# THE MUNICIPAL CORPORATIONS ACT, 1906. Municipality of Kalgoorlic.

By-Law No. 119.

P.W. 7194/14.

A BY-LAW of the Municipality of Kalgoorlie made under Sections 179 and 181 of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906," and numbered 119, for regulating the use of merry-go-rounds, swing boats, and shooting galleries, and requiring licenses to be obtained for the erection and carrying on of the same, and fixing the fees payable for such licenses.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act the mayor and councillors of the Municipality of Kalgoorlie order as follows:

- 1. No person shall within the Municipality of Kalgoorlie erect or carry on any merry-go-round, swing-boat or shooting gallery unless he shall have first obtained from the Town Clerk a license in the form of the Schedule hereto for the erection of and use of such merry-goround, swing-boat, or shooting gallery.
- For such license the Town Clerk shall charge and receive the following fees, which shall in every case be payable in advance for the full period for which it is intended to use such merry-go-round, swing-boat, or shooting gallery:-

(a) For each merry-go-round worked by mechanical power, 3s. per day.

(b) For each merry-go-round worked by hand, 1s. per day.
(c) For each set of swing-boats of four or less, 2s.

per day.
(d) For each shooting gallery, 7s. 6d. per month, with the right of taking out a monthly, quarterly, or yearly license.

And every license issued shall, subject to suspension, revocation, or cancellation, be and remain in force for the period mentioned in such license and no longer.

3. Every person granted a license under this by-law shall lodge with the Town Clerk a deposit which shall be of such amount not exceeding £2, as that officer deems necessary to ensure the ground and premises occupied by the holder of such license being cleaned up and left in a proper condition to the Town Clerk's approval, when the deposit will be returned. Failing compliance with this Clause the Council may get any necessary work done and pay the cost out of such deposit.

4. The Town Clerk may, in his discretion, refuse a license to any person applying for the same under this

by-law, and it shall not be necessary for the Town Clerk to assign any reason for such refusal.

5. The Town Clerk shall keep a register of all licenses issued under this by-law showing the names and addresses of the persons to whom such licenses have been issued, and the number of such licenses.

No license issued under this by-law shall be transferred except with the permission of the Town Clerk, and upon payment of a transfer fee of 2s. 6d., when such transfer shall by the Town Clerk be endorsed upon the original license.

7. Every person to whom a liceuse is issued under this by-law, shall when demanded by an officer of the Council or any member of the police force, produce and

show such license.

8. No merry-go-round, swing-boat, or shooting gallery shall be allowed to be used if, in the opinion of the Town Clerk, such merry-go-round, swing-boat, or shooting gallery is unsafe or unfit to be used or in such a state or condition as to endanger the safety of the public or of any person using or frequenting any such merry-goround, swing boat, or shooting gallery.

9. No merry-go-round, swing boat, or shooting gal-

lery shall be in use on any Sunday or before the hours

of 8 a.m. or after midnight.

10. Every merry-go-round swing-boat, or shooting gallery shall be so conducted as to cause no aunoyance to the public.

11. Every shooting gallery shall be so constructed that no missile or projectile that may be discharged from any firearms used therein can escape from such shooting gallery if such firearm, at the moment of discharge, is pointed towards any target or mark that may be within such shooting gallery.

12. Every part of such shooting gallery within, along, or towards which it may be intended that any firearms shall be discharged, shall be constructed of iron of such strength and thickness as will sufficiently resist any missile or projectile that may be discharged from such firearms.

13. Every shooting gallery shall at all times when open for public use be under the management and control of a sufficient number of competent persons.

- 14. No person shall wilfully and improperly or carelessly or negligently interfere with the due management and control of the letting of hire and use by any person of any firearm in a shooting gallery, or with any shield fastening or fitting to secure or contribute to the safe use of firearms therein.
- 15. The Council may, at its discretion, cancel or revoke any license issued under this by-law, and any such suspension, revocation, or cancellation shall not affect any action under this by-law.
- 16. Any person offending against any of the provisions of this by-law shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10.

# Municipality of Kalgoorlie.

By-law No. 120.

