Uniform General By-law for preventing poison being laid on roads or watering-places within the Wyndham and Hall's Creek Road Districts.

WHEREAS under Section 180 of "The Roads Act, 1911," it is provided that the Governor may make and publish in the Government Gazette Uniform General By-laws, and may prescribe the Road Districts in which such By-laws shall have the force of law: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Western Australia, acting with the advice of the Executive Council, in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, doth hereby make and publish the following Bylaw:

250.No person shall lay, deposit, or place, or cause to be laid. deposited, or placed, on any road or at or within one mile of any Water Reserve, Well, Tank, or other watering-place, any poison, poisoned bait, or other like matter injurious to live stock.

Every person guilty of an offence against this By-law shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.
