### COURT OF ARBITRATION, WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

No. 10 of 1913.

Between West Australian Typographical Industrial Union of Workers (hereinafter referred to as "the Union"), applicant, and the "West Australian" Newspaper Company, Limited; Proprietors of the "Daily News" Newspaper; "Sunday Times" Publishing Company, Limited; Proprietors of the "W.A. Record" Newspaper; R. S. Sampson; E. Myers; E. S. Wigg & Son, Limited; and the Proprietors of the "Truth" Newspaper (hereinafter included under the denomination "the Employers"), respondents.

#### AWARD.

The Court of Arbitration of Western Australia (hereinafter referred to as . "the Court") having taken into consideration the matter of an industrial dispute between the above-named parties and having heard the union and the employers by their respective representatives duly appointed, and having considered the evidence adduced on behalf of the union and the employers respectively, doth hereby order and award that as between the union and the members thereof and the employers and each of them, the terms, conditions, and provisions contained in the schedule hereto shall be binding upon the union and the members thereof, and upon the employers and each of them, and that the said terms, conditions, and provisions shall be deemed to be, and they are hereby incorporated into and declared to form part of this award: And further, that the union and the members thereof and the employers and each of them shall respectively do, observe, and perform every matter and thing by the said terms, conditions, and provisions required to be done, observed, and performed, and shall not do anything in contravention thereof, but shall in all respects abide by and observe and perform the same.

#### THE SCHEDULE HEREINBEFORE REFERRED TO.

1. (a) Compositors learning Machine.—Compositors learning to operate a linotype or monoline machine shall be allowed the following periods to attain proficiency. During such time their minimum rate of pay shall be: night work, 1s. 9d. per hour;

day work, 1s. 6d. per hour.
(b) Proficiency—Probationary Period.—Every such compositor must be able at end of the first three months of the probationary period to set and correct at a speed of at least 4,000 ens an hour; at the end of six months at least 5,000 ens an hour; at the end of nine months at least 6,000 ens an hour; and at the end of twelve months at least 7,000 ens an hour, which shall be the limit of the probationary period.

c) Proficiency (complete) .- When he shall be able to set and correct an average of 7,000 ens per hour, based on minion matrices, he shall be deemed a proficient operator; the matter to be solid. The test of the operator's proficiency to be his ability to set any of the above numbers at the period stated as tests for a full day on fair copy, and to approximately maintain those averages. An operator setting 6,000 ens an hour on a monoline at the end of twelve months shall be considered proficient.

Each employer may adopt the usual means of accurately testing the proficiency

of a probationer.

Time Hands-(a) Wages and Hours.-The lowest wage for time work for a proficient linotype operator shall be, per week not exceeding 42 hours—day work, £4; night work, £4 10s.

Casuals may be paid at the rate of 2s. per hour day work, or 2s. 3d. per hour

night work, if employed for less than one week.

(b) Operators working on time work shall, if required, mark each take of copy set by them; provided that the identity of each operator shall be made known only to the father of the chapel, or to the union representative at offices where there is no father of the chapel. The father of the chapel, or representative, shall at the request of the employer produce for his inspection the work of the operator performed during any three consecutive days of any calendar month.

3. Piece Hands.—(a) The lowest piecework prices or rates of payment shall be:
—Linotypes 3¾d. per 1,000 ens, day work; and 4d. per 1,000 ens, night work: monolines, 4½d. per 1,000 ens day work; and 5d. per 1,000 ens night work.

4. Changing from Machine to Case, etc.—(a) Any operator employed on piece required to go on hand work, and any case hand required to go on machine shall be paid

the machine time rate.

(b) No man shall be permanently changed from machine to case or vice versa without one week's notice.

Cast-up.—All kinds of composition in the English language shall be cast up at the standard rate per 1,000 en quads, a thick space over to be considered an en quad in width. 6. Dialects, etc.—Matter of and above four lines composed in other than ording.

ary English (e.g. dialects) shall be charged one-half extra, and foreign languages double for each line.

