WHEREAS by virtue of the power conferred by the provision of "The Roads Act, 1911," the Governor may, by Order in Council, abolish wards, and re-divide any district into wards and define the boundaries of and assign names to and also determine the number of members of the same: And whereas it is desirable to abolish the present North-East Ward of the Avon Road District, and to re-divide the said North-East Ward into two wards, with the names and boundaries and the number of members hereinafter appearing, and notice of intention so to do has been duly published in the *Government Gazette* and served on the Board concerned, in accordance with the terms of "The Roads Act, 1911": Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby abolish the present North-East

Ward of the Avon Road District, and re-divide the said North-East Ward into two wards, with the names and the boundaries as described and set forth in the Schedule hereunder, and doth also determine that the number of Members for the said Wards shall be four, with the number allotted to represent each Ward as set forth in the Schedule hereunder; and that in consequence the number of Members for the District as a whole shall be and is hereby increased from Nine to Eleven.

Merging of the Leonora Municipality into Mount Malcolm Road Board, re-naming Leonora-Malcolm Road District, and Division into Wards.

WHEREAS by "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906," and "The Roads Act, 1911," it is provided that the Governor may, by Order in Council, dissolve any Municipality and include the District in any adjoining Road District: And whereas it is desirable to abolish the Municipality of Leonora, and to include the district thereof in the Mount Malcolm Road District, and to alter the name of the said Road District, divide the said new Road District into Wards, allot the number of members to represent each Ward, and to fix the dates necessary for the retirement and election of members of the Board: And whereas notices of intention to do so have been duly given and published in accordance with the respective requirements of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906," and "The Roads Act, 1911": Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, under the said powers, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby order and declare:—

(a.) That on the 1st day of July next (1917)—

(1.) The Municipality of Leonora shall be dissolved, and the District thereof included in the Mount Malcolm Road District.

(2.) That the name of the Mount Malcolm Road District shall be altered to that of the Leonora-Malcolm Road District.

(b.) That the Leonora-Malcolm Road District shall be divided into six Wards, with the names and boundaries, and also with the allotment of members set forth and described in the schedule hereto.

- (c.) That the existing members of the said Road Board shall go out of office on the 23rd day of July next (1917), and that in the meantime a fresh roll for the District, as amended and divided into Wards, shall be prepared, and the following dates fixed for the purpose of election:—

Date for Preparation of Electoral List, 4th July.
 Last day for receiving claims and objections, 11th July.
 Date for exhibition of claims and objections, 14th July.
 Date for holding Revision Court, 18th July.
 Date for signing of rolls, 21st July.
 Date for retirement of existing members, 23rd July.
 Date for nomination, 25th July.
 Date of election, 1st August.

Leonora Ward.

The boundaries of the Leonora Ward are identical with the *Gazette* boundaries of the Leonora Municipality now in course of dissolution.—Three Members.

Malcolm Ward.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by Part VIII. of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906," the City of Perth doth hereby order as follows:—

Clause 43 of Division 1 of By-law 29 is hereby amended, by adding the following clause:—

43 (a), after Subclause (e) of Clause 43:

43. (a.) No person shall use any motor car or motor cycle upon any road within the Municipal District of the City of Perth, between sunset and sunrise, unless the top of the main beam of light projected from the head lights or head light of such motor car or motor cycle, respectively, shall not be higher than three feet above the roadway, at a distance of seventy-five feet from the front of the car, in the direction in which the car is proceeding. The method or device to attain the above object shall in each instance be approved of by the Traffic Inspector, save where the effect is obtained in the use of electric head lights by tilting the lamps forward towards the ground approximately three degrees from the vertical.

COURT OF ARBITRATION, WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

No. 8 of 1916.

Between the Federated Engine-drivers' and Firemen's Industrial Association of Workers of Western Australia, Applicant, and the Honourable the Minister for Public Works and Industries; The Honourable the Minister for Mines; The Honourable the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage; The Honourable the Minister for Agriculture; and The Honourable the Colonial Secretary, Respondents.

The Court of Arbitration of Western Australia doth hereby make the following award in connection with the industrial dispute between the above-mentioned parties.

AWARD.

1. *Hours.*—(a.) Subject as otherwise in this clause provided, forty-eight hours shall constitute a week's work, which may be so arranged as to provide for 8¾ hours on the first five working days and 4¼ hours on the Saturday in each week.

(b.) A day's work for a locomotive driver and for a locomotive fireman on railway construction may extend to 10 hours a day at ordinary rates, provided that a fortnight's work shall not exceed 96 hours except at overtime rates.

