#### COURT OF ARBITRATION, WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

#### No. 3 of 1918.

Between The Federated Moulders' (Metal) Industrial Union of Workers, Perth, Applicant; and The Metropolitan Ironmasters' Industrial Union of Employers, Respondent.

THE Court of Arbitration of Western Australia doth hereby make the following award in connection with the industrial dispute between the above-mentioned parties :-

#### AWARD.

1. Area .- The award shall operate over the area comprised within a radius of fourteen miles from the General Post Office, Perth.

2. Term .--- The award shall be for a term of three years with the right to apply to alter, vary, or amend after the expiration of twelve months from its date.

3. Hours .- Forty-eight hours shall constitute one week's work. There shall be power to apply for alteration of hours at any time subsequent to the issue of this award if any change is made in any award of this Court in the number of hours reducing them to less than forty-eight in any branch of the Engineering industry, and power also to apply for any proportionate alteration of pay. No day shall exceed eight and three-quarter hours. Saturday's work shall finish at noon.

Overtime .-- All time worked in excess of the usual working hours in any one day shall be paid for at the rate of time and a-quarter for the first two hours, and thereafter at time and a-half.

5. Any employee brought back on duty for a purpose outside his ordinary work-ing hours shall be paid a minimum of two hours. 6. Double Time.—All time worked between midnight Saturday and midnight Sunday, and Christmas Day, Boxing Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Eight Hours' Day, and New Year's Day, shall be paid for at double time rate. 7. Rates of Pay.—The minimum rate of pay for moulders and coremakers shall be one oblilling and distances for thing work

7. Rates of Pay.—The minimum rate of pay for moulders and coremakers shall be one shilling and eightpence farthing per hour. S. Apprentices.—(a) In this award a "duly registered apprentice" means an apprentice of whose apprenticeship notice has been given to the Clerk of the Court in accordance with the provisions of this clause; and a "duly registered probationer" means a person working as an apprentice on probation, of whose probationary period notice has been given to the Clerk of the Court in accordance with the provisions of this clause: Provided, that an apprentice or a probationer shall be deemed to be duly registered during the period of fourteen days allowed for registration. (b) Any employer hereafter taking an apprentice or probationer, but, within fourteen days thereafter register such apprentice or probationer. by giving notice

(b) Any employer intreatter taking an apprentice or probationer shall, while fourteen days thereafter, register such apprentice or probationer. by giving notice thereof to the Clerk of the Court in the prescribed form.
 (c) If at the date of this award any employer is employing any person as an apprentice or a probationer who has not been duly registered as such, he shall register such apprentice or probationer within fourteen days thereafter.
 (d) The maximum number of apprentices allowed to any employer shall be

(d) The maximum number of apprentices allowed to any employer shall be in the proportion of one to every three or fraction of three journeymen employed by him: Provided that this award shall not operate to render unlawful, or to vary the terms or provisions of any apprenticeship existing at the date of its commencement.

(e) For the purpose of ascertaining the number of apprentices allowed to be taken at any time, the number of journeymen employed shall be deemed to be the average number of journeymen employed on all working days of the six months im-

average initial of journeyment employed on an average and a set of the mediately preceding such time.
(f) The term of apprenticeship shall be six years. A probationary period of three months previous to being bound shall be lawful, such probationary period to be deemed portion of the period of apprenticeship.

(g) Should any employer from unforeseen circumstances be unable to carry out his obligations to his apprentice, he shall be allowed to transfer the apprentice to complete his term with another employer; but it shall be incumbent upon such former employer to notify the Clerk of the Court of the date of such transfer and when such apprenticeship commenced. (Form 2 in Appendix hereto.) (h) The following porvisions shall apply in the respect of all apprentice-

ships:-

- An employer shall be deemed to undertake the duty which he agrees to perform as a duty enforceable under this award, and shall, subject to the provisions of subclause (o), pay the apprentice the rate of wages herein provided.
- (2) At the end of the period of apprenticeship the employer shall give the apprentice a certificate (Form 5 in Appendix hereto) to show that he has served his apprenticeship. Should the employer at any time he has served his apprenticeship. Should the employer at any time before the termination of the apprenticeship desire to dispense with the services of the apprentice. he may, with the consent of the ap-prentice, transfer him to another employer carrying on business within a reasonable distance of the original employer's place of business, willing to continue to teach the apprentice and to pay the rate of wages prescribed by this award according to the total length of time wages prescribed by this award according to the total length of time served, and generally to perform the obligations of the original em-ployer. He shall also give to the apprentice a certificate of the time served and of the rate of wages paid, and shall give notice to the Clerk of the Court of such transfer in the form provided (Form 2 in Appendix hereto). It shall not be obligatory upon the employer to find the apprentice another employer if he shall so misconduct him-self as to entitle the employer to discharge him, but he shall never-thelese give him a cartificate for the time actually conced theless give him a certificate for the time actually served,

