Sharks Bay Road Board.

WHEREAS it is provided by Section 195 of "The Roads Act, 1911," as amended by "The Roads Act Amendment Act, 1912," that a Board may adopt, in any townsite or in any area defined for that purpose by proclamation, the system of valuation on the Annual Value: And whereas it is desirable to approve of and define the areas hereinafter described as areas within which the Sharks Bay Road Board may adopt the system of valuation on the Annual Value: Now therefore I, the said Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby approve of and define the following areas situated within the Sharks Bay Road District, viz.:—

The Plant Diseases Act, 1914.

WHEREAS it is enacted by "The Plant Diseases Act, 1914," that the Governor may by Proclamation revoke or vary any Proclamation made under the said Act or any Act thereby repealed: And whereas it is desirable that the Proclamation made on the 18th day of July, 1917, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 9th day of November, 1917, be revoked: And whereas it is provided by "The Plant Diseases Act, 1914," that the Governor may by Proclamation prohibit, either absolutely or except in accordance with regulations, the bringing into the State, either generally or from any specified State, country, or place, of things which would in his opinion be likely to introduce any disease into the State: And whereas in the opinion of the Governor and the Executive Council, casks and other coverings (except bottles) which contain or have contained wine or wine vinegar and apparatus which have been used in the manufacture of wine or wine vinegar would, if introduced into Western Australia from any State or Territory of the Commonwealth (except in accordance with the regulations hereinafter mentioned), be likely to introduce a disease, namely, *phylloxera vastatrix*, into Western Australia: Now therefore I, the said Governor, acting with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke the Proclamation made under the said Act on the 18th day of July, 1917, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 9th day of November, 1917, and further do prohibit the introduction into Western Australia from any State or Territory of the Commonwealth (except in accordance with "The Plant Diseases (Wine Casks) Regulations, 1919"), of casks and other coverings (except bottles) which contain or have contained wine or wine vinegar, and of apparatus which have been used in the manufacture of wine or wine vinegar.

ORDERS IN COUNCIL.

The Plant Diseases Act, 1914.

At the Executive Council Chambers, at Perth, this 26th day of February, 1919.

WHEREAS it is desirable that the Regulations made under "The Plant Diseases Act, 1914," on the 18th day of July, 1917, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 9th day of November, 1917, should be repealed and that the Regulations set out in the Schedule hereto should be substituted in lieu thereof: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the powers conferred by "The Plant Diseases Act, 1914," and all other powers enabling him in this behalf, doth order and declare that the Regulations made under the aforesaid Act on the 18th day of July, 1917, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 9th day of November, 1917, be repealed and the same are hereby repealed, and that the Regulations set out in the Schedule hereto be substituted in lieu thereof.

SCHEDULE.

Regulations.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Plant Diseases (Wine Casks) Regulations, 1919.

2. In these regulations—

"Apparatus" means apparatus which have been used in the manufacture of wine;

"Cask" means a cask or other covering (not being a bottle) which contains or has contained wine;

"Disease" means "*Phylloxera vastatrix*";

"State" means any State or Territory of the Commonwealth;

"Wine" includes Wine Vinegar;

"The Act" means "The Plant Diseases Act, 1914."

3. Any cask imported by sea from any State pursuant to the exception contained in the proclamation made this day under the Act must—

(a) have been previously disinfected immediately prior to its leaving the exporting State;

(b) have been stamped or otherwise legibly marked on both ends in stencilled letters not less than half an inch in height so as to indicate the method of disinfection; and

(c) be accompanied by a certificate issued by an Inspector of the Department of Agriculture of the exporting State stating the method and date of infection.

4. Casks and apparatus imported into Western Australia by sea from any State shall be inspected by an Inspector at Fremantle or Albany, and when any such cask or apparatus is consigned to any port other than Fremantle or Albany any Inspector may cause the same to be conveyed to Fremantle or Albany and the consignee shall, on demand, pay the Inspector the expenses incurred in and about such conveyance.

5. All casks and apparatus imported by the Great Western Railway for any destination Eastward of the No. 1 Rabbit-proof fence must be submitted for inspection to an Inspector immediately after being unloaded from the car or wagon in which they have been carried on the said railway.

6. All casks and apparatus imported by the Great Western Railway for any destination Westward of the No. 1 Rabbit-proof fence shall be inspected at Fremantle or Perth and any Inspector may cause the same to be conveyed to either of these places and the consignee shall, on demand, pay the Inspector the expenses incurred in and about such conveyance.

