THE following Report and List of Decisions of the Public Service Appeal Board are published for general information.

M. E. JULL, Public Service Commissioner.

To His Excellency Major General Sir Harry Barron, K.C.M.G., C.V.O., Governor of the State of Western Australia.

Sir,

In accordance with the provisions of "The Public Service Act, 1904," the Appeal Board appointed under the said Act has the honour to forward herewith the Report of the decisions of the Board upon the appeals against the proposals of the Commissioners relating to the classification and re-classification of the various offices referred to in the said report.

In so doing the Board desires to express the hope that in the case of future appeals means will be found to obviate the great delay which has occurred in connection with the present appeals. The length of time which has elasped between the classification and the hearing of the appeals made it difficult to assess the value of offices at the date of the classification, owing to altered conditions, and in many cases to changes in the duties of the appellants.

The Board would also point out that in many cases the evidence disclosed the fact that officers were not performing the duties which by the classification the Commissioners intended should be performed by them. This was apparently due in some cases to the fact that the classification did not specifically and sufficiently indicate the intentions of the Commissioners, and in other cases because the Heads or Sub-heads of Departments considered the proposals unworkable and declined to alter the routine of their offices.

To meet this difficulty the Board would suggest that in future classifications a general outline of the duties attached to each position should be shown, and that there should be some officer whose duty it should be to see that effect be given to the intentions of the Commissioners, or, if they be found unworkable, that the necessary reclassification be effected.

Finally, the Board desires to place on record the fact that a number of the appellants satisfied it that they have substantial grounds for asking for a revision of the grade at which, within their respective ranges, their salaries have been fixed by the classification.

As, however, the Full Court has laid it down that the fixing of a salary of an officer is not a "proposal relating to the classification of an office," and, therefore, not a matter cognisable by this Board, and as, moreover, the Board constituted with the Commissioner

as Chairman has, so far, declined jurisdiction on what have been called "grade appeals," the officers in question are left without that redress which they consider the Legislature intended they should have.

The Board desires to express its appreciation of the assistance which Mr. Alcock has rendered to it, and of the fair and able manner in which he conducted the appeals on behalf of the Commissioner.

Resolved: That the Articles of Association of the Company be amended by adding the following Clause thereto:—

- (a.) That the Capital of the Company be increased by the creation of Twenty thousand new shares of £1 each, to be called cumulative preference shares, to which there shall be attached the special right and privileges following, that is to say:—
- (i.) The profits of the Company which, in respect of any year or other period, it shall be determined to distribute and apply shall be applied in order of the priority and manner following:—
 - Firstly: In payment to the holders of such preference shares of cumulative preferential dividend at the rate of Eight pounds per centum per annum on the capital for the time being paid up on such preference shares respectively.
 - Secondly: Of the surplus then remaining one-fifth thereof shall be set apart and paid into a reserve fund to be entitled "The Cumulative Preferential Dividend Reserve Fund" until such reserve fund shall have been declared closed, in manner provided in Subclause 4 hereof, and if re-opened during all such time as the same shall remain open.
 - Thirdly: The remaining four-fifths of the surplus shall be applied in payment to the holders of the ordinary shares of dividends up to but not exceeding in any one year ten per cent. on the capital for the time being paid up on such ordinary shares respectively.
 - Fourthly: After payment of the dividends to the ordinary Shareholders, as hereinafter provided, the balance shall be divided into three equal parts and

- one of such parts shall be paid to the holders of the preference shares, and the other two parts shall be paid to the holders of the ordinary shares.
- (ii.) The capital paid up on the preference shares shall not be liable to cancellation or reduction in respect of loss or depreciation.
- (iii.) As soon as the reserve fund, provided for in Clause (i.) hereof, shall amount to a sum equal to three years' dividend at the rate of Eight per cent. on the capital for the time being paid up on the said Preference Shares of the Company, the Directors shall have power then or at any time thereafter to declare the same closed, and the same shall thereupon be deemed closed, but the Directors may at any time and shall, whenever the said reserve fund shall fall below the sum hereinbefore mentioned, reopen the said reserve fund and keep the same open until the amount thereof shall then be equal again to the said sum, and so long thereafter as they shall deem fit.

The said reserve fund shall, in any year when there are no profits available or the profits of the Company shall be insufficient to pay a dividend of Eight per cent. per annum to the holders of the preference shares as hereinbefore provided, be applied (in the discretion of the Directors) in payment of or towards the payment of a dividend of Eight per cent. per annum to the holders of the preference shares, and such reserve fund shall not be applied for any other purpose except with the consent in general meeting or of the holders of the preference shares for the time being.

(iv.) In the event of the winding up of the Company the holders of the preference shares shall be entitled to have the surplus assets first, in paying off the capital paid up on the preference shares held by them respectively. (vii.) The preference shares aforesaid shall be issued to such persons and on such terms and conditions as the board may think fit, and Clause 29 of Table A shall as regards such shares be deemed to be modified accordingly.