7. Catchlines.—All catchlines shall be charged by the operator.

8. All lines cast to be charged.—Each slug of matter composed by the operator shall count as one line, and all lines cast by the machine shall be charged as full lines,

(a) Tabular matter up to 15 ems pica cast on one bar shall be charged—two columns, one and one-third; three columns, one and a-half; four or more columns, double. These charges are to be made whether the matter is with or without headings or rules.

- (b) Matter with a border round.—All matter with a border round, whether formed
- of rules, letters, or otherwise shall be charged one and a half.

  (c) The operator shall be entitled to charge one line extra for each word of small caps, italics, clarendon, asterisks, and reference marks inserted by him by hand in his composition and one line extra for every four two-line initial letters filled in by hand.
- (d) Matter of all types up to brevier inclusive set to a measure under 10 ems pica shall carry a charge of  $1\frac{1}{4}$  per 1,000 ens, provided that the multiplier is less than 13 ems brevier; under 9 ems pica a charge of  $1\frac{1}{2}$  per 1,000 ens.
- (e) All types above brevier set to less than 14 ems pica shall be charged by the brevier multiplier.
- (f) Matter requiring two bars or more of the ordinary measure of the paper to complete one measure (not being tabular matter) shall be charged one-third extra.

Provided that white lines, leads, and other matter added by the "house" shall not be charged by the operator.

- 9. Figure Matter.-Figure matter set solid, as per attached examples (land, wool, and produce sales, show prize lists, cargoes, catalogues, run-on balance sheets and subscription lists, cricket, rifle, and quoit scores, examination lists and similar matter) shall be charged one-third extra.
- 10. Difficult Matter.—(a) Matter having to be transposed by the operator (i.e., which is not set up in the order in which it appears in copy) shall be paid for at the rate of one-third extra for all lines so transposed.
- (b) All matter set from copy that will not go on the copy tray shall be paid for at the rate of one-third extra.
- (c) Matter which is classed by the father of the chapel and the printer as illegible or indistinct, or not properly sub-edited, shall be entitled to one-third extra.
- (d) Any other matter which may be specially difficult to compose shall be paid at an increased rate to be determined by the printer and the father of the chapel; or in small offices by the printer and some representative of the union.
  - 11. Instructions.—Instructions shall be written on the first slip of copy.
- 12. No undue Advantage to be given .- (a) No undue advantage shall be permitted to one operator over another.
- (b) Except in cases of emergency proficient linotype operators shall not be required to work together on time and piece work.
- 13. Standing Time.—Standing time of five minutes and over at any one time shall be charged at the standard operating rate for time work. In cases where hands are brought in at a special hour, and they are required to wait for work to come in, such waiting time shall be charged as from the specified hour of commencement. No standing time to be charged until fifteen minutes have accumulated in any one week. ing time for machine delays to be countersigned by the mechanic. Standing time for copy to be signed by the printer. Where an operator is being paid standing time he may be called upon to perform other work.
- 14. Takes.—(a) Not less than twelve lines shall constitute a "take" of copy upon all newspapers, provided that the copy given out at any one time, whether referring to different articles or not shall constitute one take.
- (b) In the case of editions, thirty minutes before the closing of the formes, six lines shall constitute a "take."
- (c) Lines cast for "stop press" devices shall be charged double, but only for the width of the line that appears in print.
- 15. House Marks.—(a) The operator shall be entitled to charge two lines for every line of house mark corrections as done by him. Alterations in standing advertisements constituting less than twelve lines, shall, when given out on piecework, be charged as house marks, provided such charge shall not be in excess of the minimum take.
  - (b) The insertion of all corrected slugs shall be done by the "house."
- The "house" may at its discretion correct on time the errors in first proofs due to the operator, and deduct two lines from the operator for every line requiring alteration.
- Corrections.—All first proof and revise correction marks left undone by the operator in the first proofs shall be done by the operator, and shall be put in by the "house."
- All fresh errors imported into corrected matter by the operator shall, if not corrected by him, be charged against him at the rate of house marks.
- 17. Changing Machine.—If a machine be changed by order to a different type, the operator shall not be required to change it again to make corrections, which shall be done by the "house," and the cost of correcting every line requiring correction shall be charged to the operator.
- 18. Repeating Errors due to Machine.—Battered letters and all machine errors 18. Repeating Errors and to Machine.—Battered letters and all machine errors such as wrong letters coming down repeatedly, space bands coming too slowly, or one letter coming too slowly repeatedly for another letter and thus becoming transposed, also sunken letters, and hot and cold metal shall be charged as "house-marks" if the fault of the machine; provided that where "house-marks" exceed a "take" they may be given out as new copy: Provided further, that no charge shall be made in respect of hot or cold metal in excess of sixty single lines in any one "take." The above charges shall be countersigned by the mechanic.
- Operator not to be required to do Mechanic's Work .- No operator shall be asked to do engineer's or labourer's work (except when an operator is looking after his own machine); provided in all cases operators assist in changing their magazines when called upon to do so. Any operator called on to make more than one change of magazine during one shift shall be paid the equivalent of 1,000 ens for each change of the office of the first. Any operator on pigeawark horizontal look offers his company of the first. Any operator on piecework having to look after his own so made after the first. machine shall be allowed 10s, per week extra.
- 20. Apprentices.—Apprentices to the trade of linotype, monotype, or monoline operator may be employed subject to the following conditions:
  - (i.) The number of apprentices employed by any one employer shall not be such as to exceed the proportion of one apprentice to each four, or portion of four, fully paid operators.

