3. Candidates for examination shall be required to pass, to the satisfaction of the Board, an examination in each of the subjects hereinafter specified.

4. The scope of the examination in the subjects is indicated by the text books and statutes hereinafter referred to.

5. Candidates will be expected to show a competent knowledge of the law as set out in the text books, in so far as it is in force in this State, as well as of any statutory modifications of or additions to such law in force in the State and of the statutes hereinafter specified.

12. The result of every examination shall be certified under the hand of two members of the Board to the Commissioner, and the Commissioner shall give to every successful candidate a certificate that he has passed the examination.

Whereas it is provided by Section 19 of "The Pre-vention of Cruelty to Animals Act, 1912," that except as therein provided nothing in the said Act contained shall apply to any act done in any vivisection or other experiment performed on any animal, in accordance with regulations made by the Governor for the humane conduct of such experiments, by any person who has (pur-suant to such regulations) been duly authorised by the Governor to perform such experiments, and whose authority in this behalf the Governor has not withdrawn: And whereas it is by the said section further provided that the exemption in the said section further provided that the exemption in the said section contained shall not take effect except subject to certain conditions: And whereas it is enacted by Section 20 of the said Act that the Governor may make regulations not inconsistent with the said Act, prescribing all matters which, by the said Act, are required or permitted to be prescribed, or as may be prescribed for given may be necessary or convenient to be prescribed for giving effect to the said Act: And whereas it is desirable to make regulations for the purposes of the said Section 19 and embodying the conditions therein set out: Now, therefore I, the said Governor, acting with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby, in exercise of every power me in this behalf enabling, make the following

hereto.

2. The application shall be submitted to the Prin-cipal Medical Officer, who shall report thereon to the Attorney General, and the application and report shall be submitted to the Governor.

3. If the Governor approves the application, he may grant to the applicant an authority in the terms of the

application, subject to any conditions or restrictions which may be deemed expedient. 4. An authority under these Regulations shall be ac-cording to Form 2 in the Schedule, and may be general or may be limited to any particular experiment or experiments.

5. Any authority granted hereunder may be withdrawn by the Governor at any time and for any reason or without any reason being assigned.

6. A register of the persons having authority under these regulations shall be kept by the Under Secretary for Law. 7. Eve

 $\tau_{\rm c}$  Every operation conducted by any authorised per-son shall be performed with a minimum of suffering to the animal operated upon.

8. No operation involving the possible infliction of suffering shall be performed unless such experiment is

likely to be of scientific value. 9. The animal subject to the operation shall, during the whole time thereof, be so under the influence of some anaesthetic as to be insensible to pain.

10. When the animal has, in the course of such opera-tion, been so injured that its recovery would involve serious suffering, it shall be destroyed while still insensible.

11. An animal which has suffered one operation shall not be subjected to another.

12. Where by feeding or inoculation any animal shall have been infected with disease and such disease is likely to prove painful, the animal shall be destroyed at the

earliest possible moment consistent with the completion of observations for which the test was designed. 13. Any animal which is to be destroyed at the ter-mination of any experiment shall be destroyed in the wort reprid and humans applicable to that one most rapid and humane manner applicable to that ani-mal; unless some specific method of destruction is necessary for the purpose of the experiment, in which case the animal shall be previously anaesthetised or otherwise rendered insensible, if the manner of death is likely to be prolonged or painful.

14. No operation shall be carried out upon any ani-mal within the sight or hearing of any other animal, unless the nature of the experiment renders the presence of another animal reasonably unavoidable or unless both animals have been previously anaesthetised. 15. These regulations may be cited as the Vivisection





### By-law No. 1.

That the special yearly license for vehicles engaged in heavy traffic, that is to say, in carrying timber in bulk, or any other heavy substance whatever, such as machinery

or boilers, shall be as follows:--For two (2) wheeled vehicles, £2 per wheel per annum.

For four (4) wheeled vehicles, £1 10s. per wheel per annum.

### By-law No. 2.

That the special yearly license for vehicles engaged That the special yearly heense for vehicles engaged in heavy traffic, that is to say, in carrying stone, bricks, lime, earth, gravel, mineral, liquid, or other such sub-stance whatever, shall be as follows:— For two (2) wheeled vehicles, 5s. per wheel. For four (4) wheeled vehicles, 5s. per wheel. Such amounts shall be additional to those prescribed under "The Cart and Carriage Act, 1876." Any person who shall use on any read in the District

Any person who shall use, on any road in the District, any vehicle engaged in such traffic as defined in these By-laws, for which vehicle a current license has not been obtained under such By-laws, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10.

#### Interpretation.

The following words in these By-laws shall be interpreted as follows :-

- "Board" shall mean the Dowerin District Road Board.
- "District" shall mean the district under the jurisdiction of the Dowerin District Road Board. "Chairman"—The member acting for the time being as Chairman of the Board.