7. No casks or apparatus inspected under these regulations shall be removed from the place of inspection except on payment of fees as prescribed in Regulation 11.

8. All casks and apparatus whatever imported from any State other than South Australia shall, before removal, be disinfected to the satisfaction of an Inspector by superheated steam, scalding water, or fumigation,

9. Casks and apparatus on arrival at the port or place where they are to be inspected shall be conveyed and delivered (at the expense of the consignee) direct into such place as an Inspector may direct for inspection and such other treatment as may be decided upon; and the consignee shall ensure the delivery of the cask or apparatus into such place as aforesaid.

10. The fee for inspection shall be threepence per cask and for disinfection sixpence per cask, which fees shall be recoverable from the consignee or owner by proceedings before two justices of the peace in manner provided in the Justices Act, 1902: Provided that the minimum amount to be paid by any one person for disinfection on one occasion shall be four shillings.

11. Any Inspector may cause any cask or apparatus to be conveyed and delivered into any place as provided in Regulation 9 and the consignee shall, on demand, pay such Inspector the expenses incurred in and about such conveyance and delivery.

12. Any person guilty of a breach (by act or omission) of these Regulations shall be liable on summary conviction of a penalty not exceeding £25.

13. Any expenses payable to any Inspector under the Regulations may be recovered by him by action against the person liable in any court of competent jurisdiction.

The Roads Act, 1911.

Broome Road Board.

Appointment of Chairman.

P.W. 5241/18.

WHEREAS by Section 17 of "The Roads Act, 1911," it is provided that, in the exercise by the Government of any power conferred by Section 8 and mentioned in paragraphs (b), (c), (e), or (f) of Subsection 1 of the said Act, the Governor may by Order in Council (*inter alia*) order such and finally determine any questions and matters regarding the representation of electors on a Board and the constitution of the Board which he may deem necessary to be ordered, settled, adjusted, or determined: And whereas the Broome Road Board having been recently elected and having failed to elect a Chairman by reason of there being an equality of votes, and having requested the Government to determine the matter in the absence of a casting vote being available: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, under and by virtue of the powers conferred on him by "The Roads Act, 1911," doth hereby determine and appoint Mr. Walter John McKenna, who has been duly elected a member of the said Broome Road Board, to be the chairman thereof for the period laid down by Section 117 and subject to all other provisions of "The Roads Act, 1911."

The Roads Act, 1911.

Merredin Road District.

P.W. 376/19.

WHEREAS by virtue of the powers conferred by Section 13 of "The Roads Act, 1911," it is provided that the Governor in Council may, in the case of a District which is divided into Wards, from time to time determine the number of members for each Ward thereof, and whereas the Merredin Road District is divided into Wards, and it is desirable to redetermine the number of members for the Wards of the said Merredin Road District: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby determine that the number of members to represent the Wards of the said Merredin Road District shall be as set forth in the Schedule hereto, and that such new representation shall come into effect as from, and be observed at the ensuing Annual Elections to be held in the month of April next.

- No. 1.—Central Ward: Two members.
- No. 2.—Totadgin Ward: One member.
- No. 3.—South-West Ward: Two members.
- No. 4.—North-West Ward: Two members.
- No. 5.—Nungarin Ward: One member.
- No. 6.—East Ward: One member.

WHEREAS by Section 42 of "The Land Act, 1898," it is made lawful for the Governor to direct that any Reserve shall vest in and be held by any Municipality, Road Board, or other person or persons to be named in the order, in trust for any of the purposes set forth in Section 39 of the said Act, or for the like or other public purposes to be specified in such order: And whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserve No. 17142 should vest in and be held by the Honourable the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage, in trust for the purpose of Water: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the before-mentioned Reserve shall vest in and be held by the Honourable the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage, in trust for the purpose aforesaid; subject, nevertheless, to the powers reserved to him by Section 41 of the said Act.

WHEREAS by Section 42 of "The Land Act, 1898," it is made lawful for the Governor to direct that any Reserve shall vest in and be held by any Municipality, Road Board, or other person or persons to be named in the order, in trust for any of the purposes set forth in Section 39 of the said Act, or for the like or other public purposes to be specified in such order: And whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserve No. 17139 should vest in and be held by the Honourable the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage, in trust for the purpose of Water: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the before-mentioned Reserve shall vest in and be held by the Honourable the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage, in trust for the purpose aforesaid; subject, nevertheless, to the powers reserved to him by Section 41 of the said Act.

