WHEREAS by "The Plant Diseases Act, 1914," it is provided that the Governor may by Proclamation revoke or vary any Proclamation made under the said Act: And whereas it is also provided by the said Act that the Governor may by Proclamation prohibit, either absolutely or except in accordance with regulations,

the bringing into Western Australia, either generally or from any specified State, country, or place, of any specified plant which in his opinion is likely to introduce any disease into Western Australia: And whereas in the opinion of His Excellency the Governor and of the Executive Council, the bringing into Western Australia of potatoes infected with any of the diseases described in the Schedule hereto is likely to introduce and spread such disease in Western Australia: Now, therefore, I, the said Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke the Proclamation made under the said Act, numbered 4, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 22nd day of January, 1915, and I do hereby prohibit absolutely the bringing into Western Australia from the States of New South Wales, Victoria, South Australia, and Tasmania, and any other country or place whatsoever, of any potatoes infected with any of the diseases described in the Schedule hereto.

WHEREAS by Sections 222 and 227 of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906" (6 Edwardi, No. 32), it shall be lawful for the Governor, on request of the Council, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street or way, or any place, bridge, or thoroughfare, to be a public highway, and such land shall thereupon and thenceforth, from the date of such Proclamation, become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force.

And whereas the Perth Municipal Council has requested that certain land named and described in the Schedule hereunder which have been dedicated for streets or ways within the Municipality of Perth, be declared public highways: Now therefore I, the said Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation declare the said land to be public highways, and such lands shall, from the date of this Proclamation, be absolutely dedicated to the public as highways within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force.

WHEREAS by "The Plant Diseases Act, 1914," it is provided that the Governor may, by Proclamation, revoke or vary any Proclamation made under the said Act: And whereas it is also provided by the said Act that the Governor may, by Proclamation—

- Prohibit the bringing into the State either generally or from any specified State, country, or place; or
- Prohibit the bringing into any specified portion of the State, from the rest of the State generally, or from any specified portion thereof,

of all or any of the things following, that is to say:—

- Any specified kind of plant, fruit, or other thing which would in his opinion be likely to introduce any disease into the State or into the specified portion thereof, as the case may be;

- All or any coverings or goods in or with which any plant, fruit, or thing of the kind specified has been contained or packed or come in contact;
- Anything which is infected or anything which is infected with any specified disease:

And whereas it is also provided by the said Act that the Governor may, by Proclamation—

- Appoint any specified ports to be the only ports of entry for plants or fruit, or for any specified kind of plants or fruit;
- Prohibit the use, storage, or carriage within the State or within any specified portion of the State of coverings in or with which any specified plant or fruit has been contained or packed or come in contact:

And whereas, in the opinion of His Excellency the Governor and of the Executive Council, the bringing into Western Australia of potatoes, and of second-hand bags used for the carriage of potatoes, from any of the other States of the Commonwealth is likely to introduce and spread in Western Australia the following diseases, namely:—

Bacillus solanacearum (Brown Rot or Potato Bacteriosis).

Chrysophlyctis endobiotica (known as Potato Canker, Black Scab, Warty Disease, and Cauliflower Disease of Potato).

Fusarium, spp. (Collar Rot, Foot Rot, Leaf Spot, Dry Rot of Potato).

Potato Scab, whether caused by Fungi, Bacteria, or Insects, or by any animal whatever.

Phytophthora Infestans (Potato Disease, otherwise known as Irish Blight).

Anguillulidae, spp. (Eelworms).

Lia Solanella (Potato Moth).

Doryphora decem-lineata (Colorado Potato Beetle).

And whereas it is therefore deemed by His Excellency the Governor necessary and expedient to prohibit, except as hereinafter provided, the introduction into Western Australia of potatoes from the State of Queensland, and to restrict and regulate by regulations made as aforesaid the introduction of potatoes from the States of New South Wales, Victoria, South Australia, and Tasmania; and to prohibit the introduction into Western Australia of second-hand potato bags, and to prohibit the introduction of potatoes and second-hand potato bags into that portion of Western Australia described in the Schedule hereto from any other portion of Western Australia: And whereas, to enable the regulations made or to be made under the said Act for the inspection of imported potatoes to be carried into effect, it is necessary to appoint certain ports to be the only ports of entry for potatoes: Now therefore I, the said Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke the Proclamation made under the said Act, numbered 5, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 22nd day of January, 1915, and I do hereby, except as hereinafter provided:—

- Prohibit absolutely the bringing into Western Australia of any potatoes the product of, or directly or indirectly from, the State of Queensland;
- Prohibit the bringing into Western Australia of any potatoes the product of, or directly or indirectly from, the States of New South Wales, Victoria, South Australia, or Tasmania, except in accordance with the Plant Diseases (Potato) Regulations, 1916;
- Appoint the following ports, namely, the ports of Eucla, Fremantle, Perth, and Geraldton, and all ports North of Geraldton, to be the only ports of entry for potatoes, and prohibit the bringing of potatoes into Western Australia at any other port or place;
- Prohibit absolutely the bringing into that portion of Western Australia specified in the Schedule hereto, from any other portion of Western Australia of any potatoes or second-hand potato bags:

Provided that seed potatoes, the property of the Department of Agriculture, may be brought into the area described in the Schedule hereto, with the consent, in writing, of the Minister of Agriculture. And I, the said Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council as aforesaid, do hereby prohibit the introduction into Western Australia from the States of

New South Wales, Victoria, South Australia, Queensland, and Tasmania, of second-hand potato bags, either empty or containing goods.

Schedule.

All that portion of Western Australia situate Southward and Westward of lines starting from Point John, near Cape Peron, and extending Easterly along the shores of Mangles Bay to the terminus of the Rockingham-Jarrahdale Railway; thence Easterly along the said railway, but excluding Mundijong townsite; thence to the South boundary of Wagin townsite; thence Easterly to the No. 1 Rabbit-proof Fence to the latitude of to the South boundary of Wagin townsite, thence East-a point situate North from the cairn on Howick Hill, and thence South to the sea-coast to exclude Williams and Wagin townsites.

REGULATIONS.

HIS Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby (under "The Plant Diseases Act, 1914"), make the regulations set forth in the Schedule hereto, and doth hereby declare that the said Regulations shall come into force on the publication of this Order in the *Government Gazette*.

SCHEDULE.

Regulations.

1. All potatoes imported pursuant to the exception contained in the Proclamation made this day under "The Plant Diseases Act, 1914," must be in new and sound bags with the full name and address of the grower of the potatoes *stencilled* thereon in not less than two-inch letters (not written), and the word "Potatoes" legibly *stencilled* thereon in letters not less than four inches long. If seed potatoes, the word "Seed" must be stencilled above the word potatoes.

2. All such potatoes aforesaid shall have been inspected at the port of export by a competent officer duly appointed by the Department of Agriculture of the exporting State, and be accompanied by the following certificate:—

"I hereby certify that I have duly inspected the below-mentioned.....potatoes, and have found them to be, to the best of my knowledge, clean and free from any disease mentioned in the note endorsed hereon:—

3. All potatoes imported into Western Australia under the conditions aforesaid shall be again inspected in Fremantle, or at any other approved place of entry, by an Inspector of the Western Australia Department of Agriculture, and, if found to be free from all the diseases mentioned in the said proclamation, may be removed therefrom on payment of inspection fees as prescribed in Regulation No. 8.

4. In the event of any of the said diseases being found in any stage of development on any part of a consignment, the whole of such consignment shall be condemned by the Inspector in Fremantle or other place of entry, and no part of such consignment shall be allowed to be removed from the wharf or other place of entry; but the whole consignment shall be forthwith reshipped to a place or port beyond Western Australia, and if not so shipped will be destroyed by the Inspector at the expense of the consignee.

Provided that—

(a.) Potatoes found upon inspection at Fremantle or other approved place of entry to be only slightly affected by any of the said diseases other than Irish Blight, Eelworm, or Black Scab may be re-sorted under the supervision of an Inspector, if in the opinion of the officer in charge of the inspection work it is advisable to do so.

(b.) When sorted potatoes which are free from disease may be disposed of for consumption, the diseased portion of the consignment shall be reshipped from the State of Western Australia or destroyed at the expense of the consignee as soon as directed by an Inspector.

(c.) A fee at the rate of two shillings (2s.) per hour shall be paid by the consignee to the Department of Agriculture to cover the cost of supervising the work of re-sorting.

Provided also, that if the introduction of such potatoes into Western Australia was in contravention of any Proclamation under the aforesaid Act for the time being in force, then the said potatoes may be dealt with as provided in the said Act.

5. The potatoes on arrival at the port of entry shall, at the expense of the importer, be delivered direct into a shed set apart by the Department of Agriculture, for inspection, and such other treatment as may be decided upon from time to time by the inspector.

6. The importer or his agent shall, at the importer's expense, provide the necessary labour to open the bags, and to re-bag the potatoes, on inspection, and in every way facilitate the inspection.

7. Any consignment of potatoes being or having been in contact with any diseased or prohibited consignment of potatoes may be destroyed, disinfected, or otherwise dealt with, at the expense of the importer, as the inspector may direct.

8. A fee of two shillings and sixpence for every ton or portion of a ton of imported potatoes shall be charged to defray the cost of inspection and of carrying these Regulations into effect.

9. Potatoes imported as ware shall not be sold as seed potatoes.

10. Bags that have contained potatoes from any other State shall not be used in any way for West Australian produce. If so used the bags and contents of same shall be confiscated.

11. Seed and other potatoes are prohibited from being sent by parcels post, except in accordance with these regulations. (See "Post Office Guide," Folio 74.)

12. If any importer or his agent fails or neglects to observe these Regulations, or to carry out the requirements of any inspector aforesaid, the inspector may destroy the potatoes or perform the work at the expense in all things of the importer.

13. The Regulations made on the 8th day of April, 1914, under "The Insect Pests Amendment Act, 1898," and the amendments thereof, and "The Plant Diseases (Potato) Regulations," made on the 13th day of January, 1915, and the amendments thereof, are annulled subject to such and the like savings as apply in the case of the repeal of a Statute.