  - the Chairman. "Road" or "Reserve"-Any road or reserve, as the case may be, under the control of the Board.
  - "Person" shall include the plural, and also a body corporate.
  - "Public Streets" shall include every public street,
- road, footway, square, thoroughfare, or other public place within the Board's District. "Owner" shall apply to every person in possession or receipt either of the whole or any part of the rents or profits of any house, building, land or tenement
- land, or tenement. "Occupier" shall mean the inhabitant occupier of any land, or if there is no inhabitant occupier, the person entitled to the possession thereof, and shall include leaseholder.
- "Surveyor" shall mean the Surveyor of the Board or other officer authorised to act as such for the time being. "Inspector of Vehicles" or "Licensing Officer"
- shall mean the Inspector or Licensing Officer of the Board

"Town" shall mean and include any township or settlement within the Board's District. Other interpretations are as defined in Section 4 of "The Roads Act, 1911."

### By-law No. 1.

### Standing Orders-Order of Proceedings.

The Board shall meet at the Board Room, Minni-1. vale, on the Saturday nearest the full moon in every month, at the hour of 10.30 a.m., for the transaction of their ordinary business, and the business of the Board shall be conducted with open doors.

The Board shall commence business as soon after the above-mentioned hour as there is sufficient number of members in attendance to constitute a quorum; but if at the expiration of three and a half hours from the above-mentioned hour there is not a quorum present, no business shall be contracted by the Board at that meeting.

Should the Chairman not be present, the meeting shall elect a chairman from the members present, who shall preside during the absence of the Chairman.

4. At all meetings of the Board when there is not a quorum present, or when the Board is counted out (which counting out shall take place whenever there shall be less than one-third of the members of the Board, exclusive of the Chairman, or member chosen to preside in his absence), such circumstance, together with the names of the members present, shall be recorded in the minute book.

5. At all meetings of the Board the minutes of any preceding meeting, not previously confirmed, shall be read as the first business in order to their confirmation, and no discussion shall be permitted thereupon except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings.

### Order of Business at Meetings.

6. After the signing of the minutes as aforesaid, the order of business of any ordinary meeting shall be as follows, or near thereto as may be practicable, but for the greater convenience of the Board at any particular meeting thereof it may be altered by resolution to that effect:

- 1. Correspondence.
- 2. Report of Committees.
- 3. Secretary's report

4. Orders of the day.

5. Notices of motion. 6. Accounts.

And the order of business at a general meeting shall be any order in which such business stands in the notice thereof.

#### Divisions.

7. Whenever a division shall be demanded by any member, the members voting in the affirmative shall first hold up their hands, and then those voting in the negative shall hold up their hands, and the result be deelared by the Chairman.

#### Addresses to Governor.

8 All addresses to the Governor shall be presented by the Chairman and the Secretary, unless otherwise ordered by the Board.

### Orders of Debate.

9. Any two members may require the Board's Chamber to be cleared of strangers, and the Chairman or other presiding Chairman shall immediately give direc-tions to have the order executed.

10. Any member proposing a motion or an amend-ment shall, if the Chairman so desire it, put it in writing to the Chairman for the time being, after it has been duly seconded, and the Chairman or other presiding Chairman shall read the same before being discussed, and no motion or amendment so made shall be withdrawn without leave of the Board.

11. No member shall speak twice upon the same question except by way of explanation or in reply upon any original motion of which he may have been the mover, or as the mover of the amendment last carried. Nevertheless, any member who may have been mis-represented or misunderstood shall be allowed to explain immediately before the mover rises to reply. The amendment of the original motion, as the case may be, shall

immediately be put to the vote. 12 The Chairman or other presiding Chairman shall, without waiting for the interposition of the Board, call to order any member proceeding to speak a second time on the same question, unless entitled to reply, or in

explanation where misrepresented or misunderstood. 13. Any member moving a motion or amendment shall

be held to have spoken on that question. 14. No member shall digress from the subject matter of the question under discussion, or impute improper motives to any other member.

15. The Chairman or other presiding Chairman, when called upon to decide a point of order or practice, shall state the rule or precedent applicable to the case without argument or comment, and his decision shall be final , in that particular case.

16. One amendment shall only be discussed at one time, but, if lost, another may be moved before the original question is put to the vote; but upon any amendment being carried it shall be competent for any member to move one other amendment thereon, but no more.

17. Upon the adoption of any amendment, such amendment shall be held to have quashed the original motion; and for all purposes of subsequent discussion the amendment so carried shall be acted on as an

original motion. 18. No motion the effect of which, if carried, would be to resend any motion which has already passed the Board, shall be entertained during the same Board's year unless by consent of at least four members of the

Board 19. In case of an equality of votes, the Chairman or other presiding Chairman shall give a casting vote, and any reasons stated by him shall be entered in the minutes and proceedings.

20. No by-law shall be finally passed or rescinded at the meeting at which it shall have been first pro-posed, nor until the next or some subsequent meeting of the Board duly convened.

Members to apologise for disorderly expressions, etc.

21. Whenever any member shall make use of any expression disorderly or capable of being applied offen-sively to any other member, the member so offending shall be required by the Chairman to withdraw the expression and to make a satisfactory apology to the Board.

### Members called to order to sit down.

20 A member called to order shall sit down unless permitted to explain.

#### Member twice offending guilty of an offence.

23. Any member using offensive or disorderly language or having been twice called to order or to with-draw or apologise for such conduct, and refusing so to do, shall be guilty of an offence.

#### Voting.

24. The Board shall vote by show of hands, and any member present and not voting, not being disabled by law from so doing, shall be guilty of an offence.