WHEREAS by Section 42 of "The Land Act, 1898," it is made lawful for the Governor to direct that any Reserve shall vest in and be held by any Municipality, Road Board, or other person or persons to be named in the order, in trust for any of the purposes set forth in Section 39 of the said Act, or for the like or other public purposes to be specified in such order: And whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserve No. 17148 should vest in and be held by the Municipality of Narrogin, in trust for the purpose of Water: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the before-mentioned Reserve shall vest in and be held by the Municipality of Narrogin, in trust for the purpose aforesaid; subject, nevertheless, to the powers reserved to him by Section 41 of the said Act.

THE VERMIN ACT, 1918.

The Executive Council Chamber,
Perth, 26th February, 1919.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to make the following Regulations under "The Vermin Act, 1918."

REGULATIONS.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the *Vermin Act Regulations*, 1919, and shall be exclusive of any regulations heretofore made under any Act relating to Vermin or Rabbits.

Inspectors.

2. A certificate of the appointment of an inspector may be signed by the Minister or by the Chairman of the Board, as the case may require, and may be in the form 1 in the Schedule hereto.

Delegation of powers by Minister.

3. A delegation by the Minister of any of his powers to the Chief Inspector may be according to the form 2 in the Schedule hereto.

Number of members of Boards.

4. The number of members of each Vermin Board shall be six.

Electoral Lists.

5. On or before the third day of March in each year the Clerk shall cause an advertisement of the compilation of the electoral list for the district or any ward (in the form 3 in the Schedule) to be inserted in a newspaper circulating in the district.

6. Any person whose name has been omitted from an electoral list compiled under Section 22 of the Act, or who is dissatisfied with the statement of the number of votes to which he is entitled, may claim to have his name inserted or to have the statement altered, as the case may be.

Such claim shall be made by way of application to the Board and shall be delivered on or before the tenth day after the publication of the advertisement aforesaid, and may be sent through the post or by telegraph.

7. Any person whose name appears on any electoral list may object to any person whose name appears thereon as not being entitled to have his name retained on such list or to the statement of the number of votes to which such person is entitled.

Every such objection shall be made to the Board and to the person objected to and shall be delivered on or before the tenth day of the publication of the aforesaid advertisement, and may be sent through post or by telegraph.

8. When any such application or objection as aforesaid shall have been duly received by the Clerk in respect of any electoral list, the Board shall hold an open court for the revision of the list on such day after the time fixed for the delivery of such applications and objections, and not later than the twenty-fifth day of March in each year, as may be appointed by the Board. The court may be held at the office of the Board or, if the Board thinks fit, at any other place within the district.

9. Seven days' notice of the holding of such court, stating the time and place, shall be given by advertisement in a newspaper circulating in the district.

10. Sections 40, 41, and 42 of "The Roads Act, 1911," are hereby adopted as part of these regulations.

11. The court shall—

- (a.) Insert in the list under revision the name of every person who has claimed and is proved to the satisfaction of the court to be entitled to have his name inserted;
- (b.) Determine the claim of every person to have the statement of the number of votes to which he is entitled altered;
- (c.) Retain upon the list the name of every person objected to with the statement of the number of votes to which he is entitled unaltered unless the person objecting appears by himself or by someone on his behalf in support of the objection;
- (d.) On the appearance of the person objecting, require proof by the person objected to of

so much of the qualification as is embraced in the objection, and in case such qualification is not proved to the satisfaction of the court strike out the name of the person objected to, or alter or correct the statement of the number of votes to which he is entitled, as the case may require;

- (e.) Retain on the list the name and the statement of the number of votes to which he is entitled of every person against whom no objection has been made;
- (f.) Strike out the name of any person proved to be dead;
- (g.) Correct any mistake or supply any omission which may appear to have been made in the list in respect of the name, address, or occupation of any person.

12. Sections 44, 45, 50, 51, and 52 of "The Roads Act, 1911," are hereby adopted as part of these regulations.

13. Any document purporting to be a copy of the electoral list and to be signed by the Chairman shall be *prima facie* evidence of the contents of the list in any court of justice, and may be used for any purpose for which the original might be used.

