The Inspection of Machinery Act, 1904.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.
At the Executive Council Chamber, at Perth, this 9th day of May, 1917.

WHEREAS by Section 14 of "The Inspection of Machinery Act, 1904," the Governor may, by Order in Council published in the Government Gazette, from time to time declare that any kinds of machinery, except as provided in the first paragraph of Section 14 aforesaid,

shall be subject to the provisions of the said Act; and in like manner from time to time to declare that any kinds of machinery shall cease to be machinery subject to the said Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of Western Australia, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby declares and orders that, from and after the date hereunder mentioned, the following kinds and descriptions of machinery shall be deemed to be machinery for the purposes of the said Act, in addition to those mentioned in the Second Schedule thereto, namely:—

All machinery used in, upon, or in connection with mines under the operation of "The Mines Regulation Act, 1906," or "The Coal Mines Regulation Act, 1902," air-compressing, conveying, pumping, exhausting, blowing, refrigerating, propelling any boat, ship or vessel, dredging, preserving, grinding, chaff-cutting, chopping, crushing, and blending of vegetable or other substance, bone-crushing, malting, shearing, wool-presing, flock-milling, in the working of wood, metal, leather, stone, fabrics, or glass, in the making of gas, bricks, soap, or confectionery, in potteries, laundries, bakeries, electric light and power stations, and aerated water and bottling works.

And declares and orders, from and after the date hereunder mentioned, to be exempt from and no longer subject to the said Act, the following machinery (in addition to that specified in Section 4 thereof):—

All machinery where the maximum horse-power of the engine or motor used in connection therewith is under one horse-power and to which "The Inspection of Machinery Act, 1904," now applies or may hereafter apply; also all machinery used for domestic purposes only; also direct acting pumps worked by compresed air, and motor cars used for carrying passengers for reward, electric tram cars, railway carriages, and wagon rolling stock; also ropes and cages used in mining; also all portable spraying plants whose power does not exceed two h.p.

It is hereby further declared and ordered that, from and after the date hereunder mentioned, the notice dated the 28th day of July, 1909, and signed by the Honourable the Minister for Mines for the time being, and published at page 2316 of the Government Gazette of the 30th day of July, 1909, and purporting to affect additions to or exemptions from the Second Schedule to "The Inspection of Machinery Act, 1904," is and snall be cancelled and revoked.

This Order shall come into operation and take effect from the 14th day of May, 1917.

COURT OF ARBITRATION, WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

No. 1 of 1917.

Between Perth Electric Tramways Employees' Union of Workers, Applicant, and the Commissioner for Railways and Tramways, Respondent.

The Court of Arbitration of Western Australia doth hereby make the following award in connection with the industrial dispute between the above-mentioned parties.

AWARD.

- Interpretation.-In this award "easual hand" means a worker employed for less than one week continuously.
- 2. Conductors and Motormen.—(a.) Conductors and motormen shall be divided into two classes, and shall be known as senior and junior conductors and motormen, respectively.
- Of the total number of conductors and motormen from time to time in the employment of the Commissioner 80 per cent. shall be senior and 20 per cent. shall be junior conductors and junior motormen, respectively.
- (b.) Senior conductors and senior motormen shall be guaranteed forty-eight hours' work per week and junior conductors and junior motormen shall be guaranteed ninety-six hours' work per fortnight.
- 3. Employees performing Higher Duties .- Any employee acting in a higher grade shall be paid the minimum rate for that grade, provided that such minimum is not lower than the employee's regular rate of pay. Such time to be computed at the end

Motormen when working one-man cars shall be paid one shilling per day extra; Motormen and Conductors employed as casual hands shall be paid threepence per hour above the minimum.

Trackmen when acting as leading hands shall be paid at the rate of one shilling per day above the minimum;

Labourers employed as casual hands shall be paid one shilling per day above the minimum:

Labourers employed as tar-hands shall receive one shilling per day above the minimum whilst so employed;

Watchman.-The watchman as part of his ordinary duty may be required to do car-body cleaning, but if called upon to act as motorman or conductor shall, in addition to his ordinary pay, be paid at ordinary rates for such work whilst so employed;

Students when engaged learning the duties of motorman or conductor shall be paid half wages, provided that such half wages shall not be paid if the student leaves the employment of the Commissioner voluntarily before he completes two weeks' student-

5. Hours of Duty.-(a.) The ordinary time of duty for workers covered by this award, except junior conductors and junior motormen, horse-drivers, and watchmen, shall be forty-eight hours per week, exclusive of Sunday.