### Protests.

25. Any member may protest against any resolution of the Board, and notice of intention to protest shall in every case be given forthwith on the adoption of the resolution protested against; and the protest shall specify the reasons for protesting, and shall be entered three days at least before the ordinary meeting of the Board by the protesting member in a book to be kept for that purpose in the office of the Secretary, and signed by such member and shall be also entered in the minutes of the meeting at which notice of the intention to protest shall have been given previously to the confirmation thereof; but such protest may be expunged from the minutes if declared by the majority of the Board to be not in accordance with truth or in its terms disrespectful to the Board.

### Tenders to be opened.

26. Tenders for work shall be opened, considered, and dealt with at each meeting of the Board, or at any time subsequent thereto which the Chairman may appoint.

#### Appointments.

27 No appointment to any permanent office at the disposal of the Board shall take place until seven clear days' public notice has been given by advertisement in one or more newspapers circulating in the Board's district, inviting application from qualified candidates for the same.

### Applications for Office-How opened.

28. At the next meeting of the Board after the notice as before mentioned has been given, all letters and applications for the office shall be opened and the names read aloud, and the appointment may then be made.

### Election of Officers.

29. All elections for officers at the disposal of the Board shall be effected by voting by ballot, and it shall be a general rule that two candidates polling the largest number be again put to vote until one of such can-didates shall have polled the majority of votes of the members present, every member present being required to record his vote.

### Penalty.

30. If any person shall be guilty of an offence or misfeasance or negligent act or omission contrary to any provision contained in this subdivision, he shall forfeit a sum not exceeding  $\pounds 5$ .

### BY-LAW No. 2.

### For regulating the Duties of Officers of the Board.

1. The Secretary .- This officer is the medium of communication between all the officers of the Board and the Board. All officers must therefore take their in-

the Board. All oncers must therefore take their in-structions from the Secretary. 2. The Collector.—The Collector for the time being duly appointed by the Board shall demand, collect, and receive all rates, assessments, license fees, fines, for-feitures, rents, tolls, and other sums of money due to the Board, and his receipt shall be a sufficient discharge for any sums paid to him, and all sums so received by the Collector shall by him be paid to the Secretary of the Board at least weekly. the Board at least weekly. 3. Secretary of the Board.—The Secretary of the

Board shall keep the books of the Board, and shall duly keep and enter in a proper minute-book minutes of all proceedings of the Board. He shall attend all meetings

of the Board (including committee meetings), or Chairman thereof, and in due time, the voters' lists for the District, and cause them to be affixed as by "The Roads Act, 1911," required, and shall supply copies thereof by the said Act provided, and shall make up and complete under the direction of the Board the Rate Book, and shall under the like direction prepare the annual estimates as by the said Act required. He shall also keep all books required by the said Act. He shall also, under the like direction of the said Board, cause the accounts of the said Board to be balanced yearly as required by the Act. He shall, also, under the yearly as required by the Act. He shall, also, under the direction of the Board, prepare the annual financial statement or summary, and shall do and perform all other such Acts as the Board or Chairman therefor may lawfully require him to do under or by virtue of the said Act, and shall attend the Board's office during such hours as the Board shall determine.

4. Engineer, Surveyor, and Supervisor.—The En-gineer, Surveyor, or Supervisor for the time being appointed by the Board, shall have the immediate care, management, and direction of all buildings, lands, streets, paths, markets, posts, fences, drains, culverts, and all other property belonging to, or in charge of or under the possession, power, or control of the Board, and he shall from time to time report to the Board the state, condition, and repair of the same, and the pro-gress of any works going on therein or thereon, and the breach of any by-law in connection therewith. He shall also have the immediate care and management of all parks, recreation grounds, commonages, trees, and all parks, recreation grounds, commonages, trees, and plants, and is hereby authorised to impound or cause to be impounded any stray stock unlawfully being on any street or property of the Board, and to report the breach or violation of our by low in compacting the preach or violation of any by-law in connection therewith.

### Generally.

5. The Board shall from time to time, and at their discretion, have power to provide that the duties of the Collector, Secretary of the Board, Engineer, Sur-veyor, and Supervisor, and Inspector, and any other officer shall be performed by one or two persons, and shall have power to appoint assistants.

#### General Instructions to Officers.

6. At all times officers of the Board in passing 6. At all times officers of the Board in passing through the District are requested to be watchful and vigilant, and report immediately to the Secretary any dereliction of duty on the part of the contractors, or any infringement of the Board's By-laws. Any officer must, on the direction of the Secretary, assist for the time being any other officer of the Board as instructed No officer or cadet is to be absent without leave. Special leave may be obtained to the extent of one day only from the Secretary, if he is satisfied as to the urgency of the occasion. No officer shall issue a receipt for money received by him except upon the recognised official printed receipt form of the Board.

### BY-LAW No. 3.

### Custody and use of Board's Seal.

The Secretary shall have charge of the common 1. seal of the Board, and shall be responsible for the safe keeping and proper use of same.

### Attestations under Board's Seal.

2. The Secretary shall not affix the common seal to any corporate document other than contracts of the work to be executed, entered into by and with the Board without the express orders of the Board, but in case of power of attorney and other legal instruments not relating to the Board, the signatures of which require to be verified by the declaration or otherwise before the Chairman, the said seal may be affixed by the Secretary to the Chairman's certificate accompany-ing same, on receipt of a fee of Five shillings.