A By-law of the Municipality of Kalgoorlie, made under Sections 447 and 179 of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906," and numbered 120, for preparing, correcting, and completing a special roll for taking of a poll for and against any proposed loan, and for regula-ting the taking of votes upon any proposal to borrow money.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act, the mayor and councillors of the Municipality of Kalgoorlie order as follows:-

- The Town Clerk shall, within seven days next after the delivery of a demand that the question whether or not any loan proposed by the Council shall be incurred, be submitted to the election of the owners of rateable land situated within the municipality, make out a special roll of such owners.
- 2. Such roll shall be in the form of Schedule A hereto, and shall be arranged in alphabetical order of surnames, and shall state against the name of each person the particulars indicated in the several columns of such Schedule.
- 3. The roll so prepared shall be signed by the Town Clerk, and exhibited at the Town Hall not later than 14 days before the date fixed for the holding of the poll, and an advertisement inserted in a daily paper circulating within the municipality, stating that such roll is open to inspection, and that any claims or objections in respect of same shall be made and lodged with the Town Clerk within seven days after the date of the first publication of such advertisement.

- On or before the date mentioned in such advertisement any person-
  - (a) whose name has not been inserted in such roll and who is entitled as owner (as defined in Section 446 of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906 '') of rateable land to have his name inserted therein may by letter, delivered or sent through the post, addressed to the Town Clerk, apply to have his name inserted in such roll, and shall give particulars of his claim.

(b) whose name has been inserted in the roll, but where there are any errors or omissions in regard to any particulars relating to rateable land owned by him or in regard to the number of votes to which he is entitled may in like manner apply to the Town Clerk to have such errors or omissions corrected or supplied.

(c) whose name appears in such roll, or who claims to have his name inserted therein may, in like manner, object to the retention on the roll of the name of any other person or that any other person is not being entitled to have the number of votes set against his name.

(d) whose name has been omitted from the roll, and who claims to be entitled to vote for any rateable land for which the name of some other person is entered in such roll, may in like manner apply to the Town Clerk to have his name substituted for the name of such other person.

Claims or objections under subsections (c) and (d) and the grounds of same shall be made in duplicate by the person so claiming or objecting in the forms in Schedule B hereto; and the Town Clerk shall send one of such notices to the person objected to.

- 5. The Town Clerk shall cause a list to be made showing all claims and objections and the particulars of same, and cause such list to be exhibited at the Town Hall within two days after the date fixed for the lodging of such claims and objections.
- 6. For the purpose of revising the roll of owners and correcting and certifying to same, the Council shall, on the third day after the date fixed for the lodging of claims and objections, hold a revision court; and the provisions of Sections 55 to 62, inclusive, of the Act (so far as they are applicable) shall apply to and be followed in respect of such Revision Court.
- The Town Clerk shall prefix to every name on the roll a number, beginning such numbers at the first name on the roll with the number one, and continuing them on in regular arithmetical series to the last name thereon.
- The roll so signed and certified shall be the owners' roll, and be and continue in force until such time as another roll is made; and copies of the same certified to by the Town Clerk can be used at any place at which a poll is to be taken in regard to any loan.
- 9. Every owner whose name is on the roll shall, at every poll in regard to any loan, have a number of votes proportionate to the rateable value of the land owned by him as set against his name on the roll according to the scale set out in Section 84 of the Act.
- 10. The taking of votes of owners on any proposi-tion to borrow money shall be in accordance with the provisions of Section 447 of the Act.
- Any owner on the roll and who does not reside in 11. Any owner on the roll and who does not reside in the municipal district may apply, at any time within seven days before the day fixed for the taking of the poll, either personally or in writing to the Returning Officer for a postal voting paper, and the Returning Officer shall supply such paper, which shall be in the form of Schedule C hereto, and on the back of which the Returning Officer shall put his initials and the date, and up the front of such paper inderes the number of votes to on the front of such paper indorse the number of votes to which such owner is entitled.
- 12. The Returning Officer shall keep and on a copy of the Roll mark against the name of every owner to whom the Roll mark against the name or every owner to whom a voting paper has been supplied the date when such paper was supplied, and every owner to whom a voting paper has been supplied shall be held to have voted, and shall not be entitled to vote otherwise at any poll taken under this By-law, and the copy of the roll so kept and marked by the Returning Officer in regard to voting papers having been supplied shall be sufficient evidence that any owner applying for a voting paper has voted at such poll.

All rolls made under this By-law shall be numbered from one and continuing on in regular arithmetical series, and at the end of every roll made after the first roll shall be put the following signed by the Chairman and other members of the Revision Court who have signed the roll as being revised and correct.