14. These Regulations may be cited as the Plant Diseases (Potato) Regulations, 1916.

WHEREAS by "The Abattoirs Act, 1909," it is provided that the said Act shall be in force only in such portions of the State as the Governor may from time to time by proclamation declare to be districts for the purposes of the said Act: And whereas by a proclamation, published in the *Government Gazette* on the 26th day of March, 1915, that portion of the State bounded by a circle described from the Post Office at Midland Junction as its centre with a radius of 12 miles was constituted a district for the purposes of the said Act: And whereas it is desirable that the area of such district should be extended as hereinafter provided: Now therefore I, the said Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council do hereby proclaim and declare that all that portion of the State of Western Australia comprised within a circle described from the South-West corner of Lot 139 of Swan Location 7, Section B, at Midland Junction (Post Office Site) as its centre, with a radius of 12 miles, and all that portion of the said State comprised within a circle described from the North-West corner of Lot 1 of Cockburn Sound Location 5 (as delineated on Plan 2513, deposited in the office of Land Titles) as its centre with a radius of 11 miles, shall together be a district for the purposes of the said Act, and shall be known as the Metropolitan District, and the said Act and the regulations thereunder shall be in force in such district accordingly.

REGULATIONS.

Department of Agriculture,
Perth, 2nd June, 1916.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to make the following regulations under "The Abattoirs Act, 1909."

THE ABATTOIRS ACT, 1909.

Regulations.

1. These Regulations shall be in force in the Metropolitan District as declared by Proclamation published

in the *Government Gazette* on the 2nd day of June, 1916.

2. In these Regulations—

"Abattoir" means the Government Abattoir at Midland Junction, North Fremantle, or South Fremantle, as the case may be.

"Officer-in-Charge" means the person for the time being in charge of and responsible for the management of an abattoir.

"Slaughterman" includes attendant or assistant to a slaughterman.

"Stock" means and includes cattle, calves, sheep, lambs, goats, and swine.

Officer-in-Charge.

3. It shall be the duty of the Officer-in-Charge—

(a.) To control and direct the working of the abattoir to which he is appointed, under the direction of the Controller of Abattoirs.

(b.) To see that the provisions of "The Abattoirs Act, 1909," and the Regulations thereunder are duly observed and complied with, and if necessary to enforce the same.

(c.) To collect and recover all prescribed fees and charges.

(d.) To keep such books of account and records, and do and perform such other acts, matters and things in relation to the abattoir as shall from time to time be prescribed or required by the Minister to be done or performed.

Register of Employees.

4. All employees shall enter their names on the register kept by the officer-in-charge, and shall observe and comply with the rules of the establishment.

Hours of business.

5. Except as otherwise notified at the abattoir and by advertisement in a newspaper circulating in the district, the abattoir shall be open for work on every week-day except Saturday, between the hours of 8 a.m. and 8 p.m., and on Saturday between the hours of 8 a.m. and 12 noon, except on holidays observed at the abattoir; but an abattoir may be open for work on a holiday, or at any other than the usual working hours, if the officer-in-charge shall so direct.

Delivery at abattoir.

6. Stock shall be delivered to the officer-in-charge at the gates of the abattoir, with the owners' tar-brand on such stock in letters not less than four inches in length, except in the case of pigs, which shall be earmarked, such brand and earmark to be approved by the officer-in-charge.

A delivery note stating the name and address of owner, the number and kind of stock, the brand or earmark and the date of delivery, signed by the owner or his agent, shall be handed to the officer-in-charge.

Retention.

7. The officer-in-charge may refuse to allow stock to occupy the abattoir pens or small yards attached thereto for a longer period than 24 hours before the slaughter.

Slaughter of stock.

8. Notice in writing must be given by the owner of stock at the abattoir, or his agent, to the officer-in-charge of all slaughtering intended or required in respect of each day, not later than 5.30 o'clock p.m. on the next preceding week-day, or, if such day be Saturday, not later than 11 o'clock a.m.

No such stock shall be slaughtered if the notice required by this regulation shall not have been duly given, unless in special circumstances the officer-in-charge otherwise orders.

9. No stock shall be slaughtered otherwise than at such time, in such order, in such pens, and in such manner as the officer-in-charge may, verbally or in writing, direct.

10. If an owner or his agent delivers stock at the abattoir for slaughter by slaughtermen employed and paid by him, the stock must be slaughtered, dressed, and removed from the killing pen within such time as is allowed by the officer-in-charge for the use thereof, and a sufficient number of slaughtermen must be provided by the owner to kill, dress, and remove within the time allowed.

The killing and dressing pens must be left clean and fit for work, and all carcasses shall be taken from the rails, and all offal and viscera removed forthwith.

If a killing and dressing pen is not vacated within the time allowed by the officer-in-charge for the use thereof as aforesaid, there shall be payable by the person on whose behalf the killing pen is used or occupied after the time allowed as aforesaid, a charge at the rate of five pounds per hour for the use of each killing pen for cattle, and at the rate of five pounds per hour for the use of the space allotted to him for the slaughter and dressing of sheep, in lieu of the prescribed fees per head of stock slaughtered.

11. All carcasses and all offal, except such offal as under Regulation No 13, paragraph (2) (a) is the property of the Government, must be removed from the abattoir within eight hours after slaughter, and a receipt for the same signed by the owner or his agent shall be given.

If scale A or C of Regulation 13 applies, delivery will be made at the abattoir siding by the Government employees.

If any carcass is not removed from the abattoir or delivery thereof taken by the owner or his agent within eight hours after slaughter, a storage charge of one shilling per quarter of beef, and one shilling per carcass of other animals, per day or portion thereof, shall be payable by the owner, but the officer-in-charge may, if he thinks fit, cause the carcass to be sold, and in such case the proceeds, after deducting all abattoir charges and the cost of sale, shall be held on account of the owner.

12. When stock is slaughtered subject to the condition that the viscera and offal are claimed by the owner, all viscera and offal, except such as under Regulation 11 is removed or delivered with the carcass, must be removed by the owner from the abattoir as directed by the officer-in-charge, and, if not so removed, may be forfeited, and the owner shall have no claim in respect thereof.

Fees and charges.

13. (1.) The fees and charges set out in the following Scales A, B, and C shall be paid by and collected from all owners of stock for the use of the abattoir.

(2.) The charges in Scales A and C are fixed on the following conditions, which shall have effect:—

(a.) That the blood of all slaughtered animals, and all viscera and offal (except as hereinafter provided) shall be the property of the Government.

Such viscera and offal shall be deemed to include—

- (i.) the horns, reed fat, heart fat, stickings, trimmings, tripe trimmings, hair tips, guts, gut fat, scalp and lungs of all cattle;
- (ii.) the trotters, caul fat and lungs, and all viscera (except the fry) of sheep, lambs and goats;
- (iii.) all viscera (except the pluck) of pigs.

(b.) That the head, feet, tail, heart, liver, tripe, and caul fat of cattle, and the fry of sheep, lambs, and goats, and the pluck of pigs shall be the property of the owner, if removed within eight hours after slaughter, but, if not so removed, the same shall be the property of the Government, without compensation to or redress by the owner.

(3.) The charges in Scales A and B shall apply when stock are slaughtered and the carcasses flayed, dressed and cleaned by slaughtermen employed and paid by the owner.

The charges in Scale B shall apply if all viscera and offal are claimed by the owner.

The charges in Scale C shall apply when stock are slaughtered and the carcasses flayed, dressed and cleaned by Government employees.

The blood of all slaughtered animals shall be the property of the Government.

If any stock is, at the request of the owner, slaughtered on a holiday, or at any time other than during the usual working hours, double the amount of the charges prescribed by the foregoing scales shall be payable.

(4.) The following charges shall be payable by the owner in respect of all stock brought in for slaughter from the saleyards or elsewhere while such stock are awaiting slaughter:—

Cattle, calves, and pigs—1d. per head per day.
 Sheep, lambs, and goats—1d. per score or part thereof per day.

No charge will be made for the first 24 hours.

(5.) The following charges shall be payable by the owner for the supply of food and water, pending slaughter, to such stock as shall not be fed and watered by the owner, namely:—

Cattle (including calves)—1s. 6d. per head per day or part of a day.

Sheep, lambs, and goats—2d. per head per day or part of a day.

Pigs—6d. per head per day or part of a day.

14. All fees must be paid before delivery of the carcass in respect of which the same shall be due.

Condemned carcasses.

15. Any stock condemned by an inspector as being diseased, and any carcass found on slaughter to be subject to disease and condemned on inspection as unfit for human food, shall be confiscated by the officer-in-charge.

The owner of any stock or carcass so confiscated shall be paid at the rate of 3s. for every 100lbs. (dead weight) as compensation for such confiscation, less the prescribed charge for slaughter. The hide or skin, if not condemned, may be claimed by the owner.

Dead animals.

16. Dead animals brought into the abattoir from the saleyards or elsewhere shall be skinned and the carcasses retained by the Officer-in-Charge as the property of the Government. The skins and hides of such animals (if marketable) shall be delivered to the owner (if claimed within three days) upon payment by him of the following charges for skinning:—

Cattle, 4s. per head.
Sheep, 1s. per head.

Hides and skins.

17. All hides and skins must be removed by the owners or their agents from the abattoir as directed by the Officer-in-charge.

Delivery of hides and skins will be made at the platform of the abattoir in the presence of the owner or his agent, and no complaint regarding tally or condition of skin will be considered after such hides and skins have been taken away from the platform.

Owners are held responsible that the marks of ownership on the live animal shall be readily and easily identified on each hide or skin.

A metal disc with owner's brand or mark will be attached to any hide or skin before removal from the carcass, such disc to be supplied by the owner. Such brand or mark shall be registered with the Officer-in-charge on delivery of the stock for slaughter.

Hides will be salted, and skins will be dried, so far as practicable, if Scale A or C of regulation No. 13 applies.

If Scale B applies, hides and skins will be salted or dried, if so desired by the owner, at a charge of one shilling per hide, and three-pence per skin.

Any statutory provision or regulation relating to tick must be observed.

Prohibition of slaughter except at abattoir.

18. No stock shall be slaughtered within the Metropolitan District as declared by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* on the 2nd day of June, 1916, except at an abattoir established under "The Abattoirs Act, 1909."

Repeal.

19. The regulations under "The Abattoirs Act 1909," published in the *Government Gazette* on the 3rd April, 1914, and the 13th November, 1914, are hereby repealed.

