WHEREAS by "The Early Closing Act, 1902," it is enacted that the Governor may, by Proclamation, temporarily suspend the operation of the said Act, in so far as it applies to the closing time fixed and appointed for any shop or shops: And whereas it is expedient to exercise such power in manner hereinafter appearing: Now therefore I, the said Governor, acting with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby by this Proclamation suspend the operation of the said Act (including all amendments thereof) on the 31st day of October, the 2nd and 3rd days of November, 1916, between the hours of 6.30 and 9 o'clock in the evening, and on the 1st day of November, 1916, between the hours of 1 o'clock and 9 o'clock in the evening, in so far as it applies to the closing time of hairdressers' shops situated in the shop district of Katanning.

WAR COUNCIL ACT, 1915.

Additional Regulation.

14a. Every person, society, committee, body, or association of persons holding funds or collections in money or kind, or engaged in or undertaking the collection and distribution of collections in money or kind, for objects and purposes pertaining to the present war or other objects within the scope of "The War Council, 1915," shall within one month from the date of the publication of this Regulation in the *Government Gazette* make application to the Council, in a form to be approved by the Council, to be registered under these Regulations, and shall furnish all such information, particulars, and details regarding the collections made prior to such date, and which may from time to time thereafter be made, and the disbursement thereof, as the Council may from time to time require; and no person, society, committee, body, or association of persons hereafter desirous of establishing any fund or making any appeal for any of the objects above-mentioned shall establish such fund or make such appeal until application for registration be made as aforesaid and approved by the Council.

FREMANTLE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL.

By-laws.

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Health Act, 1911," a Local Authority may make By-laws: Now, therefore, the Fremantle Municipal Council, being the Local Authority in and for the Health District of Fremantle, doth hereby make the following By-laws for the annual licensing cowkeepers, dairymen, and vendors of milk and cream, and the annual registration of dairies, milk stores, and milk shops, and prohibiting the sale of milk or cream by other than licensed persons, and except from registered dairies, milk stores, or milk shops.

1. Interpretation:

"Cowkeeper or Dairyman" means any person being the owner or having the care or control of any cow or cows or any goat or goats from which the milk or cream is sold or otherwise disposed of to any other person.

"Vendor" means any person who sells or otherwise disposes of milk or cream to any other person.

2. (a) Every person who, at the coming into operation of these By-laws is carrying on the business of a cowkeeper, dairyman, or vendor, and whose premises are not registered with the Local Authority, shall, within one month therefrom, make application to the Local Authority for a license to carry on such business and for registration of the premises wherein such business is carried on.

(b) Every person, who after the coming into operation of these By-laws, desires to commence the business of a cowkeeper, dairyman, or vendor shall, prior to commencing such business, make application to the Local Authority for a license to carry on such business and for the registration of the premises whereon such business is intended to be carried on.

(c) Every such application shall be made to the Local Authority in the form of Schedule A hereto, and upon the granting of such application a license and registration shall be issued in the form of Schedule B hereto.

3. (a) During the first week in January of each year every person carrying on the business of a cowkeeper, dairyman, or vendor shall apply for a license to carry on such business and for registration of the premises upon which such business is carried on.

(b) Every license and registration effected under these By-laws shall operate only during the current calendar year.

4. Every person making application as provided in By-laws 2 and 3 shall lodge a registration fee in accordance with the scale set out in Schedule C hereto, and upon the refusal of any such application shall be entitled to the return of such fee. Provided that if the license and registration in any year shall commence after the first day of July of that year, one-half the fee shall be paid by the applicant.

5. All persons carrying on the business of cow-keepers, dairymen, or vendors of milk or cream, within the district of the said Local Authority, who fail or neglect to apply for registration as required by these By-laws, shall be guilty of an offence against these By-laws.

6. The Local Authority doth hereby prohibit the sale of milk by other than licensed persons and except from registered dairies, milk stores, or milk shops.

By-law No. 10 passed by the Fremantle Local Board of Health the 27th day of June, 1904, is hereby repealed.

NOTICE TO MARINERS.

NOTICE is hereby given, for the guidance of Mariners and others using the Entrance Channel to Fremantle Inner Harbour, that a new steel tripod beacon has been placed on the line of the Southern edge of the dredged channel, at a position approximately 800 feet distant from and in a Westerly direction from the South Mole Lighthouse.