### Custody of Records, Journals, etc.

3. The custody of records, journals, and all docu-ments whatsoever laid before the Board shall be kept in the charge of the Secretary, who shall neither take nor permit to be taken any such record journals, or documents from the Board's offices without the express leave or order of the Board.

### BY-LAW No. 4. Rates.

# All rates shall be payable yearly, and the Collector for the time being duly appointed by the Board shall. for the time being duly appointed by the Board small, within sixty days after the making up of the rate book, leave with the person liable to pay the same at his residence, or post to his last known address, or fixed upon the property rated, a notice of the amount due by such person, and requiring payment within thirty days, or at such other times, and by such instalments as the Board may by resolution appoint; and if the amount be not paid at the expiration of thirty days after such application, or at the times and in the manner directed by the Board in any resolution as aforesaid the Collector shall take proceedings for its recovery.

### BY-LAW No. 5.

# For the Preservation of Trees within the Townsites and Roads.

Any person who shall carelessly, wilfully, or wantonly injure, destroy, carry away, or remove from its place any tree, shrub, or plant, planted in any of the streets, roads, enclosures, or public places of, belonging to, or under the care or superintendence of the Board, or who shall carelessly, wilfully, wantonly injure, destroy, carry away, or remove out of its place, or ride or drive against any tree guard, fences, or other protection to any such trees, shrubs, or plants, or tie any horse or other animal to any of the tree guards, fence, or other protection to any such trees, shrubs, or plants as aforesaid shall forfeit and pay for every such offence a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds ( $\pounds$ 10).

#### BY-LAW No. 6.

To prevent Obstruction to Footpaths of the Streets. Every person who shall permit any goods, wares, mer-chandise, boxes, coal, firewood, or other articles to remain or be on any footway or any portion thereof, or any street within a town, for a longer period than shall be necessary for housing or removing, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

### BY-LAW No. 7.

### Throwing Dangerous Substances on Footpaths.

1. No person shall throw any orange peel, banana

1. No person shall throw any orange peel, bahana skin, or other vegetable substances, or any dangerous offensive, or noxious substance, vegetable or otherwise, or throw any lighted match on any footpath. 2. No person shall sweep, throw, or place any rub-bish, garbage, sweepings, litter, or refuse of any de-scription on any footpath or street of a town, or into the gutter or channel thereof, or cause or permit the

3. No person shall empty, throw, or discharge, or permit to be emptied, thrown or discharged, any foul or offensive water or other liquid, into or upon any street of a town, or into any gutter or channel thereof. 4. Every person offending against this By-law shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay for each offence a sum not exceeding Ten pounds (£10).

### BY-LAW No. 8.

# For the compelling of filling of any Cellarways or Openings under any Footways.

1. No trap-door or cellar-flap or covering over any stair, vault, or cellarway or opening shall be made or fixed so the covering to such stair, vault, or cellar-way or opening (except fixed gratings for which per-mission has been granted by the Board) shall project on or over any portion of the footway of any street within the town, without permission being previously granted granted.

2. Any person offending against either of the pro-visions of this By-law shall, for every offence, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (£10).

### BY-LAW No. 9.

Any person guilty of the following offences, omis-sions, or neglect shall, on conviction, pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (10) :-

- (a) Riding or driving horses, cattle, or other ani-mals upon or along any footpath.
  (b) Allowing any nightsoil or other offensive mat-
- ter to be spilt or otherwise cast into or upon any road street, footway, or other public place.

- (c) Allowing the drippings of the eaves or gutters of any house or other buildings to fall upon any public footway.
- (d) Opening any drain or sewer, or removing the surface of any footpath or carriage road, without the consent of the Board being first obtained.
- (c) Neglecting to clean all private yards, stables, pigsties, urinals, ways, passages, or avenues by which neglect a nuisance or an offensive smell is caused.
- (f) Beating any carpet or playing any game to the annoyance of any person upon any foot-way, carriage road, or public place.(g.) Throwing or discharging any stone or other missile to the damage or danger of any
- person.
- (h) Having an awning on any footway in any public street or thoroughfare, not being eight clear feet above the footway, or hanging any goods on or under such awning over the footway.
- (i) Furiously driving or riding in or along any street, thoroughfare, or public place.

#### BY-LAW No. 10.

To provide for the Licensing of Hawkers trading within the District, and fixing the amounts to be paid for their Licenses, for the Registration of their Names, and the Regulation of their Conduct.

1. It shall not be lawful for any person, without being licensed as herein provided, to hawk within the district, for the purpose of trading or carrying about for sale, any fresh fish, meat, fruit, or vegetables, or any beast of burden, or in any cart, dray, wagon, truck, or any vehicle drawn by horses, oxen, or other animals,

or any venicle drawn by horses, oxen, or other animals, or drawn or pushed by hand, or in any pack or basket. 2. Licenses in the form of the Schedule may be issued by the Secretary to every person applying to be licensed to hawk or vend on payment for the same of a fee of 10s, per quarter, and the Secretary shall keep a register of the names of all licensed hawkers.