ABATTOIR SALE YARDS.

Regulations.

1. These regulations shall have effect in the Government Sale-yards at the Midland Junction, North Fremantle, and South Fremantle Abattoirs.

2. The sale-yards shall be under the management and control of an officer of the Department of Agriculture and Industries, to be known as the Officer-in-Charge.

3. The sale-yards shall be open for the reception, sale, and delivery of cattle and other live stock on every week-day (not being a public holiday) between the hours of six a.m. and six p.m., and no person shall carry on business in the sale-yards at any other time, except with the special permission of the Officer-in-Charge.

4. The Officer-in-Charge shall have the power to reject or exclude any animal or animals from the sale-yards.

5. No person shall be admitted to the sale-yards as a stock agent unless licensed by the Minister for Agriculture. The annual fee for every stock agent's license shall be £1 ls. A license issued to a firm or company shall entitle any member or representative thereof to the privileges of the license.

6. All stock brought to the sale-yard shall be in the care of the stock agent, to whom the same may be consigned, and the Government will not be responsible for any injury to or for the death or escape of any such stock.

7. Every stock agent placing stock in the sale-yard, and the owner of all stock brought into the sale-yard, shall be responsible for the handling thereof, and for tolls and charges payable in respect thereof. No live stock shall be removed from the sale-yard until the fees and charges are paid.

8. Every person bringing live stock into the sale-yard shall supply such stock with sufficient food and water.

9. No live stock shall be sold privately in a sale-yard.

10. No calves or pigs will be allowed to be removed from the pen until the sales of calves and pigs are ended.

11. Stock agents will be held responsible for the speedy removal from the stock-yard of any sick or dead animal. No dead animal will be permitted to remain within the stock-yard for more than four hours.

12. A stock agent's license may be revoked if these regulations are not duly observed by him.

13. The sale-yard or portion thereof may be hired for the sale of hides and skins, or for the special sale of stud stock, or any product or thing connected with the stock industry, by arrangement with the Officer-in-Charge.

14. The Officer-in-Charge shall determine, in such manner as he may think fit, the order in which sales of stock by stock agents using the sale-yards shall be conducted.

15. The following tolls or dues shall be demanded, paid, and taken at the sale-yards for all stock sold or exposed for sale therein:

For every horse, mare, gelding, foal, ass, or mule—
one shilling.

For every head of meat cattle—sixpence.

For every sheep, lamb, or goat—three farthings.

For every pig—twopence.

16. The following charges will be levied on stock remaining in a sale yard on any day other than ordinary sale days:—

For every horse, mare, gelding, foal, ass, or mule—
sixpence per day.

For every head of neat cattle—fourpence per day.

For every pig—one penny per day.

For sheep, lambs, or goats, per score or portion thereof—twopence per day.

IT is hereby notified, for general information, that His Excellency the Governor in Council has approved of the attached By-laws of the Queen's Park Road Board, in accordance with Section 179 of "The Roads Act, 1911."

QUEEN'S PARK DISTRICT ROAD BOARD.

By-laws of the Queen's Park Road Board.

WHEREAS by "The Roads Act, 1911," the Road Board of any District is empowered to make By-laws for all or any purposes in the said Act mentioned, the Queen's Park Road Board, in pursuance of the powers vested in the said Board under and by virtue of the said Act and of every other authority enabling it in that behalf, doth hereby make and publish the following By-laws:—

Interpretations.

1. In these By-laws the interpretations set out in the Roads Act shall apply, in addition to which the following terms shall, unless the context otherwise indicates, bear the meaning set against them, in the Roads Act, or respectively, that is to say:—

"The Act"—"The Roads Act, 1911," and all amendments thereto which may hereafter come into force.

"Board"—The Queen's Park Road Board.

"Board Room" shall be the office, hall, or building in which the meeting of the Board is held from time to time.

"Cycle"—A bicycle, tricycle, or other velocipede.

"Cyclist"—Any person riding, impelling, or otherwise using or having the management or control of any cycle.

"District"—The District under the jurisdiction of the Queen's Park Road Board.

"Footpath" or "Footway" shall include any part of a street set apart for the sole use of foot passengers, and whether the same be made or kerbed or otherwise.

"Motorist"—Any person impelling or otherwise using or having the management or control of any motor car, wagon, or carrier.

"Secretary"—The Secretary of the Board.

All other interpretations to be as prescribed in the Roads Act or other Acts or regulations thereunder.

Duties of Secretary.

2. The duties of the Secretary shall be:—

- (a.) To attend all Board meetings.
- (b.) To attend all Committee meetings.
- (c.) To take notes of minutes and prepare reports of Committees.
- (d.) Conduct all correspondence, and to give the other officers instructions as directed by the minutes.
- (e.) Answer all questions on the Board's business.
- (f.) See that the accounts are audited once a year, and the balance sheets prepared and published yearly in the *Government Gazette*, and any other duties specified under the Roads Act.
- (g.) Prepare and place before the Board the quarterly financial statement at the end of each quarter of the financial year, and enter the same on the minutes as required by the Act.
- (h.) Supervise the preparation of the rate-books and the Board's electoral lists; to examine proof of the latter, and to arrange for the distribution of copies prior to elections; also to attend all courts of revision or appeal; to make the necessary arrangements for the elections; to issue instructions to the supervisor in accordance with the Board's resolution.
- (i.) Summon the members to Board and Committee meetings.
- (j.) Keep all books entered up to date in accordance with instructions issued by the Minister, and additional instructions of Board.
- (k.) Check all accounts sent into the Board, and see all accounts for works have stated in them the authority under which such works have

been done, and to check all returns made by the Collector or other of the Board's officers, and see that the counterfoils of the receipt book accompany all returns; to supervise and attend to the due payment of all moneys coming through the hands of the Board's officers and payable to the credit of the Board.

- (l.) Report to the Board at its next meeting any officer neglecting to make his returns as provided, with the necessary vouchers attached thereto.
- (m.) To pay into the bank after receipt, to the credit of the Board, all moneys received by him on behalf of the Board when such moneys shall amount in the aggregate to the sum of £5 or over, with the exception of moneys granted by the Government which are paid into Treasury book.
- (n.) No money shall be paid into the bank to the credit of the Board by any officer of the Board except by or through the Secretary, as directed by the Board, and the Secretary shall give all receipts on printed forms.
- (o.) Readily and cheerfully obey all lawful commands or orders of the Board, and to attend to all other matters affecting the finances and welfare of the Board and not herein specified.
- (p.) See that all bonds and other forms of security to be taken from the contractors are prepared, and that the security required of servants is taken within due time, and report as to such matters to the Board.
- (q.) Report to the Chairman any servant of the Board who has been guilty of any neglect of duty or who is incapable of performing the duties allotted to him.
- (r.) Exercise, subject to any directions given by the Board or Chairman, control over all servants of the Board.

Appointment of Officers.

3. No permanent appointment shall be made to any office under the Board until after an advertisement has been published in one or more local newspapers calling for applications from persons competent to fill such an appointment. All appointments shall be made by resolution passed by the Board. In the event of there being more than one applicant for such appointment, the election thereto shall be conducted by ballot so as to obtain an absolute majority of the members present.

4. The election of all other officers shall be conducted by a show of hands, unless a ballot be demanded, in which case the procedure in the foregoing By-law shall be followed.

5. The salary or allowance attached to the office under consideration of the Board shall be fixed in all cases preceding the election, and the salary of any officer when fixed shall not at any time be considered with a view to its increase or reduction unless specially authorised by a meeting of the Board, at which at least five of the members are present.

6. All complaints against servants of the Board must be in writing, and must in every case be signed by the person or persons complaining, and no notice whatever shall be taken of any complaint not made in accordance with this By-law. All such complaints as are receivable may be addressed to the Chairman, who, upon the receipt of such complaints, shall have power to investigate the same, and he shall report thereon to the Board at their next meeting.

Meetings and Proceedings.

7. Notice shall be given in writing by the Chairman or Secretary of ordinary or regular meetings, and also of every meeting adjourned for a term exceeding six days.

8. Meetings of the Board shall be of two kinds—"Ordinary" and "Special." Ordinary meetings are the regular meetings held in pursuance of these By-laws for the transaction of the general business of the Board, including meetings adjourned for the purpose of any incomplete business, but an adjourned meeting would not exclude any business which was considered necessary to transact. Special meetings are those called under Section 123 of the Act, and shall include those called by the Chairman in response to a requisition signed by three members on his own behalf, and the notices for such special meetings shall have such special business notified thereon for which the meeting was

called, and for which each member shall receive seven days' notice. No other business shall be transacted at a special meeting other than that for which the special meeting was called, provided that any matter of emergency can be discussed, with the ruling of the Chairman and the consent of those present. The ratepayers' meeting shall consist of one called under Section 136 of the Roads Act, and the standing orders shall, so far as the Act allows, apply to the proceedings, but the provisions of the Act shall be first dealt with. The Chairman, if present, shall preside at all meetings of ratepayers and of the Board, and in his absence, or after being present he shall retire, one of the members of the Board chosen by the ratepayers or members of the Board, as the case may be, shall preside.

9. Ordinary meetings shall be held at the office of the Board, at Queen's Park, on alternate Mondays, at 7.45 p.m., unless otherwise arranged by resolution carried to that effect at the preceding ordinary meeting of the Board, of which each member has received due notice of the proposed alteration.

10. A special meeting may, on the requisition of three members of the Board, be called at any time in the manner prescribed by the Act, but the Chairman may call a special meeting of the Board as often as he may think proper. No business will be transacted at any ordinary or special meeting unless at least three members of the Board, inclusive of the Chairman or the member of the Board chosen to preside in his absence, shall be present.

11. Any three members may require the Board room to be cleared of strangers, and the Chairman, or other presiding Chairman, shall immediately give directions to have the order executed.

12. At all meetings of the Board, when there is not a quorum present, or when the Board is counted out (which counting out shall take place whenever there shall be less than a quorum present), or within 30 minutes after time for which meeting is called, such circumstances, together with the names of the members then present, shall be recorded in the minute book.

13. The first business of all meetings of the Board shall be the reading of the minutes of the preceding meeting aloud with a view of their confirmation.

Voting.

