WHEREAS by "The Postponement of Debts Act, 1914," it is provided that the Governor may, on the advice of a Royal Commission, from time to time by Proclamation declare that payment of all debts then due or accruing due within the period mentioned in such Proclamation, of the classes specified in the Proclamation, or a specified proportion of any such debts, may, subject to such conditions and exceptions as may be contained in such Proclamation, be postponed to a date or for a period to be therein specified: And whereas a Royal Commission appointed under the said Act has advised that payment of all judgment debts, specialty debts, and simple contract debts of settlers and other persons to whom assistance has been or may hereafter be rendered under "The Industries Assistance Act, 1915," or to whom commodities have been supplied, or are deemed to have been supplied, or may hereafter be supplied under the last-mentioned Act, now due or to accrue due within a period of three months from the date of this Proclamation, should be postponed to the twentieth day of July, 1916, except debts incurred on and after the first day of March, 1916, by settlers in receipt of cash advances from the Industries Assistance Board for stores to be procured by such settlers, and except the debts and obligations of such settlers and other persons to the Colonial Treasurer under the provisions of "The Industries Assistance Act, 1915": Now therefore I, the said Governor, on the advice of the Royal Commission, and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby declare that payment of all judgment debts, specialty debts, and simple contract debts of settlers and other persons to whom assistance has been or may hereafter be rendered under "The Industries Assistance Act, 1915," or to whom commodities have been supplied, or are deemed to have been supplied, or may hereafter be supplied under the last-mentioned Act, now due or to accrue due within a period of three months from the date of this Proclamation, is hereby postponed to the twentieth day of July, 1916, except debts incurred on and after the first day of March, 1916, by settlers in receipt of cash advances from the Industries Assistance Board for stores to be

procured by such settlers, and except the debts and obligations of such settlers and other persons to the Colonial Treasurer under the provisions of "The Industries Assistance Act, 1915." And I do hereby, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, revoke the Proclamation under "The Postponement of Debts Act, 1914," published in the *Government Gazette* on the 17th day of March, 1916.

*Overtime.*—When salaried officers are called upon to work overtime in the interest of vessels or consignees, overtime shall be paid at the rate of 2s. 6d. per hour per officer.

Minimum Wharfage, 6d.

Minimum Handling, 6d.

Live Stock, when not handled by the Department, to be charged wharfage dues only.

NOTES.—Cargo transhipped from one vessel to another for conveyance to destination, or temporarily, shall pay wharfage, 1s. per ton. Live stock landed on beach, and not handled by Wharfinger, shall pay wharfage dues only.

Definition of "Handling Charges."—Handling charges on inward cargo shall, except where otherwise specifically provided, include receiving from ship's slings, tallying (which tallying shall be done in conjunction with and in the presence of any tallying which may be done by the ship), and delivering to the tail or side of vehicle, but not loading the vehicle. Inward cargo shall not, for any purpose whatever, be deemed to be in the custody of the Wharfinger until the sling is released from the ship's crane or hoisting hook, or deposited on the wharf or conveyance provided by the Wharfinger to receive the same.

Outward cargo shall be deemed to be in the custody of the ship when the ship's crane or hoisting hook is inserted in the sling.

Definition of "Handling Charges."—Handling charges on inwards cargo shall, except where otherwise specifically provided, include receiving from ship's slings, tallying (which tallying shall be done in conjunction with and in the presence of any tallying which may be done by the ship), and delivering to the tail or side of vehicle but not loading the vehicle. Inwards cargo shall not, for any purpose whatever, be deemed to be in the custody of the Wharfinger until

the sling is released from the ship's crane or hoisting hook or deposited on the wharf or conveyance provided by the Wharfinger to receive same.

Outwards cargo shall be deemed to be in the custody of the ship when the ship's crane or hoisting hook is inserted in the sling.

WHEREAS by virtue of the provision of "The Roads Act, 1911," the Road Board of every District is empowered to make, publish, alter, modify, and amend or repeal By-laws for any purpose of the said Act: It is therefore ordered by the Bunbury Road Board that from and after the publication of uniform By-laws hereunder, the same shall take effect:—

##### *Uniform By-laws for regulating Heavy Traffic.*

1. That the special yearly license for vehicles engaged in heavy traffic, that is to say, in carrying stone, bricks, lime, timber in bulk, earth, gravel, mineral, liquid, or any other heavy substance whatever shall be as follows:—

Two (2) wheeled vehicles, £2 per wheel per annum.  
Four (4) wheeled vehicles, £1 10s. per wheel per annum.