3. Every person licensed shall have exposed to public view, while hawking, on his licensed vehicle, truck, pack, or backet, his name and licensed number, and the words "Licensed Hawker" painted in legible and conspicuous Roman letters, not less than one inch in length and of

corresponding width. 4. Every unlicensed person who shall exhibit, for the purpose of hawking goods, any name on any vehicle or pack purporting to be the name of the licensed per-son, who shall omit to show to any Inspector, or other officer of the Board or police constable, on demand, his license for hawking, or shall neglect to have painted the same, number, and words aforesaid, or fail to keep them legible and conspicuous, and generally every person offending against any provision of this section, shall forfeit and pay for each offence, upon conviction, a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (£10) for every such offence.

### BY-LAW No. 11.

### Damaging Property, etc., of Board.

Any person who shall without having first obtained Any person who shall without having first obtained the sanction in writing of the Board, break up, or cut down, damage, destroy, or injure, or remove, or carry away any footpath, tree, plant, buildings, sand, or other property belonging to, or in chage of, or under the control or power of the Board shall forfeit and pay, (£10) for each such offence.

#### BY-LAW No. 12.

#### To prevent danger from Inflammable Materials within the boundaries of any Town.

Any person who shall stack any hay, straw, or other inflammable material within 75 feet of any house or other building, and shall not remove the same within two hours after due notice from the Secretary, shall forfeit and pay, on conviction, a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20) for each such offence.

### BY-LAW No. 13.

To prevent the Accumulation of Inflammable Materials. No person shall permit in any yard, way, or other premises owned or occapied by him within any town, any accumulation of straw, paper, shavings, empty cases,

crates packed with straw, or other inflammable material whatever; and any person who, after two hours' notice from the Secretary for the time being on that behalf, shall neglect or refuse to remove such inflammable material shall be guilty of an offence against this Bylaw, and, upon conviction, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20).

### BY-LAW No. 14.

### Park Lands, Reserves, and Recreation Grounds.

1. All park lands and recreation grounds shall be open to the public daily for recreation purposes, except ing as otherwise provided for in this By-law.

ing as otherwise provided for in this By-law. 2. The Board shall have the power to grant the exclusive right to use and ocuppy any park lands, recreation grounds, or reserves within the district, or under the control of the Board, for holding sports or amusements, to any responsible person or persons for any time not exceeding three consecutive days, subject to such conditions as may be decided upon by the Board, and any person or persons obtaining such rights shall be responsible for the proper care of all fences, buildings, erections, and trees upon or enclosing such park lands or recreation grounds, and shall pay to the Board a fee to be fixed. The public shall have the right to enter into such lands on payment to the persons so using and occupying as aforesaid a sum not more than 1s. per head per day, and subject to the rules and regulations made by the person or persons so using or occupying; provided that an extra charge of not more than two shillings per head may be made to any part of the grounds set apart as a special reserve or stand, and all vehicles and horses at 6d, each.

3. No cattle, pigs, goats, or losse horses shall be allowed upon any park lends, or, whether in harness or in saddle, shall be allowed therein without the previous consent in writing of the Board.

4. All persons using or being upon any park lands, recreation grounds, or reserves, shall at all times conduct themselves in a becoming and orderly manner, and any person creating any disturbance or annoyance to the public, or playing an unlawful game, or any game which in the opinion of the Board is dangerous, shall be liable to be expelled therefrom by any police constable or officer of the Board, or person or persons using or occupying as referred to in this By-law, or their assistants.

5. The Board may in its discretion prohibit any games or gymnastics from being played or being carried on by any person or persons upon any park lands, recreation ground, or reserves, without having first obtained the written consent of the Board, on any Sunday, Christmas Day, or Good Friday. 6. No games of chance shall be allowed on any park

6. No games of chance shall be allowed on any park lands, reserves, and recreation grounds under the Board's jurisdiction. Any person offending against this By-law shall, for every offence, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5.

### BY-LAW No. 15.

#### Quarries and Timber.

1. Any person who shall quarry or remove stone, or any other material on the lands belonging to or in charge of, or under the possession, control, or power of the Board, without a written license therefor, shall forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

2. Any person who shall cut or remove any timber or bush on the lands belonging to or in charge, or under the possession, control, or power of the Board, without a license, shall forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a penalty not exceeding Five pounds ( $\pounds$ 5).

### BY-LAW No. 16.

#### Procession of Bands.

No prossession other than a funeral procession, shall pass through any street of a town without having first obtained the written permission of the Board. Any person offending against this By-law shall forfeit and pay, on conviction, a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

### BY-LAW No. 17.

### Regulating Street Traffic on Special Occasions.

The Board may, by its discretion, regulate c" prohibit the traffic in or along all or any of the foot and carriage ways or any street during times of public interest, amusement, or excitement, or during repairs to any street.

### BY-LAW No. 18.

### Walls and Fences.

1. Every fence or wall to be erected which abuts on any public street within a town, to wit on a street or footpath, shall be made of substantial fence not less than five wires, posts, toprails, and wire, and shall be of a height of not less than five feet, or shall be of wooden pickets not less than four feet, and every fence to be erected which abuts on any lane, court, or alley shall be a fence within the meaning of the Fencing Act, and any wall to be erected within a town shall not be less than 12in. stone or 9in. brick, and 2ft. 6in. in height; that no person shall erect a fence abutting on any public place within a town.

