PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, } By His Excellency Major General Sir

WHEREAS by Sections 222 and 227 of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906" (6 Edwardi, No. 32), it shall be lawful for the Governor, on request of the Council, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street or way, or any place, bridge, or thoroughfare, to be a public highway, and such land shall thereupon and thenceforth, from the date of such Proclamation, become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force: And whereas the Perth Municipal Council has requested that certain land named and described in the Schedule hereunder which has been dedicated for a street or way within the Municipality of Perth, be declared a public highway: Now therefore I, the said Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation declare the said land to be a public highway, and such land shall, from the date of this Proclamation, be absolutely dedicated to the public as a highway within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force.

WHEREAS by virtue of the power conferred by Section 8 of "The Roads Act, 1911," the Governor may, by Order in Council, re-define the boundaries of any District: And whereas it is desirable to re-define the boundaries of the Upper Irwin Road District, and notice of intention of the Governor to exercise such power has, in accordance with the provisions of "The Roads Act, 1911," been duly published in the *Government Gazette* and served on the Boards concerned: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers contained in "The Roads Act, 1911," and of all other powers him enabling in this behalf, doth hereby re-define the boundaries of the Upper Irwin Road District in the manner set forth and described in the schedule hereunder:—

Schedule.

Bounded by lines commencing from a point at the intersection of the prolongation North of the East boundary of Victoria Location 3553 with the extension East of the North boundary of Pastoral Lease 1907/93, and extending East to the Western boundary of Victoria Location 2013; thence North and East along the latter's West and North boundaries to its North-East corner; thence North along part of the West boundary of Location 1900; thence East along the North boundaries of Locations 1900, 1901, and 1908 to the South-East corner of Location 1917; thence North along part of the latter's East boundary to the North-West corner of Location 2014; thence East and South along the North and East boundaries of the latter to the North boundary of Location 2015; thence East, South, and West, along the North-East and part of the South boundaries of said location to the North-West corner of Location 4522; thence South along the latter's West boundary and that of Location 4120, and the latter's South boundary to its South-East corner; thence South in prolongation of the East boundary of the latter to the North boundary of Location 2018; thence East along the North boundaries of Locations 2018 and 2019, and the East boundary of the latter, to the North boundary of Location 2021; thence East and South along the latter's North and East boundaries and the East boundary of Location 2022 to the North boundary of Location 2023; thence East and South along the North and East boundaries of the latter to its South-East corner; thence East to the West boundary of Location 5787; thence South, East, and North along the latter's West, South, and part of its East boundary to a South-West corner of Pastoral Lease 2384/93; thence East, South, East, and North along a South, a West, again a South, and part of an East boundary of said lease to the South-West corner of Location 3477; thence East along the South boundaries of Locations 3477 and 3476, the West, South, and East boundaries of Location 3475, and the South boundary of Location 5769 to its South-East corner; thence South along the West boundary of Location 5617 and East along part of its South boundary to a line in prolongation North of the West boundary of Location 927.

Bounded on the South by a Westerly line passing along the South boundaries of Locations 3163, 5832, the North, and part of the West boundaries of Locations 5865, 4365, the North boundary of 4026 and its extension.

Bounded on the West by a line commencing at a point on the above South boundary, due South of a point on the South boundary of Victoria Location 2012, about 20 chains East of the 5-mile peg thereon, and extending from said South boundary of the District North to the South boundary of Pastoral Lease 1171/93; thence West, North, and East, along part of the South, the West, and part of the North boundaries of the said lease, to the prolongation North of above-mentioned due North

line; thence North along same to the South boundary of Location 2025; thence East, North, and West along part of the South, the East, and part of the North boundaries of said location to above-mentioned due North line; thence again North along said line to a point in prolongation East of the South boundary of Location 1338; thence West along the said South boundary of Location 1338; thence along a West, a North, and again along a West boundary of Location 1338, the West and part of the North-West boundaries of Location 580, the West boundaries of 666, 874, 1865, 772, and 1208, the latter's North boundary, the West and part of the North boundaries of Location 1281, the West boundary of Location 2404; thence North-Westward along the South-West boundary of Location 2385 and its West boundary, the West boundaries of Locations 2696 and 3550, part of the latter's North boundary, and the East boundaries of Locations 2944 and 3553, and the latter's prolongation to the starting point.
