HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to amend the Regulations made on the 19th day of March, 1919, under "The Vermin Act, 1918," and published in the Government Gaette of the 21st day of March, 1919, by striking out Regulation 4 thereof, and inserting the following Regulation in lieu there-

4. Each Board shall consist of such number of members, not less than six nor more than twelve, as may be determined by the Governor on the constitution of the Board; provided, however, that where a Vermin District is divided into Wards the number of members of such Vermin Board may exceed twelve but shall not be more than twice the number of the Wards comprised in such Vermin number of the Wards comprised in such Vermin District; provided also, that the Governor may, within the limits aforesaid, from time to time change the number of members of which any specified board shall consist; provided further, that nothing in this Regulation shall be deemed to affect the number of members of any Board appointed or constituted under Section 45 of the Act.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to approve of the following By-laws under "The Cemeteries Act, 1897," and amendments for the management of the Bunbury Public Cemetery (Reserve 14000).

By virtue of all powers in that behalf vested in the Trustees of the Bunbury Cemetery Board, the said Board makes the following By-laws:—

1. All fees and charges payable to the Board, as set forth in Schedule A, shall be paid at the times and recover themsin positional values otherwise ordered.

manner therein mentioned, unless otherwise ordered.

2. Any person desiring to inter any dead body in the Cemetery shall make an application in the form contained in Schedule B. Upon such application being approved by the Board, and upon payment of the prescribed fees, they shall cause to be issued to the person so applying an "Order for Burial," in the form contained in the Schedule C.

All applications for interment shall be made at the office of the Trustees in such time as to allow at least five working hours' notice being given to the Superintendent at the Cemetery prior to the time fixed for burial. An extra charge shall be made for appplications within such time. No free interment shall be allowed mylege the application together with the Marking togeth lowed unless the application, together with the Magistrate's order therefor, be handed in at the office in such time as to allow of at least six working hours' notice

being given as above.
4. The Board shall cause all graves to be dug, and vaults, brick graves, or graves to be re-opened as and

when required.

5. Before any interment is allowed, the "Order for Burial" shall be handed to and retained by the Superintendent.

Every coffin shall have upon the lid an approved metal plate bearing the name of the deceased stamped or otherwise indelibly inscribed in legible characters

thereon. No coffin not complying with this By-law shall be admitted to or be interred in the Cemetery.

7. Every grave shall be at least 7ft. deep at the first interment, and no interment shall be allowed in any grave with a less depth than 3ft. from the top of the coffin to the original surface of the surrounding ground.

8. In the case of an application for interment in any private grave or vault to which the deceased had no claim during life, the written and verified consent of the grantee shall be handed in with the application.

9. No burial shall be allowed to take place in the Cemetery, nor shall any coffin be allowed to enter the Cemetery, unless a certificate from a District Registrar of Deaths that the death has been registered, or a Coroner's order for burial is handed to the Superintendent, at the latest, upon the funeral entering the Cemetery. Should the undertaker or his representative be unable to produce the said certificate from the Registrar, he shall give a written guarantee to produce same within three days, and satisfactory reasons must be given for the new production of each certificate in the given for the non-production of such certificate in the first instance. In default of the production of the said certificate within three days, the undertaker's license may be suspended until such certificate is produced. The certificate will be retained, but the Coroner's order shall be returned to the person delivering the same.

10. Unless otherwise ordered the principal entrance to the Cemetery shall open daily between the hours of 7 a.m. and 6 p.m. from 1st September to 30th April, and between 7 a.m. and 5 p.m. during the remaining

months of the year.

The hours for burial shall be as follows:—

1st September to 30th April—Week days from
8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Sundays, from 2 p.m. to

5 p.m. 1st May to 31st August—Week days from 8 a.m. to 4.30 p.m. Sundays, from 2 p.m. to 4.30 p.m.

and no burial shall be allowed to take place, nor any coffin allowed to enter the Cemetery at any other hour except by written permission of the Board.

12. The time fixed for any burial shall be the time at which the funeral is to arrive at the Cemetery gates, and if not punctually observed, the undertaker responsible shall be liable to a fine of 10s. 6d.