14. Each member (including the Chairman) shall have one vote, and such Chairman shall, in case of equality of votes, have a casting vote in addition to his ordinary vote, and all questions at such meetings shall be decided by a majority of the votes of the members present. All motions and amendments shall be decided by a show of hands, unless a division is demanded, before the next business is proceeded with.

Minutes of Meetings.

15. The minute-book prescribed by the Act shall be kept, in which any item of business transacted by the Board at a meeting shall be then and there entered by the Secretary. Minutes of special or ordinary meetings shall be confirmed at the next ordinary meeting. No discussion shall take place upon the minutes of proceedings, except as to their accuracy or for the rectification of a clerical error.

Standing Orders.

16. The order of business at all ordinary meetings of the Board shall be as follows, that is to say:—

- (a.) Reading and confirmation of minutes of last ordinary, also special meetings (if any).
- (b.) Consideration of business arising out of minutes.
- (c.) Questions, of which due notice has been given by members or officers of the Board.
- (d.) The Chairman shall have the right of directing attention at any meeting to any matter or subject within the jurisdiction or official cognisance of the Board by a minute signed by himself, and such minute shall when introduced take precedence of all business before or to come before the Board, and the adoption thereof may be put by him from the chair as a motion without being seconded, but he shall confine himself to the questions contained therein.
- (e.) Reports of sub-committees.
- (f.) Presentation of petitions or memorials, and consideration thereby.
- (g.) Reading of correspondence (received and despatched) and taking action as may be deemed expedient in regard thereto.
- (h.) Consideration of tenders and ratification of contracts.

- (i.) Passing of accounts for payment.
- (j.) Motions of which previous notice has been given.
- (k.) Motions without notice (by leave of the Board under By-law 2).
- (l.) General business.
- (m.) Notice of motions.

17. In the event of any member having urgent business to place before the meeting, he may move the suspension of the standing orders, and, if agreed to by the Board, such business shall take precedence to all others.

18. Any member wishing to rescind any motion shall act in direct compliance with Section 128 of the Roads Act, by giving seven days' notice to each member or submitting to the Secretary of the Board notice of his intention in time to enable him to give the necessary notice prescribed by the Act to each member.

Petitions.

19. Every petition or memorial shall be respectful and temperate in its language, and shall be presented to the Board by a member only, and any member presenting a petition or memorial to the Board shall affix his name to the beginning thereof, with the number of signatures; and any member presenting a petition or memorial shall acquaint himself with the contents thereof and ascertain that it does not contain language disrespectful to the Board. The nature or prayer of every petition or memorial shall be stated to the Board by the member presenting the same.

Tenders.

20. Tenders for work shall be opened and dealt with when the subject matter of the tenders comes on to be considered at the meeting of the Board, or by a Committee appointed for the purpose.

Orders of Debate.

Speakers must not digress.

21. A member having audience shall not digress from the subject of debate.

Unopposed Notices of Motion.

22. The Chairman may call over the notices of motion on the business paper in the order in which they appear thereon; and if objection is not taken to a motion being taken as a formal motion, may call upon the mover to move the same, and upon the motion being seconded may then, without discussion, put the motion to the vote.

Correspondence.

23. All correspondence with the Board shall be addressed to the Secretary and submitted to the Board. No letter addressed to the Board shall be presented or read by a member.

Consideration of Reports.

24. (a.) If in a report of a committee distinct recommendations are made, the decision of the Board may be taken separately on each recommendation.

(b.) Any report of a committee or any portion thereof may be amended by the Board in any matter it may think fit, or may be referred back to the committee for further consideration.

(c.) The recommendations of any committee when adopted by the Board shall be resolutions of the Board.

Precedence of Chairman.

25. When the Chairman rises in his place during the progress of a debate, any member then speaking or offering to speak shall immediately resume his seat, and every member present shall preserve strict silence so that the Chairman may be heard without interruption.

Notice of Motion: Absence of Mover.

26. In the absence of a member who has placed a notice of motion on the business paper for any meeting any other member may at such meeting move the same, or such motion may be deferred until the next ordinary meeting of the Board.

Withdrawal of Motions.

27. Except as elsewhere provided, no motion, after being placed on the business paper, shall be withdrawn without the consent of the Board.

Motions to be Seconded.

28. No motion shall be debated unless or until it has been seconded.

Motions not to be withdrawn without Consent.

29. When a motion has been proposed and seconded it shall become subject to the control of the Board, and shall not be withdrawn without consent of the Board.

Amendment may be moved.

30. When a motion has been proposed and seconded, any member shall be at liberty to move an amendment thereon, but no such amendment shall be debated unless or until it has been seconded.

Motions and Amendments to be in Writing.

31. No motion or amendment shall be debated unless or until it has been reduced to writing if the Chairman so directs.

Further Amendment may be moved on Amended Question.

32. If an amendment has been carried the question as amended thereby shall become itself the question before the Board, whereupon any further amendment upon such question may be moved.

How Subsequent Amendments may be Moved.

33. If an amendment, whether upon an original question or upon any question amended as aforesaid, has been negatived, then a further amendment may be moved to the question to which such first-mentioned amendment was moved and so on, provided that not more than one question and one proposed amendment thereof shall be before the Board at any one time.

Motions for Adjournment.

34. No discussion shall be permitted upon any motion for adjournment of the Board. If upon the question being put on any such motion the same is negatived, the subject then under consideration or next on the business paper shall be discussed, and it shall not be competent for any member to again move a motion for adjournment until half an hour has elapsed from the time of moving the one that has been negatived.

Mover of Adjournment when entitled to Priority.

35. On resuming any discussion which has been adjourned, the mover of such adjournment shall be entitled, if he has not already spoken on the subject under discussion, to speak first.

Notice of Questions to be given.

36. Sufficient notice of every question shall be given to the Chairman or member expected to reply thereto, to permit of consideration of such reply and, if necessary, reference to other persons or to documents.

Questions to be put without argument.

37. Every such question shall be put categorically and without any argument.

Replies and Objections and subsequent Motion received.

38. No discussion shall be permitted respecting any reply or refusal to reply to any question.

Mode of addressing Board, etc.

39. Members shall on all occasions when at a meeting address and speak to each other by their official designations, as Chairman or Secretary, as the case may be and, with the exception of the Chairman, shall rise in their place and stand while speaking (except when prevented from so doing by bodily infirmity).

Speaker not to be interrupted if in order.

40. No member shall be interrupted while speaking except for the purpose of calling him to order as hereinafter provided or in pursuance of By-law.

41. One or more amendments may be proposed on a motion before the Board. When more than one amendment is moved, the question shall be first put on the last amendment; then on the next in succession, and then on the original motion, in the reverse order in which they were moved.

42. A motion or amendment not seconded cannot be discussed by any member except the mover, nor put by the Chairman.

43. In submitting a motion or amendment the Chairman shall put the question first in the affirmative and then in the negative.

44. When an amendment is carried, the motion amended thereby becomes a substantive motion, upon which further amendments may be moved before it is finally dealt with.

Limitation as to Number of Speeches.

45. The mover of an original motion shall have the right of general reply to all observations which have been made in reference to such motion and to any amendment moved thereon, as well as the right to speak upon every such amendment. Every member, other than the mover of an original motion, shall have the right to speak once upon such motion and once upon every amendment moved thereon. No member shall, without the consent of the Board, speak more than once upon any one question, or for longer than ten minutes at any one time, unless when misrepresented or misunderstood, in which case he may be permitted to explain without adding any further observations than may be necessary for the purpose of such explanation.

All Members to Vote.

46. Upon a vote being taken, all members present within the Board room, unless disqualified from voting, shall, and the Chairman, unless so disqualified, may upon the question being put, record their respective votes in the affirmative or negative as each shall deem desirable, but if a member other than the Chairman neglects or refuses to vote, his vote shall be counted for the negative.

Determination of Questions.

47. (a.) All questions shall, if not otherwise decided by law, be determined thus:—Upon a question being put, those in favour shall say "Aye" and those against "No," and the Chairman shall declare whether the "Ayes" or "Noes" have determined the question; or if the Chairman prefer he may call for a show of hands for and against the question. The decision of the Chairman shall be final and conclusive, unless such decision be immediately challenged and two members rise and demand a division.

(b.) Where there is only one dissident, he may request that his name be recorded in the minutes as opposed to the motion, and it shall be so recorded.

Divisions.

48. Upon a division being so called for, the question shall first be put in the affirmative and then in the negative, and the Chairman and all members present shall vote by show of hands, and the names and votes of the Chairman and members present shall be recorded in the minutes by the Secretary. Any member of the Board present when a division is called for who does not in the manner above indicated vote on such motion, not being disabled by law from so voting, his vote shall be counted for the negative.

Chairman may repeat Question.

49. The Chairman shall be at liberty to put any question as often as may be necessary to enable him to form his opinion as to the result of the voting and declare the same.

Acts of Disorder.

50. Any member who, at any meeting of the Board or any committee, commits a breach of any By-law, or who moves or attempts to move any motion or amendment embodying any matter beyond the legal jurisdiction of the Board or committee, or who in any other way raises or attempts to raise any question, or addresses or attempts to address the Board or committee upon any subject which the Board or committee have no legal right to entertain or discuss, or who uses any language which, according to the common usage of gentlemen would be held disorderly, or makes use of any expression inconsistent with good order and decorum, or who says or does anything calculated to bring the Board or committee into contempt, shall be guilty of an act of disorder.

Members called to Order more than once.

51. Any member who, having been called to order by the Chairman for any infringement of any of the provisions of By-law or for any breach of decorum, shall, upon the request of the Chairman, withdraw from the Board room for the remainder of the meeting.

Removal from Board Room: Penalty for continued Breach of Order, etc.

52. In the event of a member declining to withdraw from the Board room on being required so to do by the Chairman, the Chairman may order his removal until the termination of the sitting, and such member shall be deemed guilty of an offence, and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding two pounds.

Disorder.

53. If disorder arise at any meeting, the Chairman may adjourn the meeting for a period of fifteen minutes and quit the chair. The Board on resuming shall, on question put from the chair, decide without debate, whether the business shall be proceeded with or not.

Appointment of Committee.

54. The Board may at any time appoint one or more members as a committee to inquire into any matter and make a report and recommendation thereon, but no committee shall incur any financial liability, or in any way commit the Board to any responsibility whatever, without express and specific authority conferred by the By-laws, or a resolution of the Board.

