WHEREAS by "The Game Act, 1912-13," it is provided that the Governor may from time to time, by Proclamation, declare any one or more portions of the State or any one or more localities to be respectively defined in such Proclamation a Reserve for Native Game or any particular Native Game: Now therefore I, the said Governor, in exercise of the power aforesaid, do hereby, with the advice of the Executive Council, declare that the portions of the State and localities mentioned and defined in the Schedule hereto shall be a Reserve for Kangaroos.

The whole of the area included within the boundaries of the Esperance Magisterial District.

Successful appointees must comply with the life assurance provisions of the Public Service Act and Regulations.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to approve of the amendment of Regulation 36 of the Education Department, to read as under.

36. The annual salaries of teachers in charge of schools shall be according to the following scale:—

		Male.	Female.
Class	I.—	£380 to £450	£320 to £370.
Class	II.—	£340 to £380	£280 to £320.
Class	III.—	£310 to £340	£260 to £280.
Class	IV.—	£270 to £300	£230 to £250.
Class	V.—	£240 to £270	£210 to £230.
Class	VI.—	£210 to £240	£190 to £210.
Class	VII.—	£160 to £200	£140 to £170.
Class	VIII.—	£110 to £150	£110 to £140.

(a) Annual increments of £10 will be given, at the discretion of the Minister, until the maximum of the class is reached, provided that the teacher's record for the year is satisfactory, and that his efficiency mark is not less than 60. No teacher is eligible for an increase unless he has held his salary for at least eight months before the end of the year. Increments are given only at the beginning of a new year.

(b) No teacher with the C3 classification in charge of a school shall receive less than £130 (man) or £120 (woman). If the teacher has had a year's previous experience with satisfactory reports before gaining the C3, the salary shall be £140 (man) or £130 (woman). No teacher with the C2 classification in charge of a school shall receive less than £140 (man) or £130 (woman). If the teacher has had a year's previous experience with satisfactory reports before gaining the C2, the salary shall be £150 (man) or £140 (woman). A male teacher with the C2 classification in charge of a school of Class VII. may rise to a salary of £160. No unclassified teacher shall receive more than £140 (man) or £130 (woman).

(c) The salaries of Head Teachers appointed to First Class Schools after February, 1913, shall be subject to the following limitations:—

- (1) The salary of a male Head Teacher shall not rise beyond £420, unless his school has at least 50 children enrolled in Classes VII. and VIII.
- (2) The salary of a female Head Teacher shall not rise beyond £350, unless her school has at least 50 children enrolled in Classes VII and VIII.
