APPEALS TO THE COMMISSIONER OF PUBLIC HEALTH UNDER SECTION 36.

Regulations.

Whereas by Section 36 of "The Health Act, 1911-12," it is provided that in certain matters a person aggrieved by an order or decision of a Local Authority may appeal against the same to the Commissioner of Public Health, and that every such appeal shall be brought and conducted in accordance with Regulations made by the Governor: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following Regulations accordingly:—

1. Any person desirous of appealing to the Commissioner under Section 36 of "The Health Act, 1911-12," against any order or decision of a Local Authority shall, within fourteen days after receiving notice of such order or decision, deliver to the Commissioner a Notice of Appeal setting forth—

- (a) The matter in respect of which the Notice of Appeal is given;
- (b) The terms of the order or decision appealed against;
- (c) The date of such order or decision;
- (d) The grounds upon which the appeal is based.

2. Upon receipt of such notice of appeal the Commissioner shall investigate the matter and hear such evidence as may be brought before him by the appellant or by the Local Authority, whose order or decision is appealed against.

3. If any evidence is to be heard, the Commissioner shall fix a place and time for the hearing, of which at least seven days' notice shall be given to the appellant and to the Local Authority concerned.

4. At such hearing the appellant and the Local Authority may be represented by counsel; the proceedings at such hearing need not be in accordance with the recognised procedure of a Court of Law, but shall be as directed by the Commissioner.

5. All evidence shall be given upon oath, and in relation to witnesses and their examination and the production of documents, the Commissioner shall have similar powers to those conferred upon Justices by "The Justices Act, 1902."

COURT OF ARBITRATION, WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

No. 3 of 1915.

Between the Metropolitan Hairdressers and Wigmakers' Employees' Union of Workers, Applicant, and T. Sharp ; D. Rosenwax ; J. Gleeson ; Charles H. J. Perry ; James Spigl ; A. Lodi ; W. J. Beisley ; Cook and Bayley ; and W. Klix, Respondents.

The Court of Arbitration of Western Australia doth hereby make the following award in connection with the industrial dispute between the above-mentioned parties :—

AWARD.

1. *Definitions* : In this award, unless the context otherwise indicates, and without limiting the ordinary meaning of the term :—

“Master Hairdresser” means a person, who, although he or she may not be a hairdresser, carries on the business of hairdressing, and employs at least one hairdresser ; and also a person, who, being a hairdresser, carries on the business of hairdressing on his own account.

“Public Holiday” means a day gazetted in the *Government Gazette* as a public holiday.

2. *Wages* : The minimum rate of wage shall be :—

3. *Holidays* : Hairdressers shall not be required to work at all on Christmas Day, Good Friday, or on Wednesday afternoons.

On all public holidays other than the two mentioned work shall cease at 11 a.m.

Hairdressers shall not be required to work after the hour of 9 p.m. on Saturday.

Provided always, that a hairdresser shall, before ceasing work, complete the operation in relation to any customer upon which he is engaged at the hour fixed for ceasing work.

4. *Overtime* : All work required to be done after the hour of 11 a.m. on public holidays other than Christmas Day and Good Friday, and on Wednesday after 1 p.m., and on any other day, after the usual hour for ceasing work, shall be paid for at the rate of time and a-half, with a minimum of overtime, in addition to ordinary wage, of 6d.

All work done on Christmas Day and Good Friday shall be paid for at the rate of double time, and any hairdresser employed on either of the said days shall be paid for at least one hour's overtime.

5. *Termination of Employment* : One week's notice by either party shall terminate the employment, except in the case of incompetence or misconduct on the part of the worker.

6. *Apprentices* : (i.) No person shall, after the date of this award, be engaged by any master hairdresser as an apprentice, or to learn the trade of hairdressing, except under and in the manner prescribed by this award.

(ii.) The period of apprenticeship shall be four years. A probationary period of three months previous to being bound shall be lawful, and such probationary period shall be deemed portion of the term of the apprenticeship.

(iii.) The number of apprentices that may be taken by any one employer shall not exceed the proportion of one apprentice to every three fully paid hairdressers or fraction of three in his employ. This shall not, however, debar a master hairdresser who is himself working at the trade from taking an apprentice.

