## THE ELECTORAL ACT, 1907.

## FOODSTUFFS COMMISSION ACT, 1914.

*Notice to furnish Returns.*

BY virtue of the powers conferred on them under Section 4, Subsection 2, of the above Act, the Commissioners hereby require all persons in possession of more than the quantities specified in the second column of the Schedule hereto, of the commodities specified in the first column of the Schedule hereto, to furnish the Commission with Returns of the quantities of any or all of such commodities in their possession as on Monday, the 14th September, 1914. Returns to be sent in on or before Monday, the 21st September, 1914.

Persons failing to furnish returns, or furnishing false returns, are liable to the heavy penalties prescribed in Sections 4 and 5 of the above Act:—

Wheat,	100 bushels,
Flour,	1 ton.
Pollard,	1 ton.
Bran,	1 ton.
Oats,	100 bushels.
Hay,	5 tons.
Chaff,	5 tons.
Straw,	5 tons.