This beacon will exhibit at night a white fixed light from 26th September till 2nd October, 1916, when the colour will be changed to green.

Simultaneously on 2nd October, 1916, the lights at present exhibited from the two other beacons marking the Southern edge of the dredged channel will be changed from fixed white to fixed green.

It should be noted that these beacon lights are approximately sixteen feet outside the edge of the dredged channel.

COURT OF ARBITRATION, WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

No. 5 of 1916.

Between the Collie River District Miners' Union of Workers (hereinafter referred to as "the union"), Applicant, and The Collie District Collieries Industrial Union of Employers (hereinafter included under the designation of "the employers"), Respondents.

AWARD.

The Court of Arbitration of Western Australia (hereinafter called "the Court") having taken into consideration the matter of an industrial dispute between the above-named parties, and having heard the union and the employers by their respective representatives duly appointed, and having heard and considered the evidence adduced on behalf of the union and the employers respectively, doth hereby order and award that as between the union and the members thereof, and the employers and each of them, the terms, conditions, and provisions contained in the Agreement that existed between the parties prior to the reference of this dispute to the Court, together with the modifications and additions made by the Court as contained in the schedule hereto, shall be binding on the union and the members thereof, and upon the employers and each of them, and that the said terms, conditions, and provisions shall be deemed to be and they are hereby incorporated into and declared to form part of this award: And, further, that the union and the members thereof, and the employers and each of them, shall respectively do, observe, and perform every matter and thing on the part of the union and the members thereof and on the part of the employers and each of them respectively, required to be done, observed, and performed, and shall not do anything in contravention of the said terms, conditions, and provisions, but shall in all respects abide by, and observe, and perform the same.

THE SCHEDULE HEREINBEFORE REFERRED TO.

1. *Hewing Rate.*—The hewing rate at all places worked on the face shall be four shillings and threepence per ton. If during the currency of the award there shall be any fluctuation in the selling price of coal by the employers to the Government above the sum of eleven shillings per ton, then the hewing rate shall rise or fall one penny per ton for every threepence per ton increase or decrease in the selling price above eleven shillings per ton.

2. *Day Wage Workers.*—In the event of the employers getting an increase or decrease in the maximum selling price of coal, viz., eleven shillings, then the employer shall increase, or may decrease, the wages of every worker of the age of nineteen years and over, one penny per day, for every penny increase or decrease in the selling price of coal of eleven shillings per ton. Workers under the age of nineteen years shall in such case be paid or may have their wages reduced half the above-mentioned increases or decreases.

3. *Bords.*—Bords worked on end of coal shall be worked on shift work until otherwise mutually provided for.

4. *Cross-cut Work.*—When a bord is driven from ten degrees or more from a right angle to the cleavage of the coal is shall be deemed to be worked on the cross, and in addition to the hewing rate the following shall be paid: From ten degrees to sixteen degrees, one penny per ton; from sixteen degrees to twenty-two degrees, twopence; and from twenty-two degrees upwards, threepence per ton. The above degrees to be reduced to lineal measurement as per an endorsed scale between employers and the union.

5. *Headings.*—Headings from ten degrees up to sixteen degrees, sixpence per yard extra; over sixteen degrees, one shilling per yard extra.

6. *Turning away Bords.*—For turning away bords twelve feet wide, four shillings per yard shall be paid, and for cutting out from twelve feet to twenty-four feet, sixteen shillings shall be paid in addition to the hewing rate. Heading price shall be paid for bords turning away nine feet wide, and twenty-two and sixpence shall be paid for cutting out from nine feet to twenty-four feet.

7. *Narrow Work.*—For heading and cut-through work not less than nine feet wide, the following prices shall be paid, viz., single, seven shillings; double, seven shillings and sixpence; and three shifts, eight shillings per yard. One penny per ton shall be paid where two shifts, and twopence per ton where three shifts are worked in addition to ordinary tonnage rates.

For narrow bords or cut-throughs not less than twelve feet wide, four shillings per yard in addition to the above-mentioned rates shall be paid.

For narrow bords not less than eighteen feet wide, two shillings and sixpence per yard in addition to the above-mentioned rates shall be paid.