Finance and Accounts.

55. All accounts, bills, and vouchers shall be submitted to the ordinary meeting, and after being certified as correct, shall be paid by cheque.

56. An account shall be opened with such bank as the Board may from time to time direct, and all moneys received from whatever source, with the exception of money granted by the Government, shall be paid into such bank to the credit of the Board, and no account shall be paid except by cheque signed by the Chairman and one or more members of the Board, and countersigned by the Secretary. All moneys belonging to the Board shall, within 24 hours after they come into the hands of any officer, servant, or clerk, be paid to the Secretary or to any other responsible officer if directed by the Board.

Urgent Works.

57. The Chairman, with one member, or, in the absence of the Chairman, any two members, may, in case of emergency, authorise the expenditure of a sum not exceeding £10, which should be confirmed at the next meeting.

Unauthorised Expenditure.

58. Every item of expenditure and every liability incurred by any committee, or member of the Board, otherwise than under the authority of the Act or of these By-laws, shall be deemed unlawful expenditure, and a breach of this By-law by such person.

Common Seal.

59. The common seal of the corporation shall be kept in a strong box with two locks and keys, one of which keys shall be kept by the Chairman and the other by the Secretary. The common seal shall not be affixed to any deed or other instrument except by order of the Board.

Prevention of Nuisances.

60. Any person who—

- (a.) Shall keep, or cause to be kept, any abattoir, slaughter-house, pigsty, manure works, works for boiling down meat, bones, blood, or offal, bone mill, bone manure depot, fellmongery, tannery, wool-scouring establishment, glue factory, soap or candle works, fish-curing establishment, place for storing, drying, or preserving bones, hides, hoofs, or skins, dairy or other work or establishment; or
- (b.) Shall keep, or cause to be kept, any house, passage, yard, way, cellar, drain, stable, cowshed, earth or other closet or cesspool; or
- (c.) Shall permit any accumulation of stagnant water, manure, dung, offal, or other filth upon any premises owned or occupied by him; or
- (d.) Shall deposit, or cast, or allow to remain upon any road or public place the carcase of a dead animal, or any refuse or offensive matter; or
- (e.) Shall cause or permit any foul or offensive liquid to flow from any land, house, or premises owned or occupied by him in and upon any road or footpath,

so as to be or likely to become a nuisance or injurious to public health, shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these By-laws, and shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20.

Offences, Omissions, or Neglects.

61. Any person guilty of any of the following offences shall, on conviction thereof, pay a penalty not exceeding £20:—

- (a.) Riding or driving cattle or horses or other animals, or wheeling any barrow, or driving any carriage or cart upon or along any footpath.

- (b.) Placing any timber, bricks, or other material upon any footpath, channel, surface drain, or road without the permission of the Board having been first obtained.
- (c.) Burning any shavings or other material or matter in any road or open or public place.
- (d.) Damaging or destroying any dam, well, tank, pump, windmill, windlass, bucket, rope, piping, troughing, fence, or gate under the control of the Board.
- (e.) Placing any placard or other document, writing, printing on or otherwise defacing any house or building abutting or contiguous to a public road, or on any wall, fence, gate, or lamp-post without the consent of the occupier or owner thereof.
- (f.) Opening or obstructing any drain or sewer or removing the surface of any footpath or road, without the permission of the Board having first been obtained.
- (g.) Rolling any cask, beating any carpet, breaking in any horse, flying any kite, using any bow or arrow, or playing at any game to the annoyance of any person in any public place, or allowing any cart or animal to remain upon any footpath, placing goods upon any footpath, or otherwise obstructing any footpath.
- (h.) Throwing or discharging any stone or other missile in any road to the damage or danger of any person.
- (i.) Having any awning upon or over the footpath in any road not being eight feet clear above the footway, or hanging any goods on or under such awning over the footway without permission of the Board.
- (j.) Blasting any rock, stone, or timber in or near any road without the permission of the Board, and not attending to such directions in regard thereto given by such Board.
- (k.) Furiously or negligently driving or riding along any road.
- (l.) Making any cellar-door or other opening from the footway of any road without the consent of the Board.
- (m.) Plying for hire without a license in the form set forth in Schedule "C" hereto.
- (n.) Fishing off any bridge.
- (o.) Using or having in possession or control any unlicensed vehicle or machine engaged or to be engaged in heavy traffic without having a license in the form set forth in Schedule "B" hereto.
- (p.) Using or having in possession or control any unlicensed cycle or motor without having a license in the form set forth in Schedule "B" hereto.

General Regulation of Traffic.

62. Every person having the care or conduct of any carriage shall keep the same on the left side or near side of the road, except in case of actual necessity or other sufficient reason for deviation, and shall not interrupt or interfere with any person or carriage passing or attempting to pass his carriage.

63. No person shall ride or drive any horse or other animal along any road at a speed exceeding eight miles an hour.

64. No person shall drive any vehicle between sunset and the following sunrise along any road unless provided with proper lamps as required under the Uniform General By-laws for Regulating Motor Traffic and Standard Lights to be carried by all vehicles, published in *Government Gazette* of 3rd January, 1913, and subsequent amendments published in *Gazettes* of 23rd May, 1913, 5th December, 1913, and 1st May, 1914.

65. No person having the care or control of a horse or other animal, or of any vehicle, shall allow the same to remain in any road of the district, or to obstruct any portion of such road, for a longer period than necessary for loading and unloading the vehicle; provided that where suitable bridle posts are provided the horses may be securely fastened thereto, for any period not exceeding sixty minutes, but immediately upon the request of any officer or member of the Board or police constable such shall be removed.

66. Any person leading any horse or cattle shall, on passing any vehicle or equestrian, keep on the right side of the road, and the attendant must be on the near side of such horse or cattle.

To prevent Trees falling across any Road or Track.

67. No person shall make or leave a fire near any road or track or reserve under the jurisdiction of the Board without taking proper precautions against such fire spreading, and any person offending against this By-law shall, upon conviction, pay a penalty not exceeding £20.

68. No person shall set fire to any standing tree upon or near any road or track, and any such offender shall, upon conviction, pay a penalty not exceeding £20.

To prevent Accidents from Riding, etc., on Bicycles, etc.

69. (a.) No person shall leave any cycle or motor in or on any road or footpath so as to become an obstruction, and every person shall remove his cycle or motor immediately upon being requested to do so by any constable or officer or member of the Board.

(b.) No person shall pass at a speed exceeding eight miles an hour any person who shall be riding or driving any horse or other animal.

(c.) No person shall ride any cycle or motor round the corner formed by the junction of any roads in the district, or cross the intersection of any of the said roads, at a pace exceeding six miles an hour.

To prevent Obstructions on the Footpaths.

70A. No person shall permit any box, case, coal, sand, firewood, goods, wares, merchandise, or other articles or effects to remain on any part of a road, or on any part of a footpath, within the district after sunset, nor in any case for a longer period than shall be necessary for housing and removing same.

70B. And no person shall at any time, day or night, obstruct by seats or resting places of any kind on footpaths.

71. No person shall place, lay, deposit, shoot, or discharge any rubbish or materials whatsoever on the surface of any street, road, footway, or public reserve within the district without having first obtained permission of the Board.

72. Every person shall, after having received from the Board, as in the last preceding section provided, a permit to deposit rubbish or materials on the surface of any road, footway, or public reserve, have and keep sufficient and continuous light burning thereon from sunset to the following sunrise during the time such rubbish or material shall remain or continue so deposited.

To prevent Damage to Footpaths and any other Board Property.

73. No person, without first having obtained the written sanction of the Board, shall break up, cut down, damage, destroy, or injure any footpath, gutter, drain, culvert, bridge, road, public way, tree, plant, gate, fence, post, lantern, lamp-post, implements, materials, buildings or other property of the Board, or under the control thereof.

Preservation of Trees, etc.

74. Any person who shall carelessly, wilfully, or wantonly injure, destroy, carry away, or remove from its place any tree, shrub, or plant, standing in any of the roads, enclosures, public places of, belonging to, or under the care or superintendence of the Board, or who shall carelessly, wilfully, or wantonly injure, destroy, carry away, or remove out of its place, or ride or drive against any of the tree-guards, fences, or other protection to any such trees, shrubs, or plants as aforesaid, shall forfeit for every such offence a penalty not more than £10.

Throwing Dangerous Substances on Footways.

75. Any person who shall throw vegetable substances, or any offensive, noxious, or dangerous substance upon any footway within the district shall forfeit and pay, on conviction, a penalty not exceeding £1 for every such offence. Any person or persons placing, or causing to be placed, or broken in or upon any road, pathway, reserve, or park lands under the care or supervision of the Board, any glass, metal, or earthenware bottles or utensils, without having first obtained the consent of the Board so to do, shall be liable, beyond the costs and charges incidental to the removal of any such glass, metal, or earthenware, to a fine, upon conviction, not exceeding £2, in addition to amount of damages caused thereby.

Park Lands, Reserves, and Recreation Grounds.

76. All park lands and recreation grounds shall be open to the public daily for recreation purposes, excepting as otherwise provided for in these By-laws. The

Board shall have the power to grant exclusive right to use any park lands, recreation grounds, or reserves placed under its control within the district for holding public sports or amusements to any responsible person or persons; and any person or persons obtaining such right shall be responsible for the proper care of all such fences, buildings, and trees, or other improvements upon or enclosing such park lands, recreation grounds, and reserves, and shall pay the Board a fee to be fixed for admission on such occasions.

77. No horse, cattle, or vehicle shall be allowed on any park lands or recreation grounds without the written permission of the Board.

78. All persons using or being upon any park lands, recreation grounds, or reserves shall at all times conduct themselves in a becoming manner, and any person creating any disturbance or annoyance to the public shall be liable to be expelled from such lands by any police constable or officer of the Board.

79. The Board may, in its discretion, prohibit any games or gymnastics from being played or carried on by any person or persons upon any park lands, recreation grounds, or reserves on any Sunday, Christmas Day, or Good Friday.

80. No person shall sell, or expose for sale, any goods, wares, fruit, or merchandise in any park lands, recreation ground, or reserve without first having obtained the permission of the Board, and shall pay a fee, the amount of such fee not to exceed £10.