(b.) The ordinary time of duty for junior conductors and junior motormen shall be ninety-six hours per fortnight, exclusive of Sunday.

- (c.) Sixty-five per cent, of the whole of the conductors and motormen for the time being employed on traffic shall complete their shifts within ten hours and thirty-five per cent. within twelve hours.

 (d.) The ordinary time of duty for horse-drivers shall be fifty-four hours per
- week, including Sunday.

 (e.) There shall be no fixed hours of duty for watchmen.

Overtime Rate .- (a.) Trackmen called upon to work after the usual working hours shall be paid for such work at the rate of time and a-quarter.

(b.) All time worked in excess of forty-eight hours in any one week (exclusive of Sunday) by employees other than wetchmen and those specified hereunder, shall be paid for at the rate of time and a-quarter.

- (c.) All time worked in excess of fifty-four hours in any one week, or ninety-six hours in a fortnight (exclusive of Sunday) by junior conductors or junior motormen shall be paid for at the rate of time and a-quarter.
- (d.) All time worked in excess of fifty-four hours in any one week (inclusive of Sunday) by horse-drivers shall be paid for at the rate of time and a-quarter.
- (e.) All time worked in excess of ten hours in any one day by motormen and conductors shall be paid for at the rate of time and a-quarter.
- (f.) Labourers when employed assisting tradesmen shall come under the same overtime conditions as prescribed for tradesmen with whom they are working.
- (g.) Motormen and conductors when required to work special passenger cars between the hours of 1 a.m. and 5 a.m. shall be paid double time, with a minimum payment for two hours at this rate. When such duty is necessitated by accident or repairs to track, this extra allowance shall not apply.
- 7. Payment for Sundays and Special Days.—(a.) All time worked on Sundays, Good Friday, and Christmas Day shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half (except in the case of horse-drivers attending to their horses), and watchmen.

(b.) Sunday time shall stand alone, and be paid for separately from time.

- (c.) Only the actual hours worked on Good Friday and Christmas Day shall be included in the total time worked for the week on which the 25 per cent. overtime allowance shall be paid.
- (d.) Motormen and conductors who finish duty by 12,30 a.m. on Sundays shall not be paid the extra allowance for such time.
- 8. Minimum Payment for Time on Duty.—(a.) Any motorman or conductor booked on duty, and informed before leaving the Depôt that he will not be required shall be allowed two hours' pay.

 (b.) The minimum pay for a spread of shift up to ten hours shall be equivalent to six hours' ordinary pay for each day. If the spread of shift is from ten to eleven and a-half hours, a minimum pay of seven hours' ordinary pay per day shall be paid, and if the spread of shift is from eleven and a-half hours to twelve hours, a minimum pay of eight hours' ordinary pay per day shall be paid.

 (c.) Any employee rostered for duty who shall receive two hours' notice at his place of residence that he is not required, shall not be entitled to any allowance.

 (d.) The provisions of this clause shall not apply to casual hands.

- 9. Meal Relief .- (a.) Motormen and conductors shall not be required to work longer than five and a-half hours between meal relief, except in special cases agreed
- (b.) Motormen and conductors may be allowed a minimum of thirty minutes for meals, but such time may be extended when practicable.
- 10. Call-Backs.—(a.) The Department shall have the right to call back an em-Pioyee for further duty after the completion of his ordinary shift and after booked off; any employee so called back shall be paid for at least two hours.
- (b.) Employees rostered on the morning shift and who come back on duty to 8.30 a.m., shall finish "call-back" duty by 8.30 p.m.
- (c.) Call-back duty which is not confined within twelve consecutive hours of the employee first coming on duty, shall be paid for at the rate of time and a quarter, and (except in the case of junior conductors and junior motormen) shall stand alone.
- (d.) Employees shall not be called back, with the exception of once per week, except during the Easter and Christmas holidays, or to take the place of any member of the staff at sent through sickness or other causes. The name of the person relieved to be exhibited on the notice board at the Car Barn.
- (e.) When an employee is required to continue on duty after completing his rostered shift it shall not be deemed a "call-back.
- 11. Duty Rosters.—(a.) Rosters shall be posted showing the shifts of motormen and conductors (other than junior conductors and jurior motormen) for one week in advance. Such roster may be amended from day to day if necessary to reduce over-time or make up short time. When necessary to reduce a roster to adjust overtime, it shall be done either at the commencement or end of a shift.