2. Such amount shall be additional to those prescribed under "The Cart and Carriage Act, 1876."

3. Any person who shall use, on any road in the District, any vehicle engaged in heavy traffic as defined in By-law No. 1, for which vehicle a current license has not been obtained under such By-law, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10.

#### DIVISION I.

##### *Interpretations.*

1. The words "Irrigable," "Irrigation," "Minister," "Prescribed," "Works," shall have the meanings severally attached to them in "The Rights in Water and Irrigation Act, 1914," or any amendment thereof.

#### DIVISION II.

##### *By-laws for protecting the water, grounds, works, etc., from trespass and injury.*

2. Trespassing within the fenced-off ground adjacent to or reserved for Water Supply or Irrigation Works, or the entering without proper authority on any Water or Irrigation work not open to the public, is prohibited.

3. Camping or lighting of fires within the vicinity of any reservoir, except on land set apart for such purposes, or the lighting of fires on any other reserves or fenced-off land, is absolutely prohibited.

4. The removal, plucking, or damaging of any wild-flowers, shrub, bush tree, or other plant growing on any land or reserve vested in the Minister, within half-a-mile of any reservoir, is prohibited.

5. Vehicles, conveyances, or animals shall not be driven, taken, or ridden in such a manner as to endanger the mains, conduits, or any works, or be permitted to cross the same except where crossing places have been provided.

6. No person shall cast away, throw, or deposit, on any portion of the property of the Minister, any rubbish of any kind or carry on any operations, or do any act which creates or tends to create any nuisance on any portion of the property of the Minister. No occupier shall allow any waste water on his land or enter any reservoir, conduit, or pipe used for any water belonging to or under control of the Minister, nor shall by negligence allow the water supplied by him to run to waste on public roads, or private or public lands.

7. No person shall take or use, or cause to be taken or used, any water from any reservoir, channel, conduit, or pipe belonging to the Minister, without the Minister's authority.

8. No person shall raise or lower any sluice gate or weir, or in any manner interfere with any reservoir, channel, conduit or pipe or appurtenance connecting thereto, belonging to the Minister, without the Minister's authority.

9. No person having control of any animal shall drive or allow the same to stray upon any of the property of the Minister.

10. No person having control of ducks or other fowl shall allow the same to enter or swim in the channels of the Minister.

11. No person shall bathe in any reservoirs, channels, or conduits of the Minister.

DIVISION III.

*By-laws for general purposes.*

12. Applications on Form A of Schedule hereto for a watering for irrigation shall be made in writing by ratepayer to the officer authorised by the Minister to receive same.

13. The Minister will, on application, at the times and in the quantities fixed by him, as notified to the applicant, and subject to payment of irrigation rates due, supply water:—

(a) To the highest point on each irrigable block in the district, and

(b) Subject to the Minister's approval, to such other points in such block as may be agreed upon.

14. The occupier of each block shall provide and maintain head ditches to the satisfaction of the Minister, and make all arrangements for the distribution and retention of water on his land. Failing such provision, the Minister shall have the power to refuse the supply of water until such head ditches or retention works shall have been provided.

15. The officers of the Minister may, at any time, enter upon any block for the purpose of inspection or regulating the water supply, and in the event of any water being taken or used in an unauthorised manner, shall have the power to stop all further supply of water. This regulation shall not be construed so as to relieve any person from the penalties referred to hereunder.

16. All persons taking water from the works of the Minister shall take delivery thereof through their respective outlets, at such times, and in such order and in such manner as the Minister may direct. The outlets for the delivery of water shall be operated only by the Minister's officers.

17. Deliveries of water for which notice has been given, if refused when duly offered, may be deemed to have been made.

18. A ratepayer shall not be entitled in consideration of the payment of the irrigation rate to a larger quantity of water than one acre foot of irrigable land, provided that for the purposes of these by-laws a watering shall mean the application of a volume of water of not less than four inches (4in.) in depth over any area watered, and one watering shall be the minimum quantity to which a ratepayer shall be entitled in respect of the irrigation rate.

DIVISION IV.