81. No person shall damage or injure any tree, shrub, or plant in any park lands, recreation grounds, or reserves. Any person offending against this By-law shall forfeit and pay, on conviction, a penalty not exceeding £10 for every such offence.

Sand and Timber.

82. Any person who shall remove any sand or other materials from any lands belonging to, or in charge of, or under the control of the Board, without a license in form set forth in Schedule 'E' hereto, shall forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a penalty not exceeding £5.

83. Any person who shall cut or remove any timber or bush on any lands belonging to, or in charge of, or under the control of the Board, without a license in the form set forth in Schedule 'E' hereto, shall forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a penalty not exceeding £5.

Construction of Footways, Crossing Places.

84. It shall be lawful for the owner of any land fronting or adjoining any road or public way requiring access thereto with horses and vehicles from such street to such land across any existing made footway, kerbing, channel, or gutter, having first had and obtained the consent of the Board, to construct a crossing of such dimensions and materials, and in such form and manner as the regulations of the Board for the time being require, or as may be directed by the Secretary, and shall thereafter keep and maintain the same in good and safe repair. Any person not complying with the provisions of this By-law shall, upon conviction, forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding £5.

85. Every person who wilfully and without lawful excuse shall ride or drive, or wheel any carriage, cart, or other vehicle, or shall ride any bicycle, velocipede, tricycle, or motor upon, along, or across any footway, kerbing, or water channel, or gutter by the side of any street, road, or public way, save in each such case upon or by, or at some proper constructed crossing, shall forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a sum not exceeding £5, and shall also pay to the Board such sum, not exceeding £10, by way of compensation for any damage done to the footway, kerbing, or channel, as the justice adjudicating upon the information shall on the hearing thereof order.

Lamp-posts, etc.

86. No lamp-post, bridle-post, water-trough, telegraph, telephone, or electric lighting pole, or flagstaff shall be erected by any person in any street or road without the written consent of the Board, and upon consent being obtained shall be placed in such position, and shall be painted at least once in every three years, and may be directed by the Board; and the Board may order the removal by the owners of all bent, dangerous, or unsightly posts or poles. Any person offending against this By-law shall forfeit and pay, on conviction, a penalty not exceeding £2 for every such offence.

Prescribing the Removal of Verandahs and Balconies, etc., at expense of Owner or Occupier.

87. Any verandah or balcony which obstructs the footway or roadway, or is dangerous, and all other obstructions on the footways, or roadways, or overhanging same, shall be removed when ordered within such time as shall be notified by the Board, and all expenses incurred in removing same shall be borne by the owner or occupier of such verandah, balcony, or other obstruction, whether removed by the Board or otherwise; and any person whatsoever interfering or obstructing any officer or person employed by the Board in carrying out this By-law, on conviction, shall pay a sum not exceeding £10.

Encroachments or Obstructions to be removed.

88. On the order of the Board, the Secretary or other appointed officer may direct the removal, within 14 days, of any building, fence, or other obstruction or encroachment in or upon any street, road, lane, or public place under the control of the Board.

In any case where, after service of notice for such removal, any such obstruction or encroachment has not been removed within the specified time, it shall be lawful for the officer appointed by the Board to remove same at the cost and charges of the person so offending and to proceed against the offender for the breach of this By-law, the penalty for which breach shall be not more than £20 for every day or part of a day during which such offence shall be committed or continued after the expiry of the notice prescribed therein.

Damaging Roads.

89. No person shall damage or destroy by means of horse, team, wagon, dray, or any other means, any road or portion of a road under construction or repair, and any person found guilty of such damage or destruction shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20.

90. Any person who:—

- (a.) Cuts or removes without the consent in writing of the Chairman of the Board, timber, earth, sand, gravel, stone, or other material from a road; or
- (b.) Erects, without the consent aforesaid, upon a road so as to encroach thereon; or
- (c.) Draws, without any consent aforesaid, across the water-side of a road, except over a properly constructed approach or culvert, a dray or other wheeled vehicle; or
- (d.) Draws upon a road, timber, stone, or other material otherwise than on a wheeled vehicle, or suffers such material, when carried principally or in part upon a wheeled vehicle, to drag or trail upon a road, or draws upon a road a whim or timber carriage any portion of which, or any portion of chains attaching thereto, or any portion of any other attachment, trails or drags upon a road, or locks any wheel of any vehicle or implement thereby damaging road,

shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these By-laws, and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5 for every such offence.

Cattle to keep off the Roads.

91. The owner of any cattle, sheep, horse, pig, or other animal straying on any road within the district shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £2.

92. The owner of any bull, stallion, or boar straying on any road within the district shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10.

Copulation of Stock.

93. Any owner who, as owner or otherwise, while in charge of an entire horse, bull, or ass, shall cause, allow, permit or suffer any such entire horse, bull, or ass to try to cover any mare or cow within the township, or shall cause or permit or allow or suffer any such entire horse, bull, or ass to be turned loose in any yard or other place with any mare or cow for the purpose of allowing such mare or cow to be tried or covered, except in some yard, building, or other premises as shall be entirely and sufficiently screened from public view, shall forfeit and pay, on conviction, a sum not exceeding Ten pounds (£10).

94. No entire shall be led or exhibited in township at inexpedient hours.

Heavy Traffic.

95. The owner of every vehicle or engine which, together with its load, shall weigh more than five tons, shall travel the roads, bridges, and culverts at his own risk, and shall be liable to pay for any damage done.

96. The Board may, by notice affixed to any bridge or culvert, declare the maximum weight of any engine, agricultural or other machine, or vehicle of any kind, and of any load or material which shall be permitted to cross such bridge or culvert, and also the pace or speed at which such engine, machine, vehicle, or load shall be driven, led, or taken over any such bridge or culvert, and any person who shall cross any such bridge or culvert in contravention of this By-law shall, in addition to any liability for damage he may have caused, be liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding £10.

Pounds.

97. Any person who shall break, damage, or destroy any pound fence, gate lock, shed, trough, or premises shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

98. Any person who shall obliterate deface, or damage any table of fees, placard, or other notice required by "The Cattle Trespass, Fencing, and Impounding Act, 1882," shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law, and shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

99. Any person who shall release or attempt to release, any cattle which shall be lawfully seized for the purpose of being impounded, whether such cattle shall be in the pound or on the way to or from any such pound, shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law, and shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

Bathing.

100. No person shall bathe in any river or open public water within the limits or abutting on the boundary of the Road District, within the jurisdiction of the Board, between the hours of seven in the morning and eight in the evening, without suitable bathing costume or clothing.

101. Any person offending against any of the provisions of this By-law shall, for every such offence, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20.

Water Supply.

102. Any person who shall injure or damage any well, bore, pipe, tank, or place for storage of water under the control of the Board, or any machinery, appliances, or property used in connection therewith, shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law, and notwithstanding any civil remedy for damages so caused shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding £5.

103. Any person who shall waste, or allow water to escape, foul or pollute any water contained in any bore, pipe, tank, or place of storage shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law, and shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20, in addition to any other sum which he may be legally required to pay for damages.

104. No person shall pollute or cause to be polluted any watercourse, pool, well, tank, reservoir, or other water within the district.

105. No animal shall be allowed to stray on any roads or places, and no animal suffering from an infectious or contagious disease shall be ridden or driven on any road. Any animal found so suffering may be slaughtered and destroyed at the owner's expense.

Licenses.

106. The several licenses contained in the schedules hereto may be granted by the Board for such periods not exceeding twelve months, or for such purposes irrespective of any period of duration, and upon payment of such fees as shall be prescribed; and if any person holding any such license shall make default in any of the conditions obtained in such license the license shall thereupon become absolutely null and void, and the fees paid therefor shall be forfeited to the Board, and such person shall, in the event of any breach of the said license, be guilty of an offence against this By-law, and shall, on conviction thereof, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

107. The owner of every licensed vehicle plying for hire or engaged in heavy or medium traffic, and of every licensed bicycle or motor shall have their license number affixed on some conspicuous part of such vehicle, cycle, or motor, and any person who shall refuse or neglect to have such number so affixed shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law, and shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £2.

Penalties.

108. Where any person by these By-laws, or any of them, is required to do or perform any act, and such act is not done or remains undone or unperformed, it shall be lawful for the Board to perform the same and charge the cost and expenses against such person, and the amount thereof may be recovered summarily.

109. Every person who does, permits, or suffers any act, matter, or thing contrary to any of these By-laws, or commits or permits any breach or neglect thereof, shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these By-laws, and, where not otherwise provided, shall be deemed liable to a penalty not exceeding £20 for every such offence.

110. All penalties or other sums recovered under the provisions of these By-laws shall, unless otherwise provided, be paid to the Board, and shall become the property of and form part of the ordinary income of the district, except so much as may be payable to any informer.

PREVIOUS BY-LAWS.

111. All By-laws issued previous to this date are hereby repealed.

A By-law for the Regulation of passage of horses, cattle, and sheep through certain streets, No. 300.

By-law No. 300.

No person shall be allowed to drive between the hours of 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. mobs of horses, cattle, or sheep through that part of Hampton Street between Phillip Street and Bunbury Street, and through that part of Steere Street between the intersection of Hampton Street and Roe Street.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to approve of the following By-laws under "The Cemeteries Act, 1897," and amending Acts, for the control and management of the Dunsborough Public Cemetery.

PUBLIC CEMETERY, DUNSBOROUGH.

BY virtue of all powers in that behalf, vested in the trustees of the Public Cemetery, Dunsborough, the said trustees make the following By-laws for the regulation of that Cemetery.

1. All fees and charges payable to the trustees, as set forth in Schedule "A," shall be paid to the Secretary at the time, and in the manner specified herein.

2. The salary of the Secretary shall be fixed from time to time by the trustees.

3. The area of ground allotted for each grave shall not exceed eight feet by four feet.

4. The area of ground enclosed by any fence or tomb shall not exceed eight feet by four feet, except when two or more graves are enclosed by one fence or tomb.

5. No fence, headstone, or other erection shall be placed within the above-named cemetery until first approved by the trustees or their officers.

6. Four hours' notice must always be given to the Secretary previous to any burial taking place.

7. No burial shall take place in the above-named cemetery before sunrise, or after sunset, except by special permission of the trustees or their officers.

