#### ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Executive Council Chamber, at Perth, this 24th day of January, 1917.

#### *Present:*

His Excellency the Governor.

The Honourables—The Premier,

The Minister for Lands.

WHEREAS by "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906," it is provided that the Governor may, by Order in Council, dissolve any municipality and include the district in any adjoining Road District: And whereas it is desirable to abolish the Municipality of Kanowna, and to include the district thereof in the North-East Coolgardie Road District, and to alter the name of the said Road District, divide the said new Road District into Wards, allot the number of members to represent each ward, and to fix the dates necessary for the retirement and election of members of the Board: And whereas notices of intention to do so have been duly given and published in accordance with the respective requirements of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906," and "The Roads Act, 1911": Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby order and declare:—

- (a) That on the 1st day of February, next (1917)—
  - (i.) The Municipality of Kanowna shall be dissolved, and the district thereof included in the North-East Coolgardie Road Board;
  - (ii.) That the name of the North-East Coolgardie Road District shall be altered to that of the Kanowna Road District.
- (b) That the Kanowna Road District shall be divided into two wards, with the names and boundaries, and also with the allotment of members set forth and described in the Schedule hereto.
- (c) That the existing members of the said Road Board shall go out of office on the 21st day of February next (1917), and that in the meantime a fresh roll for the District, as amended and divided into wards, shall be prepared, and the following dates fixed for the purpose of election:—

Preparation of lists—5th February, 1917.

Claims and objections—12th February, 1917.

Revision Court—14th February, 1917.

Signing List—17th February, 1917.

Members to go out of office—21st February, 1917.

Nominations—24th February, 1917.

Elections—3rd March, 1917.

#### *Schedule.*

##### *Town Ward.*

The Town Ward boundaries shall be identical with those of the Kanowna Municipality as at present existing—Three members.

##### *Country Ward.*

The Country Ward shall consist of the balance of the said North-East Coolgardie Road District—Four members.

CREATION of new Ward to be called the Mt. Marshall Ward, and to be formed of certain territory to be excised from the present Korrelocking, Trayning, and Kununoppin Wards, increase the number of members, and determining the number of members for each ward of the said District.

WHEREAS by virtue of the power conferred by the provisions of "The Roads Act, 1911, the Governor may by Order in Council create new wards, alter the boundaries of existing wards, declare the number of members a Board shall consist of, and determine the number of members of each ward of any Road District; And whereas it is desirable to create a new ward to alter the boundaries of certain of the existing wards, declare the number of members the Board shall consist of, and to determine the number of members for each ward of the Ninghan Road District in manner herein-after appearing; And whereas the notice of intention so to do has been duly given and published as required by the provisions of "The Roads Act, 1911": Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby create a new ward to be called and known as the Mt. Marshall Ward, and to consist of that portion of the Ninghan Road District, which is described and comprised in the First Schedule hereto, alter the boundaries of the Korrelocking, Trayning, and Kununoppin Wards accordingly, consequent upon the formation of the said new ward, also declare that the number of members of the Board shall consist of nine members instead of seven as hitherto, and determine the number of members to represent each ward of the Ninghan Road District as set forth in the Second Schedule hereunder.

*First Schedule.**Mount Marshall Ward.*

Comprising all that portion of the territory of the Ninghan Road District North of a line commencing at a point on the Western boundary of the Road District, at the South-East corner of Location 17573; thence East to the North-West corner of Location 14613 along the North boundary of same, and the North boundary of part of Location 14614; thence in an Easterly direction to the North-West corner of Location 16558, and along the Northern boundary to its North-East corner; thence North-East to the South-West corner of Location 16548, along the Southern boundary of same to its South-East corner; thence due East to the Southern side of surveyed road at a point about 60 chains North of Location 14580, and thence in an Easterly direction along said Southern side of road passing along the North boundaries of Avon Locations 15658, 15657, 15652, 14268, 14269, 14270, 14279, 14278, 11776, 11780, 20886, 11777, 14383, and 14384 to the Eastern boundary of the District.

The boundaries of the said present Korrelocking, Trayning, and Kununoppin Wards are altered accordingly.