All rolls of owners made previously to this date are hereby cancelled, and this, the owners' Roll No., of the Municipality of Kalgoorlie, is the current and only owners' roll in force.

# Municipality of Kalgoorlie. By-law No. 121.

A By-law of the Municipality of Kalgoorlie, made under Sections 179 and 181 of 'The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906,' and numbered 121, for regulating the erection and control of hoardings upon private property and for advertising thereon, and fixing the license fees to be paid in respect of such hoardings and advertising thereon; also for compelling the removal of any such hoardings or any other advertising matter or thereon.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act, the Mayor and Councillors of the Municipality of Kal-

goorlie order as follows:-

No person shall erect any hoarding whatsoever within the Municipality of Kalgoorlie, whether on private property or not, unless and until he shall have made application therefor to the Council in writing and obtained permission in the form of Schedule A for the erection of such hoarding.

2. Every application for permission to erect a hoarding shall state the exact locality where it is proposed to erect such hoarding, and shall be accompanied by drawings in ink to scale and specifications, setting out the dimensions and specifying the material of which the hoarding is proposed to be constructed, and no permit shall be issued unless and until such drawings and specifications shall have been approved by the Town Surveyor.

Each application shall be accompanied by a deposit

of £2.

3. When a permit is granted for the erection of any hoarding, and before such permit is issued, there shall the Council a fee of two shillings per 100 be paid to the Council a fee of two shillings per 100 superficial feet of such hoarding, but in no case shall

the fee be less than ten shillings.

- 4. Any hoarding for which a permit has been issued. and which is creeted otherwise than in accordance with the approved plans and specifications, or which is not constructed with the approval of the Town Surveyor, and which is not removed after notice in writing from the Council, within the time specified in such notice, may be removed or altered by the Council at the expense of the person to whom such permit has been issued.
- 5. The deposit lodged by any person in respect of any hoarding shall be to him returned on a certificate from the Town Surveyor that such hoarding has been creeted to his satisfaction;
- No person shall paste or otherwise attach or affix or place on any hoarding any advertisement, picture, or thing of an insulting, indecent, or obscene nature, and any person being the owner of any such hoarding who suffers, permits, or causes any advertisement picture or thing of an insulting, indecent. or obscene nature to be put on or remain on any such hoarding shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law, and shall be liable to have his permit cancelled.
- 7. The owner of any hoarding on which there is any objectionable advertisement, picture, or thing shall remove the same within 24 hours after receiving notice in writing from the Town Clerk so to do.
- 8. All hoardings shall be kept and maintained in a proper and efficient state and condition of repair to the satisfaction of the Town Surveyor.

9. The owner of every hoarding erected under the provisions of this By-law shall remove the same forthwith on receipt of notice in writing from the Town Clerk so to do; and in the event of such owner failing to comply with such notice, the Town Surveyor may enter upon the premises upon which the hoarding is erected and remove the same without prejudice to any penalties the owner may have incurred for failure to comply with such notice.

No person shall on any hoarding constructed under this By-law, paste, affix, or otherwise attach any advertisement, picture, or thing unless such person be duly

licensed as a bill poster by the Council.

11. Any fence or other erection that is over eight feet in height, measured from the natural surface of the ground or the level of any footpath at the building line of any street on which such fence or other erection faces or abuts, shall be and is a hoarding under this

12. In this By-law the term "owner" means and includes the owner of the land on which any hoarding is erected, and any person for the time being receiving or entitled to receive the rents and profits of such land or

hoarding.

13. Any person offending against the provisions of this By-law shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20 for each offence.

# Municipality of Kalgoorlie. By-Law No. 122.

A By-law of the Municipality of Kalgoorlie made under Section 179 of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906," and numbered 122, for regulating and controlling quarrying and blasting operations.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act, the Mayor and Councillors of the Municipality of Kalgoorlie order as follows:

- 1. No person shall within the Municipality of Kalgoorlie carry on nor permit nor suffer to be carried on any blasting or quarrying operations without having first obtained permission in writing from the Town Clerk so to do, and the Town Clerk may in his discretion refuse or withhold such permission without assigning any reason for such refusal,
- Before granting such permission the Town Clerk shall require the applicant to deposit with the City Treasurer such sum (if any) not exceeding £20, as the Town Surveyor may deem advisable, to ensure the repair and making good to his satisfaction any damage to any footpath, street, road, way, or other property belonging to or under the control of the Council that may be caused by any such blasting or quarrying operations, and such deposit shall be dealt with as hereinafter mentioned.
- 3. Any person who has obtained such permission as aforesaid shall before commencing or suffering or permitting blasting or quarrying operations, put up such notices to the approval of the Town Surveyor, and in such places as may be directed by such permission or by the Surveyor, and shall keep such notices conspicuously exhibited during the whole of the time any blasting or

quarrying operations are being carried on.
4. The Town Surveyor may give such directions as he deems advisable with respect to the size, weight, or amount of any explosive that may be used in any one

amount of any explosive that may be charge in blasting operations.