13. Every funeral shall enter by the principal entrance, and no vehicle, except the hearse and mourning coaches, shall be permitted to enter the Cemetery, or stand opposite the entrance gates. Horses shall not be allowed to proceed faster than at a walking pace within the Cemetery, and shall precede at each by such reads as the Cemetery, and shall proceed at and by such roads as directed by the Superintendent or other officer of the Trustees from time to time. Any driver or other person failing or neglecting to observe such directions may be forthwith expelled from the Cemetery. No bicycle shall be ridden within the Cemetery.

14. Children under the age of ten years entering the Cemetery must be in charge of some responsible person.

15. Smoking shall not be allowed within the Cemetery, nor any fire-works discharged therein.

16. No dogs shall be admitted into the Cemetery, and any found there shall be liable to be destroyed.

17. Any person violating the rules of propriety and decorum, or committing any nuisance or trespass, or injuring any tree, shrub, flower, border, grave, or any erection, or in any way infringing these By-laws, shall be expelled from the Cemetery.

18. No person shall remove any plant, tree, shrub, flower (other than withered flowers, which are to be placed in the receptacles provided by the Board for same), or any article from any grave without first obtaining a permit from the Board or their representatives.

19. No person shall pluck any tree, plant, shrub, or flower growing in any portion of the Cemetery.

20. No person shall remove or carry out of or attempt to earry out of the Cemetery any tree, plant, shrub, or flower without the written authority of the Board or their representative.

21. No person shall promote or advertise, or carry on within the Cemetery any trade, business, or calling either by solicitation, distribution of circulars, by cards or otherwise, or by any other system of advertisement whatsoever, without the written consent of the Board, and any person infringing this By-law shall be expelled from the Cemetery.

22. No person employed by or under the Board shall be permitted to accept any gratuity whatever, nor shall he be pecuniarily interested in any work in the Cemetery, other than the remuneration he receives from the Board, and any such person proved guilty of accepting any gratuity, or being pecuniarily interested in any such work, shall be liable to summary dismissal.

23. Subject to the By-laws and to the directions of the Trustees, the Superintendent shall exercise a general

the Trustees, the Superintendent shall exercise a general supervision and control over all matters pertaining to the Cemetery, including the conduct of all funerals and interments within the Cemetery.

24. Any person requiring an "Exclusive Right of Burial" in any part of the Cemetery shall apply to the Board, in writing, specifying the location of the grave, and whether it is proposed to erect a brick grave or vault, and in such case submitting plans and specifications of the proposed work. Such application shall also state the names of any already deceased person whose remains it is proposed to inter therein.

whose remains it is proposed to inter therein.

25. Upon being satisfied of the matters aforesaid, and of the suitability of the said work, plans, and specifications, the Board may authorise the construction specifications, the Board may authorise the construction and erection thereof, or, if no work is to be done, may issue a "Grant" in the Form "E" in the Schedule.

26. Upon the completion of the work aforesaid, the Board may, if and when such work is done to their complete satisfaction, issue a "Grant" in the Form "E" in the Schedule.

27. Every such Grant shall be subject to the Bylaws for the firm.

27. Every such Grant shall be subject to the By-laws for the time being, and no interment in any such grave or vault shall be allowed unless upon production of the "Order for Burial" aforesaid, nor shall any such grave or vault be opened, unless with the written consent of the Board.

28. Every coffin placed in any such bricked grave or vault shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered with a slab of stone, slate, or iron, unless special written exemption be obtained from the Board.

29. If application be made for an "Order for Burial" in any grave or vault of the remains of any person other than the person to whom the grant was issued, or his registered assign, the written and verified consent of such grantee or assignee shall be produced.

Any person desiring to place or erect, or to alter any part of the Cemetery must first obtain the written consent and approval of the Board, and otherwise comply with Section 23 of the principal Act (61 Vict., No. 23).

31. Every tombstone, monument, or enclosure shall be placed on proper and substantial foundations, which, if required by the Board or their officers, shall extend to the bottom of the grave.

32. The materials used in every such erection shall

be subject to the approval of the Superintendent or other officer appointed by the Board, and any material rejected shall be immediately removed from the Cemetery by the Contractor for the erection. All refuse and other rubbish remaining after any work is completed shall be immediately removed from the Cemetery by the

person causing the same.