*Rates and Charges.*

19. Within the Harvey Irrigation District, the irrigation rate shall be seventeen shillings and sixpence per acre upon all irrigable land, provided that a minimum rate of not exceeding One pound per annum shall be payable on each separately assessed parcel of land.

20. Irrigation rates shall become due and payable yearly in advance on the first day of July in each year, provided that in all cases where a rate is made after the first day of July in any year, the notice of the order for the making and levying of such rate published in the *Government Gazette* and a newspaper as provided in Section 79 of "The Water Boards Act, 1904," shall specify the minimum sum payable as rate as aforesaid, and the date or dates when the rate shall be due and payable, and such rates shall be and become due and payable in accordance with the terms of such notice.

21. The Minister may refuse to supply water to any land upon which rates are unpaid.

DIVISION V.

*Penalties.*

22. Any person committing a breach of any of the foregoing By-laws or who shall refuse or neglect to obey any injunction in any such By-law, or to comply with any requirements therein contained, shall, upon conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20, and in the case of a continuing breach a further penalty not exceeding five pounds for each day the offence continues after notice has been given by or on behalf of the Minister to the offender.

## COURT OF ARBITRATION, WESTERN AUSTRALIA

No. 14 of 1915.

*Between South-West District (W.A.) Clothing Trades' Industrial Union of Workers, Applicant; and Adelaide Tailoring Company, D. Clercteko, Commercial Tailoring Company, Commonwealth West End Tailors, E. Berry, Parker & Company, Foy & Gibson Proprietary, Limited, Bon Marché, Limited, Boon Brothers, Oliver's Tailoring Company, G. R. Brown, G. B. Samuel, J. Healy, Angus McLeod, and J. Chilman, Respondents.*

The Court of Arbitration of Western Australia doth hereby make the following award in connection with the industrial dispute between the above-mentioned parties:—

## A W A R D.

1. *Scope of Award*: This award shall apply to employers and workers engaged in the making from personal measurement or from charts of the garments described and referred to in the log hereafter set out.

2. *Hours*: Forty-eight hours shall constitute a week's work. The hours shall be so arranged as to allow for half a day's work only on Saturday.

All time worked beyond the usual hours shall be deemed overtime, and shall be paid for at time and a quarter. Each day shall stand by itself.

3. *Distribution of Work*: There shall be a fair distribution of work among workers, both male and female, in each workshop by the employer. When there are several workshops used by an employer they shall be considered and included as one workshop for the purpose of this clause.

4. *Regulation of Outwork*: (a.) All work shall be done in workshops provided and controlled by the employer: Provided, that any employer may apply to the Chief Inspector of Factories for permission to give work out and such permission shall be granted on the Inspector being satisfied that the employer has not sufficient accommodation for the work to be done indoors, or that the person to whom it is proposed to give such work is unable to work on the employer's premises by reason of infirmity, old age, or domestic ties.

(b.) Persons doing outdoor work shall not employ labour except that of members of their own family resident with them.

(c.) Notice of all applications to the Inspector under this clause shall be given to the Secretary of the claimant union.

5. *Minimum Weekly Wage*: The minimum rate of wage payable under this award to workers (other than duly registered apprentices and probationers) working for a weekly wage shall be ascertained according to the following schedule:—

If any trouser and vest presser is employed for any period less than a week on coats, he shall be paid at the rate of 10s. per day, or 1s. 3d. per hour.

6. *Apprentices*: (a.) In this award a "duly registered apprentice" means an apprentice of whose apprenticeship notice has been given to the Clerk of the Court in accordance with the provisions of this clause; and a "duly registered probationer" means a person working as an apprentice on probation, of whose probationary period notice has been given to the clerk of the Court in accordance with the provisions of this clause. Provided that an apprentice or probationer shall be deemed to be duly registered during the period of fourteen days allowed for registration.

(b.) Any employer hereafter taking an apprentice or probationer shall, within fourteen days thereafter, register such apprentice or probationer, by giving notice thereof to the Clerk of the Court in the prescribed form.

(c.) If at the date of this award any employer is employing any person as an apprentice or a probationer who has not been duly registered as such, he shall register such apprentice or probationer within fourteen days thereafter.

(d.) Male apprentices shall not exceed in number one to every three journeymen, or fraction of three journeymen coat, vest, or trouser hands or machinists employed by each employer or firm of employers.