(ii.) The term of apprenticeship shall not be less than three nor more than four years. The apprentice shall serve a term of not less than one year nor more than three years at hand composition, and not less than two years on the machine.

Provided however, that no apprentice shall be permitted to commence on the machine until he shall have attained the age of eighteen years, and until he shall have satisfied a board of examiners hereinafter provided for, that he has attained the proficiency required of an apprentice who has completed the second year of his term in the hand composing.

- (iii.) Should any employer from unforeseen circumstances be unable to carry out his obligations to the apprentice, he shall be allowed to transfer the apprentice to complete his term with another employer; but it shall be incumbent upon such former employer to notify the clerk of the Court of Arbitration of the date of such transfer and when such apprenticeship commenced. Subject to the right to transfer as herein provided, it shall be the duty of the employer and the apprentice to carry out in its entirety the contract of apprenticeship, and failure to do so shall be deemed a breach of this award.
- (iv.) In the absence of indentures or written contracts of apprenticeship, or in cases where indentures or written contracts are entered into subsequently to the date of this award, apprentices shall be bound for the term and on the conditions herein provided, and subject to the following provisions:—
  - (a) Any employer taking an apprentice shall give notice thereof to the clerk of the Court of Arbitration in the form provided, and shall be deemed to undertake the duty which he agrees to perform as a duty enforceable under this award, and shall, subject to the provisions of subclause (x.) hereof, pay the apprentice the rate of wages herein provided.
  - (b) At the end of the period of apprenticeship the employer shall give the apprentice a certificate to show that he has served his apprenticeship. Should the employer at any time before the termination of the term of apprenticeship desire to dispense with the services of the apprentice he may, with the consent of the apprentice, transfer him to another employer carrying on business within a reasonable distance of the original employer's place of business, willing to continue to teach the apprentice and pay the wages prescribed by this award according to the total length of time served, and generally to perform the obligations of the original employer. He shall also give to the apprentice a certificate of the time served and of the rate of wages paid, and shall give notice to the clerk of the Court of Arbitration of such transfer. It shall not be obligatory upon the employer to find the apprentice another employer if he shall so misconduct himself as to entitle the employer to discharge him, but he shall nevertheless give him a certificate for the time actually served.
  - (c) An employer shall be deemed to fail in his duty towards his apprentice if he neglects to keep him constantly at work, but slackness of work may form a proper ground for transferring him to a master willing to undertake the responsibility of teaching him.
  - (d) When an apprentice is discharged for cause, the employer shall send notice in writing of the discharge and the cause thereof to the said clerk of the Court of Arbitration.
- (v.) The minimum weekly rate of pay for an apprentice shall be:-