33. Should any work by masons or others be not completed before a Sunday, they shall be required to leave the work in a neat and safe condition to the satis-

faction of the Superintendent.

34. Monumental masons and other tradesmen shall, before commencing any work within the Cemetery, deposit with the Secretary to the Board the sum of 10s., which shall be forfeited if the provisions of either of the two preceding By-laws be not complied with to the satisfaction of the Superintendent.

35. All material required in the erection and completion of any work shall, as far as possible, be prepared before being taken to the Cemetery; and all materials required by tradesmen shall be admitted at such entrance as the Superintendent shall direct, and no vehicle conveying any such materials with wheels less than 4in. broad shall be permitted to enter the Cemetery.

36. No catacomb shall be allowed.
37. Subject to the approval of the Trustees, each applicant for an "Order for Burial" shall, within three months from date of application, enclose the grave mentioned in such application with a kerbing of tiles, slate, or stone, and shall cause to be placed thereon a numberplate bearing the number of the grave or vault. Every grave, vault, monument, tombstone, kerbing, or any other erection shall be maintained and kept in thorough repair and proper condition, by and at the expense of the

Should the grantee's residence not be known, grantee. or be out of the State, the Board to have power to do the work and keep an account against the grantee. No mounds shall be allowed.

38. No wooden fence, railing, cross, or other wooden erection shall be allowed on or around any grave or

vault.

No trees or shrubs shall be planted on any grave 39. except such as shall be approved by the Superintendent. 40. All workmen, whether employed by the Board or

40. All workmen, whether employed by the Board or by any other person, shall at all times, whilst within the boundaries of the Cemetery, be subject to the supervision of the Superintendent, and shall obey such directions as that officer may find it necessary to give; and any workman permitting any breach of these Regulations and By-laws, or refusing or neglecting to comply with any directions of the said Superintendent, shall be removed from the Comptens. from the Cemetery.

41. Licenses for grave dressing or decorating may be issued by the Board in the form contained in Schedule "G"; such licenses to be renewed annually in the month

of January.

42. Any person taking part in dressing or attending to any grave shall comply with the following rules:—

(a.) No rubbish, soil, sand, or other material removed in dressing a grave shall be placed on any adany other grave, and if placed on any adjoining ground shall be removed immediately the work is completed.

(b.) No sand, soil, or loam shall be taken from any portion of the Cemetery for the purpose of

dressing any grave, except with the permission of the Superintendent.

(c.) The dressing of all graves, and the wheeling and earting of any material shall be subject to the supervision of the Superintendent.

(d.) Work in all cases to be carried on with due despatch, and only during regulation hours.

43. Prior to conducting any interment within the Cemetery, or making use of the Cemetery for any pur-Cemetery, or making use of the Cemetery for any purpose connected with interments, every undertaker shall pay to the Board an annual fee of £2 2s., and shall at the time of making such payment give his assent in writing to such conditions as the Board may deem fit to impose. Upon such assent being given, and payment of the fee made, he shall receive a "Permit," to hold good during good behaviour and until the first day of January following, and unless in the possession of such a "Permit" no undertaker shall be allowed to engage in or carry out any duty or work within the Cemetery.

44. The Board may decorate graves from time to time, when desired by the grantees so to do. If the grantees do not desire the Board to carry out this work, the grantees may either do it themselves or employ any person licensed by the Board for that purpose.

No person, except the relatives of the deceased, the Board, or those licensed by the Board, shall be per-

mitted to decorate any grave.

46. Any person committing any breach of any of these By-laws and Regulations, or of any other Rules, Regulations, or By-laws, lawfully made under the authority of any Act, relating to cemeteries, shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5, and in case of a continuing breach, a further sum not exceeding £1 for every day during which such breach continues, and shall be forthwith removable from the Cemetery by the Board, the Superintendent, or other officer of the Board, and shall be treated as a trespasser, and may be proceeded against accordingly.

A plan of the Cemetery showing the distribution of the land, compartments, sections, situation, and numher of grave, and a Register of all certificates of "Rights of Burial," shall be kept at the office.

