WHEREAS by Section 8 of "The Fisheries Act, 1905-13," it is provided that the Governor may, by Proclamation, prohibit all persons from-

- (a.) Taking fish of any specified species, by any specified means of capture;
 (b.) Taking any fish whatsoever, by any specified means of capture;
- (c.) Taking any fish whatsoever, by any means of capture whatsoever;

capture whatsoever; in any specified portion of Western Australian waters during any specified time in any specified year or during a specified portion of any year: Now therefore I, the said Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby, in exercise of the powers aforesaid and of any other powers enabling me in this behalf, proclaim and declare as follows:—

(1) That all that portion of Western Australian

- (1.) That all that portion of Western Australian waters defined in the First Locality Schedule attached hereto shall be closed against the use of fishing nets as from the 1st day of January, 1915, until the 30th day of April, 1915, and as from the 1st day of August, 1915, until the 31st day of December, 1915, inclusive.
- (2.) That all those portions of Western Australian waters defined in the Second Locality Schedule attached hereto shall be closed against the use of fishing nets as from the 1st day of January, 1915, until the 30th day of April, 1915, and from the 1st day of November, 1915, until the 31st day of December, 1915, inclusive.
- (3.) That all those portions of Western Australian waters defined in the Third Locality Schedule attached hereto shall be closed against the use of fishing nets as from the 1st day of January, 1915, until the 31st day of March, 1915, and from the 1st day of October, 1915, until the 31st day of December, 1915, inclusive.

- (4.) That all that portion of Western Australian waters defined in the Fourth Locality Schedule attached hereto shall be closed against the use of fishing nets as from the 1st day of January, 1915, until the 23rd day of March, 1915, and from the 16th day of May, 1915, until the 31st day of December, 1915, inclusive.

 (5.) That all that portion of Western Australian waters defined in the Fifth Locality Schedule shall be closed against the use of fishing nets as from the 1st day of January, 1915, until the 31st day of December, 1915, inclusive; provided that subject to certain provisions (vide separate Proclamation) it shall be lawful to fish within the waters of the Leschenault Estuary North of a line drawn from the South-Eastern corner of Leschenault Location 24 to the North-Western corner of Leschenault Location 31, between the hours of twelve o'clock noon and twelve o'clock midnight on all Mondays and Thursdays. days and Thursdays.
- (6.) That all that portion of Western Australian waters defined in the Sixth Locality Schedule shall be closed against the taking of English Perch by any method of capture as from the 1st day of July, 1915, until the 31st day of October, 1915, inclusive.

First Locality Schedule.

All that portion of the ocean waters of Rottnest Island lying West of the North-Eastern extremity of North Point (on the Northern side of the said island) and West of the South-Western extremity of Salmon Point (on the Southern side of the said island) and within the sea limits of half a mile from the foreshore.

Second Locality Schedule.

- (a.) That portion of the waters of Geographe Bay extending in an Easterly direction from the Eastern side of the shore end of the Busselton Pier or Jetty to a point on the foreshore one and a half miles from the said pier or jetty and half a mile into the waters of the said bay.
- (b.) That portion of the waters of Geographe Bay extending in a Westerly direction from the Western side of the shore end of the Busselton Pier or Jetty to a point on the foreshore half a mile from the said pier or jetty and half a mile into the waters of the said bay.

Third Locality Schedule.

That portion of the waters of Geographe Bay (a.) extending from the North-Western side of the "Fish Rock" to a point half a mile along the foreshore and a quarter of a mile into the waters of the said bay.

(b.) That portion of the waters of the said bay.

extending from the South-Eastern side of the "Fish Rock" to a point half a mile along the foreshore and a quarter of a mile into the waters of the said bay.

Fourth Locality Schedule.

That portion of the ocean waters near the entrance to Peel's Inlet bounded by the following lines:—

On the West by a line drawn in a Northerly direction for a quarter of a mile from the extremity of Robert Point (on the Western side of the Bar); thence by a line running in an Easterly direction until it meets the foreshore of the mainland (on the Eastern side of the entrance to Peel's Inlet); thence in a generally Southerly direction along the line of foreshore to the Bar; thence by a line in a generally Westerly direction to the Western point of entrance to the Bar, and thence the Western point of entrance to the Bar, and thence in a generally Westerly direction along the line of foreshore to the point of commencement.

Fifth Locality Schedule.

The whole of the waters of Leschenault Estuary (Bunbury).

Sixth Locality Schedule.

The whole of the waters of the Capel River (near Bunbury), including the creeks flowing into it.