2. Every person offending against this By-law shall forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a penalty not exceeding Five pounds ( $\pounds 5$ ) for every such offence.

#### BY-LAW No. 19.

#### Lamp-posts, etc.

1. Any lamp-post, bridle-post, telegraph, telephone, or electric lighting pole shall be painted once at least in every three years, as may be directed by the Board, and the Board may order the removal by the owners of all bent, dangerous, or unsightly poles.

of all bent, dangerous, or unsightly poles. 2. Any person offending against this By-law shall forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a penalty not exceeding Two pounds (£2) for every such offence.

#### BY-LAW No. 20.

### Prescribing the removal of Verandahs, Balconies, etc., at expense of Owner or Occupicr.

Any verandah or balcony which obstructs the footway or roadway or is dangerous, and all other obstructions to the footway and roadway, or overhanging same, shall be removed when ordered, within such times as shall be notified by the Board, and all expenses incurred in removing same shall be borne by the owner or occupier of such verandah, balcony, or other obstruction, whether removed by the Board or otherwise; and any person whatsoever interfering or obstructing any officer or person employed by the Board in carrying out this By-law, on conviction, shall pay a sum not less than Ten pounds (£10).

### BY-LAW No. 21.

#### Encroachments or Obstructions to be removed.

1. On the order of the Board, the Secretary or other appointed officer may direct the removal within fourteen days of any building, fence, or other obstruction or encroachment in or upon any street, lane or public place under the control of the Board.

2. In cases where, after services of notice for such removal, any such encroachment or obstruction has not been removed within the specified time, it shall be lawful for the officer appointed by the Board to remove same at the cost and charges of the person so offending, and to proceed aginst the offender for the breach of this By-law; the penalty shall not be more than Twenty pounds ( $\pounds$ 20).

#### BY-LAW No. 22.

### Verandah Height and Width Measurement.

That any verandah erected shall extend from the building line of the street to the outer edge of the footpath, and such verandah shall not be less in height than eight feet clear above the street level, and verandah not less than eleven feet from building.

### BY-LAW No. 23.

### Regulating Signboards.

1. No person shall place or suspend in any street or lane within a town any signboard or other sign, show-bill, or show-board which shall project more than three feet from the building line, or be at a lesser height than eight feet clear above the street level, except by the permission of the Board.

2. Every person offending against this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds ( $\pounds$ 5).

### BY-LAW No. 24.

### Construction of Footpaths and Crossing-places.

1. It shall be lawful for the owner of any land fronting any street or public place requiring access thereto with horses and vehicles from such street to such land across any existing made footpath, channel, or gutter, having first had and obtained the consent of the Board, to construct a crossing of such dimensions and materials, and in such a form and manner as the regulations of the Board for the time being require, or as may be directed by the Town Surveyor, and shall thereafter keep and maintain in 'safe' repair. Any person not complying with the provisions of this By-law shall, upon conviction, forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

2. Every person who shall wilfully and without lawful excuse ride or drive or wheel any carriage, cart, or other vehicle, or shall ride any bicycle, velocipede, or tricycle along or across any footpath or water channel or gutter by the side of any street, road, or public way, save in each such case upon and by or at some properly constructed crossing, shall forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a sum not exceeding Two pounds (£2).

### BY-LAW No. 25.

### Driving around Corners, etc.

1. Every person who shall ride or drive any animal or animals, whether attached to a vehicle or not, at a rate exceeding six miles an hour or at more than a walking pace round the corners formed by the junction of any streets in a town (provided, always, that the Board put up notice boards at or near such street intersection requiring the public to drive or ride around such corner at a walking pace) shall, for every such offence, forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a sum not exceeding Two pounds (£2).

2. Every person who shall drive any horse or other animal drawing any wagon, dray, eart, or other vehicle without springs at a faster rate than four miles per hour through, over, or along any street, road, or thoroughfare in a town shall, upon conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Two pounds (£2).

### BY-LAW No. 26.

### To restrict the Breaking in of Horses or other animals in the Streets of a Town.

No person shall break in any horse, mare, gelding, pony, mule, ass, or camel, nor shall drive any bullocks or camels, either by leading, riding, or driving the same, between the hours of 7.30 a.m. and 11 p.m., in any street or thoroughfare in the town. Any person not complying with the provisions of this By-law shall, upon conviction, forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding Two pounds  $(\pounds 2)$ .

### BY-LAW No. 27.

### For preventing Animals or Vehicles being left in the Streets or Roads, or obstructing any part of the Streets or Roads.

No person shall leave any horse, ass, mule, camel, ox, cow, goat, or any vehicle to which they may be attached and harn-ssed any animal unattended in any street, road, or at any place of public resort or entertainment, without the wheel being chained, nor shall any person depasture or allow to roam any goat or other animal in any portion of a street or road, and any Board's officer or police constable may seize and remove any such vehicle or animal to the nearest public pound or town hall yard, and the person so leaving such animal shall forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding Two pounds (£2) in addition to any pound fees which may have become due and payable by reason of such impounding.