- (3) An employer shall be deemed to fail in his duty towards his apprentice if he neglects to keep him constantly at work, but slackness of work may form a proper ground for transferring him to a master willing to undertake the responsibility of teaching him.
- (4) When an apprentice is discharged for cause, the employer shall send notice in writing of the discharge, and the cause thereof, to the said Clerk of the Court (Form 3 in Appendix hereto).
- (i) The minimum wage payable to an apprentice shall be:-
  - During the first year-12s. 6d. per week.
  - During the second year—17s. 6d. per week. During the third year—22s. 6d. per week. During the fourth year—30s. per week.

  - During the fifth year—45s. per week. During the sixth year—60s. per week.

(j) Every apprentice shall be bound to submit himself to examination by a Board of Examiners hereinafter constituted, once in each year of his service, when called upon by the Clerk of the Court so to do..

(k) The Clerk of the Court shall notify the Board of Examiners of the names and addresses of all candidates required to submit themselves to examination. The examination will be held at the place where the apprentice is employed, and it shall be the duty of each employer to provide such necessary material and machinery as may be required, and in all ways to facilitate the conduct of the examination.

(1) The examination will be held in the month of May in each year. The Board of Examiners will consist of persons skilled in the trade, to be nominated by the union and by the employers carrying on business within the area to which this by the union and by the employers carrying on business within the area to which this award applies; or, failing such nomination or nominations, such person or persons as may be appointed for that purpose by the Court. In the event of a disagreement between the examiners, the matter in dispute shall be referred to a third person agreed to by them, or nominated by the Court, or the President, at the request of either member, and the decision of such third person shall be final and conclusive. The examiners shall examine the work of and inquire into the diligence of each apprentice and as to the opportunities provided by the employer to each apprentice to learn. to learn.

(m) The examiners shall report to the Court in writing as to the result of the examination.

(n) The Clerk of the Court shall supply to each candidate a certificate showing the result of his examination, and it shall be lawful for any employer to withhold the increase in wages accruing in accordance with the scale set forth in subclause (i) hereof from any apprentice who fails to satisfy the examiners.

(o) If the examiners report to the Court that any employer has not provided sufficient opportunity for the apprentice to learn, the employer shall be deemed *prima* facie guilty of a breach of this award under Section 90 of the Act, and may be summoned before the Court. Upon any such proceeding the report may be received in evidence.

9. Under-rate Workers .- Any worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum wage may be paid such lesser wage as may from time to time be agreed upon in writing between the union and the employer, and in default of such agreement within twenty-four hours after such worker shall have ap-plied in writing to the secretary of the union stating his desire that such wage should be agreed upon, such wage as shall be fixed by the most convenient resident or police magistrate upon the application of such worker after twenty-four hours' notice in writing shall have been given by him to the said secretary, who shall, if he so desires, be heard by the magistrate upon such application. After having given notice to the secretary and after lodging the application mentioned, and pending the magis-trate's decision thereon, the worker shall be entitled to work for and be employed at the proposed lesser rate. The determination of the magistrate shall have effect of the period of six calendar months from the date thereof, and after the expiration of the said period until the wage shall have been again fixed at the instance of the said secretary in the manner prescribed. The secretary of the union may by writing under his hand appoint an agent or substitute to represent the union at the hearing of the application before the magistrate.

10. Exemptions.-Nothing in this award shall be taken to apply to employers or workers engaged solely in the manufacture of stoves, ranges, and grates.

Shipping Casualty s.s. "Cardium." Report of Inquiry.

Harbour and Light Department,

Fremantle, 1st May, 1919.

The Under Secretary.

Sir,

I have to report, for the information of the Hon. Minister, having held an inquiry at Albany into the circumstances attending a fire which occurred on the s.s. "Cardium" whilst at sea.

After taking the evidence of William Ellis Jones (Master), Thomas Kendall Evans (Chief Engineer), Arthur Powell Jones (3rd Officer), Charles Dicken Combes (3rd Engineer), and William Charles Cook (4th Engineer), 1 find that the s.s. "Cardium" is a steel screw vessel of 6,127 gross and 3,997 tons net register, official number 112703, registered at London, and especially constructed for the carriage of oil in bulk.