WHEREAS by Section 17 of "The Fisheries Act, 1905-13," it is provided that the Governor may from time to time, by Proclamation, declare what length and depth of net and size of mesh for the whole or any part of a fishing net shall, when used or intended to be used in any specified water or waters be a lawful net: And whereas it is expedient to declare the length and size of mesh of nets that may be used in the waters specified in the Schedules hereto: Now therefore I, the said Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby, in exercise of the powers enabling me in this behalf, proclaim and declare

as follows:-(1.) That nets which do not exceed in length 30 fathoms (60 yards) and the size of the mesh of any part whereof is not less than 2½ inches measured from knot to knot on the inside of the mesh when wetted and ready for use and stretched so that the opposite knots on the alternate corners are in contact, shall when used or intended to be used for lawful fishing in the waters defined in the First Schedule hereto be lawful nets, and that it shall not be lawful to use in such waters any net not in conformity with these conditions.

That nets which do not exceed in length one whereof is not less than $2\frac{1}{4}$ inches measured from knot to knot on the inside of the mesh when wetted and ready for use and stretched so that the opposite knots on the alternate corners are in contact, shall when used or intended to be used for lawful fishing in that portion of the waters of the Leschenault Estuary defined (vide separate Proclamation) be lawful nets, and that it

shall not be lawful to use in such waters any net not in conformity with these conditions.

(a.) Taking fish of any specified species, by any specified means of capture, in any specified portion of Western Australian waters

during any specified time in any specified year or during a specified portion of any year: And whereas the Prawn is a prescribed species of fish within the meaning of is a prescribed species of fish within the meaning of this provision: And whereas by Section 17 of the same Act the Governor may, by Proclamation, declare what length and depth of net and size of mesh for the whole or any part of a fishing net shall, when used or intended to be used in any specified water or waters, or for catch-ing any specified kind or kinds of fish, be a lawful net: Now therefore I, the said Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby, in exercise of the powers aforesaid and of every other in exercise of the powers aforesaid and of every other power enabling me in this behalf, proclaim and declare as follows:

That those portions of Western Australian waters defined in the Schedule hereto shall be closed against the taking of Prawns by means of any net other than a hand-scoop net (such net not to exceed a total length of nine feet) from the 1st day of January, 1915, until the 31st day of December, 1915, inclusive: And further that any net which does not exceed 25 fathoms in length and has a mesh throughout the whole of the net of not less than one-half inch, measured from knot to knot on the inside of the mesh when wetted ready for use and stretched so that the opposite knots on the alternate corners are in contact, shall be a lawful net when used or intended to be used for the capture of Prawns in any Western Australian waters, except that portion defined in the said Schedule.

to make the following amendments to the Regulations published in the Government Gazette on the 17th July, 1914.

Regulation 58.—Spirits.

Paragraph (3).—Insert the word "Scotch" before the word "Whisky" in the first line. Strike out the word "Pure" and insert the word "Standard" in lieu thereof.

(a.) Strike out the word "pure" in the first line and insert the word "standard" in lieu thereof. Strike out all words after the fourth line.

(b.) Strike out the word "pure" in the first line and insert the word "standard" in lieu thereof. Strike out the figures "45" in the second line and the figures "160" in the third line, and insert the figures "40" and "140" respectively in lieu thereof.

(c.) Strike out the word "Pure" in the figures.

(c.) Strike out the word "Pure" in the first line and insert the word "Standard" in lieu thereof. Strike out the figures "40" in the second line and the figures "140" in the third line, and insert the figures "35" and "110" in lieu thereof respectively.

Add the following paragraph to stand as paragraph (4):-

- (4.) Irish whisky shall be spirit distilled from barley, malt, or other grains, certified to the satisfaction of the Customs to have been natured by storage in wood for a period of not less than two years, and shall be sold under one of the following designations, and conform to the respective standards specified therefor:—
 - (a.) Standard pot still whisky shall contain at least 35 grammes of compound ethers and 200 grammes of higher alcohols per 100 litres of absolute alcohol, when these ingredients are estimated etrictly by the methods laid down in Schedule A attached to these Regulations.
 - (b.) Blended whisky containing at least seventyfive per centum of standard pot still whisky shall contain not less than 30 grammes of compound ethers, and 160 grammes of higher alcohols per 100 litres of absolute alcohol.
 - (c.) Blended whisky containing at least fifty per centum of standard pot still whisky shall contain not less than 25 grammes of compound ethers, and 130 grammes of higher alcohol per 100 litres of absolute alcohols.
 - (d.) Blended whisky containing less than fifty per centum of standard pot still whisky shall be that which fails to comply with any of the above standards.

(5.)All whiskies other than Scotch or Irish as above defined shall be sold under one of the designations and conform to the respective standards specified therefor in Paragraph 3, (a), (b), (c), and (d) of these Regula-

IT is hereby notified, for public information, that in order to aid the development of Mining in the State, the Government, when requested to do so, will, until further notice, undertake the shipment to market and sale there of metalliferous ores and concentrates on behalf of the owners thereof, and will make cash advances thereon, on the following terms and conditions, viz.:—

1. The ores and concentrates shall be such as contain lead, tin, or copper as their principal metallic constituent, but the Minister for Mines from time to time may direct that any other ores, minerals, or metalliferous products of marketable value may be accepted and dealt with similarly.