48. Any person desiring to inter a dead body on a Sunday shall, in addition to paying an extra fee of One pound over and above the prescribed fees, produce a certificate in writing by a medical officer of health, or by a police magistrate, or by a Justice of the Peace, that for sanitary or special religious reasons it is necessary or advisable that the burial take place on that day.

The foregoing By-laws, with the accompanying Schedules, were duly framed and presented to a meeting of the Board held at the Council Chambers, Monday, the 28th of April, 1919, and adopted.

THE Mount Magnet Road Board, as the Board of Management of the Mount Magnet, Lennonville, and Paynesville Commons, do hereby make and publish the following By-laws for the regulation and good management of the Mount Magnet, Lennonville, and Paynesville Commons:

1. All stock running on the Commons, otherwise than in accordance with the following By-laws, shall be treated as trespassing stock.

2. No person shall depasture any animal on the Commons without having first obtained a license from

the Board. 3. Every Every applicant for a license to depasture under these By-laws shall furnish the Secretary or Ranger with a correct list, in writing, of the number of horses, cattle, camels, asses, sheep, goats, or other animals, that he, she, or they intend to depasture on the Commons, and shall describe the brands, numbers, or other distinguishing marks thereon, and shall obtain a license from the Chairman, Secretary, or other person duly authorised in that behalf, setting forth the number and description of animals licensed by the Road Board to depasture on the Commons according to these By-laws.

With the exception of stock owned by bona fide travellers, travelling teamsters, and drovers, as hereinafter provided for, no stock of any description shall be allowed to run or depasture on the Commons free of charge, except as hereinafter provided, and the following charges shall be payable half-yearly in advance on the first days of January and July in each and every the first days of January and July in each and every year, in respect of all stock running or depasturing thereon. Persons residing within the boundaries of the Mount Magnet Road Board District only shall have the right to run stock on the Commons. The scale of charges to be as follows:-

Horses, cattle, mules, and asses, 7s. 6d. per head per annum.

Dairy cows, 5s. per head per annum.

Camels, 30s. per head per annum. Goats, 2s. per head per annum.

Dairy goats, 1s. 6d. per head per annum. Butchers' stock, charges £7 10s. per annum for not more than 150 sheep and 10 head of cattle.

- No camel shall depasture on the Commons without the written permission of the Chairman or two members of the Road Board.
- Stock under nine months of age shall be exempt from tax.
- (a) No license shall be granted to any person, at bona fide butchers and dairymen, to depasture on the Commons at any one time more than ten head of cattle, mules, asses, goats, or camels. Only sheep kept for killing by bona fide butchers for supply to the public shall be allowed to run and depasture on the Com-
- (b) No firm of butchers shall depasture more than 150 sheep and 15 cattle at any one time, and no dairyman shall depasture more than 20 cows or 30 goats at any one time, except by special permission of the Road Board.
- 8. Any person running stock on the Commons may change such stock from time to time, provided that he does not at any time exceed the number for which he shall have paid Commonage fees.
- Bona fide travellers or teamsters shall be allowed to run their horses, cattle, mules, asses, or camels, on the Commons for the space of seven clear days free of

charge; such stock, after being on the Commons for that time, must make a bona fide trip of at least four-teen miles from where they unloaded, Mount Magnet or elsewhere, before being entitled to another term free. Should that period, however, be exceeded they shall be charged at the rate of sixpence per head per day or part of a day, for all horses, cattle, mules, asses, or camels. In no case shall such horses, cattle, mules, asses, or camels remain on the Commons under this regulation longer than twelve clear days at any one

10. Resident teamsters will be allowed to run their teams stocks on the Commons at an annual charge of five pounds (£5) per team per annum, payable quarterly in advance; such teams not to exceed 30 donkeys, 15 horses, or 18 camels. Any stock above these numbers to pay the ordinary rates of 7s. 6d. per head per annum.

11. No stock shall be mustered on the Commons

without the written permission of the Secretary of the Road Board or Commonage Ranger, and no person or persons shall brand stock running or depasturing on Commons, unless in the presence of the Secretary or Ranger.