- (vi.) Every apprentice shall be bound to submit himself to examination by the Board of Examiners hereinafter constituted at the expiration of each year of the first three years of service; provided always, that it shall be permissible for an apprentice of the age of eighteen years to submit himself to the second or third year's examination after having served one year at the trade
- vii.) The clerk of the Court of Arbitration will notify the Board of Examiners of the names and addresses of all candidates desirous of submitting themselves to examination. The examination will be held at the place where the apprentice is employed, and it shall be the duty of each employer to provide such necessary material and machinery as may be required, and in all ways to facilitate the conduct of the examination.

- (viii.) The Board of Examiners shall consist of the secretary of the union, or such other person as may be nominated by the union in his stead, and a person skilled in the trade, to be appointed on the nomination of the employers of such apprentices carrying on business within the area to which this award applies, or failing such nomination or nominations, such person or persons as may be appointed for that purpose by the Court. In the event of a disagreement between the members of the Board, the matter in dispute shall be referred to a third person agreed to by them, or nominated by the Court or the President thereof at the request of either member, and the decision of such third person shall be final and conclusive.
- (ix.) The examiners will report to the Court in writing as to the result of the examination. An examination certificate shall be signed by the examiners and forwarded to the apprentice with the necessary endorsement at the conclusion of the examination.
- (x.) It shall be lawful for the employer to withhold the increase in wages accruing to the apprentice in accordance with the scale set forth in subclause (v.) hereof, from any apprentice who fails, through no fault on the part of his employer, to satisfy the examiners.

  (xi.) If the examiners report to the Court that any employer has not provided suffi-
- cient opportunity for the apprentice to learn, the employer shall be deemed prima facie guilty of a breach of this award under Section 89 of the Act, and may be summoned before the Court. Upon any such proceeding the report may be received in evidence.
- (xii.) Such fees shall be paid by the clerk to the examiners as the Court shall allow.
- Person entitled to operate Machines.-No person other than an apprentice, compositor, or fully qualified operator shall be employed on a type-casting or typesetting machine.
- Monotypes-Rate of Pay.-The lowest prices or rates of payment payable to a proficient operator employed on a monotype perforating machine shall be: day work, £3 17s. 6d. per week of forty-two hours.
- 23. Monotype—Probationers.—During a period of six months' probation the lowest rate of wage payable to a journeyman compositor who is learning to operate the monotype perforating machine shall be: night work, 1s. 9d. per hour; day work, 1s. 6d. per hour per week of forty-two hours.
- 24. Hand Compositors (Newspapers)—Wage and Hours.—The minimum wage payable to a compositor (other than an operator) employed on newspapers shall be £3 7s. 6d. per week of forty-eight hours day work, or £4 per week of 45 hours night work. 25. Proof Reader—Wages and Hours.—The minimum rate of pay for a proof-reader employed on a daily or weekly newspaper shall be £3 15s. per week of forty-five
- hours, day work; or £4 5s. per week of forty-five hours, night work.

  26.—Proof Reader's Assistant—(a) Wages.—The minimum rate of pay for a proof
- reader's assistant shall be £2 17s. per week.

  (b) Hours.—The hours of work for a proof reader's assistant shall be the same as those provided by Clause 25 hereof, in the case of a proof reader.
- 27. Holidays.—(a) All employees to whom this award applies shall, if required to work on Good Friday, Eight Hours' Day, or Christmas Day, be entitled to payment at the rate of double time for all work performed on those days.
- Workers, other than those engaged on newspapers, who are required to work on any of the following days, namely, New Year's Day, Anniversary Day, Easter Monday, Foundation Day and Boxing Day, shall be entitled to payment at double ordinary time rate for all work so performed.
- (b) Each worker engaged on newspapers, such for example as the West Australian, Daily News, Sunday Times. Westralian Worker, and Truth, shall be entitled to two weeks' annual leave at not less than the time rate hereinbefore prescribed for his class of work, such leave to be continuous. Provided always, that should the service be brought to a termination after the expiration of six calendar months but before the expiration of twelve calendar months from the date upon which this award commences to have effect, the said two weeks' holiday shall be commuted to a holiday of one day for each calendar month's service: Provided further, that in case the worker is dismissed for serious and wilful misconduct, the provisions of this subclause shall not
- apply.

