WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Mining Act, 1904," it is lawful for the Governor by Proclamation to alter or amend the boundaries of a Goldfield or District: Now therefore I, the said Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers in me vested in that behalf by the said Ordinance, do hereby alter the existing boundaries of the Phillips River and Yilgarn Goldfields, and hereby proclaim the boundaries of the said Goldfields to be as follows:—

Phillips River Goldfield.

Bounded by lines starting from a point on the Southern coast, near Red Islet, South of the 125-mile post on the Southern section of the No. 1 Rabbit-proof Fence; thence North, passing about 3¾ miles East of Mainerup Pool, on the Albany-Ravensthorpe Road, to the said 125-mile post; thence North-Westerly along the fence to a point due West of the summit of Mt. South Ironcap; thence East through the said summit of Mt. South Ironcap to a point South of Cairn H26 on Koorarawalee Rock; thence South along the West boundary of the Dundas Goldfield to a point West of the 75-mile post on the Esperance-Dundas Road; thence East along the South boundary of the Dundas Goldfield 77 miles; thence South to a point West of survey mark N24 on Mt. Ridley; thence West to a point North of survey mark C66, on the Albany-Esperance telegraph line; thence South to a point 2½ miles North of survey mark C66, on the Albany-Esperance telegraph line; thence South to a point 2½ miles North of survey mark C66, on the Albany-Esperance telegraph line; thence West about 35 miles (passing about 1¾ miles North of the crossing of the Hopetoun-Ravensthorpe and the Albany-Esperance telegraph lines) to a point 1½ miles East and about 2 miles South from a cairn on No Tree Hill; thence South to the sea-coast at Culham Inlet; thence South-Westward along the sea-coast to the starting point; and also to include within the said Goldfield the following Miners' Homestead Leases, namely, Nos. 25, 45, 46, 160, 162, 186, 208, and 256, which shall continue portions of the Phillips River Goldfield.

Yilgarn Goldfield.

Bounded by lines starting from a point North of cairn H26 on Koorarawalee Rock and West of cairn NB1 at Wangine Soak, and extending South along the West boundary of the Coolgardie and Dundas Goldfields, and passing through cairn H26 at Koorarawalee Rock to a point East of the summit of Mt. South Ironcap; thence West, passing through the summit of Mt. South Ironcap to a point on the Southern section of the No. 1 Rabbit-proof Fence, near the 113-mile post; thence North-Westerly and Northerly along the fence to the 14-mile post on the Northern section of the fence; thence East 20,833 links, North 24,000 links, and West 20,833 links to the 17-mile post on the fence; thence Northerly along the fence to the 158-mile post; thence Easterly about 75 miles to a cairn marked AN11 on an island at the Eastern end of Lake Barlee; thence Southerly about 11 miles to a cairn marked GDR40 on Mt. Elvire; thence South-South-Easterly about 41 miles to Johnson's Rocks; thence South-Easterly about 26 miles to starting point.

Excluding the Yilgarn Agricultural Area near Southern Cross as proclaimed on page 4035 of *Government Gazette* of 13th September, 1912.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to approve of the following Regulations for Secondary School Scholarships.

CECIL ANDREWS,
Director of Education.

Secondary School Scholarships.

1. Scholarships, not exceeding fifty in each year, are annually offered for boys and girls attending Government or other efficient schools. Ten of these Scholarships will be of the value of £20 per annum. The remainder will entitle the holders to receive a grant to defray the necessary expenses incurred in the provision of books, provided that no such extra grant shall exceed £3 per annum, and to have their entrance fees paid by the Department on sitting for the Junior Examination in the Third year, and for the Leaving Certificate Examination in the Fifth year of their Scholarships. Scholarship holders living at home may also receive a grant to defray their necessary travelling expenses, provided that their homes are at a greater distance than two miles from the school. The winners of these Scholarships must attend Secondary Schools approved by the Department. If the winner of a Scholarship resides at such a distance from an approved school that it is necessary for him to become a boarder or to live away from home, an additional allowance of £30 per annum will be given.

2. The Scholarships will be tenable for three years in the first instance, but may be renewed for a further period of two years if the industry and success of the scholar are considered to warrant such an extension.

3. A candidate for these Scholarships must—

(a) Be over twelve and not more than thirteen years old on the last day of the year in which the examination for the Scholarship is held.

NOTE.—In 1916 a certain number of Scholarships will be allotted to candidates who are between the ages of thirteen and thirteen and a-half on the last day of the year. After 1916 all candidates must be under thirteen, and, if attending State Schools, must be enrolled in Class VI.

(b) Have attended one or more of the Government or other efficient schools of the State for at least two years immediately preceding the day mentioned in (a), and have made not less than three hundred half-day attendances (unless prevented by illness) in such school or schools during his last year.

(c) Produce a certificate of industry and good conduct from the Head Teacher of the school last attended.

(d) Forward a statutory declaration from his parent or guardian showing either (1) that the total income of the parent or guardian does not exceed a quota of £70 per annum for each member of the family, including the parents or guardians, and excluding children earning a wage of 10s. or more weekly, or (2) that the total income of the parent or guardian is less than £350 per annum.

4. The Scholarships are awarded upon a competitive examination conducted by the Education Department.

5. A number of Scholarships, not exceeding one-fifth of the total number offered, will be reserved for pupils from country schools, provided that candidates of sufficient merit present themselves. A school with an average attendance of over 200 shall not be deemed a country school for the purposes of this section.

6. The conditions upon which the Scholarships are tenable are—

(a) That the successful scholar shall, at the commencement of the first term following the award of the Scholarship, become a pupil at a Secondary School approved by the Minister. The Minister may require that the school be inspected.

(b) That he shall continue to attend such school, and at the end of each term obtain from the authorities of the school, and forward to the Education Department, a certificate stating that his conduct, progress, and attendance have been satisfactory. Full particulars of attendance, of success in study, and of promotion if any, must

be given. If an unfavourable report is received or if at any time his conduct be disorderly or immoral, the Scholarship may, at the discretion of the Minister, be forthwith cancelled.

7. The examination will be on the following subjects:—

(1) English (300 marks).—The paper will be designed to test the candidate's powers of understanding the language and of using it freely and correctly. It will include Composition and questions on simple Grammar and Analysis of Sentences.

(2) Arithmetic (200 marks).—The ordinary course of Arithmetic as prescribed for classes not higher than the sixth in State schools.

(3) History (100 marks).—Outlines of British History. A text-book such as "A Brief Survey of British History," by G. Townsend Warner (Blackie, 1s. 6d.), will give sufficient material.

(4) Geography (100 marks).—The Geography of the British Empire, with special attention to Australasia. Simple Physiography as prescribed for Classes not higher than the sixth in the State schools.

8. The examination will be held in such centres as shall be fixed annually by the Department.

9. Schools desiring to be included on the list of approved Secondary Schools at which these Scholarships are tenable must apply to the Department for inclusion. The Minister must be satisfied that the school possesses suitable premises and equipment and is adequately staffed; and that it provides a five years' course of instruction beyond the primary stage, leading up to a standard not lower than that of the Leaving Certificate in such a number and range of subjects as the Minister may deem adequate.

Admission to Secondary Schools.

The Examination for admission to Secondary Schools will be identical with that for Secondary School Scholarships. In 1916 Candidates must be under 14 at the end of the year. In subsequent years candidates must be over 12 and under 13