14. In the case of a new district or any district where there is no Board, all acts and things whatsoever required or necessary to be done under this portion of these regulations may be lawfully done by such person at such time and at such place as the Minister may appoint in that behalf.

15. In case there is no objection or claim delivered within the prescribed time in respect of an electoral list prepared by the Clerk, such list shall be signed by the Chairman and shall be deemed to be electoral list of the district or ward, as the case may be.

16. The Clerk may, unless the Board otherwise directs, make use of the rate-book for compiling and keeping the electoral list, and for that purpose may in the appropriate column (to be called the electoral column) of the rate-book enter the name of every person qualified to vote in respect of each holding, with a statement of the number of votes to which such person is entitled.

Elections.

17. Sections 57 to 75 (both inclusive) of "The Roads Act, 1911," are hereby adopted as part of these regulations, provided that the words "if any, he may, and if there is no electoral roll he shall ask such persons the appropriate questions hereinafter mentioned, and if such questions when asked are answered satisfactorily the Returning Officer shall" shall be deemed to be excised from Section 73, and the following words inserted in lieu thereof, that is to say, "he shall, subject to the prescribed questions (if asked) being answered satisfactorily."

18. (1.) The returning officer or his deputy may, and, if required so to do by any scrutineer, shall, put to any person tendering or claiming to give any vote to which he appears entitled by the electoral list the following questions:—

- (a.) Are you the person whose name appears as A.B. in the electoral list for this district (or ward) and who is entered therein as entitled to.....votes?
- (b.) Are you of the full age of 21 years?
- (c.) Are you a natural born or naturalised subject of the King?
- (d.) Were you on the 13th January, 19 , the owner of the holding in respect of which you claim to vote?
- (e.) Have you already voted at the present election?

(2.) If any person refuses to answer these questions when put to him or by his answers shows that he is not entitled to vote, his claim to vote shall be rejected.

19. Sections 78 to 89 (both inclusive) of "The Roads Act, 1911," are hereby adopted as part of these regulations.

Ouster from Office.

20. An application to a magistrate for a rule under Section 34 of the Act may be made verbally and need not be supported by affidavit, but the magistrate may satisfy himself in such manner as he thinks fit of the genuineness of the claim.

21. The rule shall be intitled in the local court and may be in the form 4 in the Schedule, and the subject matter of the rule shall be deemed to be a matter within the meaning of "The Local Courts Act, 1904," which Act and the rules made thereunder shall (so far as applicable) apply to and in respect of the rule and all subsequent proceedings accordingly.

22. (1.) On the return of the rule the question in issue may be tried in, as nearly as may be, the same way as an action in a local court.

(2.) Judgment of ouster may be in the form No. 5 in the Schedule.

Rate-book.

23. Subject to the Act, the rate-book of a Board shall be in the form 6 in the Schedule. The use of the electoral column shall be optional.

24. (1.) After a rate-book has been made up and completed, the Clerk shall make a note thereof in the book indicating the date of completion.

(2.) When alterations and additions are made so as to enable the rate-book to be made use of for a subsequent year or rate under Section 58 of the Act, the Clerk shall make a note of the date of the completion of such alterations and additions, and that shall be deemed the date of the completion of the rate-book for that purpose.

25. The columns between the "amount due" column and the electoral column and also the "remarks" column shall not be deemed part of the rate-book, but entries may be made therein from time to time as required.

26. When, in exercise of the powers conferred by Section 65 of the Act, a Board instead of compiling a rate-book under these regulations elects to use the rate-book compiled by it as a Road Board under "The Roads Act, 1911," it may add thereto such of the columns comprised in the said form 6 as it deems expedient.

27. The memorandum of the imposition of a rate shall be according to the form 7 in the Schedule, and the notice of assessment in accordance with the form 8 in the Schedule.

Accounts and Audit.

28. The financial year of every Board shall end on the 30th day of June in every year.

29. Every Board shall cause books to be provided and kept, and true and regular accounts to be entered therein of (a) all sums of money received and paid on account of and for the Board and of all moneys owing to or by them, and of the several purposes for which such sums of money have been received and paid and owing and (b) of all the assets and liabilities of the Board; and the said books shall at all reasonable times be open to the inspection of any member of the Board, or ratepayer, and any such person may take copies or extracts from the said books without payment of any fee.

30. Every Board shall, in addition to the rate-book, keep a cash book and general ledger. The cash book shall be according to the form 9 in the Schedule.