(e.) Female apprentices shall not exceed in number one to every two journeywomen or fraction of two journeywomen coat, vest or trouser hands, or machinists, employed by each employer, or firm of employers.

(f.) For the purpose of ascertaining the number of apprentices allowed to be taken at any time the number of journeymen employed shall be deemed to be the average number of journeymen employed for at least two-thirds of full time on all working days of the six months immediately preceding such time.

(g.) This award shall not operate to render unlawful or to vary the terms or provisions of any apprenticeship existing at the date of its commencement; and if upon such date the number of persons employed otherwise than as a fully paid journeyman or journeywoman by any employer exceeds the number of apprentices which such employer would be entitled to take under this award, such employer may continue to employ such persons, but shall not be entitled to take any further apprentices until the number of persons so employed shall fall below the number of apprentices he would be entitled to employ under the foregoing provisions of this award. All such persons shall be registered as apprentices within fourteen days after the date of this award.

(h.) The term of apprenticeship to coatmaking shall be five years; to vest-making, three years; to trouser-making, three years; to pressing, three years; to coat, trouser, and vest machining, three years. A probationary period previous to being bound shall be lawful in the case of coat apprentices of three months, and in the case of trouser or vest, or pressing or machining apprentices one month. Such probationary period shall be deemed part of the term of apprenticeship.

(i.) Should any employer from unforeseen circumstances be unable to carry out his obligations to his apprentice, he shall be allowed to transfer the apprentice to complete his term with another employer, but it shall be incumbent upon such former employer to notify the Clerk of the Court of Arbitration of the date of such transfer and when such apprenticeship commenced. (Form 2 in the Appendix hereto.)

(j.) The following provisions shall apply in respect of all apprenticeships:—

1. An employer shall be deemed to undertake the duty which he agrees to perform as a duty enforceable under this award and shall, subject to the provisions of subclause (g.) pay the apprentice the rate of wages herein provided.

2. At the end of the period of apprenticeship the employer shall give the apprentice a certificate (Form 5 in the Appendix hereto) to show that he has served his apprenticeship. Should the employer at any time before the termination of the term of apprenticeship desire, to dispense with the services of the apprentice he may, with the consent of the apprentice transfer him to another employer carrying on business within a reasonable distance of the original employer's place of business, willing to continue to teach the apprentice and to pay the rate of wages prescribed by this award, according to the total length of time served, and generally to perform the obligations of the original employer. He shall also give to the apprentice a certificate of the time served and of the rate of wages paid, and shall give notice to the Clerk of the Court of such transfer in the Form provided (Form 2 in the Appendix hereto). It shall not be obligatory upon the employer to find the apprentice another employer if he shall so misconduct himself as to entitle the employer to discharge him, but he shall nevertheless give him a certificate for the time actually served.

3. An employer shall be deemed to fail in his duty towards his apprentice if he neglects to keep him constantly at work, but slackness of work may form a proper ground for transferring him to a master willing to undertake the responsibility of teaching him.

4. When an apprentice is discharged for cause, the employer shall send notice, in writing of the discharge, and the cause thereof, to the said Clerk of the Court (Form 3 in the Appendix hereto).

(l.) An apprentice who after having served the full term of five years is under the age of twenty-one years may continue in his master's employment at less than a journeyman's minimum wage until the expiration of one year thereafter, or until he becomes twenty-one years of age, whichever first happens: Provided that during the first six months after the expiration of the apprenticeship term he shall be paid 45s. a week, and for the balance of the period 60s. a week.

(m.) Every apprentice shall be bound to submit himself to examination by a Board of Examiners hereinafter constituted once in each six months of his service when called upon by the Clerk of the Court so to do.

(n.) The Clerk of the Court shall notify the Board of Examiners of the names and addresses of all candidates required to submit themselves to examination. The examination will be held at the place where the apprentice is employed, and it shall be the duty of each employer to provide such necessary material and machinery as may be required and in all ways facilitate the conduct of the examination.

(o.) The examinations will be held in the months of January and July in each year. The Board of Examiners will consist of persons skilled in the particular class of the trade to which the candidate is apprenticed, to be nominated by the union and by the employers carrying on business within the area to which this award applies; or, failing such nomination, or nominations, such person, or persons, as may be appointed for that purpose by the Court. In the event of a disagreement between the examiners, the matter in dispute shall be referred to a third person agreed to by them, or nominated by the Court, or the President, at the request of either member, and the decision of such third person shall be final and conclusive. The examiners shall examine the work of and inquire into the diligence of each apprentice and as to the opportunities provided by the employer to each apprentice to learn.