(iv.) Should any employer, from unforeseen circumstances, be unable to carry out his obligations to the apprentice, he shall be allowed to transfer the apprentice to complete his term with another employer, but it shall be incumbent upon such former employer to notify the Clerk of the Court of Arbitration of the date of such transfer, and when such apprenticeship commenced.

(v.) In the absence of indentures, apprentices shall be bound for the term and on the conditions herein provided, and subject to the following provisions :—

(a.) Any employer taking an apprentice shall, within thirty days thereafter, give notice thereof to the Clerk of the Court of Arbitration in the form hereinafter provided (Form 1 in Appendix hereto), and shall be deemed to undertake the duty which he agrees to perform as a duty enforceable under this award, and shall, subject to the provisions of sub-clause (xi.) hereof, pay the apprentice the rate of wages herein provided.

(b.) At the end of the period of apprenticeship the employer shall give the apprentice a certificate (Form 5, in Appendix hereto), to show that he has served his apprenticeship. Should the employer at any time before the termination of the apprenticeship desire to dispense with the services of the apprentice he may, with the consent of the apprentice, transfer him to another employer carrying on business within a reasonable distance of the original employer's place of business, willing to continue to teach the apprentice and to pay the wages prescribed by this award according to the total length of time served, and generally to perform the obligations of the original employer. He shall also give to the apprentice a certificate of the time served and of the rate of wages paid, and shall give notice to the Clerk of the Court of Arbitration of such transfer in the Form hereinafter provided (Form 2 in Appendix hereto). It shall not be obligatory upon any employer to find any apprentice another employer if he shall so misconduct himself as to entitle the employer to discharge him, but he shall, nevertheless, give him a certificate for the time actually served.

(c.) An employer shall be deemed to fail in his duty towards his apprentice if he neglects to keep him constantly at work, but slackness of work may form a proper ground for transferring him to a master willing to undertake the responsibility of teaching him.

- (d.) When an apprentice is discharged for cause the employer shall send notice, in writing, of the discharge, and the cause thereof, to the said Clerk of the Court of Arbitration (Form 3 in Appendix hereto).
- (vi.) The minimum weekly wage payable to an apprentice shall be :—
 During the first year's service, 10s. per week.
 During the second year's service, £1 per week.
 During the third year's service, £1 10s. per week.
 During the fourth year's service, £2 per week.
- (vii.) Every apprentice shall be bound to submit himself to examination by a Board of Examiners, hereinafter constituted, once in each year of his service when called upon by the Clerk of the Court so to do.
- (viii.) The Clerk of the Court shall notify the Board of Examiners of the names and addresses of all candidates required to submit themselves to examination. The examination will be held at the place where the apprentice is employed, and it shall be the duty of each employer to provide such necessary material and machinery as may be required, and in all ways to facilitate the conduct of the examination.
- (ix.) The examination shall be held during the month of November in each year, on a date to be fixed by the Board of Examiners.
- The Board of Examiners will consist of two persons skilled in the trade, one of whom shall be nominated by the union and the other by a majority of the employers carrying on business within the area to which this award applies, or, failing such nominations, such person or persons as may be appointed for that purpose by the Court.
- In the event of a disagreement between the members of the Board, the matter in dispute shall be referred to a third person agreed to by them or nominated by the Court or the President thereof at the request of either member.
- The Board of Examiners shall examine the work of and inquire into the diligence of each apprentice, and as to the opportunity provided by the employer to each apprentice to learn.
- (x.) The Board shall report to the Court, in writing, as to the result of each examination.
- (xi.) The Clerk of the Court shall supply to each candidate a certificate showing the result of his examination, and it shall be lawful for any employer to withhold the increase of wages accruing, in accordance with the scale set forth in sub-clause (vi.) hereof, from any apprentice who fails to satisfy the examiners.
- (xii.) If the examiners report to the Court that any employer has not provided sufficient opportunity for the apprentice to learn, the employer shall be deemed *prima facie* guilty of a breach of this award under Section 90 of the Act, and may be summoned before the Court. Upon any such proceeding the report may be received in evidence.
- (xiii.) Such fees shall be paid by the Clerk to the examiners as the Court shall allow.

