WHEREAS it is provided by "The Plant Diseases Act, 1914," that the Governor may, by Proclamation, either generally or except in accordance with regulations prohibit the bringing into the State of any specified kind of plant which would in his opinion be likely to introduce any disease into the State: And whereas the plants hereinafter mentioned would in my opinion, and in the opinion of the Executive Council (if introand in the opinion of the Executive Council (if introduced into the State otherwise than in accordance with the regulations hereinafter mentioned) be likely to introduce diseases, namely, Puccinia Allii D.C., Peronospora Schleieniana ung, Urocystis cepula Frost, Phorbia ceparum, and Anthomyiinae sp., into Western Australia: Now, therefore I, the said Governor, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby (in exercise of the powers aforesaid and of do hereby (in exercise of the powers aforesaid and of all other powers me in this behalf enabling) prohibit generally the bringing into Western Australia (except in accordance with regulations made under the said Act, and published in the Gazette contemporaneously herewith) of any onions.

WHEREAS by an Order in Council dated the 23rd day of May, 1917, and published in the Government Gazette of the 25th day of May, 1917, page 851, the Municipality of Leonora was, in exercise of the powers conferred by Section 12 of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906," dissolved as from the 1st day of July, 1917, and the district thereof merged in the Mt. Malcolm Road District, and the name of which was thereby altered to that of the Leonora-Malcolm Road District, also the said Leonora-Malcolm Road District was thereby divided into wards as and in manner appearing in the Government Gazette heretofore mentioned: And whereas it is provided by the said Section 12 of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906," that on the exercise of any of the powers thereby conferred the Governor may by Order in Council adjust and determine any matters which in consequence of any carbon conferred to the conferred any matters. which in consequence of any such exercise require adjustment or determination between any local authorities affected: And whereas it is deeved expedient that the Order hereinafter contained be made in reference to the Cash Balance of £643 13s. 5d. standing to the evedit the Cash Balance of £643 13s. 5d. standing to the credit of the late Mt. Malcolm Road Board as on the 36th day of June, 1917: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby order and direct that the whole of the cash balance or sum of £643 13s. 5d. standing to the credit of the la'e Mt. Malcolm Road Board as on the 30th day of June, 1917 (as set forth in the late Board's balance sheet bearing the certification of Road Board Inspector Hawtin, and rublished tion of Road Board Inspector Hawtin, and rublished in the Government Gazette of the 7th day of September, 1917, page 1428), shall be reserved for expenditure and shall be expended exclusively within or for the benefit of that portion of the Leonora-Ma'colm Road District which immediately preceding the amaleamation with the Leonora Municipal District formed the Mt. it is made lawful for the Governor, by Order in Council, without issuing any deed of grant to place any Reserve under the control of any Municipality, Roads Eoard, or other person or persons, as a Board of Management, and to empower such Board to make, repeal, and alter by-laws for the control and management of such Reserves, and prescribe fees for depositions. such Reserves, and prescribe fees for depasturing thereon, and for other purposes, such by laws to be approved by the Governor and published in the Governproved by the Governor and published in the Government Gazette: And whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserve 6217, for Common, at Wiluna, should be placed under the control of the Wiluna Road Board as a Board of Management: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby place the before-mentioned Reserve under the control of the Wiluna Road Board in trust for the purpose aforesaid as a Board of Management and doth empower such Board to make of Management, and doth empower such Board to make, rejeal, or alter by hws for the control and management of the said Reserve, for prescribing fees for depasturing thereon, for directing the manner in which such fees shall be imposed, paid, collected, and disposed of, and to impose penalties not exceeding in any case \$5 for any breach thereof, and £2 a day for a continuing breach, but not more than £20 in the aggregate. WHEREAS it is desirable to make regulations under "The Plant Diseases Act, 1914," relating to the introduction into Western Australia of any onions: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the powers conferred by "The Plant Diseases Act, 1914," and all other powers enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby make the regulations set forth in the Schedule hereto, and doth declare that the said regulations shall come into force on the publication of this Order in the Government Gazette. this Order in the Government Gazette.

SCHEDULE.

Regulations.

- 1. All onions imported pursuant to the Proclamation made this day under "The Plant Diseases Act, 1914," must be in new and sound bags, with the full name and address of the grower of the onions stencilled (not written) thereon, in not less than two-inch letters.
- 2. All onions imported into Western Australia shall arrive in a sound and marketable condition; such condition shall be determined by the Inspector, and dealt with in accordance with Regulation 4 and the provisions thereunder, and shall have been inspected at the port of export by a competent officer duly appointed by the Department of Agriculture of the exporting State, and be accompanied by the following certificate:—

I hereby certify that I have duly inspected the below-mentioned onions, which have been passed over a screen of not less than a two-inch mesh, and have found them to be, to the best of my know-ledge, clean and free from any disease mentioned in the note endorsed hereon.

Note.-All onions passing through a 1%-inch screen will be counted as picklers.

- 3. All onions imported into Western Australia under the conditions aforesaid shall be again inspected in Fremantle, or at any other approved place of entry, by an Inspector of the Western Australian Department of Agriculture, and, if found to be free from all the diseases mentioned in the said Proclamation, may be approved therefore on payment of inspection for some removed therefrom on payment of inspection fees as prescribed in Regulation No. 7.
- 4. In the event of any of the said diseases or pests being found in any stage of development on any part of a consignment, the whole of such consignment shall

be condemned by the Inspector in Fremantle or other place of entry, and no part of such consignment shall be allowed to be removed from the wharf or other place of entry; but the whole consignment shall be forthwith re-shipped to a place or port beyond Western Australia, and if not so shipped shall be destroyed by the Inspector at the expense of the consignee.

Provided that-

- (a) Onions found upon inspection at Fremantle or other approved place of entry to be only slightly affected by any of the said diseases other than onion fly or onion maggot, may be re-sorted under the supervision of an Inspector, if in the opinion of the officer-in-charge of the inspection work it is advisable to do SO.
- (b) When sorted onions which are free from disease may be disposed of for consumption, the diseased portion of the consignment shall be destroyed at the expense of the consignee as soon, and in such a way as directed by the Inspector.
- (c) A fee at the rate of 2s. (two shillings) per hour shall be paid by the consignee to the Department of Agriculture to cover the cost of supervising the work of re-sorting:

Provided also, that if the introduction of such onions into Western Australia was in contravention of any Proclamation under the aforesaid Act for the time being in force, then the said onions may be dealt with as provided in the said Act.

- 5. The onions on arrival at the port of entry shall, at the expense of the importer, be delivere ddirect into a shed for inspection, and such other treatment as may be decided upon from time to time by the Inspector.
- 6. The importer or his agent shall, at the importer's expense, provide the necessary labour to open the bags for inspection, and to re-bag the onions, and in every way facilitate the inspection.
- 7. A fee of two shillings and sixpence for every ton or portion of a ton of imported onions shall be charged to defray the cost of inspection, and of carrying these regulations into effect.
- Onions and onion sets are prohibited from being sent by parcels post, except in accordance with these regulations. (See Post Office Guide.)
- 9. If any importer or his agent fails or neglects to observe these regulations, or to carry out requirements of an Inspector aforesaid, the Inspector may destroy the onions or perform the work at the expense in all things of the importer.
- 10. These regulations may be cited as the "Plant Diseases (Onion) Regulations, 1917."

32. Any contravention of this By-law shall be an offence punishable, if the animal is a bull, boar, or stallion, by a fine not exceeding £20, and in other cases by a fine not exceeding £10.