  The annual holiday shall be granted at such time during the year as may be
- mutually agreed upon between the employer and worker concerned.

  28. Lost Tine.—When an employee works beyond the ordinary hours for the purpose of making up time lost by his own fault or at his own request, he shall not be entitled to charge more than ordinary time rate for such work. In no case shall lost
- time be set off as against overtime worked.

  29. Definitions—"Day Work," Night Work."—"Day work" shall mean work done between the hours of 8 a.m. and 6.30 p.m. "Night work" shall mean work done between the hours of 6.30 p.m. and 8 a.m.

  All employees regularly employed on night work called on to work during the day
- shall be paid night work rates, and employees regularly employed on day work called on
- shall be paid night work rates, and employees regularly employed on day work caned on to work at night shall be paid night work rates.

  30. Special Editions.—Any employee sent by the "House" in which he is for the time being employed to assist in the production of any special edition, otherwise than in his resual daily working hours, shall, if he attends, be entitled to an extra charge of not less than two hours at ordinary rates as a "call" in addition to his ordinary
- ot . wage. 31. 31. Overtime.—Work required to be performed by any worker to whom this award applies after the completion of the ordinary day's or night's work shall be deemed overtime, and shall be paid for as follows:—

  Time and a-third for the first two hours;

Time and a-half for the next two hours; and

Double time thereafter.
Provided always that in the case of papers other than dailies special arrangements regarding the working hours may be made between the proprietors and the applicant

- Under rate Workers.—Any worker who is unable by reason of old age or infirmity to earn the wage hereinbefore prescribed may be paid such less wage as may from time to time be agreed upon, in writing, between any employer and the president or secretary of the union. In default of such agreement being arrived at within twentysecretary of the union. In default of such agreement being arrived at within twenty-four hours after application has been made, in writing, to the secretary of the union, the matter may be referred to the nearest resident or police magistrate for settlement. Any journeyman whose wage has been so fixed may work for, and may be employed by any employer for such less wage for the period of six calendar months thence next ensuing, and thereafter until fourteen days' notice, in writing, shall have been given to such journeyman by the secretary of the union requiring his wage to be again fixed.
- 33. Disputes.—Any dispute arising out of any of the foregoing rules, which cannot be satisfactorily settled between the father of the chapel and the printer, shall be referred to the applicant union and the "House."
- 34. Absence to attend Meeting .- No employee shall absent himself from his work for the purpose of attending a chapel or other meeting during working hours without the consent of his employer.
- 35. Record.—Each employer shall keep at his establishment, or at each of them, if more than one, a book containing a record of-
  - (a) The names of all workers employed by him at such establishment, and to whom this award applies; and
  - (b) The class of work performed, the hours during which the worker is employed, and the wages paid to each such worker.

The employer and the worker shall be severally responsible for the proper posting

Such book may be inspected at any time during ordinary business hours by the secretary for the time being of the workers' or employers' union (if any), and also by any person thereto authorised by the President of the Court of Arbitration.

- 36. Notice.—One week's notice by either employer or employee shall suffice to terminate employment.
- 37. Application of Award.—This award shall apply to all establishments using type-casting machines, which are located within a radius of fifteen miles from the General Post Office, Perth, and shall continue in force for a period of three years from the date of the gazettal thereof.
- No Reduction .- The fixing of the minimum rates of pay prescribed under this award shall not entitle an employer to reduce the wage of any worker who, at the time of issue of this award was being paid a higher rate of pay than the minimum herein prescribed for his class of work