7. *Record Book* : Each master hairdresser shall keep at his hairdressing saloon, or at each of such saloons, if more than one, a book containing a record of—

- (a.) The names of all workers employed by him, and to whom this award applies ;
 (b.) The wages paid to each such worker ; and
 (c.) The hours worked by each such worker.

On the first working day of each week the said book shall be entered up by the employer so as to show the aforesaid particulars for the week then immediately preceding.

The said book may be inspected on any week day except Saturday, at any time during ordinary business hours, by the secretary for the time being of the workers' or employers' union, and also by any person thereunto authorised by the President of the Court of Arbitration.

8. *Area* ; This award shall operate over the area comprised within a radius of fourteen miles from the General Post Office in the City of Perth.

9. *Term* : This award shall operate for a period of three years from its date : Provided, nevertheless, that the Court may at any time after the expiration of twelve months from the date hereof on the application in the prescribed manner by any party or person affected by its provisions, terminate, alter, or amend the award in such a manner as the Court may deem expedient.

COURT OF ARBITRATION, WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

No. 1 of 1915.

Between the Coastal District Committee Amalgamated Society of Engineers' Industrial Association of Workers, Applicant, and A. W. Dobbie and Company, Limited; Tomlinson Brothers; J. and E. Ledger; Wright and Gibb; George Kent, Limited; Atlas Engineering Company; James Chalmers; The Metropolitan Iron-masters' Industrial Union of Employers; The Mayor and Councilors of the City of Perth; and the Fremantle Municipal Tramway and Electric Lighting Board, Respondents.

The Court of Arbitration of Western Australia doth hereby make the following award in connection with the industrial dispute between the above-mentioned parties:—

AWARD.

1. *Hours*: Forty-eight hours shall constitute one week's work. No day shall exceed 8½ hours. Saturday's work shall finish at noon. Provided, that the present recognised custom as to the day's work shall apply to all workers engaged in the manufacture of vertical pipes; and provided also, that if from any cause workers so engaged perform in any one day less than the recognised day's work their pay for that day may be reduced proportionately.

2. *Overtime and Holidays*: (a.) All time worked in excess of that mentioned in Clause 1, shall be reckoned as overtime and shall be paid for at the rate of time and a-quarter for the first two hours, and time and a-half thereafter until the usual starting time next day.

(b.) Systematic overtime shall not be worked. Overtime shall be considered to be systematic when two weeks' continuous overtime has been worked. Provided that this sub-clause shall not apply to cases, where, after application to the secretary of the association, extra labour is not forthwith available. No worker shall be required or permitted to work more than 24 hours overtime in any one week.

(c.) All overtime shall commence from the usual stopping time, and shall be reckoned as overtime until the usual starting time next day. Each day's work shall stand by itself.

(d.) Any worker recalled to work after he has left the works after the usual time of ceasing work shall be paid for at least two hours at overtime rate.

(e.) Work done on New Year's Day, Sunday, Easter Monday, Good Friday, Eight Hours' Day, and Christmas Day, shall be paid for at the rate of double time.

(f.) Work done on Anniversary Day, Easter Saturday, King's Birthday, and Boxing Day, shall be paid for at the rate of time and a-half.

3. *Night Shifts*: Night shifts shall be paid for at ordinary rates, plus 2s. per shift. Only one shift in the twenty-four hours shall be recognised as a day shift, namely, the first shift after starting work in the morning. Where less than three consecutive nights are worked, or where only one shift is working on the job, overtime rates shall be paid for night work.

4. *Dirt Money*: Workers engaged on dirty work outside the employer's workshop shall be paid 1½d. per hour as dirt money. The following may be taken as examples of work in respect of which dirt money shall be payable under this clause—

(i.) *On Ships*: Under lower platform of engine room, in bilges or in confined places around ships' boilers, between ships' sides and boilers, through manhole doors, between bulkheads and back end of single-ended boilers, and in ships' tunnels;

(ii.) *In Chemical and Manure Works*: All repairs and renewals on superphosphate mixing plants, and pyrite furnaces.

5. *Minimum Wage*: The minimum wages payable to workers other than duly registered apprentices and probationers shall be:—

In this award a "duly registered apprentice" means an apprentice of whose apprenticeship notice has been given to the Clerk of the Court in accordance with the provisions of this clause; and a "duly registered probationer" means a person working as an apprentice on probation, of whose probationary period notice has been given to the Clerk of the Court in accordance with the provisions of this Clause. Provided, that an apprentice or a probationer shall be deemed to be duly registered during the period of fourteen days allowed for registration.