(c.) In addition to the above hours of work, drivers and firemen shall be allowed 1½ hours daily for early and late attendance when required, outside the ordinary working hours, which shall be paid for at ordinary rates.

(d.) When a cleaner is not employed and the work usually performed by a cleaner is done by the driver or fireman, he shall be paid for such extra work at ordinary rates.

(e.) The week's work for workers employed for seven shifts in the week shall consist of 56 hours.

(f.) The hours of steam ferry engine-drivers shall not exceed 108 per fortnight at ordinary rates, and may be so arranged as to suit the ferry service for the time being in existence: Provided that they shall cover six days a week only.

2. *Overtime.*—Time worked beyond the hours specified in Clause 1 shall be deemed overtime, and shall be paid for at the rate of time and a-quarter for the first two hours and time and a-half thereafter. Provided that extra time worked owing to any arrangement between employees or in consequence of the periodical rotation of shifts, and extra time, not exceeding four hours, worked owing to any relieving employee not coming on duty at the appointed time shall not be deemed overtime.

In computing overtime, each day shall stand alone.

3. *Sunday and Holiday Work.*—Except in the case of men working seven shifts per week and in the case of steam ferry engine-drivers, all time worked on Sundays and on the holidays hereinafter specified shall be paid for at the rate of time and a-half.

4. *Holidays.*—(a.) Employees working seven shifts per week shall be entitled to three weeks' holiday on full pay for each period of twelve months' continuous service. In the event of such an employee not completing the full period of twelve months' continuous service, he shall be entitled to receive one and three-quarter day's pay for each month of service.

(b.) Steam ferry engine-drivers shall be entitled to two weeks' holiday on full pay for each period of twelve months' continuous service. In the event of a driver not completing the full period of twelve months' continuous service, he shall be entitled to receive one day's pay for each month of service.

(c.) All other workers covered by this award shall be entitled to the following six paid holidays, viz., Christmas Day, New Year's Day, Boxing Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, and Eight Hours' Day.

5. Each locomotive engine-driver on railway construction shall be entitled to the assistance of a fireman of not less than eighteen years of age.

6. Stationary engine-drivers shall, where it is reasonable, do their own firing. Where the reasonableness of his so doing is disputed, the Chief Inspector of Machinery shall decide the question.

7. *Wages.*—The minimum rate of wages payable to the respective classes of workers covered by this award shall be as follows:—

(a.) Steam ferry engine-drivers	£4 per week.
(b.) Locomotive driver on railway construction (South-West Land Division)	13s. 6d. per day.
(c.) Locomotive driver on Harbour Works	13s. 0d. "
(d.) Engine-driver on pile-driver (friction winch)	12s. 6d. "
(e.) All other stationary steam engine-drivers whose work requires a second-class certificate	12s. 6d. "
(f.) All other stationary steam engine-drivers whose work requires a third-class certificate	11s. 6d. "
(g.) Engine-driver on producer gas engine	12s. 6d. "
(h.) Automatic pump house attendants	11s. 0d. "
(i.) Locomotive firemen	10s. 6d. "
(j.) Firemen (shore stationary engines)	10s. 6d. "

8. *Aged and Infirm Workers.*—Any worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum rate of wages hereby prescribed may be employed at a lesser rate of wages to be agreed upon in writing between the worker and the secretary of the union, and in default of such agreement within twenty-four hours after such worker shall have applied in writing to such secretary stating his desire that such wage shall be agreed upon, such wage as shall be fixed by the most convenient Resident or Police Magistrate upon the application of such worker after twenty-four hours' notice in writing shall have been given by him to the said secretary, who shall, if he so desire, be heard by the magistrate upon such application. After having made application to the secretary and after lodging the application with the magistrate and pending the decision thereon in either case, the worker shall be entitled to work for and be employed by the employer at the proposed reduced wage. The determination of the magistrate shall have effect for six calendar months from the date thereof, and after the expiration of the said period until the wage shall be again fixed in the manner prescribed at the instance of the said secretary. The secretary may, by writing under his hand, appoint an agent or substitute to represent the union at the hearing of any such application before the magistrate.

9. *Term.*—This award shall continue in force for a period of three years from its date: Provided that, at any time after the expiration of twelve months from its date, the Court may alter or amend the same on the application of any party or person affected by its provisions.

10. *Locality.*—This award shall be binding upon the above-named applicant and respondents and shall be limited to the area comprised within a radius of ten miles from the General Post Office, Perth, and to the area comprised within Government Reserve No. 14073, Wooroloo, except that in so far as its provisions relate to railway construction it shall operate over the whole of the South-Western Land Division.