8. All graves shall be dug to a depth of not less than six feet, and not less than seven feet for a double interment.

9. A charge of one pound for adults, and ten shillings for children shall be made for digging each grave, and five shillings for registering the same in the books of the Board.

10. No grave shall be dug in the above-named cemetery, except by such person as the trustees or their officers may appoint.

11. The cemetery charges shall be collected by the Secretary, and paid in to account at the end of each week, and such money shall be used to defray the cost of working the above-named cemetery.

12. No person shall remove any body from any grave in this cemetery after burial, without having first obtained a certificate of permission for such removal, signed by two trustees and the Secretary, which said permission shall be entered upon the minutes of the next ordinary meeting of the trustees: Provided always, that the order of the Governor for exhumation shall have been obtained and produced before the granting of the said certificate.

13. No carriage, trap, cart, or other vehicle, excepting the hearse, shall be permitted to enter the cemetery without an order from the trustees or their officer. Any person violating this By-law will be prosecuted.

14. No burial shall be allowed to take place in the cemetery unless a certificate from the District Registrar of Deaths, that the death has been registered, or a coroner's order for burial is first exhibited for the inspection of the Secretary, or a member of the trustees; and no burial shall be allowed to take place, nor any coffin allowed to enter the cemetery, except by permission of the trustees.

15. The trustees reserve to themselves the right to grant to the several churches and bodies among whom the cemetery has been divided, the right to make such further rules or laws as they may deem desirable for the further regulation of the several portions thereof, subject, however, to the by-laws of the trustees.

16. The trustees shall meet at the Quindalup Hall on the first Saturday in the months of January, April, July, and October in each year.

17. Three members shall constitute a quorum at any meeting of the trustees.

18. Notice of motion must be given in writing, at least seven days previous to the ordinary meeting of the trustees, before any of these By-laws can be altered.

19. Any person desiring to erect or place any monument, tombstone, or enclosure in any part of the cemetery must first obtain the written consent and approval of the Trustees.

20. Every tombstone, monument, or enclosure shall be placed on proper and substantial foundations, approved by the trustees.

21. The material used in any such erection shall be subject to the approval of the trustees, and any material rejected shall be immediately removed from the cemetery by the contractors for the erection.

22. All refuse and other rubbish remaining after any work is completed shall be immediately removed from the cemetery by the person causing the same.

23. Monumental masons and other tradesmen shall, before commencing any work within the cemetery, deposit with the Secretary the sum of Ten shillings, which shall be forfeited if either of the last two preceding By-laws are not complied with to the satisfaction of the trustees.

24. All workmen, whether employed by the trustees or by any other person, shall at all times, whilst within the boundaries of the cemetery, be subject to the supervision of the trustees, and shall obey such directions as they may find it necessary to give.

25. Any person taking part in dressing or attending to any grave shall comply with the following rules:—

- (a) No rubbish, soil, sand, or other material removed in dressing a grave shall be placed on any other grave, and if placed on any adjoining ground shall be removed immediately the work is completed.

- (b) No sand, soil, or loam shall be taken from any portion of the cemetery for the purpose of dressing any grave, except with the permission of the trustees.

- (c) The dressing of all graves, and the wheeling and carting of all material shall be subject to the supervision of the trustees.

- (d) Work in all cases shall be carried on with due despatch, and only during regulation hours.

26. Every person guilty of an offence against any of these By-laws shall, for every such offence, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

The foregoing By-laws, with the accompanying schedules, were duly framed and passed at a meeting of the Board of Trustees, held in the Quindalup Hall on the 12th February, 1916.

COURT OF ARBITRATION, WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

No. 3 of 1916.

Between Ingliston Extended Gold Mines, Limited; Commodore Gold Mining Company, No-Liability; The Kyarra Gold Mine, No-Liability; Lake View and Oroya Exploration, Limited; Ingliston Consols Extended Gold Mine; Marmont Gold Mining Syndicate; and Fenian Gold Mining Syndicate, Applicants; and Meekatharra Miners' Union of Workers (A.W.A.), Respondent.

THE Court of Arbitration of Western Australia doth hereby make the following award in connection with the industrial dispute between the above-mentioned parties:—

A W A R D .

1. *Definition.*—"Timberman" means a worker employed in "putting in" timber or "timbering up" in the mine, but does not include a worker called in to assist in lifting or carrying timber. "Timbering up" or "putting in" timber does not include logging up passes.

"Surface labourer" means and includes pick and shovel men, lumpers, battery feeders, slime, sand, and wood truckers, wood trimmers, and general labourers.

2. *Wages.*—The minimum rate of wages payable to workers covered by this award shall be in accordance with the following scale:—

Workers operating the Holman Hoist in winzes and stopes are to be paid as rock drill men.

3. *Wet Pay.*—Men working in wet ground shall be paid 1s. 2d. (one shilling and twopence) per shift in addition to the ordinary rate of pay.

Should any dispute arise as to whether any place where men are at work in the mine is wet, such dispute shall be referred to a board constituted of a representative appointed by the employer, a representative appointed by the Miners' Union registered in respect of the locality in which the dispute arises, with the warden of the goldfield in which such mine is situated as chairman, whose decision shall be final.

4. *Hours.*—Forty-seven hours inclusive of crib time shall constitute a week's work for all men working underground.

For men working single shifts on the surface, forty-eight hours, exclusive of crib time, shall constitute a week's work (day shift only).

For men working shifts on the surface forty-eight hours, inclusive of crib time, shall constitute the week's work.

5. *Holidays.*—Christmas Day and Labour Day shall so far as practicable be observed as close holidays. On those days all work underground and on the surface is to be suspended, and only those men required to protect the plants and mine, keep furnaces warm, and do any other necessary work are to be employed and when so employed are to be paid the ordinary rate of wage.

6. *Area.*—This award shall have effect over that portion of the Meekatharra District of the Murchison Goldfield as is situated within a radius of ten miles from the Meekatharra railway station.

7. *Term.*—This award shall be binding on the above-named applicants and respondent and shall continue in force for a period of three years from its date: Provided that at any time after the expiration of twelve months from its date the Court may alter or amend the same on the application of any party or person affected by its provisions.

THE COURT OF ARBITRATION, WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

No. 12 of 1915.

Between The United Furniture Trades' Industrial Union of Workers, Perth, W. A., Applicant, and W. Zimpel; Bon Marché, Limited; Boan Brothers; Washing Brothers; Perth Shop Fitting Company; Robertson & Moffat (successors); A. Povey; Baker & Moore; William Sandover & Company; Ittershagen & Griffen; C. J. Locke; D. Craik; A. Boase; Wright & Fendick; M. Brown; and Foy & Gibson, Respondents.

THE Court of Arbitration of Western Australia doth hereby make the following award in connection with the industrial dispute between the above-mentioned parties:—

A W A R D .

1. *Hours.*—The week's work shall consist of forty-eight hours, and shall be worked between the hours of 7.30 a.m. and 5.30 p.m. on the first five week days, and between the hours of 7.30 and noon on Saturday.

2. *Overtime.*—The following rates shall be paid for work performed after the usual time for ceasing work:—

On the first five working days of the week—

Time and a-quarter for the first two hours;

Time and a-half after that up to 10 o'clock p.m., and double time thereafter until the usual starting time next morning.

On Saturday—

Time and a-quarter for the first two hours;

Time and a-half for the next four hours;

After that double time rate.

3. *Holidays.*—A worker required to work on Sunday, New Year's Day, Anniversary Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Foundation Day, Eight Hours' Day, Christmas Day, or Boxing Day, shall be paid at double time rate for work performed on those days.

4. *Country Work.*—Any worker sent by his employer to a job at such a distance that he cannot return to his home each night shall be provided with board and lodging. All travelling not exceeding eight hours in any one day to and from the job shall be paid for at ordinary rates. The employer shall pay all fares and for necessary meals whilst travelling.

5. *Travelling Time.*—All travelling time from and to the employer's place of business or from one job to another during the hours of work, shall be paid for by the employer at ordinary rates. The employer shall pay all fares in connection with such travelling.

6. *Wages.*—The minimum rate of wages payable to male workers other than lap-boys and duly registered apprentices and probationers shall be in accordance with the following Schedule:—

A "wickerworker" shall mean a worker in cane, pith, sea grass, bamboo, rush, or any material used in the manufacture of furniture, go-carts, and baskets.

Lap-boys may be employed in the wicker-working industry to lap, varnish, clean up the factory, and go messages.

Lap-boys shall be between the ages of fourteen and sixteen years, and shall be paid a minimum wage of 10s. per week in their first year, and 15s. per week in their second year.

Lap-boys shall not be employed in a greater proportion than one boy to every three or fraction of three fully paid journeymen: Provided that an employer shall not be entitled to employ a lap-boy unless he employs two fully-paid journeymen.

The number of journeymen employed by an employer at any time shall be deemed to be the average number of journeymen employed on all working days of the three months immediately preceding such time.

Girls may be employed instead of, and in the same proportion, as lap-boys.

7. *Wages paid in Cash:* All wages shall be paid in cash on or before Friday in each week within fifteen minutes of the time of ceasing work. No charge shall be made against the worker for the use of bench, appliances, or tools of trade supplied by the employer, and workers shall not be permitted to board or sleep upon the premises of their employer.

8. *Grinding Time:* When a worker is discharged or ordered to stand by for two consecutive days, if he has been employed for six consecutive working days he shall be allowed one hour's pay or time equivalent; or if he has been employed for twelve consecutive working days he shall be allowed two hours' pay or time equivalent.

9. *Under-rate Workers*: Any worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum wage may be paid such lesser wage as may from time to time be agreed upon in writing between the union and the employer, and in default of such agreement within twenty-four hours after such worker shall have applied in writing to the secretary of the union stating his desire that such wage shall be agreed upon, such wage as shall be fixed by the most convenient resident or police magistrate upon the application of such worker, after twenty-four hours' notice in writing shall have been given by him to the said secretary, who shall, if he so desire, be heard by the magistrate upon such application. After having given notice to the secretary, and after lodging the application mentioned, and pending the magistrate's decision thereon, the worker shall be entitled to work for and be employed at the proposed lesser rate. The determination of the magistrate shall have effect for the period of six calendar months from the date thereof, and after the expiration of the said period until the wage shall have been again fixed at the instance of the said secretary in the manner prescribed. The secretary of the union may by writing under his hand appoint an agent or substitute to represent the union at the hearing of the application before the magistrate.