(b.) Motormen and conductors may, at any time, be called upon to do car-body

- cleaning, or other such work in Car Barn as may be required.

 (c.) Rostered shifts shall be made to rotate as far as practicable.

 (d.) Motormen and conductors shall be signed on and off duty a Motormen and conductors shall be signed on and off duty at the Car Barn, Town Hall, or at such other place as may be appointed after agreement between the parties.
- (e.) A motorman or conductor shall not be called or booked up for duty unless he has nad ten hours off, except in the case of emergency, or when it is necessary to bring him on sooner to facilitate rotation or change of shifts, or in the case of "call-
- (f.) Motormen and conductors required for Sunday duty shall be rostered in rotation when practicable.
- (g.) Motormen and conductors (junior motormen and junior conductors excepted)
- (g.) Motormen and conductors (jumor motormen and jumor conductors excepted) shall be paid not less than two hours for the second portion of a rostered shift.

 (h.) Employees may on obtaining approval from the officer in charge exchange shifts or days off. Overtime incurred through such exchange shall not be paid for.

 12. Time Allowance for booking on and off Duty.—Motormen shall be granted an allowance of five minutes when first signing on duty and five minutes when finally signing off duty, making a total allowance of ten minutes per day. Conductors shall be granted an allowance of ten minutes when first signing on duty and ten minutes when finally signing off duty, making a total allowance of twenty minutes per day. These
- finally signing off duty, making a total allowance of twenty minutes per day. allowances shall apply irrespective of the point at which motormen and conductors may
- commence or cease duty, and shall count as portion of the week's work.

 13. Holidays.—(a.) After twelve months' continuous employment in the service of the Commissioner, employees shall be entitled to twelve days' holiday per annum on full new included in which shall be Christman Downers. full pay, included in which shall be Christmas Day and Good Friday.

 (b.) Annual leave shall be taken at time convenient to the Department.
- (c.) After the expiration of six months' continuous service with the Commissioner, employees shall be entitled to the foregoing holidays in proportion as the length of service is to the full number of holidays for the twelve months, which is equivalent to one day per month of service rendered.

(d.) Any employee who may resign or be dismissed from the service shall be entitled to receive payment for any holidays which may have been due up to the time of leaving the service; provided always, that if the employee has been dismissed for disobedience of lawful orders, for peculation, for being under the influence of liquor on duty, or for drunkenness, no claim for holidays shall be recognised.

(e.) A roster will be posted at the Car Barn showing the approximate dates on which employees will be booked off on leave.

(f) Holidays may, subject to the approval of the Commissioner, be allowed to accumulate for two years.

14. Uniforms.—(a.) The following uniforms shall be supplied by the Commissioner to motormen and conductors after six months' service—

Motormen and conductors. One cap, one winter and one summer suit annually; Motormen: One oilskin and one sou'-wester every two years;

Conductors: One overcoat every two years; Ticket inspectors will be supplied with uniforms as may be deemed necessary. (b.) Uniforms shall be held by the employees and worn only on duty. They shall not be sold or otherwise disposed of. In the event of an employee leaving the Department he must hand the uniform over to his superior officer.

15. Concession Season Tickets on Cars.—Season tickets available between the Car

- Barn or Power House and the nearest point on the tramway system at which an employee resides will be issued at special rates to enable employees to travel to and from
- 16. Free Transit on Cars.-Motormen and conductors will be permitted to travel
- free on cars to and from duty when in uniform.

 17. Charges against Employees.—(a.) Any charge brought against an employee by an officer of the Department shall be made within fourteen days of the officer's first knowledge of the occurrence.

(b.) Each employee shall himself provide, when called upon, with the least possible delay, any report or statement which may be required by the officer in charge.

(c.) When an employee has made a statement to an officer in charge, and which

(c.) When an employee has made a statement to an officer in charge, and which statement the officer in charge has taken down in writing, such employee shall be either furnished with a copy of such statement or allowed to take a copy of it.

(d.) If a final decision in any case where a charge has been made against an employee be not given within three calendar months of the occurrence of the offence, the

charge in question shall lapse.

18. Records.—The secretary 18. Records.—The secretary of the Union shall be entitled at all reasonable times to inspect the Commissioner's records of the hours worked by and of the amounts paid to the various workers covered by this award.

19. Area.—The area within which the Perth Tramway System operates.
20. Term.—The award shall operate for a period of three years from the date Provided that at any time after the expiration of twelve months from its date, the Court may alter or amend the same on the application of any party or person affected by its provisions.
