Applicants outside the Public Service are eligible for appointment to the Administrative and Professional Divisions, but are not eligible for appointment to Clerical or General Division vacancies unless they were in the service of a State on 1st January, 1901, or have retired from the service of the Commonwealth or of a State.

Applicants who are officers of the Public Service of a State should state the date of their appointment to the service, present position, and salary.

Applicants from outside the service should state their qualifications for the office they seek. Copies only of diplomas, references, testimonials, or certificates should be forwarded. If the originals are required they will be asked for.

Date and year of birth should be stated, and applications must be in applicants' hand-writing.

Applications should be addressed to the "Commonwealth Public Service Inspector" of the State in which the vacancy exists, and in the case of officers of the Commonwealth Service be forwarded through the chief officer of the department to which the applicant belongs.

Minimum and maximum salaries, where shown, indicate the limits of the class or grade in which the position is classified. Subject to the provisions of the Public Service Act, appointments may be made at any salary within those limits. Successful appointees must comply with the life assurance provisions of the Public Service Act and Regulations.

COURT OF ARBITRATION, WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

No. 10 of 1915.

Between the Coastal and Eastern Goldfields Government Water, Sewerage, and Drainage Employees' Industrial Union of Workers, Applicant, and the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage, Respondent.

The Court of Arbitration of Western Australia doth hereby make the following award in connection with the industrial dispute between the above-mentioned parties.

AWARD.

1. *Scope of Award.*—This award shall apply to the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage, and to the workers employed on sewerage construction.

2. *Definitions.*—“*Shaft*” means any hole sunk for the purpose of opening up a drive or tunnel, but does not include work known as “cut and cover.”

“*Miner*” means any worker employed in a shaft or tunnel sinking or driving, and includes a worker excavating in rock where explosives are used, and also a worker engaged using hammer and drill or employed breaking through between open cuts.

“*Timberman*” means a worker who hangs centres and fixes sets and poles off laths, lays keels, fixes frames or lays decking, or who is employed handling timber in shafts when buildings are being under-pinned.

“*Concretor*” means a worker engaged filling the gauge, mixing on the board, wheeling from the board, or packing concrete.

“*Trowel Hand*” or “*Renderer*” means a worker who lays and finishes concrete floors in w.c.s., stables, and concrete work in and about house connections, and drains and sewers.

“*Packer*” means a worker who packs sand or other material in a drive or tunnel.

“*Timber cutter*” means a worker employed cutting piles, laths, keels, and sets.

“*Pipe setter*” means a worker who sets Monier or stoneware pipes.

“*Pipe jointer*” means a worker who joints Monier or stoneware pipes.

A “*boy*” means a worker under the age of 18 years.

“*Wet ground*” means ground in which, in the opinion of the engineer, it is impracticable for workers to work without getting wet feet.

3. *Wages.*—The minimum rates of wages payable under this award to workers (other than boys) shall be ascertained according to the following schedule :—

4. *Hours.*—Watchmen shall work seven shifts as required between the hours of 5 p.m. and 7.30 a.m.

Miners when employed in shafts, drives, and tunnels shall work forty-seven hours per week inclusive of crib time, which shall be twenty minutes per day.

All other workers shall work forty-eight hours per week.

When single shifts are worked, such hours shall be between 7.30 a.m. and 5 p.m. on week-days other than Saturday, on which day work shall cease at noon.

5. *Overtime*.—For all overtime worked on ordinary working days from 5 p.m. to 8 p.m., time and a-quarter rates shall be paid; from 8 p.m. to midnight, time and a-half; and from midnight to 7.30 a.m. double time.

For all work done on the days specified in the next paragraph, workers shall be entitled to extra pay at ordinary rates.

6. *Holidays*.—The following days shall be regarded as holidays and paid for:—Christmas Day, New Year's Day, Boxing Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, and Eight Hours' Day.

7. *Change of Grade*.—Any worker called upon to perform work in a grade lower than the rate at which he is usually employed shall suffer no reduction in wages, unless he is continuously employed in such lower grade for over 16 hours.

Any worker being called upon to perform work in a higher grade than that in which he is usually employed shall be paid for the whole day, at the mean of the two rates, unless employed continuously for over four hours, when he shall be paid the higher rate.

8. *Allowances, etc.*—Workers employed in offensive work, in connection with old sewers, shall be paid time and a-quarter rates. Any worker working in wet ground shall be paid one shilling per day extra. Workers working over six feet from the surface in trenches shall receive an extra sixpence per day from the time timber is stood.

A change house shall be erected on any job where it is reasonably required for the convenience of workers.

9. *Area*.—This award shall operate over the area covered by the Metropolitan Water Supply and Drainage Act, 1909.

10. *Term*.—This award shall be binding upon the above-named applicant and respondent, and shall remain in force for three years from its date: Provided that, at any time after the expiration of 12 months from the date hereof, the Court may alter or amend the same on the application of any party or person affected by its provisions.