5. The Town Surveyor may in his discretion order any place where blasting or quarrying operations are being carried on to be fenced in such manner as he may deem advisable for the protection of persons, stock, or property.

Notwithstanding the granting of such permission as aforesaid the Town Surveyor may order any blasting or quarrying operations to be discontinued either forthwith or at a time to be specified in such order.

Any person who has obtained such permission shall observe all reasonable and proper precautions for preventing accident to persons, stock, or property during blasting operations, and prior to any charge being

fixed shall take all necessary steps to warn all traffic in the neighbourhood and all persons residing in the vicinity of the place where such charge is about to be

No person shall be exempted from liability for any damage occasioned to any person, stock, or property arising from any blasting or quarrying operations by reason only of having obtained such permission as aforesaid or of having complied with all orders and directions

of the Town Surveyor.

9. In the event of any damage being caused to any footpath, street, road, way, or other property belonging to or under the control of the Council by any such blasting or quarrying operations, such damage shall forthwith be repaired and made good to the satisfaction of the Town Surveyor; and in default of the person by whom or under whose authority such blasting or quarrying operations have been carried on failing to do so when required by the Town Clerk, the necessary work may be done by the Council under the supervision of the Town Surveyor, and the cost of such reparation and making good shall be deducted from the deposit (if any), and in the event of the deposit being insufficient to such purpose, the cost and expense of such work over and above the amount of such deposit (if any) shall forthwith be repaid to the Council by the person by whom or under whose authority such blasting or quarrying operations have been carried on.

10. Upon the Town Surveyor certifying to the Town Clerk that no damage has been done to any footpath, street, road, way, or other property belonging to or under the control of the Council or that if any damage has been done the same has been repaired and made good to his satisfaction, the deposit referred to in Clause 2 hereof, or in the event of any part thereof having been expended in repairing or making good such damage the balance (if any) of such deposit shall be returned to the person who lodged the same.

11. Any person who, without permission in writing from the Town Clerk, shall carry on any blasting or quarrying operations, or permit or suffer the same to be carried on, or who shall neglect to observe and carry out the orders of the Town Surveyor, or who offends against any of the provisions of this By-law shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay for every such offence, a sum not exceeding £20.

Municipality of Kalgoorlie. By-Law No. 123.

A By-law of the Municipality of Kalgoorlie, made under Section 179 of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906," and numbered 123, for regulating the keeping of goats within the Municipality.

In pursuance of the powers contained in Section 179 of the Act, the Mayor and Councillors of the Municipality

of Kalgoorlie order as follows:—
1. In this By-law "Goat" means and includes any

kid of or over the age of three (3) months.

Nothing in this By-law shall be a bar to any proceedings for compensation for any damage done by any goat or for the recovery of any fines specified in the Trespass Scale, nor prejudice the powers of the Municipality or any of the officers thereof to kill any goat trespassing on any land whereof the Municipality shall be the owner.

3. No person shall keep within the Municipality of Kalgoorlie any goats unless such goats shall have been registered at the office of the Town Clerk, and the Town Clerk shall keep a book showing the names and addresses of all persons so registering goats, and the number of goats registered.

4. No person shall keep within the Municipality of Kalgoorlie any goats except in a building or yard so walled or fenced in as to securely confine such goats and

prevent them escaping therefrom.

5. Every person keeping goats shall keep and maintain in proper order, condition, and repair the walls or

tences of any buildings or yards within which such goats are kept, so that such goats cannot break out of or escape therefrom.