31. The Minister may, subject to these regulations, from time to time prescribe what books the Board shall keep and the manner and form in which the books and accounts of the Board shall be kept, and the same shall be kept accordingly.

32. All books, accounts, and vouchers of the Board shall at all times be open to the inspection of any person nominated by the Minister.

33. Any person having the custody of the said books who shall not, on any reasonable demand of any such member, ratepayer, or person nominated by the Minister, permit him to inspect the said books, or to take copies or extracts as aforesaid, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds for every such offence.

34. All moneys of the Board shall be paid into such bank, and in such manner as the Board shall from time to time appoint and direct for that purpose, and no sum exceeding five pounds shall be held in the hands of a member, or any officer, servant, or clerk of the Board, for any period exceeding seven days.

35. No such money shall be drawn out of such bank excepting by a cheque signed by the chairman and countersigned by the Clerk, and the authority for payment shall be a resolution of the Board duly entered in the minute book.

36. If in any district the absence of banking facilities renders a strict compliance with Regulations 34

and 35 impracticable, the Minister may permit such modification thereof as he thinks fit.

37. Receipts for all moneys received shall be given on forms approved by the Minister.

38. All moneys in hand on the last day of the financial year shall, so far as possible, be paid on that day to the credit of the banking account of the Board, and included in the banker's certificate of the amount standing to the credit of the Board on that day, which certificate the Board shall obtain and produce to the auditors.

39. Every officer appointed or employed by the Board shall from time to time, when required by the Board, make out and deliver to them, or to any person appointed by them for that purpose, a true and perfect account, in writing under his hand, of all moneys received by him on behalf of the Board.

40. Such account shall state how, and to whom, and for what purpose such moneys have been disposed of, and, together with such accounts, such officer shall deliver the vouchers and receipts for such payments.

41. Every such officer shall pay to the Board, or to any person appointed by them to receive the same, all moneys which appear to be owing by him upon the balance of such accounts.

42. Each Board shall have its accounts audited at least once in every year by two auditors, one of whom shall be appointed by the Auditor General and the other shall be appointed by the Board or by the Minister whenever he is satisfied that the Board has failed for an unreasonable time to make any such appointment. Provided that the Governor may at any time remove any auditor from office.

43. It shall be the duty of the Chief Inspector to inquire into the general administration of the Board and to inspect fences and other works made or undertaken by the Board on which Government funds are expended, and to report thereon to the Minister and the auditors at least once in every year. The Chief Inspector may delegate any of his powers and functions under these regulations.

44. Such inspector shall, for the purpose of any inspection, inquiry, or report, and any auditor (including special auditor) shall, for the purpose of any audit, have authority at all reasonable times and without notice to demand from the Board and the officers thereof the production of all books, accounts, vouchers, papers, documents, and cash in hand belonging to the Board in the custody of the Board or any of its officers.

45. Every Board member or officer neglecting or refusing to comply with any such demand shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

46. The Board shall cause the accounts of the Board to be balanced annually on a date to be fixed by the Minister, up to the last day of each financial year; and as soon as conveniently may be after such balancing the auditors shall audit the said accounts. Provided that the auditor appointed by the Auditor General may make an audit at any time either in conjunction with the other auditor or by himself if such other auditor is unwilling or unable to act.

47. Notice of the time at which the audit will take place shall be exhibited at the office of the Board on the fourteen days next preceding. Provided that an omission to duly exhibit such notice shall not affect the validity of the audit.

48. The Board shall, by their Clerk or other proper officer, produce and lay before the auditors the accounts so balanced as aforesaid, with all vouchers in support of the same, and all books, papers, and writings in their custody or power relating thereto.

49. If the accounts are found correct, the auditors shall sign the same in token of their allowance thereof, but if they think there is just cause to disapprove of any part of the said accounts, they may disallow any part of the said accounts so disapproved of, and take such steps thereupon as are hereinafter provided.

50. The Minister may at any time direct a special audit to be made by such person and in such manner as he may think fit.

51. Any person interested in the said accounts as a ratepayer may be present at the audit of the said accounts, by himself or his agent, and may make any objection in writing, signed by such person or his agent, to any part of such accounts.

52. Annual statements and accounts according to the forms 10, 11, 12, and 13 in the Schedule, showing the financial position of the Board at the end of every

financial year, shall be prepared by the Board, showing the income from every source and the various matters and items of expenditure and the assets and liabilities of the Board. Form 10 may be used for the purposes of Section 52 of the Act.

