WHEREAS by Section 9 of "The Land Act, 1898," the Governor may resume, for any of the purposes specified in Section 39 of the said Act, any portion of land held as a Grazing Lease: And whereas it is deemed expedient that the portions of Grazing Lease 2762/68 (portions of Avon Location 4593 and portion of Avon Location 4594), as described hereunder, should be resumed for one of the purposes specified in paragraph 8 of Section 39 of the said Act, that is to say, for a Town-site: Now therefore I, Major General Sir Harry Barron, Governor as aforesaid, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation resume such portions of Grazing Lease 2762/68 for the purpose aforesaid.

Schedule.

Those portions of Grazing Lease 2762/68 (Avon Location 4593), comprising 71 acres 3 roods, exclusive of Railway and Road Reserves, together with that portion of Grazing Lease 2762/68 (Avon Location 4594), comprising 10 acres 0 roods 35 perches, situated East of Road No. 2552, as surveyed and shown on Diagram 8275. WHEREAS by Section 9 of "The Land Act, 1898," the Governor may resume, for any of the purposes specified in Section 39 of the said Act, any portion of land held as a Grazing Lease: And whereas it is deemed expedient that the portion of Grazing Lease 4108/68 (portion of Avon Location 12832), as described hereunder should be resumed for one of the purposes specified in paragraph 6 of Section 39 of the said Act, that is to say, for School site: Now therefore I, Major General Sir Harry Barron, Governor as aforesaid, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation resume portion of Grazing Lease 4108/68 (Avon Location 12832), for the purpose aforesaid.

APPLICATIONS are invited by the Commonwealth Public Service Commissioner from persons qualified for appointment to the following positions.

Applicants outside the Public Service are eligible for appointment to the Administrative and Professional Divisions, but are not eligible for appointment to Clerical or General Division vacancies unless they were in the service of a State on 1st January, 1901, or have retired from the service of the Commonwealth or of a State.

Applicants who are officers of the Public Service of a State should state the date of their appointment to the service, present position, and salary.

Applicants from outside the service should state their qualifications for the office they seek. Copies only of diplomas, references, testimonials, or certificates should be forwarded. If the originals are required they will be asked for.

Date and year of birth should be stated, and applications must be in applicants' hand-writing.

Applications should be addressed to the "Commonwealth Public Service Inspector" of the State in which the vacancy exists, and in the case of officers of the Commonwealth Service be forwarded through the chief officer of the department to which the applicant belongs.

Minimum and maximum salaries, where shown, indicate the limits of the class or grade in which the position is classified. Subject to the provisions of the Public Service Act, appointments may be made at any salary within those limits. Successful appointees must comply with the life assurance provisions of the Public Service Act and Regulations.