8. *Two Shift Work.*—Miners engaged in bords or cut-throughs which are being worked two shifts shall be paid one penny per ton, and where three shifts are being worked, twopence per ton in addition to the ordinary tonnage rates. Where two shifts are being worked all men shall have every alternate week on day shift.

9. *Standard Height.*—The standard height shall be five feet, and all work performed in places under five feet shall be paid for at the rate of one penny per ton per inch extra.

10. *Refuse.*—If there is any refuse in the coal worked, the price to be paid shall be in addition to the hewing rate. For anything up to the first three inches, one penny per ton, and one half-penny per ton per inch afterwards. Before any refuse scale comes into force, the refuse must be of sufficient thickness to necessitate its being picked out of the coal.

11. *Wet Work.*—Water shall be removed out of the place at the commencement of each shift, in order to allow the miners commencing their work in comfort. During the continuance of each shift water shall be kept as clear from the working place as is practicable, so as to enable the worker to prosecute his work in comfort during the continuance of each shift. If it is not practicable and reasonably possible to remove the water from the place as provided for in this clause, then another place shall be provided for the workers so as to obviate the necessity of them losing time whilst em-

ployed in the mine. Any underground worker on day wages, or otherwise, shall be compensated if he be compelled to stand in water, or if water drips on him in sufficient quantity to inconvenience him in his work. Should any dispute arise and failing a settlement, the worker shall be found a fresh place, if available, until such time as the dispute is settled by the arbitration provided for in Clause 33: Provided that the amount of compensation to be paid (if any) shall not be less than one shilling and sixpence per day per man.

12. *Timbering*.—For fixing timber the following shall be paid:—One shilling and sixpence for each slab; three shillings for each bar (the term "bar" shall apply to timber nine feet long and six inches at the small end).

13. *Wheelers*.—When workers are engaged on tonnage rates, wheelers shall take all empty skips to and remove all full skips from the face of the working places.

14. *Rails*.—The employers shall lay all necessary rails to the miners' places, with the exception of the six-foot length next to the face. In the event of the rails into the miners' places being pulled up for the employers' convenience, they shall be re-laid by the employer before the men resume work.

15. *Regular Turn of Skips*.—Every effort shall be made by the employer to secure a regular turn of skips, so as to allow the workers to earn the minimum wage, having regard alike to the interest of the mine and the workers, and neither the employer nor the workers shall violate the spirit of this condition, nor endeavour to secure or encourage its violation. In the event of any place not being ready for an empty skip when available, the turn shall pass to the next place ready to take it.

16. *Cavil*.—There shall be a general cavil for places at the close of the months of March, June, September, and December of each year. Places shall be ballotted for in the usual way. Cavilling for "special" places shall precede that of the general, and in case of any place starting "special" during the quarter, it shall be ballotted for among the miners desiring to put in for it, but so as not to prevent the manager from making special arrangements for special work. Persons cavilling for "specials" shall be subject to the approval of the manager and the two scrutineers appointed by the men.

17. *Places stopped and re-started*.—Should work at any time be stopped and re-started during the period of the cavil, the men working in it at the time of stopping shall, if available, have the first option of again working it.

18. *Continuation of Employment*.—When work at any place is finished or stopped during the period for which the cavil is operative, the men working at such place shall be entitled to work at any other place that is ready and vacant. If there be no such vacant place, the men shall nevertheless be entitled to be included in the next general cavil for places.

19. *Places left in Good Order*.—All places shall be left in good and proper order. Should any place be left unfair, two competent miners shall be appointed (one from each adjoining place) to examine the place and to decide as to the value of the deficiency, which shall be paid by the out-going men to the in-coming men.

20. *Wheelers' and Shiftmen's Cavil*.—One wheeler and one shiftman shall be allowed to cavil each quarter, provided that they find suitable mates prepared to take them on the coal. Preference to be given to the wheeler and shiftman who have been longest employed: Provided, further, that no wheeler nor shiftman shall be allowed to cavil unless there are more than sufficient places available for the miners already employed.

21. *Employers to find certain Tools*.—The employers shall find all spanners and files used in or about the mine, and also all augers half-inch and over used by the carpenters.

22. *Reduction of Hands*.—In the event of the management deeming it necessary to reduce hands, the last man employed in the particular class of work in which the reduction of hands is to be made shall be the first to go; but in the event of such worker having been shifted from one class of work to another, then he shall be treated as if he were employed at his last job from the date he last signed on at the mine.