53. In the case of any Board that has borrowed any money during the year, or has brought forward any borrowed money from the preceding year, a statement according to the form 14 in the Schedule shall be made, showing, on the one side, all moneys so received or brought forward, and, on the other, the application of all such moneys as have been expended, and the amount remaining unexpended and to be carried forward.

54. Such statements and accounts shall be audited by the auditors, and, if found correct, shall be certified as correct under the hands of the auditors, and when so certified shall, within thirty clear days after the completion of such audit, be published in the *Gazette* and also published in a newspaper usually circulating in the district or, at the option of the Board, brought to the notice of ratepayers by the transmission through the post to each ratepayer at his address appearing in the rate book of a copy of each such statement and account.

A record shall be kept of all plant purchased or in the possession of the Board and the disposal of same.

A record shall also be kept of all stores, material, and tools purchased for stock and the disposal of same. Stock shall be taken at least once a year and agreed with the ledger account.

55. It shall be the duty of the auditors, if they shall find any accounts or statements submitted to them for audit to be erroneous or deficient in any particular, unless such error or deficiency be at once made good by the person or persons liable to make it good, instead of signing such account or statement to publish in the *Gazette*, and in a newspaper usually circulating in the district, a statement showing in what respects they have found such accounts or statements erroneous or deficient.

56. In auditing the accounts of any Board, the auditors shall disallow any expenditure which is not authorised by or which contravenes any provision of "The Vermin Act, 1918," and shall specially report such expenditure to the Minister.

57. The auditors may, at the expense of the Board, take legal opinion on any question arising in the course of an audit.

58. Any difference between the auditors shall be referred to and finally settled by the Minister.

Distress for Rates.

59. When a rate is to be levied by distress, the warrant may be in the form 15 in the Schedule.

60. A notice of the making of the distress and an inventory of the things distrained may be respectively in forms 16 and 17 in the Schedule. Service of the notice on the occupier shall in all cases be deemed sufficient.

Loans.

61. Applications for loans must be made in or to the effect of the form 18 in the Schedule.

62. When a Board applies for a loan, plans and specifications of the proposed fences must be submitted to the Chief Inspector, and passed by him before any advance from the loan will be granted.

63. No loan shall be made by the Minister to a Board until the Chief Inspector shall have certified that the existing fences (if any) of the Board are approved by him.

64. When any loan has been made to a Board by the Minister no fence shall, whilst the loan or any part thereof remains unpaid, be erected by the Board unless the plans and specifications of such are first submitted to the Chief Inspector and approved by him, and every such fence must be erected to the satisfaction of the Chief Inspector.

65. Every fence of a Board which is indebted to the Minister for loan money shall be repaired, maintained, and kept in good order by the Board to the satisfaction of the Chief Inspector, and on the Chief Inspector certifying to the Minister that default has been made in compliance with this rule such fence may be repaired and put in good order by the Minister, and the expense thereof shall be repaid by the Board to the Minister on demand.

Interest.

66. The rate of interest on any loan under the Act shall be the rate for the time being charged by the Agricultural Bank on a similar loan. The rate of 7 per cent. per annum is hereby prescribed as the rate of interest to be charged or paid under the sections of the Act providing for the charging or payment of any interest on moneys other than loans.

Contribution to Fences by adjoining Owners.

67. The notice of demand under Section 80 of the Act shall be according to the form 19 in the Schedule.

68. The amount of any contribution payable under Section 80 of the Act shall be apportioned between the owner and occupier of the adjoining holding, in accordance with the following rules:—

- (i.) If the occupier, at the time when the right to the contribution vests, has a right of occupation for ten years or more, he shall bear four-fifths of the expense.
- (ii.) If his right is for six years but less than ten years, he shall bear three-fifths of the expense.
- (iii.) If his right is for four years but less than six years, he shall bear two-fifths of the expense.
- (iv.) If his right is for two years but less than four years, he shall bear one-fifth of the expense.
- (v.) If his right is for less than two years, he shall bear one-tenth of the expense.