(p.) The examiners shall report to the Court, in writing, as to the result of the examination.

(q.) The Clerk of the Court shall supply to each candidate a certificate showing the result of the examination, and it shall be lawful for any employer to withhold the increase in wages accruing, in accordance with the scale set forth in sub-clause (k) hereof, from any apprentice who fails to satisfy the examiners.

(r.) If the examiners report to the Court that any employer has not provided sufficient opportunity for the apprentice to learn, the employer shall be deemed *prima facie* guilty of a breach of this award under section 90 of the Act, and may be summoned before the Court. Upon any such proceeding the report may be received in evidence.

(s.) Such fees shall be paid by the clerk to the examiners as the Court shall allow.

7. *Under-rate Workers* : Any worker, who, by reason of old age or infirmity, is unable to earn the minimum wage may be paid such lesser wage as may from time to time be agreed upon in writing between the union and the employer, and in default of such agreement within twenty-four hours after such worker shall have applied in writing to the secretary of the union stating his desire that such wage should be agreed upon, such wage as shall be fixed by the most convenient resident or police magistrate upon the application of such worker after twenty-four hours' notice in writing shall have been given by him to the said secretary, who shall, if he so desires, be heard by the magistrate upon such application. After having given notice to the secretary, and after lodging the application mentioned, and pending the magistrate's decision thereon, the worker shall be entitled to work for and be employed at the proposed lesser rate. The determination of the magistrate shall have effect for the period of six calendar months from the date thereof, and after the expiration of the said period until the wage shall have been again fixed at the instance of the said secretary in the manner prescribed. The secretary of the union may, by writing under his hand, appoint an agent or substitute to represent the union at the hearing of the application before the magistrate.

8. *Record Book* : A time and wage book shall be kept by each employer in which book shall be entered the name of each worker paid by time, the nature of the work he is doing, the hours worked each day, and the amount of wage received by him or her each week. The employer shall be responsible for the proper posting of the book each week. The said book shall be open to the inspection of the secretary of the union during working hours.

9. *Piecework* : The minimum rates to be paid for piecework shall be calculated in accordance with the log annexed hereto.

10. Should any dispute arise as to the payment due under this award to any pieceworker, it shall be submitted to a Board consisting of the secretary of the employers' union and the secretary of the workers' union, who shall, if necessary, elect a chairman. In case the said secretaries fail to agree upon some person as chairman, the President of the Court will appoint a chairman.

11. *Area* : This award shall apply over the area comprised within a radius of twenty-five miles from the General Post Office, Perth.

12. *Term* : This award shall be binding upon the above-named applicant and respondents, and shall continue in force for a period of three years from its date: Provided that, at any time after the expiration of twelve months from its date the Court may alter or amend the same on the application of any party or person affected by its provisions.

## COURT OF ARBITRATION, WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

No. 5 of 1915.

*Between Amalgamated Society of Carpenters' and Joiners' Industrial Union of Workers (Perth Branch), Applicant, and Master Builders' and Contractors' Association; Timber Merchants' Association; J. Hawkins & Son; S. B. Alexander; C. Arnott; Millars' Timber and Trading Company, Limited; Whittaker Brothers; and Jones & Company, Respondents.*

The Court of Arbitration of Western Australia doth hereby make the following award in connection with the industrial dispute between the above-mentioned parties:—

