Interstate vessels which, after arriving at Fremantle, or the latitude of Fremantle, make a voyage, in the case of vessels mantle, make a voyage, in the case of vessels from the Eastern States or New Zealand, to any port or ports North of Fremantle, and, in the case of vessels from Singapore, to any port or ports South of Fremantle shall, while so engaged on such voyages pay, in addition to Tonnage Dues as prescribed in Regulations, the sum of 1d. per ton on all cargo actually worked at the different ports, as Light Dues."

(3.) Regulation 42, add the following:—
"Provided that such vessel has not since the Certificate was issued, visited any port in any other State or Country.'