69. Every agreement made under Section 81 of the Act may be registered as regards a holding or part of a holding not subject to "The Transfer of Land Act, 1893," by the delivery and registration of a memorial thereof in manner set out in the Ordinance 19 Vict., No. 13, and as regards any holding or part of a holding subject to "The Transfer of Land Act, 1893," by presenting such agreement for registration to the Registrar of Titles together with a request to register the same on the certificate of title of any land affected and the entry by the Registrar of a memorandum thereof on such certificate of title, and for this purpose the production of the duplicate certificate of title shall not be necessary, but no such agreement shall be registered under "The Transfer of Land Act, 1893," unless the execution thereof is attested or proved in manner set out in Section 145 of that Act, and, subject to this regulation and the Act, the relative provisions of "The Transfer of Land Act, 1893," shall apply to and in respect of such agreement and the registration thereof.

Enclosing Water Supplies.

70. The manner of enclosing water supplies with rabbit-proof fencing shall be as set out in No. 94 of these regulations.

Supply of Wire Netting.

71. Applications under Section 87 of the Act shall be made in duplicate in the form 20 in the Schedule, addressed to the Minister or the Chairman of the Board.

72. Notice may be sent to the applicant of the cost of the netting and of the amount of the annual instalment and interest that will be payable therefor in the form 21 in the Schedule.

73. No application for wire netting or other appliances shall be granted until an inspector has examined the land which it is proposed to enclose and has reported upon the same.

74. No netting shall be supplied for the purposes of attaching the same to any existing fence until an inspector shall have reported upon the suitability of such fence for having the wire netting attached.

75. If the Minister or Board decide to grant the application, the applicant will be required to produce evidence of his title to the land and to execute a mortgage to the Agricultural Bank, as agent for the Minister or the Board, in such form as the Crown Solicitor or the Board's solicitor (as the case may require) may approve, and to pay the cost of the preparation and registration thereof, and all other incidental costs and expenses reasonably incurred.

76. The wire netting and other appliances supplied shall be of such quality as the Minister or the Board, as the case may be, shall think fit.

77. Every fence for which netting has been supplied shall be erected as a vermin or rabbit-proof fence to the satisfaction of the Chief Inspector or an Inspector of the Board, as the case may be.

78. The Minister or the Board will be under no liability for failure to deliver or for any delay in the delivery of netting.

79. Before any application is granted, the Minister or Board shall ascertain whether there is any mortgage on the land in respect of which application is made, together with full particulars of any such mortgage and whether the mortgagee under every such mortgage has consented in writing to the application, and if he has so consented shall obtain possession of such consent.

80. At or after the time of the registration of any mortgage under Section 87 of the Act affecting land under "The Transfer of Land Act, 1893," the Registrar of Titles shall, on delivery to him of such consent as aforesaid of every mortgagee of the land, register the same in manner provided in "The Transfer of Land Act, 1893," for the registration of other instruments, and shall make and sign a memorandum on the certificate of title affected by the mortgage under the said Section 87 of the priority which such mortgage has by virtue of that section; provided that the signature to every such consent is attested or proved in manner set out in Section 145 of "The Transfer of Land Act, 1893," and that such consent shall be retained and filed in the Office of Titles.

81. Any mortgage or consent under Section 89 of the Act may be registered without the production of the duplicate certificate of title of any lands affected.

82. When the applicant is the occupier and not the owner of the land, the Minister or Board shall require the applicant to prove that he has given notice (in the form 22 in the Schedule) of the application to the owner, and shall send notice (in the form 23) to the owner of the time and place at which he may show cause against the application, and the application shall not be granted until the owner has had an opportunity of showing cause against it.

83. If the Minister or the Board is of opinion that the owner should join in the mortgage to be given by an occupier applicant, he or it shall send him notice according to the form 24 in the Schedule, accompanied by an engrossment of the mortgage (which may be in duplicate if thought fit), and in case of his refusal or neglect to comply with such notice and the note thereto, the Minister or the Board may, pursuant to Subsection 6 of Section 87 of the Act, enter a caveat in the form 25 in the Schedule against the land of such owner in respect of which the application has been made; but the Registrar of Titles may refuse to register such caveat until a statutory declaration has been lodged in the Office of Titles verifying the caveat and proving compliance with the relative provisions of these regulations and the Act.

Apportionment of Obligations on Charge of Ownership or Occupancy.

84. Any person desiring to proceed in a local court under Section 90 of the Act may file an application in the local court held nearest to the land affected, and the clerk of the court shall thereupon issue a summons in the form 26 in the Schedule, which shall, unless the magistrate of the court otherwise directs, be served as directed in the said section, and a copy of the application shall be annexed thereto or endorsed thereon.

