- (2.) Christmas Day, New Year's Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, and Eight Hours' Day to be paid holidays. Any work done on those days or on Sunday to be paid for at the rate of double time.
- (3.) Any employee called back to work after leaving to be paid for at least one hour.
- (4.) Overtime shall be paid as follows:—
 - On Saturdays—for work performed after the usual time for ceasing work until 3 p.m., time and a-quarter; between 3 p.m. and 7 p.m., time and a-half; and double time thereafter.
 - On other week days—for work performed after the usual time for ceasing work until 8 p.m., time and a-quarter; from 8 p.m. until midnight, time and a-half; from midnight until the ordinary time for starting work, double time.
- (5.) Special men required (2) for attending to consumers calls to remedy trouble in evening may be employed and paid—

THE SCHEME ABOVE REFERRED TO.

- Employees paid a weekly salary shall be deemed permanent employees. Permanent Employees shall be paid their weekly salary with no lost time, and shall not be entitled to be paid for overtime except when called out on a breakdown job.
- The hours of work for permanent employees (exclusive of work done on breakdown jobs) shall not exceed ninety-six hours in any two consecutive weeks.
- Permanent employees shall be paid at the rate of double time in addition to their weekly salary for work done on Sunday; and at ordinary rates in addition to their weekly salary for work done on New Year's Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Eight Hours' Day, Christmas Day, and Boxing Day.
- On breakdown jobs permanent employees shall be paid overtime as follows:—On Saturdays, for work performed after the usual time for ceasing work until 3 p.m., time and a-quarter; between 3 p.m. and 7 p.m., time and a-half; and double time thereafter. On other week days, for work performed after the usual time for ceasing work until 8 p.m., time and a-quarter; from 8 p.m. until midnight, time and a-half; from midnight until the ordinary time for starting work, double time.
- Permanent employees shall be entitled to a fortnight's annual leave on full pay.
- Casual employees shall be entitled to holidays and overtime in accordance with the provisions of Clause 2 of the Award.