### BY-LAW No. 28.

### Curriers and Vendors of Water.

1. The Board shall have power at all times to make regulations for the removal of water from the public wells, and other water generally for their use and management, as occasion shall require, and shall, from time to time, decide and declare what wells and other water under their control shall be used for the purpose of human consumption; and no person shall take water from public wells or places not so declared for the purpose of selling the same to be used for human consumption within a town. 2. Any person desirous of taking water for the purpose of selling the same for human consumption shall obtain a license from the Board (such license to contain the conditions under which the same is granted), and shall pay a fee of 10s, per annum, and shall provide himself with a suitable marked tank or other receptacle for the carriage of water, to be approved by the Board, and used exclusively for the carriage of such water; and no tanks or other receptacles not sufficiently marked shall be used for carrying water from such wells or places for the purpose of being sold; but the Board shall have power to refuse to grant a license to any person or at any time to revoke any license at their discretion, without being called upon to give any reason for such refusal or revocation.

3. Any person offending against this By-law shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding Ten pounds  $(\pounds 10)$  for each offence.

### BY-LAW No. 29.

### Camels and Dromedaries.

No camel or dromedary shall be driven, ridden, or led along or across any street, except by special license first had and obtained from the Board, which shall embody the conditions as to the route to be observed by the owner, driver, or other person or persons who may have charge of such camel or dromedary, and no person shall depasture camels or dromedaries on the park lands, commonages, or other lands within the boundaries or under the control of the Board, without the sanction of the Board in writing, and the owner of any such camels or dromedaries shall, in addition to any penalty inflicted under these By-laws, be liable for any damage through frightening of horses, or otherwise, which may be sustained during or in consequence of the infraction of the By-law.

### BY-LAW No. 30.

## To regulate the Copulation of Stock in any Town.

No person or persons, either as owners or otherwise, in charge of an entire horse, bull, or ass shall cause, allow, permit, or suffer any such entire horse, bull, or ass to cover any mare or cow within a town, or to cause or permit, or allow or suffer, any such entire horse, bull, or ass to be turned loose in any yard or other public place with any mare or cow for the purpose of allowing such mare or cow to be covered, except in some yard, building, or other premises as shall be entirely or sufficiently screened from public view; and any person offending against any part of this By-law shall forfeit and pay for every such offence, on conviction, a sum not exceeding Ten pounds (£10).

### BY-LAW No. 31.

### No Glass, etc., to be affixed to Walls.

No person shall affix any broken glass, glass bottles, iron spikes, or barbed wire to any wall, fence, or building abutting on any street or roadway within any town, unless at a height of five feet above such street or roadway, and the owner of any spikes placed in any fence, wall, or building at a lower height shall protect the same as to prevent danger to the public. Any person offending against this By-law shall forfeit and pay, on conviction, a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (±5) for every such offence.

### BY-LAW No. 32. Pigs.

No person shall keep any kind of living swine within a town without the permission of the Board. Any person offending against this By-law shall forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a penalty not exceeding Two pounds (£2) for every such offence:

### BY-LAW No. 33.

### To prevent Trees falling across any Road and Prevention of Fire.

(a.) No person shall set fire to any standing tree upon or near to any road or track, and any such offender shall, upon conviction, pay a penalty not exceeding  $\pounds 20$ . (b.) No person shall make or leave a fire near any

### BY-LAW No. 34.

### Unauthorised Expenditure.

Every item of expenditure and every liability incurred by any committee or member of the Board, otherwise than under the authority of the Act or of these By-laws, shall be deemed unlawful expenditure, and a breach of this By-law by such person.

### BY-LAW No. 35.

### Appointment of Committee.

The Board may at any time appoint three or more members as a Committee, to inquire into any matter, and make a report and recommendation thereon, but no committee shall incur any financial liability or in any way commit the Board to any responsibility whatever, without express and specific authority conferred by the By-laws or a resolution of the Board.

The quorum of a committee shall comprise two members.

#### Finance Committee.

A Finance Committee shall consist of the Chairman and two or more members appointed by the Board for the purpose of examining all accounts, bills, and vouchers. Such committee shall meet at some hour previous to every ordinary meeting, but on the same day

All accounts, bills, and vouchers shall be submitted to the Finance Committee prior to the ordinary meeting, and after being certified as correct shall be passed for payment by resolution of the Board, and paid by cheque. Each such cheque shall be signed by the Chairman and one member of the Board, and countersigned by the Secretary.

### Urgent Works.

The Chairman with one member, or, in the absence of the Chairman, any two members may, in case of urgency, authorise the expenditure of a sum not exceeding £5, and shall in every case report the same at the next meeting of the Board.

## BY-LAW No. 36.

#### Petitions.

Every petition or memorial shall be respectful and temperate in its language, and shall be presented to the Board by a member only; and any member presenting a petition or memorial to the Board shall affix his name to the beginning thereof, with the number of signatures; and any member presenting a petition or memorial shall acquaint himself with the contents thereof, and ascertain that it does not contain language disrespectful to the Board. The nature or prayer of every petition or memorial shall be stated to the Board by the member presenting the same.

### BY-LAW No. 37.

### Damaging Road.

No person shall damage or destroy by means of horse, team, wagon, dray, or any other means, any road or portion of a road under construction or repair, and any person found guilty of such damage or destruction shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20.

