MIDLAND JUNCTION GOVERNMENT ABATTOIRS.

Regulations framed under "The Abattoirs Act, 1909." THE following Regulations relate to the Government Abattoir at Midland Junction:

Throughout these Regulations:-

- (a.) The term "Officer-in-charge" means the controller or any person for the time being responsible for the management of the Abat-
- (b.) The term "owner" means any person delivering stock at the Abattoir for slaughter and dressing, whether actually owner thereof or not, and the Officer-in-charge shall not be bound to inquire as to ownership or the authority of such person as to the stock.

 (c.) "The Abattoir" means the Midland Junction
- Government Abattoirs.

Officer-in-charge.

The duty of the Officer-in-charge shall be:—
(a.) To engage the staff and slaughtermen and other persons engaged in connection with slaughtering stock in the Abattoir, and to control and direct the working of the Abattoir and particularly(b.) To see that the provisions of "The Abattoirs Act, 1909," and any amendment thereof, and these or any other Regulations which may from time to time be framed thereunder, are duly observed and complied with, and if necessary to enforce the same and prosecute any person guilty of an offence against or breach of the said Act or any Regulations made thereunder, and otherwise to sue for and recover any moneys payable for the slaughter or retention of stock or curing of hides and skins hereinafter prescribed.

(c.) To keep such books of account and records of owners and slaughtering, and do and perform such other acts, matters, and things in relation to the Abattoir as shall from time to

time be necessary for its purpose and be required by law or the Minister. (d.) If deemed necessary by the Minister, the Officer-in-charge acting under his instructions may let any portion of the Abattoir from day to day for slaughtering purposes, on such terms and conditions as the Officer-incharge shall prescribe, otherwise subject to such of the Regulations in respect of the Goldfields Government Abattoirs fairly applicable to the Abattoir.

Register for Employees.

3. All employees shall enter their names on the Register kept by the Officer-in-charge, and shall sign an undertaking to observe, comply with, and obey each and every rule of the establishment under pain (apart from any other penalty) of having his name expunged from the Register and expelled from the service of the Government.

Hours of Business.

4. Except as otherwise notified by advertisement at the Abattoir and-or-in a daily newspaper circulating in Midland Junction and suburbs, the Abattoir shall be open for work between the hours of 8 a.m. and 8 p.m. daily, except on Sundays and public holidays observed at Midland Junction, and also at any time on holidays or any other than usual working hours as the Officerin-charge may from time to time prescribe or allow.

Manner of Slaughter and Dressing.

5. Stock shall be slaughtered and dressed in such numbers and in such manner as the Officer-in-charge shall from time to time direct.

Charges.

(a.) Slaughter and dressing shall be charged for at the following rates:-

.. 4s. per head, 30 Sheep and lambs Calves (up to 60 lbs.) Calves (over 60 lbs. and under .. 5d. per head. 1s. per head, 150 lbs.) 2s. per head, Pigs (up to 100 lbs.) 3s. per head,
Pigs (over 100 lbs.) . . . 4s. per head,
except that for slaughtering and dressing done on holidays and any other than the usual working hours the

charges shall be double.

(b.) The following charges shall be made for supply of food and water to such stock, pending slaughter, as shall not be fed and watered by the owner, namely:—

Cattle—1s. 4d. per head per day or part of a day. Sheep, Lambs, and Pigs—2d. per head per day or part of a day.

(c.) The following charges shall be made for lairage for all stock received for slaughter from the saleyards or elsewhere while such stock are awaiting slaughter:-

Cattle and pigs-1d. per head per day.

Sheep—1d. per score per day.

No charge will be made for the first 24 hours.

All charges shall be payable on or before delivery to the owner or agent.

Delivery at Abattoir.

Stock shall be delivered to the Officer-in-charge at the gates of the Abattoir, with the owner's brands or other marks legibly shown thereon, at any time between sunrise and sunset, accompanied by a statement of ownership, and the number, kind, and brands or other marks of identification of such stock and of the daily slaughtering required, subject to the absolute right of the Officer-in-charge to refuse to accept delivery of all or any stock.

Retention.

8. The Officer-in-charge may refuse to allow stock to occupy the Abattoir pens or small yards attached thereto for a longer period than 24 hours before the slaughter.

Notice.

9. As each owner's stock is being slaughtered he may deliver to the Officer-in-charge a daily order in writing for slaughter of his stock according to his requirements, provided such order is given not later than 10 a.m.

Delivery to Owner.

10. The owner or his accredited agent shall receive from the Officer-in-charge all carcases upon completion of slaughter, dressing, and Government inspection, and all hides and skins on completion of curing, and the receipt thereof shall be acknowledged in writing upon such forms as the Officer-in-charge may provide or request, by such owner or agent, at the time of such delivery.

Such delivery shall be made at the Abattoir siding, and the owner or agent shall be obliged to receive same or supply to the Officer-in-charge an order in writing to make delivery into trucks or other vehicles, in which latter case a certificate of the Abattoir employee effecting delivery shall be conclusive as to the tally.

Offal.

Offal.

11. The offal, consisting of head, feet, tail, heart, tripe, and caul fat shall be the property of the owner, in accordance with the practice of the trade, and the same shall be removed by the owner within twelve (12) hours after slaughter; failing which the same shall become the absolute property of the Government without compensation or redress to the owner. The blood and viscera of slaughtered stock shall be retained by the Officer-in-charge as the property of the Government.