## AWARD.

1. *Minimum Wage.*—The minimum rate of wage payable to a worker under this award other than a duly registered apprentice or probationer shall be 1s. 6d. per hour.
  2. *Country Work.*—Any worker sent by his employer to a job at such a distance that he cannot return to his home each night shall be paid 2s. per day extra, unless the employer shall provide board and lodging. All travelling not exceeding eight hours in any one day to and from the job shall be paid for at ordinary rates. The employer shall pay all fares.
  3. *Hours.*—Forty-eight hours shall constitute a week's work. The hours of work shall be so arranged as to provide for work to cease at noon on Saturday.
  4. *Overtime.*—The following rates shall be paid for work performed after the usual time for ceasing work:—
    - On the first five working days of the week—
      - Time and a-quarter for the first two hours;
      - Time and a-half after that up to 10 o'clock, p.m.; and
      - Double time thereafter until the usual starting time next morning.
    - On Saturday—
      - Time and a-quarter for the first two hours;
      - Time and a-half for the next four hours;
      - After that double time rate.
  5. *Holidays.*—All work performed on Sunday, New Year's Day, Good Friday, Eight Hours' Day, and Christmas Day shall be paid for at double time rate.
  6. *Travelling Time.*—All travelling time from and to the employer's place of business or from one job to another during the hours of work, shall be paid for by the employer at ordinary rates. The employer shall pay all fares in connection with such travelling.
  7. *Payment of Wages.*—When a worker is discharged at or before the usual pay time, he shall then be paid all wages due to him. Payment of wages to be made on or before Friday of each week.
  8. *Grinding Time.*—A worker upon being discharged or upon being ordered to stand by for two consecutive days, shall be allowed one hour's pay, or time equivalent, if he has been employed for six consecutive working days, and two hours' pay or time equivalent if he has been employed for twelve consecutive working days.
  9. *Leading Hand.*—A worker who has charge in a shop or on a job of four or more journeymen shall be considered a leading hand and shall be entitled to receive 1s. 6d. per day extra.
  10. *Safe Keeping of Tools.*—The employer shall provide a place for the storing and safe keeping of the workers' tools when not in use.
  11. *Appliances to be provided by Employer.*—The employer shall provide when required for the workers' use a grindstone, a saw clamp, and floor clamps.
  12. *Under-rate Workers.*—Any worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum wage may be paid such lesser wage as may from time to time be agreed upon in writing between the union and the employer, and in default of such agreement within twenty-four hours after such worker shall have applied in writing to the secretary of the union stating his desire that such wage should be agreed upon, such wage as shall be fixed by the most convenient resident or police magistrate upon the application of such worker, after twenty-four hours' notice in writing shall have been given by him to the said secretary, who shall, if he so desire, be heard by the magistrate upon such application.
- After having given notice to the secretary and after lodging the application mentioned, and pending the magistrate's decision thereon, the worker shall be entitled to work for and be employed at the proposed lesser rate. The determination of the magistrate shall have effect for the period of six calendar months from the date thereof, and after the expiration of the said period until the wage shall have been again fixed at the instance of the said secretary in the manner prescribed. The secretary of the union may by writing under his hand appoint an agent or substitute to represent the union at the hearing of the application before the magistrate.
13. *Record Book.*—The employer shall make and keep a record showing the name of each worker and the hours worked and the amount paid to each worker. Such records shall be signed by the worker and shall be open for inspection by the representative of the union during working hours.
  14. *Interviewing Workers.*—The secretary, or any duly authorised official of the union shall not be prevented by any employer from visiting and conversing with the members of the union on any job, or in any shop, during meal times.
  15. *Piecework.*—A worker employed on piecework shall be paid at least the minimum rate of wage.

16. *Apprentices* : (a.) In this award a "duly registered apprentice" means an apprentice of whose apprenticeship notice has been given to the Clerk of the Court in accordance with the provisions of this clause ; and a "duly registered probationer" means a person working as apprentice on probation, of whose probationary period notice has been given to the Clerk of the Court in accordance with the provisions of this Clause. Provided that an apprentice or probationer shall be deemed to be duly registered during the period of fourteen days allowed for registration.

(b.) Any employer hereafter taking an apprentice or probationer shall, within fourteen days thereafter, register such apprentice or probationer by giving notice thereof to the Clerk of the Court in the prescribed form.

(c.) If at the date of this award any employer is employing any person as an apprentice or a probationer who has not been duly registered as such, he shall register such apprentice or probationer within fourteen days thereafter.

(d.) The maximum number of apprentices allowed to any employer shall be in the proportion of one apprentice to every two or fraction of two journeymen employed by him.

(e.) For the purpose of ascertaining the number of apprentices allowed to be taken at any time the number of journeymen employed shall be deemed to be the average number of journeymen employed on all working days of the six months immediately preceding such time.

(f.) The term of apprenticeship shall be five years. A probationary period of three months previous to being bound shall be lawful. Such probationary period shall be deemed portion of the period of apprenticeship.

