FREMANTLE HARBOUR TRUST.

Deepening Operations in Inner Harbour and Entrance Channel—Drilling Stage and Punt.

Notice to Mariners.

Notice is hereby given, for the information and guidance of those navigating the Inner Harbour at Fremantle and the Entrance Channel thereto, that in connection with the deepening of the harbour and channel certain drilling stages and drilling punts are in operation.

The drilling stage is a structure measuring approximately 140 feet long by 44 feet broad, held in position by fixed spuds, and is conspicuous from the fact that it has an elevated drilling attachment standing approximately 40 feet high above water level erected upon it.

At night the position of this stage is indicated by red lights marking its extremities on its Southern side and green lights similarly placed on its Northern side. Its position changes with the progress of the work, but it is always as far as possible held fore and aft the channel.

In the neighbourhood of the outer end of the dredged entrance channel the drilling appliance consists of a floating punt or barge measuring 100 feet long by 20 feet broad, having a conspicuous drilling attachment 50 feet high above water level erected upon it. This barge is held in position by moorings, and its position in the channel changes with the progress of the work.

At night the punt is marked by white lights, and it is then drawn to one edge of the channel.

When not in position, the moorings are kept afloat by a wooden droghue or buoy situated on the Southern or Northern edge of the dredged entrance channel as required.

Mariners and all others are warned to keep clear of these appliances and moorings.

Regulation restricting Cutting of Timber on State Forest at Mt. Varden.

Department of Lands and Surveys,
Perth, 9th March, 1917.

HIS Excellency the Lieut.-Governor and Administrator, in Executive Council, has been pleased to make the following Regulation under the provisions of Section 15 of "The Land Act Amendment Act, 1904":—

No person shall, without the special permission in writing of the Minister for Mines or his agent (such permission only to be given where the timber is required for use within the boundaries of the said State Forest), fell, cut, split, or remove any timber growing or standing, or burn any charcoal on the area of Crown lands hereafter to be known and distinguished as the Mt. Varden State Forest, the boundaries of which are described hereunder:—

The Crown lands situated within an area having its boundaries in the meridian and at right angles thereto; being a square block of land comprising 81 square miles, its North-Western corner being situated 124 chains 50 links West and 368 chains 75 links North from Mt. Varden Trig. Station HM (conjoined) 48. (Plan 43/300.)

Any person offending against this Regulation shall, on conviction, be subject to a penalty not exceeding £100.

KALGOORLIE ROAD BOARD.

By-law No. 20.

In pursuance of the powers and provisions in, under, and by virtue of "The Roads Act, 1911," and amendments thereof, the Kalgoorlie Road Board makes and ordains that the following By-laws for the registration and control of Goats be enforced and observed:—

- (a) Every keeper of any goat or goats within the boundaries of the townsite areas under the jurisdiction of the above-mentioned Board shall register with the Board his or her name as keeper of goats and shall register each goat kept, and shall, at the time of registration, pay the sum of sixpence for every goat so owned and kept within such boundaries, and shall place and keep on the neck of every goat so owned, a collar, bearing disc with registration number stamped thereon.
- (b) No person shall suffer any goat or goats in his or her charge or apparent ownership to run loose within such boundaries without a keeper in constant attendance, or the person in whose charge such goat or goats shall be at the time.
- (c) Every person who shall offend against any provision of this By-law shall for every such offence forfeit and pay on conviction a penalty not exceeding Two pounds (£2), irrespective of and in addition to any other fine or damages for trespass to which the defendant shall be subject, and the Board may impound, sell, or destroy any such goat or goats which shall be permitted to run loose as aforesaid.