Dead Animals.

12. Dead animals received from the saleyards or elsewhere shall be skinned and the carcases retained by the Officer-in-charge for boiling down. The skins and hides of such animals shall be returned to the owner upon payment by him of the following charges for skinning:-

Cattle-2s. 6d. per head. Sheep-1s. per head.

Retention of Carcases.

13. Any stock or part of stock condemned by a Government inspector as being unfit for human consumption, or any carease found on slaughter to be subject to disease, shall be confiscated by the Officer-in-charge for the Minister, and the Officer-in-charge may retain any carcase, or portion of a carcase, and sell the same, without notice, by private sale or by public auction, in the event of any charges payable for the slaughter and dressing thereof or of any other stock of the same owner or any other proper charge being not duly paid: All proceeds of such sale shall be applied (first) in paying the cost thereof, (second) in payment of all moneys as aforesaid owing by the owner, and any balance remaining shall be paid to the owner.

Hides and Skins.

14. All hides and skins shall be dried and salted on the premises set apart for such purpose and the requirements of Tick and other Acts operative shall be adhered

Owners of hides and skins shall be allowed every facility to handle, weigh, and deliver them.

Delivery of hides and skins will be made at the platform of the above premises in the presence of the owner or his agent, and no complaint regarding tally or condition of goods will be considered after such hides and skins have been taken away from the platform.

All hides and skins must be removed by the owners from such premises within seven days after slaughter.

Owners are held responsible that the marks of ownership on the live animals shall be readily and easily identified on each hide or skin.

A metal disc with owner's brand or mark will be attached to any hide or skin before removal from the carcase if such disc is supplied by the owner. Such brand or mark shall be registered with the Officer-incharge on delivery of the stock for slaughter.

Responsibility.

15. The Minister or the Department of Agriculture and Industries shall not be responsible for any loss or damage to stock, carcases, carcase meat, offal, or hides and skins, not arising from the proven neglect or default of their own servants.

No complaint regarding any such loss or damage will be considered unless made to the Officer-in-charge within 24 hours of the loss or damage complained of.

Penalty.

16. No person shall remove any stock, carcase, carcase meat, offal, hide, or skin, or interfere in the work done at the Abattoir, without the written authority or consent of the Officer-in-charge, and no person shall intrude or trespass upon the Abattoir grounds.

Prohibition.

17. No stock shall be slaughtered for human consumption within the district in which the Abattoir is situated, except at the Abattoir qr such other Abattoirs as are excepted by Section 7 of "The Abattoirs Act, 1909,"

Dogs.

18. No dogs shall be brought into or allowed to remain in the Abattoir. Working dogs must be tied up after work. Any dog found inside the boundary fence running loose will be destroyed.

MIDLAND JUNCTION SALEYARDS.

Regulations.

These Regulations relate to the Government Saleyards situated at Midland Junction.

Officer-in-Charge.

2. The Saleyards shall be under the management and control of an Officer of the Department of Agriculture and Industries, to be known as the Officer-in-Charge.

Hours of Business.

3. The Saleyards shall be open for the reception, sale, and delivery of cattle and other live stock on every week-day (not being a public holiday) between the hours of six a.m. and six p.m., and no person shall carry on business in the Saleyards at any other time, except with the special permission of the Officer-in-Charge.

Power to Reject.

4. The Officer-in-Charge shall have the power to reject or exclude any animal or animals from the Salevards.

Responsibility.

5. The Stock Agent placing stock in the market for sale shall be responsible for all tallies, and grades of same, market dues, and tolls accruing thereon. case shall any stock be taken out of the market till all tolls, dues, and other charges demandable on such stock under these regulations shall have first been fully paid and satisfied.

Food and Drink.

6. Any person or persons who may place stock in the Saleyards for sale shall supply such stock with sufficient food and water.

No Private Selling.

7. No stock shall be sold privately in the market.

Sick, Dying, or Dead Animals.

8. Agents must make arrangements for the quick removal of all sick, dying, or dead animals. Dead animals may be skinned at the prescribed place set apart for such purposes only, as directed. No dead animal shall remain more than four hours within the area.

Time for the removal of Calves and Pigs.

9. No calves or pigs will be allowed to be removed from the pen until the sales of calves and pigs are

General Behaviour.

10. Any person who, in any part of the Saleyards, shall be under the influence of drink or shall be guilty of profane or of foul or of abusive language, or of obscenity or indecency, or shall conduct himself riotously or create a disturbance, or who shall obstruct in the execution of his duty the Officer-in-Charge, his assistant, or other officer or person appointed by the Gov-

ernment to conduct or aid in the good management, or who shall neglect or refuse to comply with any lawful request of any such Officer-in-Charge, or assistant officer or person, made in accordance with the provisions of this by-law, or of such regulations as shall for the time being be lawfully enforced at the Saleyards, or shall deposit any filth or refuse matter upon any portion of the Saleyards or on any land or road abutting thereon, save in the bins or receptacles provided and appointed for same will be prosecuted according to law. for same, will be prosecuted according to law.

Special Sales.

- 11. The market or portion thereof may be hired for the sale of hides and skins, or for the special sale of stud stock, or any product or apparatus connected with the stock industry, by arrangement with the Officer-in-Charge.