(g.) Should any employer from unforeseen circumstances be unable to carry out his obligations to his apprentice, he shall be allowed to transfer the apprentice to complete his term with another employer ; but it shall be incumbent upon such former employer to notify the Clerk of the Court of the date of such transfer and when such apprenticeship commenced. (Form 2 in Appendix hereto).

(h.) The following provisions shall apply in respect of all apprenticeships :—

(1.) An employer shall be deemed to undertake the duty which he agrees to perform as a duty enforceable under this award, and shall, subject to the provisions of sub-clause (o) pay the apprentice the rate of wages herein provided.

(2.) At the end of the period of apprenticeship the employer shall give the apprentice a certificate (Form 6 in the Appendix hereto) to show that he has served his apprenticeship. Should the employer at any time before the termination of the term of apprenticeship desire to dispense with the services of the apprentice, he may, with the consent of the apprentice, transfer him to another employer carrying on business within a reasonable distance of the original employer's place of business willing to continue to teach the apprentice and to pay the rate of wages prescribed by this award, according to the total length of time served, and generally to perform the obligations of the original employer. He shall also give to the apprentice a certificate of the time served, and of the rate of wages paid, and shall give notice to the Clerk of the Court of such transfer in the Form provided (Form 2 in the Appendix hereto). It shall not be obligatory upon the employer to find the apprentice another employer if he shall so misconduct himself as to entitle the employer to discharge him, but he shall nevertheless give him a certificate for the time actually served.

(3.) An employer shall be deemed to fail in his duty towards his apprentice if he neglects to keep him constantly at work, but slackness of work may form a proper ground for transferring him to a master willing to undertake the responsibility of teaching him.

(4.) When an apprentice is discharged for cause, the employer shall send notice, in writing, of the discharge and the cause thereof, to the said Clerk of the Court (Form 3 in Appendix hereto).

(i.) The minimum wage payable to an apprentice shall be :—

- During the first year of his term, 10s. per week.
- During the second year of his term, 15s. per week.
- During the third year of his term, 25s. per week.
- During the fourth year of his term, 35s. per week.
- During the fifth year of his term, 50s. per week.

(j.) Every apprentice shall be bound to submit himself to examination by a Board of Examiners hereinafter constituted once in each year of his service when called upon by the clerk of the Court so to do, and shall in each year of his apprenticeship attend at the Technical School the classes for instruction in the trade covered by this award.

(k.) The clerk of the Court shall notify the Board of Examiners of the names and addresses of all candidates required to submit themselves to examination. The examination will be held at such place as shall be from time to time appointed by the clerk of the Court, and it shall be the duty of each employer to supply such necessary material and machinery as may be required and in all ways facilitate the conduct of the examination.

(l.) The examination will be held in the month of November in each year. The Board of Examiners shall consist of one person skilled in the trade to be nominated by the workers' union, one person skilled in the trade to be nominated by the employers, and one person to be nominated by the Director of Education, or failing such nomination or nominations, such person or persons, as may be appointed for that purpose by the Court. The Examiners shall examine the work of and inquire into the diligence of each apprentice and as to the opportunities provided by the employer to each apprentice to learn.

(m.) The Examiners shall report to the Court, in writing, as to the result of the examination.

(n.) The clerk of the Court shall supply to each candidate the result of his examination, and it shall be lawful for any employer to withhold the increase in wages accruing in any year in accordance with the scale set forth in subclause (i) hereof from any apprentice who fails to satisfy the Examiners at the examination for that year referred to in subclause (l) or (until he has completed the carpentry course) fails to obtain from the Technical School a certificate that he has, during the year, passed an annual examination in carpentry at the school.

The employer shall pay the fees payable to the Technical School.

(o.) If the Examiners report to the Court that any employer has not provided sufficient opportunity for the apprentice to learn, the employer shall be deemed *prima facie* guilty of a breach of this award under Section 90 of the Act, and may be summoned before the Court. Upon any such proceeding the report may be received in evidence.

(p.) Such fees shall be paid by the clerk to the examiners as the Court shall allow.

17. *Area* : This award shall operate over the area comprised within a radius of fourteen miles from the General Post Office in the City of Perth.

18. *Term* : The currency of this award shall be three years : Provided, that at any time after the expiration of twelve months from its date the Court may alter or amend the same on the application of any party or person affected by its provisions.