10. *Piecework*.—A worker employed on piecework shall be paid not less than the minimum time rate hereinbefore prescribed for a worker employed in the same class of work.

11. *Apprentices*.—(a) In this award a "duly registered apprentice" means an apprentice of whose apprenticeship notice has been given to the Clerk of the Court, in accordance with the provisions of this clause; and a "duly registered probationer" means a person working as an apprentice on probation of whose probationary period notice has been given to the Clerk of the Court in accordance with the provisions of this clause. Provided, that an apprentice or probationer shall be deemed to be duly registered during the period of fourteen days allowed for registration.

(b) Any employer hereafter taking an apprentice or probationer shall, within fourteen days thereafter, register such apprentice or probationer, by giving notice thereof to the Clerk of the Court in the prescribed form.

(c) If at the date of this award any employer is employing any person as an apprentice or a probationer who has not been duly registered as such, he shall register such apprentice or probationer within fourteen days thereafter.

(d) The maximum number of apprentices allowed to any employer in any branch shall be in the proportion of one apprentice to every two or fraction of two journeymen employed by him in that branch: Provided that an employer shall not be entitled to have apprentices to any branch in the same year of their apprenticeship in a greater proportion than one to every four, or fraction of four, journeymen employed by him in that branch: Provided also, that this award shall not operate to render unlawful, or to vary the terms or provisions of any apprenticeship existing at the date of its commencement.

(e) For the purpose of ascertaining the number of apprentices allowed to be taken at any time, the number of journeymen employed shall be deemed to be the average number of journeymen employed on all working days of the six months immediately preceding such time.

(f) Apprentices may be taken to any one of the branches of the Furniture trade mentioned in the classification set out in Clause 6, and shall be engaged under the terms hereinafter set forth.

(g) The term of apprenticeship to the machining branch shall be four years, and to any other branch five years. A probationary period of three months previous to being bound shall be lawful, such probationary period to be deemed portion of the term of apprenticeship. In the event of a lap-boy becoming apprenticed one half of the time during which he has been employed as a lap-boy shall count as service under his indentures of apprenticeship.

(h) Should any employer from unforeseen circumstances be unable to carry out his obligations to his apprentice, he shall be allowed to transfer the apprentice to complete his term with another employer; but it shall be incumbent upon such former employer to notify the Clerk of the Court of the date of such transfer and when such apprenticeship commenced. (Form 2 in the Appendix hereto.)

(i) The following provisions shall apply in respect of all apprenticeships—

- (1) An employer shall be deemed to undertake the duty which he agrees to perform as a duty enforceable under this award, and shall, subject to the provisions of Sub-clause (o) pay the apprentice the rate of wages herein provided.
- (2) At the end of the period of apprenticeship the employer shall give the apprentice a certificate (Form 5 in the Appendix hereto) to show that he has served his apprenticeship. Should the employer at any time before the termination of the term of apprenticeship desire to dispense with the services of the apprentice, he may, with the consent of the apprentice, transfer him to another employer carrying on business within a reasonable distance of the original employer's place of business, willing to continue to teach the apprentice and to pay the rate of wages prescribed by this award, according to the total length of time served and generally to perform the obligations of the original employer. He shall also give to the apprentice a certificate of the time served and of the rate of wages paid, and shall give notice to the Clerk of the Court of such transfer in the form provided (Form 2 in the Appendix hereto). It shall not be obligatory upon the employer to find the apprentice another employer if he shall so misconduct himself as to entitle the employer to discharge him, but he shall nevertheless give him a certificate for the time actually served.
- (3.) An employer shall be deemed to fail in his duty towards his apprentice if he neglects to keep him constantly at work, but slackness of work may form a proper ground for transferring him to a master willing to undertake the responsibility of teaching him.

- (4.) When an apprentice is discharged for cause, the employer shall send notice in writing of the discharge, and the cause thereof, to the said Clerk of the Court (Form 3 in the Appendix hereto).
- (j.) The minimum wage payable to an apprentice shall be—

(k.) Every apprentice shall be bound to submit himself to examination by a Board of Examiners hereinafter constituted once in each year of his service when called upon by the Clerk of the Court so to do.

(l.) The Clerk of the Court shall notify the Board of Examiners of the names and addresses of all candidates required to submit themselves to examination. The examination will be held at the place where the apprentice is employed, and it shall be the duty of each employer to provide such necessary material and machinery as may be required, and in all ways to facilitate the conduct of the examination.

(m.) The examination will be held in the month of May in each year. The Board of Examiners shall consist of two persons skilled in the trade to be nominated by the union and by the employers carrying on business within the area to which this award applies, or, failing such nomination, or nominations, such person, or persons, as may be appointed for that purpose by the Court. In the event of a disagreement between the Examiners, the matter in dispute shall be referred to a third person agreed to by them, or nominated by the Court, or the President, at the request of either member, and the decision of such third person shall be final and conclusive. The examiners shall examine the work of and inquire into the diligence of each apprentice and as to the opportunities provided by the employer to each apprentice to learn.

(n.) The examiners shall report to the Court in writing as to the result of the examination.

(o.) The clerk of the Court shall apply to each candidate a certificate showing the result of his examination, and it shall be lawful for any employer to withhold the increase in wages accruing in accordance with the scale set forth in subclause (j) hereof, from any apprentice who fails to satisfy the examiners.

(p.) If the examiners report to the Court that any employer has not provided sufficient opportunity for the apprentice to learn, the employer shall be deemed *prima facie* guilty of a breach of this award under Section 90 of the Act, and may be summoned before the Court. Upon any such proceeding the report may be received in evidence.

(q.) Such fees shall be paid by the Clerk to the examiners as the Court shall allow.

12. *Record Book* : The employer shall keep, or cause to be kept, a time-and-wages book wherein shall be entered the name of each employee, the time he commences and finishes work each day, the hours worked on each day, the overtime worked each day, and the wages due therefor. Such book shall be entered up from day to day in legible English characters, and shall be initialed weekly, if correct, by each employer.

The employer and employee shall be severally responsible for the proper posting up of the book, which shall be open to the inspection of a duly authorised representative of the union on the employer's premises, in a place convenient to the employer during all working hours.

13. *Posting Award*.—A copy of this award to be supplied by the union shall be posted up by the employer in a conspicuous place in his workshop.

14. *Area*.—This award shall apply over the area comprised within a radius of twenty miles from the General Post Office, Perth.

The Court of Arbitration of Western Australia doth hereby make the following award in connection with the industrial dispute between the above-mentioned parties:—

AWARD.

1. *Scope of Award.*—This award shall apply to employers engaged in the production and retail delivery, or in the retail delivery only, of milk, and to workers employed by such employers.

2. *Hours.*—The week's work shall consist of sixty hours actual work exclusive of holidays and meal hours. No milk carter shall start on his round before 4 o'clock a.m.

3. *Overtime.*—All times worked in excess of the usual working hours in any one day, or beyond sixty hours in the week, shall be paid for as overtime at the rate of time and a-half.

4. *Holidays.*—The worker shall be allowed a half-holiday on Christmas Day, Boxing Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, New Year's Day, Eight Hours' Day, and every Sunday, and on some day during each week as shall be mutually agreed upon between the employer and the worker.

Should the worker be called upon to work more than six hours on any of the aforesaid days he shall, in addition to his weekly wage, be paid at the rate of 1s. 6d. per hour or fraction of an hour for all time beyond such six hours.

5. *Wages.*—The minimum rate of pay for a milk carter or a yardman (other than a junior worker) shall be £3 per week, without board and lodging, and shall be paid in cash.

In establishments in which a yardman is employed one junior worker may be employed to assist in yardman's work.

A "junior worker" shall mean a worker under the age of nineteen years. The minimum wage payable to junior workers shall be determined in accordance with the following scale, viz.:—

Junior worker up to 17 years	£1 10s.	per week.
" " 18 "	£1 17s. 6d.	"
" " 19 "	£2 5s.	"

6. *Board and Lodging.*—Unless it is impracticable for a worker to secure other suitable accommodation within half a mile of his employer's premises, he shall not board or lodge with his employer.

In case the worker shall lodge with his employer no charge shall be made in respect of such lodging unless the employer shall provide a suitable room and bedding, and in no case shall the charge for such lodging exceed 5s. per week.

7. *Record Book.*—Each employer shall keep a time and wages book, which shall show the name of each worker, the time he starts and finishes work each day, the total hours and the amount of overtime worked, the wages paid and worker's signature for same. The employer and worker shall both be responsible for the posting of the book daily. The said book shall be available for inspection by a representative of the Union at least once in each month during working hours.

8. *Under-rate Workers.*—Any worker who, by reason of old age or infirmity, is unable to earn the minimum wage, may be paid such lesser wage as may from time to time be agreed upon in writing between the union and the employer, and in default of such agreement within twenty-four hours after such worker shall have applied in writing to the secretary of the union stating his desire that such wage should be agreed upon, such wage as shall be fixed by the most convenient resident or police magistrate upon the application of such worker after twenty-four hours' notice in writing shall have been given by him to the said secretary, who shall, if he so desires, be heard by the magistrate upon such application. After having given notice to

the secretary, and after lodging the application mentioned, and pending the magistrate's decision thereon, the worker shall be entitled to work for and be employed at the proposed lesser rate. The determination of the magistrate shall have effect for the period of six calendar months from the date thereof, and after the expiration of the said period until the wage shall have been again fixed at the instance of the said secretary in the manner prescribed. The secretary of the union may, by writing under his hand, appoint an agent or substitute to represent the union at the hearing of the application before the magistrate.

9. *Area.*—This award shall apply over the area comprised within a radius of twenty miles from the General Post Office, Perth.

10. *Term.*—This award shall be binding upon the above-mentioned applicant and upon such of the above-named respondents as are engaged in the production and retail delivery, or in the retail delivery only, of milk, and shall continue in force for a period of three years from its date: Provided that at any time after the expiration of twelve months from its date the Court may alter or amend the same on the application of any party or person affected by its provisions.