(b.) Any employer hereafter taking an apprentice or probationer shall, within fourteen days thereafter, register such apprentice or probationer, by giving notice thereof to the Clerk of the Court, in the prescribed form.

(c.) If at the date of this award any employer is employing any person as an apprentice or a probationer who has not been duly registered as such, he shall register such apprentice or probationer within fourteen days thereafter.

(d.) The maximum number of apprentices allowed to any employer in any branch shall be in the proportion of one apprentice to every two or fraction of two journeymen employed by him in that branch: Provided that an employer shall not be entitled to have apprentices to any branch in the same year of their apprenticeship in a greater proportion than one to every four or fraction of four journeymen employed by him in that branch. Provided also, that this award shall not operate to render unlawful, or to vary the terms or provisions of any apprenticeship existing at the date of its commencement.

(e.) For the purpose of ascertaining the number of apprentices allowed to be taken at any time the number of journeymen employed shall be deemed to be the average number of journeymen employed on all working days of the six months immediately preceding such time.

(f.) Apprentices shall not be allowed except to one of the following branches of the engineering trade—

1. Patternmaking;
2. Coppersmithing;
3. Blacksmithing;
4. Brass finishing;
5. Turning;
6. Fitting;
7. Universal milling machining; or
8. Machining—other than universal milling machining;
9. Electrical trades;

and shall be engaged under terms hereinafter set forth.

(g.) The term of apprenticeship shall be five years. A probationary period of three months previous to being bound shall be lawful, such probationary period to be deemed portion of the term of apprenticeship.

(h.) Should any employer from unforeseen circumstances be unable to carry out his obligations to his apprentice, he shall be allowed to transfer the apprentice to complete his term with another employer; but it shall be incumbent upon such former employer to notify the Clerk of the Court of the date of such transfer and when such apprenticeship commenced. (Form 2 in the Appendix hereto).

(i.) The following provisions shall apply in respect of all apprenticeships—

- (1.) An employer shall be deemed to undertake the duty which he agrees to perform as a duty enforceable under this award and shall, subject to the provisions of sub-clause (p.) pay the apprentice the rate of wages herein provided.
- (2.) At the end of the period of apprenticeship the employer shall give the apprentice a certificate (Form 5 in the Appendix hereto) to show that he has served his apprenticeship. Should the employer at any time before the termination of the term of apprenticeship desire to dispense with the services of the apprentice, he may, with the consent of the apprentice, transfer him to another employer carrying on business within a reasonable distance of the original employer's place of business, willing to continue to teach the apprentice and to pay the rate of wages prescribed by this award, according to the total length of time served, and generally to perform the obligations of the original employer. He shall also give to the apprentice a certificate of the time served and of the rate of wages paid, and shall give notice to the Clerk of the Court of such transfer in the form provided (Form 2 in the Appendix hereto). It shall not be obligatory upon the employer to find the apprentice another employer if he shall so misconduct himself as to entitle the employer to discharge him, but he shall nevertheless give him a certificate for the time actually served.
- (3.) An employer shall be deemed to fail in his duty towards his apprentice if he neglects to keep him constantly at work, but slackness of work may form a proper ground for transferring him to a master willing to undertake the responsibility of teaching him.
- (4.) When an apprentice is discharged for cause, the employer shall send notice, in writing, of the discharge, and the cause thereof, to the said Clerk of the Court (Form 3 in the Appendix hereto).

(j.) The minimum wage payable to an apprentice shall be—

			per week.
During the first year	10s. 4
During the second year	15s. 7
During the third year	£1 8
During the fourth year	£1 10s.
During the fifth year	£2

(k.) Every apprentice shall be bound to submit himself to examination by a Board of Examiners hereinafter constituted once in each year of his service when called upon by the Clerk of the Court so to do.

(l.) The Clerk of the Court shall notify the Board of Examiners of the names and addresses of all candidates required to submit themselves to examination. The examination will be held at the place where the apprentice is employed, and it shall be the duty of each employer to provide such necessary material and machinery as may be required, and in all ways to facilitate the conduct of the examination.