12. All travelling stock, with the exception of those travelling to and from the Railways, shall be allowed to cross the Commonages conditionally that the owner or drover in charge of such stock gives written notice of his intention to travel such stock and to comply strictly with Section 29 of "The Cattle Trespass, Fencing, and Impounding Act, 1882" (46 Vic., No. 7).

13. Travelling stock arriving by train will be allowed two clear days after arrival free of charge. Travelling sheep, if waiting for trucks to leave Mount Magnet, Lennonville, or Paynesville, or any railway siding within the Mount Magnet Road Board District,

will be allowed three clear days free of charge.

14. Stray stock proved to be accidentally on the Commons shall not be liable to pay Commonage fees, but shall be treated in all respects as trespassing stock.

- 15. No stock on which Commonage fees are due shall be removed from the Commons unless with the written sanction of the Secretary, until such fees have been paid in full.
- The Secretary shall at any time, with the approval of the Chairman of the Road Board, have authority to take legal proceedings for the recovery of any fees unpaid.
- 17. No entire horse, jack donkey, or bull, over the age of nine months, shall be allowed on the Commons without the owner thereof obtaining written permission from the Chairman or Sceretary of the Road Board, and in addition to the penalty hereinafter perscribed and receivable under these By laws against the expression and recoverable under these By-laws against the owner, if known, any such entire horse, jack donkey, or bull found thereon shall be liable to be dealt with in the manner prescribed by "The Cattle Trespass, Fencing, and Impounding Act, 1882" (46 Vic., No. 7).

18. The Secretary or Ranger for the time being shall have authority to demand particulars of stock de-

pasturing on the Commons.

19. The Road Board shall not be responsible for damage or injury sustained from any cause whatever by any animal depasturing on the Commons under the provisions of these By-laws.

The Road Board shall be the sole judge of what constitutes a bona fide butcher, dairyman, traveller, teamster, drover, and dairy eattle or dairy goats, within the meaning of these By-laws.

21. Every licensee under these By-laws shall produce

his license upon being requested to do so by any mem-

ber or officer of the Road Board or any policeman.

22. The Road Board prohibits the doing by any unlicensed person of any act or thing for which a license may be granted under the provisions of these By-laws, and any unlicensed person doing such act or thing shall be guilty of an offence against these By-laws.

23. All penalties and other sums recovered under the provisions of these By-laws shall, unless otherwise provided, be paid to the Road Board, and shall become the property of and form part of the ordinary income of the Road Board.

24. (a) Any person or persons who shall introduce

24. (a) Any person or persons who shall introduce, cause or allow to be introduced or depastured any diseased animal or animals upon the Commons, or allow the same to depasture on the Commons, shall be guilty of a breach of these By-laws and shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty hereinafter prescribed.

(b) The Chairman, Secretary, or Commonage Ranger or other authorised person may, if in his opinion any

animal appears diseased, order or cause the same to be removed from the Commons and, if he thinks fit, cause the same to be impounded and examined, and if found to be diseased, all expenses and costs incurred in con-nection therewith and in relation thereto shall be paid

by the owner.

25. The Secretary or Commonage Ranger shall at any time, with the approval of the Chairman or any two members of the Board, have authority to take legal proceedings for the recovery of fees unpaid, or the reproceedings for the recovery of fees unpaid, or the recovery of any fine or penalty, or for any breach of the within By-laws, or any of them, or for the enforcement of the within By-laws, or any of them, and such legal proceedings shall be commenced by a complaint made by the Secretary or Commonage Ranger, and all the proceedings shall be in conformity with "The Justices Act, 1902," and its amendments, unless such proceedings are represent to the within By-laws or any of ings are repugnant to the within By-laws or any of them.

26. Any person who does, permits, or suffers to be done any act, matter, or thing contrary to any of these By-laws, or commits or permits any breach thereof either by act of commission or omission, shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these By-laws and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5 and £2 per day for a continuing breach, but not more than £20 in the agreegate

gregate.

27. No person shall be permitted to fell or remove any green or growing timber on the Commons, without the written permission of the Chairman or any two members of the Board.

These By-laws have been approved by the Mount Magnet Road Board at a meeting held on the 5th day of October, 1918, and are to take effect from the date of publication in the Government Gazette.

All previous existing Common By-laws are hereby repealed.