The vessel sailed from Pulo Samboe with a full cargo of benzine in bulk for Melbourne, and called at Fremantle en route. She left this port on the 31st March, 1919.

All went well until 7.10 p.m. on the 3rd April, when the steamer was in Lat. 35deg. 54min. S., Long. 122deg. 34min. N., when huge flames were seen emerging from the engine-room stokehold. Despite all efforts to overcome the fire, it was not extinguished until 6 a.m. on the 4th. At intervals during the night of the 3rd distress signals were sent out. As it was ascertained that the oil fuel plant was completely disabled and the vessel could not proceed under her own steam, the "Tarcoola" was signalled to take her in tow, but after several attempts it was abandoned, as the "Tarcoola" was too light.

In response to S.O.S. calls, the s.s. "War Soldier" came to the "Cardium's" assistance, and at 6.30 a.m. on the 6th April a towing hawser was connected and after same having parted several times, the "Cardium" arrived at King George's Sound on the night of the 9th April.

The evidence proves conclusively that the outbreak of fire occurred in the engine-room at or near the fuel pumps and heaters, which are fitted in the forward end of the engine-room on the starboard side, and caused the total disablement of this portion of the vessel's equipment, leaving her helpless.

In this vessel the engines are fitted aft, and the system of supplying fuel oil to the furnace is as follows:—The oil is drawn from the bunkers, through heaters, to the oil fuel pumps, it is then forced through another heater placed on the delivery side of the pump and through a filter, thence to the burners, where it is delivered under pressure. The suction heaters are used only in very cold weather, and according to a statement made by the Chief Engineer, were not in use on the day on which the fire occurred.

Judging by the evidence it is quite obvious, owing to the rapidity with which the fire spread, that it was caused by the ignition of an inflammable gas.

It will be noted that a statement was made by the Chief Engineer that the oil had been heated up to a temperature of 210°F. on the afternoon on which the fire occurred, and that he instructed the engineer on watch to let the temperature come back to 140°F., which was normal. The 3rd Officer, in his evidence, expressed the opinion that there was a leak in the bulkhead between No. 1 tank and the after cofferdam, which allowed the benzine cargo in No. 1 tank to mix with the fuel oil stored in the cofferdam. He also said that he had come to this conclusion through the specific gravity of the benzine in that tank being higher than any of the others, also that it was discoloured. These two statements were the only ones made by the witnesses examined which indicated any possible cause of the fire, and investigations were therefore made along these lines.

Dealing first with the 3rd Officer's evidence. The specific gravity of the benzine in the various tanks was taken the day after the inquiry and, as stated by him, it was higher in No. 1 tank than in any of the other tanks, but the Chief Officer's records showed that this was the case when it was pumped into the tank at the loading port. His statement that the benzine was discoloured also proved to be correct, but by testing the discoloured liquid, which separated from the benzine, it proved to be seawater.

Samples of the fuel oil were then taken from the forward cofferdam, after cofferdam, and cross bunker, and forwarded to the Government Analyst for analysis and report. The report shows the flash points to be 150°F., 190°F., and 206°F., respectively.

All these three oils were being mixed per medium of sluice valves to keep the same level in the cofferdams and bunker during the voyage.

It will be noted that the oil in the after cofferdam had a flash point of 190°F. and there is no mention of the presence of benzine by the Government Analyst, which, together with the tests previously made, disposes of the 3rd Officer's opinion that there was a leak between this cofferdam and No. 1 benzine tank.

It also appears that due care had been exercised in loading, as the oil with the lowest flash point was placed in the forward cofferdam which is the farthest removed from the engine and boiler spaces, and the oil with the highest flash point in the cross bunker.

Regarding the Chief Engineer's statement that he noticed the temperature of the oil fuel had been raised to  $210^{\circ}$ F. by the heaters, I have come to the conclusion that this was the most probable cause of the fire. As already stated, the three oils had been mixed, which would bring the flash point down some degrees below  $210^{\circ}$ F., so that an inflammable gas would be given off at the temperature named, which would probably escape into the engine-room through a slight leak in one of the joints, although there is no evidence to show how ignition occurred.

In conclusion, I cannot help but express the opinion that the practice of carrying fuel oil in the cofferdams, which has now become general, is very much open to question, particularly in vessels with benzine cargoes. I am also of the opinion that an automatic regulator should be devised and fitted to fuel heaters so that the temperature of the oil would be kept within reasonable limits, and the flash point not exceeded.

I regret to state that two members of the crew lost their lives through the fire.

In conclusion, I find that every attempt was made by the Master and the Officers, assisted by the crew, to overcome the fire.