23. *Holidays*.—The following holidays will be observed:—New Year's Day, Foundation Day (26th January), Good Friday, Easter Monday, Eight Hours' Day, Boxing Day, and Parliamentary contested Election day. Parliamentary contested Election Day is hereby defined to mean and include the following election days, but only when the election is being contested:—

Federal Parliament General Election Day;

W.A. State Parliament General Election Day;

The day fixed for the holding of a by-election of a member of either House of the Federal or State Parliament for the district in which the Colliery Coalfield is included.

Every worker shall have the right to an annual holiday not exceeding fourteen consecutive days, in addition to the above-mentioned holidays.

Arrangements shall be made between the manager and the local representatives at each mine as to the date upon which such holiday shall commence: Provided, always, that such time shall be selected as shall cause the least inconvenience to the employer.

24. *Pay Saturday*.—The general custom of observing the pay Saturday as a holiday shall be the rule under this award: Provided, always, that the workers shall, if required by the employer, work on that day; but it must be distinctly understood that this provision shall not be taken advantage of by the employer in making a practice of working the mine on such pay Saturday. If at any time during the currency of this award it shall be proved to the satisfaction of the Court that any employer has unnecessarily called upon his employees to work on pay Saturday, he shall be deemed to have committed a breach of this award. In the case of an underground worker working on pay Saturday, six hours from the time he commences to descend the mine until he returns to the surface shall be deemed to be equivalent to the full shift, and shall be paid for accordingly, and in the case of a surface worker six hours' actual work shall be equivalent to and be paid for as a full shift. Should the worker be required to work less than six hours, then such time as he has worked shall be deemed to be full time. Should he cease work of his own accord, he shall be paid at the ordinary rate for such time as he has actually worked.

25. *Deduction from Wages*.—The employer may deduct from the workers' wages all moneys as agreed upon for the doctor's fund and accident relief fund.

26. *Wages Schedule.*—Workers of the age of nineteen years and upwards shall be paid not less than the following:—

27. *Shiftman defined.*—The term “shiftman” shall include roadman, timberman, a man working at or after a coal-cutting machine, trimming sides, roads, bottoms, cutting drains, a brusher or furnaceman who gets his own coal.

28. *Pieceworkers to find their own Tools.*—All men employed on contract work must find their own oil, explosives, and tools. The wheelers and underground workers their own oil.

29. *Shiftmen's Tools.*—All shiftmen on the coal supplied with tools by the employer will be required to return the same to the employer on the completion of work, otherwise payment shall be charged for same.

30. *Pay Day.*—The wages shall be paid to the workers on every alternate Friday. Wages shall be paid on the same date at each colliery.

31. *Fair Share of Work.*—Workers shall have an equal share of work prevailing in the mine in their respective grades.

32. *Minimum Wage in Contracts.*—No contracts shall take place without the sanction of the employers and the executive of the union. All contracts other than those for employment at hewing rates and tonnage rates shall contain or be deemed to contain a provision whereby the employer undertakes to pay at least the minimum wage hereinbefore prescribed in respect to the work to be performed.

33. *Workers performing Higher or Lower Duties.*—In the event of a worker being called upon to work in a grade lower than that in which he is usually employed, he shall suffer no reduction in his wages. In the event of a worker being called upon to do work of a higher grade than that at which he is usually employed for half a shift in any one shift, he shall be paid the higher rate for the whole shift. The words “work at which he is usually employed” shall be deemed to mean the rating of the workers in question in the company's books at the commencement of each pay-fortnight. If a worker be permanently transferred from one grade to another during the currency of the fortnight, then the words “work at which he is usually employed” shall mean the last permanent rating of the said worker in the company's books. Should there be any dispute as to the last permanent rating, then such dispute shall be settled by private arbitration as provided in Clause 38 of this award.

34. *Workers under the age of nineteen years.*—All workers under the age of nineteen years employed at any class of work not specially mentioned shall be paid at such rates as may be fixed by mutual agreement between the management and such worker or workers, subject to the approval of the general secretary of the union. If the said secretary does not consider the said wage satisfactory, he shall notify the manager in writing of the reasons of his dissatisfaction, and if after a conference between the said secretary and the management they fail to agree upon the wages to be paid in the particular case or cases about which the conference has been held, then the said case or cases shall be settled in the manner provided for by Clause 38. Provided, always, that the wage to be awarded to any set-rider under the age of nineteen years shall not be less than nine shillings and one penny per day.