- 6. No person being the owner or having the control of any goats shall cause, permit, or suffer or allow any such goats to wander or stray or be at large in or on any street or public place within the Municipality.
- 7. No person shall take or drive any goat to or from pasture through or over any street, nor depasture any goats within the Municipality unless such goats be under the proper control so as to prevent them wandering, straying, or being at large; and no goat shall be driven or taken to or from pasture or depastured before the hour of six o'clock in the afternoon.
- Any person offending against any of the provisions of this By-law shall, on conviction, for each and every offence forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding £10.

  - (b) The tranway track on the Western side of Maritana Street for a length of 70 feet Southward from the Southern building line of Hannan Street.
  - (c) The tramway track on the Western side of Maritana Street for a length of 70 feet Southward from a point 95 feet Southward of the Southern building line of Hannan Street.
- Not more than one tramear shall be allowed on any stand except with the special permission of the Council in writing under the hand of the Town Clerk.
- 3. No tramear shall stand outside the limits of any stand nor shall the fittings or attachments of any tram-car project over or extend beyond such limits.
- 4. Any person in charge of any tramear on or that is being brought on to or taken off any stand shall obey the instructions and directions of the Traffic Inspector or other authorised officer of the Council in regard to the position to be occupied by such car.
- 5. Every tramear on a stand shall be provided with proper lamps inside and a headlight at each end, and such lights shall be kept lighted from sunset to sunrise.
- Every tramear on a stand shall be kept in a perfectly clean state and condition, and free from any accumulation of papers, rubbish, or any objectionable matter.
- 7. No tramear on a stand shall be used as a sleeping place, nor for the keeping or storage of any animal or thing, nor shall any games be played therein.
- Any person offending against any of the provisions of this By-law shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty nor exceeding £20 for each offence.

- 4. At any public meeting of ratepayers no person other than a ratepayer of the Municipality of Kalgoorlie shall put any question or move or second any motion or amendment or speak or vote upon any motion or amendment, or take part in any discussion on any ques-
- Any person in any way obstructing any public meeting of ratepayers or behaving in a disorderly manin any way misconducting himself, shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law, and may at the request of the Chairman of such meeting be removed from such meeting by any officer of the Council or member of the Police Force.

The Standing Orders of the Municipality relative to the rules of debate and submitting of motions and amendments shall, as far as they are applicable, be followed in the conduct of public meetings of ratepayers of

the Municipality.

7. Any person offending against any of the provisions of this By-law shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty for each offence of not more than £10.

Regulations governing Permits for Gates on Public Roads.

- (a.) Any person desiring to place a gate across a public road within the boundaries of the Toodyay District shall first apply to the Board for permission to do so.
- (b.) Gate permits will not be granted for a period longer than one year.
- (c.) Any permit so granted will expire on the 30th June next following date of issue.
- (d.) An annual registration fee of two shillings and sixpence is hereby fixed for every permit so granted; such fee must accompany applications in every instance.
- (e.) Any person desirous of retaining any gate that may have been previously registered must lodge a renewal application accompanied by the annual registration fee herein provided.
- (f.) No application will be entertained, or permit granted, unless the class and description of such gate strictly harmonises with the specification set out hereunder, viz.:—
- (g.) Any gate erected across a public road may be made out of iron, wood, or other approved material, or made out of fron, wood, or other approved material, or combination of materials, and shall be constructed and equipped in the following manner:—Width of gate not to be less than 14 feet clear of posts, hung so as to swing freely from either side, having a clearance of not less than four inches, measured from the lower edge of the bottom rail and the highest part of the crown of the road. Each gate to be supplied with approved automatic purpose also featurers readly capable of covening in either spring clip fasteners readily capable of opening in either direction, each gate to be provided with substantial holdback posts, one on each side of the gateway, placed at right angles thereto, securely fixed in the ground and not less than twelve feet measured from the hanging post. Each hold-back post to be fitted with a proper cetch. eatch, automatically operated.
- (h.) No person shall erect or maintain a gate across any road unless the gate shall have the words "Public Road" and the number thereon conspicuously and legibly painted and displayed thereon in black letters on a white ground, such letters being not less than 4in. in length.
- (i.) The Board retains the right to grant or withhold such permission, and may, before dealing with any applicant, to publish notice thereof in such manner as to the Board may seem fit.
- (j.) The Board may at any time require such gate to be removed by the person by whom it was erected, or may in the event of a default cause such gate to be removed at the expense of the person responsible for the erection of any such gate.
- (k.) Any person leaving open any gate for which a permit has been granted shall be guilty of an offence under the provisions of "The Roads Act, 1911," and