85. Every application under the said section shall be deemed to be a matter within the meaning of "The Local Courts Act, 1904," and the provisions of that Act shall, so far as applicable but subject to the Act and these regulations, apply to and in respect thereof accordingly; provided that any question in issue in such a proceeding may be tried in, as nearly as may be, the same way as an action in a local court.

Authorisation of Persons to act in the Destruction of Vermin.

86. An authority to any person to act as and be an "authorised person" under Section 92 of the Act may be in the form 27 in the Schedule.

Registration of Charges.

87. For the purposes of Section 104 of the Act, notice of any charge may be (as regards land not subject to the provisions of "The Transfer of Land Act, 1893," and dealings relating to which are not registered in the Department of Lands or Mines) in the form 28 in the Schedule, and shall be registered by the delivery and registration of a memorial thereof in manner set out in the Ordinance 19 Vict., No. 13, and as regards

land under "The Transfer of Land Act, 1893," the notice may be contained in a caveat in the form 29 in the Schedule, and shall be deemed to be registered on such caveat being lodged and a memorandum thereof entered on every certificate of title affected in manner provided in "The Transfer of Land Act, 1893." In the case of land, dealings concerning which are registered in the Department of Lands or Mines, the notice may be contained in a caveat according to the form aforesaid, with such alterations as may be necessary, and shall be lodged and registered in the department concerned, and thereupon the notice shall be deemed to be registered. The Registrar of Titles or the Under Secretary for Lands or Mines, before accepting any such caveat, may require it to be verified by statutory declaration.

Certificate that Fence Vermin or Rabbit Proof.

88. The fee payable to the Chief Inspector for an inspection under Section 104 of the Act shall be £2 2s.

89. (1.) A certificate under Section 104 of the Act may be in the form 30 in the Schedule.

(2.) The notice required to be given by Subsection 2 of Section 104 of the Act, before such evidence as is therein mentioned can be adduced, shall be according to the form 30 in the Schedule, and shall be served on the opposite party at least five days before such evidence is adduced.

Bonus for Destruction of Wild Dogs.

90. Bonuses for the destruction of wild dogs within the district of any Vermin Board shall be paid through the Board of the district in which the wild dogs are destroyed.

91. Wild dog scalps must be handed to a clerk or a police constable or a member of the Vermin Board, who shall in the presence of another member of the Vermin Board or police constable or some one appointed for that purpose under the hand of the Chief Inspector under "The Vermin Act, 1918," totally destroy such scalps by fire.

92. A scalp shall consist of the tail and two ears with strip of skin connecting the ears. No other evidence shall be recognised.

93. The Board may grant for every wild dog scalp such bonus as to the Board may seem meet.

Rabbit-proof Fences.

94. A rabbit-proof fence shall consist of posts and strainers and at least three wires or two wires and a top rail. The posts if round shall be not less than four inches in diameter at the small end, except in the case of mulga, or jam posts, when three inches shall be deemed sufficient. If split posts are used they shall not be less than 18 square inches in area or three inches in breadth at the smaller end. The posts shall be of sound timber and placed not less than 21 inches in the ground and not more than 18 feet apart. The strainers shall not be less than six inches in diameter at the small end and shall be of sound timber and placed three feet in the ground and not more than 128 feet apart. The netting shall be attached to two wires, the top one of which is to be 36 inches above the ground; the other wire is to be about 22 inches above the ground. The netting must be attached to each of the two wires with wire ties not more than three feet apart. The netting is to be sunk below the surface of the ground perpendicularly six inches. The use of plain or barbed wire above the netting is optional.

Miscellaneous.

95. The production of a document purporting to be signed by the Minister and to certify that he has come to any decision or determination or that anything has or has not been done to his satisfaction shall be sufficient evidence of the truth of the matter stated.

96. (1.) The parts of "The Roads Act, 1911," adopted by these regulations shall be deemed to include all amendments thereof up to the date of these regulations, and the expression "electoral roll" in any part so adopted shall, for the purposes of these regulations, be taken to mean "electoral list."

(2.) Any forms prescribed under "The Roads Act, 1911," for the purposes of the parts so adopted may be used *mutatis mutandis* for the purposes of those regulations.

97. None of these regulations which are made for the purposes of any particular part of the Act shall apply to any Board to which that part is inapplicable.