- Any person who—
  (a.) Cuts or removes, without the consent in writing of the Board, timber, earth, sand, gravel, stone, or other material from a road; or
  - (b.) Erects, without the consent aforesaid, upon a road so as to encroach thereon; or
  - (c.) Draws, without the consent aforesaid, across the waterside of a road, except over a properly constructed approach or culvert, a dray or other wheeled vehicle; or (d.) Draws upon a road timber, stone, or other
  - Draws upon a road timber, stone, or other material, otherwise than on a wheeled vehicle or suffers such material, when carried prin-cipally or in part upon a wheeled vehicle, to drag or trail upon a road, or draws upon a road a whim or timber carriage any portion of which, or any portion of chains attaching
- of which, or any portion of chains attaching thereto, or any portion of any other attachment, trails or drags upon a road; or
  (e.) Draws upon any road or street any plough or other implement used in cultivating the land, without having it raised and set in such a way as not to damage the road or street.
  shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these Bylaws, and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding

laws, and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5 for every such offence.

### BY-LAW No. 38.

Cattle to keep off the Road. The owner of any cattle, sheep, horse, pig, or other animal straying on any road within the district, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £2. The owner of any bull, stallion, or boar straying on any road within the district shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10.

### BY-LAW No. 39.

### Heavy Traffic.

The owner of every vehicle or engine which, to-gether with its load, shall weigh more than four tons, shall travel the roads, bridges, and culverts at his own risk, and shall be liable to pay for any damage done.

## BY-LAW No. 40.

### Pounds.

Any person who shall break, damage, or destroy any pound fence, gate, lock, shed, trough, or premises shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5. Any person who shall obliterate, deface, or damage any table of fees, placard, or other notice required by the Act, shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law, and shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5. Any person who shall release, or attempt to release, any cattle which shall be lawfully seized for the purpose of being impounded whether such cattle the purpose of being impounded, whether such cattle shall be in the pound or on the way to or from any such pound, shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law, and shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

### BY-LAW No. 41.

### Pound and Pounding Fees.

The Pounds for the Dowerin District Road Board shall be at such place or places as may be from time to time fixed by the Board; and the following trespass fees shall and may be charged and taken by the Poundkeeper:-

## BY-LAW No. 42.

### Infected Stock.

No animal shall be allowed to stray on any roads or places, and no animal suffering from an infectious or contagious disease shall be ridden or driven on any road. Any animal found so suffering may be slaughtered and destroyed at the owner's expense.

### BY-LAW No. 43. Water Supply.

Any person who shall injure or damage any well, bore, pipe, tank, or place for storage of water under the con-trol of the Board, or any machinery, appliances, or pro-perty used in connection therewith, shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law, and notwithstanding any civil remedy for damages so caused, shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding £5.

### BY-LAW No. 44.

Any person who shall waste, or allow water to escape, foul or pollute any water contained in any bore, pipe, tank, or place of storage shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law, and shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20, in addition to any other sum which he may be legally required to pay for damages.

### BY-LAW No. 45.

No person shall pollute or cause to be polluted any watercourse, pool, well, tank, reservoir, catchment area, or other water within the district.

Any person so offending shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a fine not exceeding  $\pounds 20$ .

### BY-LAW No. 46.

### Licenses.

The several licenses contained in the schedules hereto may be granted by the Board for such periods not exceeding twelve months, or for such purposes irrespective of any period of duration, and upon payment of such fees as shall be prescribed; and if any person holding any such license shall make default in any of the conditions obtained in such license the license shall thereupon become absolutely null and void, and the fees paid therefor shall be forfeited to the Board, and such person shall, in the event of any breach of the said license, be guilty of an offence against this By-law, and shall, on conviction thereof, be liable to a penalty not exceeding f5.

### BY-LAW No. 47.

The owner of every licensed vehicle plying for hire or engaged in heavy or medium traffic, and of every licensed bicycle or motor shall have their license number affixed on some conspicuous part of such vehicle, cycle, or motor, and any person who shall refuse or neglect to have such number so affixed shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law, and shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £2.

### BY-LAW No. 48.

# Obstructing roads and streets whilst camping or breakdown.

No person shall obstruct any of the roads or streets within the Board's jurisdiction by leaving vehicles or animals thereon whilst camping, by day or night, or in case of breakdown. Any person offending against this By-law shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5.

### BY-LAW No. 49.

### Penalties.

Where any person by these By-laws, or any of them, is required to do or perform any act, and such act is not done or remains undone or unperformed, it shall be lawful for the Board to perform the same and charge the cost and expenses against such person, and the amount thereof may be recovered summarily.

### BY-LAW No. 50.

Every person who does, permits, or suffers any act, matter, or thing contrary to any of these By-laws, or commits or permits any breach or neglect thereof, shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these By-laws, and, where not otherwise provided, shall be deemed liable to a penalty not exceeding  $\pm 20$  for every such offence.

### BY-LAW No. 51.

All penalties or other sums recovered under the provisions of these By-laws shall, unless otherwise provided, be paid to the Board, and shall become the property of and form part of the ordinary income of the district, except so much as may be payable to any informer.