(m.) The examination will be held in the month of May in each year. The Board of Examiners will consist of persons skilled in the trade to be nominated by the association and by the employers carrying on business within the area to which this award applies; or, failing such nomination, or nominations, such person, or persons, as may be appointed for that purpose by the Court. In the event of a disagreement between the examiners, the matter in dispute shall be referred to a third person agreed to by them, or nominated by the Court, or the President, at the request of either member, and the decision of such third person shall be final and conclusive. The examiners shall examine the work of and enquire into the diligence of each apprentice and as to the opportunities provided by the employer to each apprentice to learn.

(n.) The examiners shall report to the Court in writing, as to the result of the examination.

(o.) The Clerk of the Court shall supply to each candidate a certificate showing the result of his examination, and it shall be lawful for any employer to withhold the increase in wages accruing, in accordance with the scale set forth in sub-clause (j.) hereof, from any apprentice who fails to satisfy the examiners.

(p.) If the examiners report to the Court that any employer has not provided sufficient opportunity for the apprentice to learn, the employer shall be deemed *prima facie* guilty of a breach of this award under Section 90 of the Act, and may be summoned before the Court. Upon any such proceeding the report may be received in evidence.

(q.) Such fees shall be paid by the Clerk to the examiners as the Court shall allow.

7. *Country Work*: (a.) When a worker is engaged on outside work the employer shall pay all fares and a proper allowance at current rates shall be paid for all necessary meals. Fares shall be second-class, except when travelling by coastal boat, when saloon fare shall be paid.

(b.) When a worker is engaged at such a distance that he cannot return at night, suitable board and lodging shall be found at the employer's expense.

(c.) Travelling time shall be paid for at ordinary rates; provided that, when travelling by boat, not more than eight hours shall be paid for as travelling time in any one period of twenty-four hours.

8. *Under-rate Workers*: Any worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum wage may be paid such lesser wage as may from time to time be agreed upon in writing, between the association and the employer, and in default of such agreement within twenty-four hours after such worker shall have applied in writing to the secretary of the association stating his desire that such wage should be agreed upon, such wage as shall be fixed by the most convenient resident or police magistrate upon the application of such worker after twenty-four hours' notice in writing shall have been given by him to the said secretary, who shall, if he so desires, be heard by the magistrate upon such application. After having given notice to the secretary, and after lodging the application mentioned, and pending the magistrate's decision thereon, the worker shall be entitled to work for and be employed at the proposed lesser rate. The determination of the magistrate shall have effect for the period of six calendar months from the date thereof, and after the expiration of the said period until the wage shall have been again fixed at the instance of the said secretary in the manner prescribed. The secretary of the association may, by writing under his hand, appoint an agent or substitute to represent the association at the hearing of the application before the magistrate.

9. *Record Book* : A time and wage book shall be kept by each employer, in which book shall be entered the name of each worker, the nature of the work he is doing, the hours worked each day, and the amount of wages received by him each week. The employer shall be responsible for the proper posting of the book each week. The said book shall be open to the inspection of the secretary of the association during working hours.

10. *Exemptions* : (a.) Nothing in this award shall be held to apply to the manufacture, assembling, fitting up, or distribution of agricultural implements and machinery, or to the manufacture of stoves, ranges and grates, or to the manufacture of bolts and nuts when made by machinery.

(b.) Clause 2 of this award shall not apply to such of the following Corporations, viz., The Fremantle Municipal Tramway and Electric Lighting Board ; The Perth City Council ; The Subiaco Municipal Council ; and the Claremont Municipal Council, as shall, within one month, or such extended time as the Court shall allow, submit alternative schemes which the Court shall deem satisfactory, providing for holidays and the payment for overtime to their respective employees. Any scheme approved by the Court under this clause shall, as regards the Corporation submitting it, be deemed to be incorporated with and to form part of this award

11. *Term of Award* : The currency of this award shall be three years : Provided that at any time after the expiration of twelve months from its date the Court may alter or amend the same on the application of any party or person affected by its provisions.

12. *Area* : This award shall operate over the area comprised within a radius of fourteen miles from the General Post Office in the City of Perth, save and except such portions thereof as are in the occupation of and used in connection with the works of the Westralia Ironworks, Limited, and the Midland Railway Company.
