11. No burial shall be permitted to take place in the Cemetery without an order for burial being obtained from the Trustees, in the form of Schedule C, and delivered to the sexton of the Cemetery.

12. Any workman employed by the Trustees or by any other person shall at all times while in the Cemetery be subject to the supervision, direction, and control of the surveyor, or other person duly appointed; comply

with or obey the direction of the officer, and shall be removable from the Cemetery upon any breach of the By-laws, or any refusal or neglect to comply with or obey the direction of the officer.

13. No rubbish or any material removed in dressing a grave shall be placed on any other grave or pathway, and if placed on any adjoining ground shall be removed immediately after completion of the work.

14. No smoking shall be allowed within the Cemetery, nor shall any explosives or fireworks be discharged therein, except by special permission and in case of a military funeral.

15. No animals, other than horses drawing hearses or mourning coaches, shall be permitted to enter the Cemetery. No dogs shall be admitted into the Cemetery; any found therein shall be liable to be destroyed.

16. No person shall cut, pluck, gather, or take out of the Cemetery any flowers, plants, shrub, tree, or any part thereof, or do any injury whatsoever thereto, or to any plot, border, railing, fence, or any erection or road, or remove or interfere with anything laid, built, or placed upon any grave or plot space, and any person so doing shall be guilty of a breach of this By-law and, on conviction, be liable to a penalty as hereinafter provided for.

17. All fees not paid may be recovered, and all proceedings under these By-laws taken before any two Justices in Petty Sessions, except where otherwise provided for.

18. A plan of the Cemetery shall be kept at the office of the Trustees, showing the distributive sections, blocks, graves numbered, a register of burials and certificates of rights of burials.

19. The hours for burial shall be as follows:—

On week-days, September to April inclusive, 9 a.m. to 6 p.m.; May to August inclusive, from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m.; and on Sundays throughout the year, from 9 to 10 a.m. and from 12 noon to 5 p.m.;

and no burial shall be allowed to take place before or after the hours above-mentioned, except by special permission.

20. Any person committing a breach of any of the foregoing By-laws shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds, and in case of a continuing breach, not exceeding one pound for every day during which such breach continues.

21. The enforcement of these By-laws, and the due performance of all the duties imposed thereunder and in "The Cemeteries Act, 1897," and amending Acts, shall, subject to the absolute control of the Trustees, be performed by a Committee of Management, to consist of seven members, who shall be annually chosen at the statutory meeting of the ratepayers, the Trustees reserving to themselves the right to at any time assume the active administration of the Cemetery.

COURT OF ARBITRATION, WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

No. 8 of 1913.

Between The Baddera Miners' Union of Workers, A.W.A. (hereinafter called "the union"), Applicant, and The Fremantle Trading Company, Limited (hereinafter included under the denomination "the employer"), Respondent.

AWARD.

THE Court of Arbitration of Western Australia (hereinafter called "the Court") having taken into consideration the matter of an industrial dispute between the above-named parties, and having heard the union and the employer by their respective representatives duly appointed, and having heard and considered the evidence adduced on behalf of the union and the employer respectively, doth hereby order and award that, as between the union and the members thereof and the employer, the terms, conditions, and provisions contained in the schedule hereto shall be binding upon the union and the members thereof and upon the employer, and that the said terms, conditions, and provisions shall be deemed to be and they are hereby incorporated into and declared to form part of this award: And further, that the union and the members thereof and the employer respectively do, observe, and perform every matter and thing by the said terms, conditions, and provisions required to be done, observed, and performed, and shall not do anything in contravention thereof, but shall in all respects abide by and observe and perform the same.

THE SCHEDULE HEREINBEFORE REFERRED TO.

1. *Locality.*—The award shall have effect over the area comprised within a radius of thirty miles from the Post Office, Northampton.

2. *Term.*—The award shall be deemed to have come into effect on the first day of June, One thousand nine hundred and fourteen, and shall continue in force until the first day of June, One thousand nine hundred and seventeen: Provided, nevertheless, that the Court may at any time after the first day of June, One thousand nine hundred and sixteen, on the application in the prescribed manner by any party or person affected by its provisions, alter or amend the award in such manner as the Court may deem expedient.

3. *Wages.*—The minimum rate of wage payable by the employer to a person employed in any of the capacities hereinafter mentioned shall be:—

Should any dispute arise on the point as to whether any particular place in the mine is wet, the matter shall be referred to a Board composed of a representative appointed by the union, a representative appointed by the employer, with the Warden of the District or the Inspector of Mines as chairman, whose decision shall be final.

5. *Hours of Labour.*—The hours of labour shall be:—For men working one shift on the surface, forty-eight hours per week, exclusive of crib time; for men working shifts on the surface, forty-eight hours per week, inclusive of crib time; for men working underground, forty-seven hours per week inclusive of crib time.

Work shall commence at 1 a.m. on Monday, and shall cease at 10 p.m. on Saturday.

The night shift following the Sunday shall commence work at 1 a.m. on Monday, and cease work at 8 a.m. The day shift on Saturday shall on that day commence at 8 a.m., and cease work at 3 p.m. The afternoon shift on Saturday shall go on at 3 p.m., and cease work at 10 p.m.

6. *Sunday Work.*—Men required to work on Sunday shall, if required to do other than necessary work, be paid whilst so engaged at the rate of time and a-half; otherwise ordinary time rate only shall apply.

(e.) Every person offending against this By-law shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a fine not exceeding £10.
