WHEREAS by Sections 222 and 227 of "The Muni-cipal Corporations Act, 1906" (6 Edwardi, No. 32), it shall be lawful for the Governor, on request of the Council, by notice in the Government Gazette, to de-clare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or ex-change acquired for a street or way, or any place, bridge, or thoroughfare, to be a public highway, and such land shall thereupon and theneeforth, from the date of such proclamation, become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force: And whereas the City of Perth Municipal Council has re-quested that certain land named and described in the Schedule hereunder which has been used for street or way within the City of Perth, be declared a public highway: Now therefore I, the said Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do by this my proclamation declare the said land to be a public highway, and such land shall, from the date of this proclamation, be absolutely dedicated to the public as a highway within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force. WHEREAS by Crown Grants under "The Land Regu-lations, 1887," registered in the books of the Office of Land Titles in Volume 95, Folios 37 and 38, Victoria Locations 2044 and 2045, containing 100 acres and 150 acres, respectively, were granted to John Men-hennet Pascoe, of Dongara, farmer, subject to the reservation to His Majesty the King, his heirs and suc-cessors, of the right to resume and enter upon posses-sion of any part of the said lands which it might at any sion of any part of the said lands which it might at any sion of any part of the said lands which it might at any time be deemed necessary to resume for roads, tram-ways, railway stations, bridges, canals, towing paths, harbour or river improvements works, drainage or irri-gation works, or quarries, and generally for any other works or purposes of public use, utility, or convenience, and such land so resumed to hold to His Majesty, his heirs and successors, as of his or their former estate, without making to the said grantee any compensation in respect thereof, so that the lands so resumed should in respect thereof, so that the lands so resumed should not exceed one-twentieth part in the whole of the land aforesaid, and that no such resumption should be made of any land upon which any buildings should be erected, or should be in use as gardens or otherwise for the more convenient occupation of any such building, with-out compensation: And whereas it is desirable to re-sume the land hereinafter described (being a portion of the land granted as aforesaid not exceeding one-twen-tieth thereof) for the purpose of a Road: Now know ye that I, the Governor of this State, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim that, in exercise of the power contained in the said Crown Grants as aforesaid, the land described in the schedule hereto, being portions not exceeding one-twentieth of the whole of the land comprised in the said Grants, was on the 14th day of May, 1919, resumed on behalf of His Majesty, for the purpose of a Road.



WHEREAS by "The Bank Holidays Act, 1884," it is provided that it shall be lawful for the Governor, when it is inexpedient that a day appointed for a Bank holiday should be a Bank Holiday, to declare by Proclamation that such day shall not be a Bank Holiday, and to appoint such other day as to the Governor may seem fit to be a holiday instead thereof: And whereas under the provisions of "The Bank Holidays Amendment Act, 1899," Monday, the 9th day of June would, except as hereinafter declared, be observed as a Bank Holiday in commemoration of the birthday of the Sovereign: And whereas it is desirable that 'Tuesday, the 3rd day of June, should be appointed to be a Bank Holiday, the intention being that the birthday of the Sovereign should be observed on that day instead of the 9th day of June: Now therefore I, the said Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby declare that the 9th day of June proximo shall not be a Bank Holiday, and I appoint the 3rd day of June proximo to be a Bank Holiday instead of the first-named day.