35. *Cope-over.*—The term “cope-over” or “cope” shall mean the place at which the empty skip is usually tipped to allow the full skip to pass. It shall be the duty of the employer to provide a cope-over or cope as near as practicable to the place where the skip stands to be filled. It shall be the duty of the wheeler to help, if necessary, the filler or fillers to shove the skips from the cope-over or cope to the place where the ship stands to be filled. Providing that if the cope-over or cope is more than eight yards from such place, then the filler or fillers shall be deemed to be hand wheeling for the time occupied in shoving the skip from the cope-over to the place where it stands to be filled, and shall be paid for at the increased rate provided for in Clause 33 of this award.

36. *Incapacitated Workers.*—In the event of any worker over the age of nineteen being so incapacitated by accident or old age as to be unable to perform the task of an adult worker, he shall be allowed, after receiving the sanction of the union, to perform work other than that provided for in Clause 28 of this award for an adult worker, and his rate of pay shall be fixed, if not mutually agreed upon, between the worker and the employer and the executive of the union as provided for in Clause 38 of this award.

37. *Tonnage Rates after Machines.*—In the event of any of the employers desiring to introduce tonnage rates for shooting, boring, and filling, and doing all other work, other than holing the seam, such rates may be settled by an agreement arrived at between the particular employer and the union, and every such agreement shall include all clauses in this award with the exception of Clause 4, but due consideration shall be given to the cross-cut work in the total price to be paid.

38. *Local Arbitration Clause.*—Any matter in dispute of any kind whatever in connection with the working conditions, discharge of workmen, or any other thing not provided for in this award, shall forthwith be referred to a board of arbitration consisting of the employer or his manager and the general secretary of the union, for amicable settlement. Failing a settlement, the arbitrators so appointed shall appoint an umpire to decide the matter in dispute. Should they fail to agree upon an umpire

within forty-eight hours, the Inspector of Mines for the district shall act as umpire, and the decision of such person shall be final. There shall be no cessation of work whilst a settlement is being arrived at. The persons appointed as a board of arbitration as herein provided may, when determining any dispute referred for their arbitration, direct that the costs (if any) occasioned by the proceedings shall be paid by one specified party or parties to the other or others, and the parties to this award shall abide by and literally comply with any such direction.

39. *Afternoon and Midnight Shifts.*—Afternoon and midnight shifts shall not operate at any of the mines working less than nine shifts a fortnight unless for the purpose of repairs to the mine, preparing machine-cut coal for the next working day's operations, and the driving of main dip headings, and other development work: Provided that this clause shall not apply to the Westralian Coal Mining Company, Limited, for a period of three months from the date of this award; and provided further, that the Court reserves to itself the right to grant a further period of exemption from the provisions of this clause to the Westralian Coal Mining Company, Limited, or to any other employer, upon application being made to the Court in that behalf.

Notice of such application shall be given to the union, who shall, if it so desires, be entitled to appear and be heard in opposition.

40. *Day Wage and Tonnage Rates.*—Where tonnage rate is in operation in any mine, no coal shall be got on day wages other than that from the main dip headings and their connections, places deemed deficient by the scrutineers and management, work done for the purpose of development, maintenance, and upkeep.

41. *Minimum Number of Days.*—The companies shall find, as far as practicable and consistent with Clause 22, nine days' work per fortnight for all men getting coal. No company which has worked less than twenty-seven shifts during a period of six weeks shall increase the number of men employed in getting coal unless for the purpose of an increased output.

42. *Area.*—This award shall apply to the whole of the Collie Coalfields.

43. *Term.*—This award shall continue in force for a period of three years from its date: Provided that, at any time after the expiration of twelve months from its date, the Court may alter or amend the same on the application of any party or person affected by its provisions.

44. *All Workers to be Members of Union.*—Every worker engaged by the employers shall become members of the union within three weeks of their engagement, and the union hereby agrees to accept him as a member. This provision, however, shall not apply to officials and deputy or members of the mechanical staff of the mine. The term "deputy" as used in this clause, means a person in charge of a district in the mine and classified as such on the pay-sheet.
